**FIRST DAY**

**Wednesday, January 20, 1971**

In accordance with Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, the House of Representatives convened in Regular Session on Wednesday, January 20, 1971. The Honorable Jack K. Suwa being the Representative at the time present who was elected from the First Representative District of the State of Hawaii, called the House to order at 10:00 o'clock a.m.

Representative Suwa appointed the Honorable Motohisa Unemori, Daniel J. Kihano, Ted Yap, Joseph R. Garcia, Jr. and John J. Medeiros to escort the Very Reverend Robert R. Mackey, Chancellor, St. Louis-Chaminade Education Center, to the rostrum.

Reverend Robert R. Mackey invoked the Divine Blessing, after which the Lord's Prayer was sung by the Kamehameha Boys' School Concert Glee Club.

Representative Suwa then appointed the Honorable Richard H. Wasai, Richard Garcia, Minoru Inaba, Dorothy L. Devereux and James Aki to escort Reverend Yoshiaki Fujitani, of the Honpa Hongwanji Mission to the rostrum.

Reverend Yoshiaki Fujitani then invoked the Divine Blessing.

**INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION**

## 2ND DAY

Thursday, January 21, 1971

The House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1971, was called to order at 11:00 o'clock a.m.

The Temporary Chairman presided.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by The Reverend Doctor Frank Butterworth of the Methodist Church District Headquarters.

Roll call of the members of the House of Representatives showed that all members were present.

The Temporary Clerk proceeded to read the Journal of the House of Representatives of the First Day.

On motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, reading of the Journal was dispensed with and the Journal of the First Day was approved.

At 11:05 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

At 11:17 o'clock a.m., the House of Representatives met in joint session with the Senate, pursuant to House Resolution No. 2, to receive the Governor's message.

At this time, the Temporary Chairman introduced to the members of the Senate and House the most gracious First Lady of the State of Hawaii, Mrs. John A. Burns, and the Honorable George M. Ariyoshi, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawaii.

The Chair then appointed Representatives Wakatsuki, Ushijima, Soares and J. Garcia and Senators Ushijima, Ching and Yee as a committee to escort the Honorable John A. Burns, Governor of the State of Hawaii, to the rostrum.

The following is the address of Governor John A. Burns (Gov. Mess. No. 1):

“Mr. Speaker, Mr. President, Honorable and Distinguished Members of the Sixth Hawaii State Legislature, Distinguished Guests, Ladies and Gentlemen:

Your most gracious invitation to address this joint session of the Senate and the House for the Sixth Hawaii State Legislature for such address or greeting that I may choose to make is deeply appreciated.

May I first take advantage of this opportunity to extend my personal congratulations to each of you who have been so honored as to be elected to Hawaii's Sixth State Legislature.

The mixture of old and new faces in your membership mirrors well the orderly change which has characterized Hawaii's growth in recent years.

To those of you with whom I have been privileged to work in sessions past, I welcome you back and renew my standing pledge of this Administration's willingness to cooperate fully with you in all our mutual undertakings.

To those of you who have newly assumed positions of trust and confidence of your respective constituencies, I extend a warm Aloha as well as our promise to work in concert with you in a spirit of common endeavor.

Traditionally, this occasion has been a forum for the presentation of those legislative proposals which the Executive considers worthy of special consideration by your Honorable Bodies.

In recent years, however, we have tended to favor the use of this very privileged platform for public examination of those broader questions which concern all of us in Hawaii.

In keeping with the spirit of change which has inclined us toward this practice, I would again address our more immediate concerns in terms of the larger policy issues of which they are a part.

As prescribed by law, the executive budget proposals have been submitted for your review and your consideration. I know you will, in the days ahead, be devoting detailed attention to all elements of the budget and to the several departmental reports already in your hands or forthcoming. I will forego any repetitious presentation of these matters.

That we are met today in an economic, social, and political climate

envied far and wide for stability, harmony, and progress reflects the validity of those programs we developed together to meet Hawaii's needs in the Sixties.

Working together, we have achieved unprecedented progress in recent years.

They have been years of remarkable changes in every conceivable aspect of our lives. And, while many of these changes have been dramatic in perspective, they have all been attained in orderly fashion.

The boldness of your imagination and your responsiveness to public need were indeed instrumental in producing these changes.

To recount all that has been done would mean a lengthy recitation of progressive legislation in all areas of government concern: in education, in social, economic, and tax reform, in public health and welfare, in consumer protection, and in a wide variety of laws to protect and insure the security of working men and women throughout the State.

We have, in fact, been a model for all the other states in the Nation and for Nations elsewhere in our legislative enactments in the programs we have effectuated for our people. It is, therefore, no accident that we have thus far weathered, with relatively minor ill effects on our society, the economic depression and social upheavals so widespread throughout the rest of the Nation.

Nevertheless, we begin this decade under fiscal restraints that preclude easy rhetoric about new programs and fresh directions.

I need hardly remind you of the consequences of diminished revenue resulting from the grave recession in which our Nation finds itself today.

Under the circumstances, and guided as well by a popular mood calling for a thorough review of our present conditions—a mood more easily felt than precisely defined—it is timely that we adopt a policy of consolidation and conservation.

This is not to say that a purely holding operation is the order of the day. On the contrary, more than ever, we must be creative, imaginative, and innovative in planning those programs and policies we adopt to better the lives of all of our people.

I suggest we take stock of what we have achieved, to see where we are and why. We can then more wisely decide how our resources may be more effectively allocated to continue our progress without unduly straining ourselves.

Even if our economic outlook projected continued, steady growth rather than a levelling-off, this session affords us a welcome opportunity for consolidating our very substantial gains and to refining our goals.

It behooves us now to give careful consideration to the need to conserve all those elements that make Hawaii so special to us: a supremely beautiful setting, a talented and industrious people, and a location which, while it is very much a part of America, is linked in spirit and tradition to the many peoples of the Pacific and the Asian world.

I think we should bear in mind that our recent growth was based to a substantial extent upon the utilization of often irreplaceable capacities and resources.

We have used our land—its beauty and its fertility—and we have transformed much of our natural resources to bring new wealth to our citizens and to provide them the opportunities for advancement and self-development that they desire and deserve.

And, as always, with success have come new problems.

Industrial expansion and accelerated construction have produced not only wealth and the jobs necessary to sustain our economy, but a general concern rightly so over the attendant pollution of our air, our water, and our landscape.

Increased employment and rising incomes have put more motorists on our highways and brought the frustrations of

traffic congestion.

More people have brought greater needs for decent housing, especially for those of our citizens of more modest means.

With higher standards of living, we are presented with the need for more parks and recreational facilities. Affluence and greater leisure time have not been without their uglier ramifications. We have been exposed to this, too, in the form of more crime.

Thus, as we view the legislative requirements before us and look, as we must, to the years ahead, it is paramount that we give our earnest attention to means by which we can conserve and restore our natural and human treasure, the essential capital upon which our future growth depends.

Through our programs and policies, we must insure that our children inherit a land capable of sustaining a high quality of life as well as the knowledge, skills, and training for attaining even richer personal lives.

Where land whose beauty or fertility would enrich the lives of future generations is threatened by use of a more diminishing return, we must conserve it.

Where human talent is being wasted, we must offer means for retraining those who need new skills so that they may find meaningful opportunities for self-expression and attainment.

Where waste and unchecked pollution threaten to engulf land and people, we must take effective remedial action.

We can do no less for our land, our people, and future generations.

Working together, as we have done so successfully in the past, I am confident that we can develop effective means for the consolidation and conservation of our earlier accomplishments as a base upon which we can continue to build for tomorrow.

I suggest that in approaching the many inter-related questions before us, we plot our future course of action by taking a view divorced from any provincial

concerns.

Let us reaffirm that we are one State and that we are one people. Whether on Oahu, Kauai, Maui, or Hawaii County, we share a responsibility for one another.

To take the view that more than 80 per cent of our people live on Oahu and that therefore our efforts to improve the quality of life should be concentrated on this island is to beg the question.

To my mind, it can be actually more productive of a wider range of benefits to look at the attendant problems of urban congestion in a different light.

The Neighbor Islands comprise 93 per cent of our State's land area. Under our present population distribution, there are 24 persons per square mile on these islands, as compared with a density of more than 1,000 persons per square mile on Oahu.

This imbalance is really an opportunity to improve conditions throughout our State.

It is more urgent than ever that we broaden and stabilize our economic base across our Island chain.

In formulating public policy, therefore, I suggest a statewide perspective be taken in the allocation of our resources.

We have thus far done a more than commendable job in bringing the delivery of public services closer to the people throughout the State.

We must also remember that the placement of these services can be influential in attracting new planned units of population centers across our State.

Opportunities for effective application of this policy exist in a wide range of activities for which the State is responsible, particularly in the consideration of our many programs for institutional development.

Related to this is the need to retrain our labor force with new skills where necessary to meet the requirement of changing times; to diversify our agriculture in accordance with research and experimentation; and the

modification of land use patterns commensurate with desirable changes in our total Island lifestyle.

The larger view also dictates the course of our endeavors to improve the mobility of our people. Our readiness and willingness to further invest in a mass transit system for Oahu is a part of our view of a statewide transportation network.

Just as mass transit will impinge on residential patterns on Oahu and on the future personal habits of this island's citizens, so too will our actions on future resource allocations affect our overall population distribution, the patterns of family recreation, job opportunities and selection, and other related matters.

A broader view is also needed in the field of education, where we have been most liberal in budgeting decisions. It is particularly timely that we apply the ultimate test as to the value of our present school programs: are they benefitting the child?

Here, we can properly expect our professional educators to use their full creativity and their imagination so that maximum use is made of every authorization given to those responsible for our public school system.

New and better means of training our children to properly equip themselves in a changing society need not necessarily mean more expenditures. But where justified, we must continue to lend our full support to those endeavors which lead to the intellectual leavening of our most precious resource—our children.

In consolidating our goals in education, this is an opportune period to move toward the further refinement of career training offered at our University.

We have made great progress in strengthening those disciplines relating to studies particularly suited for Hawaii's unique geographic qualities. I suggest that our graduate programs will be given better direction by favorable consideration of proposals to develop a full medical school and a law school as a part of our University system.

Also deserving of our early attention is the need to modify our laws relating to

personal conduct. We seek, of course, only the highest possible ethical standards in government and in the public service generally.

Such standards are not always easy to agree upon in a community like ours when so many people, rightly and properly, are involved in so many activities, public and private.

But we should come to some agreement on a set of working principles which will secure the State and its people against violations of the public trust—violations that can be clearly defined for all to know and to understand.

We must also devise ways to make our laws more reflective of our cultural diversity and our pluralistic society, and thus more worthy of genuine respect by all our people. It is necessary, then, to eliminate the condition where the standards of one group form the basis of law which oppresses another, where activities which victimize none but are valid and valued customs are permitted, thus strengthening the commitment of all to all laws.

We cannot, however, tolerate the rising tempo of violent crime, and we must take those necessary steps to improve the effectiveness of our law enforcement agencies as well as our programs for the rehabilitation of lawbreakers.

These are but some of the many concerns to which we will be mutually addressing ourselves in the days and the weeks ahead.

I fully recognize that there are a multitude of specific elements, too numerous to cite here, that will require your careful scrutiny and study.

While the conditions today are not as they were in our earlier meetings together, our basic objective remains constant: to provide for all our people every opportunity for the full development of their rich and diverse talents, skills, and abilities. We seek this in a social environment that offers respect for the dignity of each individual and a physical environment of grace, beauty, and natural harmony.

To balance our total needs under the

fiscal projections before us is, I know, a difficult task.

Based, however, on the record of preceding Legislatures, we have every reason to expect that the session ahead will again be richly productive in sound programs and policies that will ultimately benefit all Hawaii and her people.

It was the philosopher George Santayana who posed the admonition that those who cannot remember the past are condemned to repeat it.

It is for us to wisely use the lessons of history as they bear on our decisions today and affect our destiny tomorrow.

We have new challenges before us.

We have fresh inspiration in a matchless setting.

We have people dedicated and devoted to the common wheel.

With God's help, we will move forward together toward our common goal—a more rewarding, a more abundant life for all of our people, a life of quality unsurpassed anywhere else in this world.

Mahalo and God Bless you.”

The Senate President then stated:

“Governor Burns, on behalf of the members of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, I wish to extend our thanks to you for meeting with us here today, presenting to us your State of the State message.

I believe, in listening to the presentation, the guidelines which you have established are quite clear and that we will be able, within the context of these, to scrutinize and study the specific matters, the specific measures that will be presented to us for consideration.

Again, our thanks to you.”

At 11:42 o'clock a.m., the joint session with the Senate adjourned and the House stood in recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

At 11:56 o'clock a.m., the House of Representatives reconvened.

At 11:58 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

### EVENING SESSION

The House of Representatives reconvened at 9:45 o'clock p.m.

Representative Beppu then stated:

“Before we adjourn tonight, Mr. Chairman and members of the House, I would suggest that we adjourn in the memory of a public servant who served in the Territorial government and the State government for over 15 years. He served in various capacities, as a Committee Clerk, Assistant Clerk and as Chief Clerk of the House and I am referring to the late Shigeto Kanemoto who passed away last summer. And, as I said in my eulogy, he was an uncommon man among common men who devoted much of his life in public service and other activities that benefitted our community. Mr. Chairman, I would request that we adjourn in his memory.

Thank you.”

The Temporary Chairman requested all members to stand for a minute of silence in memory of the late Shigeto Kanemoto.

At 9:56 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:00 o'clock a.m. tomorrow, January 22, 1971, in memory of the late Shigeto Kanemoto.

### 3RD DAY

Friday, January 22, 1971

The House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1971, was called to order at 11:00 o'clock a.m.

The Temporary Chairman presided.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by the Reverend Gary P. Colton of Our Lady of Good Counsel Church.

Roll call of the members of the House of Representatives showed that all members were present with the exception of Representative Unemori, who was excused.

The Temporary Clerk proceeded to read the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Second Day.

On motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, reading of the Journal was dispensed with and the Journal of the Second Day was approved.

The Chair declared a recess at 11:06 o'clock a.m., subject to the call of the

Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 11:40 o'clock a.m.

The Chair directed the Temporary Clerk to note the presence of Representative Unemori.

The Chair declared a recess at 11:41 o'clock a.m., subject to the call of the Chair.

#### AFTERNOON SESSION

The House of Representatives reconvened at 4:52 o'clock p.m.

The Chair declared a recess at 4:53 o'clock p.m., subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 11:58 o'clock p.m.

At 11:59 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative Wakatsuki and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:00 o'clock a.m., on Monday, January 25, 1971.



## 4TH DAY

Monday, January 25, 1971

The House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1971, was called to order at 11:00 o'clock a.m.

The Temporary Chairman presided.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by The Reverend Doctor Paul Wheeler of St. Clement's Episcopal Church.

Roll call of the members of the House of Representatives showed that all members were present.

The Temporary Clerk proceeded to read the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Third Day.

On motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, reading of the Journal was dispensed with and the Journal of the Third Day was approved.

At 11:07 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

### EVENING SESSION

The House of Representatives reconvened at 5:20 o'clock p.m.

### INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

A resolution (H. R. No. 3) providing rules for the House of Representatives was offered by Representative O'Connor and was read by the Temporary Clerk.

Representative O'Connor moved that H. R. No. 3 be adopted, seconded by Representative Kimura.

On request by Representative Kato, the Chair declared a recess at 5:22 o'clock p.m.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 8:14 o'clock p.m.

Representative Kato then offered the following amendment:

#### "PART II

The Standing Committees, their duties and functions, shall be as follows:

### R U L E 5 1 . G E N E R A L R E S P O N S I B I L I T I E S O F S T A N D I N G C O M M I T T E E S

It shall be the duty of each standing committee to systematically review those portions of the State budget relating to the programs over which it has responsibility and to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions and matters relating to such programs or as may properly come before it.

Each committee shall concern itself with those portions of the State budget and the General and Supplemental Appropriations Bills as may relate to the programs over which it has responsibility, and shall recommend to the Standing Committee of Finance the programs and amounts to be spent thereon which, when taken as a whole, will be consistent with and within the expenditure amounts allocated by the Committee on Finance. On other bills referred to it by the House, it shall, after determination of the objectives of the bills, make appropriate recommendations, including, if proper, expenditure recommendations. Such expenditure recommendations shall be consistent with the allocations established by the Standing Committee on Finance. On bills which relate to programs over which the Standing Committee to which they are referred has no direct responsibility, the Standing Committee shall make no recommendation which alters the intent, purposes and program recommendations determined by the standing committee which has the primary responsibility over such programs unless the approval of the chairman of such primary committee is first obtained.

It shall further be the duty of each standing committee to review how programs over which it has responsibility have been carried out in compliance with legislative direction and whether studies, analysis and audit should be conducted on all or part of the program in order to define issues and recommend improvements. Each standing committee shall also recommend amendments to existing appropriation acts and may further recommend revenue measures and improvements to the State's planning, programming, budgeting system to the Standing Committee on Finance.

In every case in this rule where a

standing committee makes a recommendation to the Standing Committee on Finance, the latter shall make the final recommendation to the House. However, in making its final recommendation, the Committee on Finance shall not, without the prior concurrence of the chairman of the standing committee having primary responsibility, alter the intent, purposes and program recommendation of the standing committee having primary responsibility for a bill.

#### RULE 52. COMMITTEE ON AGRICULTURE

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Agriculture, unless otherwise directed by the House, to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions, matters, and those portions of the budget relating to agriculture programs and other matters referred to it by the House.

#### RULE 53. COMMITTEE ON FINANCE

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Finance to consider the reports of the finance officers of the State, and all bills, petitions, resolutions and matters relating to revenues and proposed expenditures referred to it by the House and to report thereon. Programs involving financial policies to be adopted by the State, including taxation and other methods of revenue raising, debt and cash management and the proper implementation on a statewide basis of planning, programming, budgeting system (PPBS) and the evaluation thereof, shall be within the jurisdiction of this committee. The Committee, however, shall not make a final recommendation to the House until it considers the reports and recommendations of the other standing committees as provided in Rule 51.

The Committee on Finance shall establish, within the revenue raising ability of the state, the general level of total governmental expenditures for each fiscal year of a biennial period and allocate to each standing committee a proportionate part of such expenditures. Each standing committee shall be responsible for budget review of programs in the areas of its respective responsibilities and in making recommendations for program expenditures to the Committee on

Finance. In receiving the recommendations of the other standing committees, the Committee on Finance shall review the same to determine if, when taken as a whole, the programs and amounts to be expended thereon are consistent with and within the expenditure amounts it has allocated to the respective standing committees. In making allocations to and in reviewing recommendations in any program area, the Committee on Finance shall invite the participation of the chairman of the standing committee having primary responsibility over the program. After review of all standing committee recommendations, the Committee on Finance shall be responsible for preparing General and Supplemental Appropriations Bills for consideration by the House.

The Committee on Finance shall inform the Committee on Federal, State and County Relations of the amount and type of finances available for the General Improvements Bill, including amounts for capital improvements other than amounts included in the General or Supplemental Appropriations Bills. Upon receiving recommendations for capital expenditures from the Committee on Federal, State and County Relations, it shall review the same to determine if, when taken as a whole, the capital improvement projects and amounts to be expended thereon are consistent with and within the expenditure amounts allocated.

In all other appropriation bills, the Committee on Finance shall inform the standing committee responsible for the program area under consideration, of the amount and type of finances available. Upon receiving recommendations for expenditures from the appropriate standing committee, it shall review the same to determine if, when taken as a whole, the programs and amounts to be expended thereon are consistent with and within the expenditure amounts allocated. In reviewing recommendations of the standing committees, the Committee on Finance shall invite the participation of the standing committee chairman concerned.

#### RULE 54. COMMITTEE ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

It shall be the duty of the Committee

on Economic Development, unless otherwise directed by the House, to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions, matters and those portions of the budget relating to programs for the development and promotion of the economy and industry (except those programs directly related to tourism, land development, and agriculture) and other pertinent matters referred to it by the House.

#### RULE 55. COMMITTEE ON EDUCATION

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Education, unless otherwise directed by the House, to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions, matters and those portions of the budget relating to programs for lower education, continuing education (except the continuing education programs of the University of Hawaii), public libraries, and cultural enrichment and other pertinent matters referred to it by the House.

#### RULE 56. COMMITTEE ON GOVERNMENT EFFICIENCY AND PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Government Efficiency and Public Employment, unless otherwise directed by the House, to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions, matters and those portions of the budget relating to programs for government efficiency, government support services, public employee recruitment, classification pay and benefits, and public employment conditions and other pertinent matters referred to it by the House.

#### RULE 57. COMMITTEE ON FEDERAL, STATE AND COUNTY RELATIONS

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Federal, State and County Relations to consider and recommend to the Committee on Finance the General Improvements Bill, including amounts for capital improvements other than those included in the General or Supplemental Appropriations Bills. The Committee shall also consider all bills, petitions, resolutions and matters of particular concern to the counties or relating to relations between the Federal, State or County governments as may be referred to it by the House and to report from time to time its opinions and recommendations thereon. The

Committee shall also inquire into the state of Federal Grant Programs, the availability of Federal funds to the State and Counties, and the State Grants-in-Aid Program.

#### RULE 58. COMMITTEE ON HARBORS, AIRPORTS AND TRANSPORTATION

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Harbors, Airports and Transportation, unless otherwise directed by the House, to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions, matters and those portions of the budget relating to programs for air, water and land transportation and other pertinent matters referred to it by the House.

#### RULE 59. COMMITTEE ON HAWAIIAN HOMES

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Hawaiian Homes, unless otherwise directed by the House, to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions, matters and those portions of the budget relating to programs for Hawaiian Homes and Hawaiian Home Lands and other pertinent matters referred to it by the House.

#### RULE 60. COMMITTEE ON HIGHER EDUCATION

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Higher Education, unless otherwise directed by the House, to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions, matters and those portions of the budget relating to programs for the University of Hawaii (except those programs directly related to the Legislative Reference Bureau and the Economic Research Center) and other pertinent matters referred to it by the House.

#### RULE 61. COMMITTEE ON HOUSING AND CONSUMER PROTECTION

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Housing and Consumer Protection, unless otherwise directed by the House, to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions, matters and those portions of the budget relating to programs for housing, consumer protection, and the regulation of trade, business, professions and occupations (except programs directly related to the Public Utilities Commission) and other pertinent matters referred to it by the House.

**RULE 62. COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY**

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Judiciary, unless otherwise directed by the House, to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions and matters relating to judicial questions, the Rules of the House, those portions of the budget relating to programs of the Attorney General and of the Judiciary (except programs directly related to the Revisor of Statutes) and other pertinent matters referred to it by the House. In the event of a contest, it shall investigate and report upon the certificates of election of members. The Committee shall consider all petitions and other matters relating to elections and returns referred to it by the House and report thereon.

**RULE 63. COMMITTEE ON LABOR AND EMPLOYMENT PROBLEMS**

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Labor and Employment Problems, unless otherwise directed by the House, to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions, matters and those portions of the budget relating to programs for labor, employment and labor-management relations and other pertinent matters referred to it by the House.

**RULE 64. COMMITTEE ON LANDS**

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Lands, unless otherwise directed by the House, to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions, matters, and those portions of the budget relating to programs for the use, development and protection of land and water resources, environmental quality, environmental health, outdoor recreation, State parks and historic sites.

**RULE 65. COMMITTEE ON LEGISLATIVE MANAGEMENT**

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Legislative Management to audit and settle all accounts which may be charged to the House and its individual members, and in general, to oversee the administrative operations of the House. The Committee shall be responsible for all expenditures made by the House and shall submit detailed monthly reports of said expenditures to all of the members of the House throughout its term of office. It shall from time to time direct

the Clerk to draw drafts on the treasury for the payment of expenses of the House.

The Committee shall make recommendations on the expenses to be included in the appropriation bills providing for the expenses of the legislature, and it shall be charged with the responsibility of insuring that the expenses of the House are in accordance with the appropriation acts providing therefor.

The Committee shall regularly report to the House in accordance with data supplied by the Manager of the Print Shop, the numbers and amounts of the various bills, resolutions and other documents printed in the Print Shop. It shall also periodically report on the amounts of materials used by the Print Shop and the costs of such materials.

The Committee shall make recommendations to the House as to improvements in printing procedures, and as to ways in which the Print Shop may be more efficiently operated.

When directed by the House, the committee shall procure cost estimates as to commercial printing of various documents and report its findings.

It shall also be the duty of the Committee on Legislative Management to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions, matters and those portions of the budget relating to programs to support the accomplishment of legislative goals, including the dissemination of information on legislative process and the establishment and operations of legislative staff agencies such as the Legislative Reference Bureau and the Economic Research Center of the University of Hawaii, the Revisor of Statutes, the office of the Legislative Auditor and the Ombudsman, and other pertinent matters referred to it by the House.

**RULE 66. COMMITTEE ON HEALTH, YOUTH AND AGED**

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Health, Youth and Aged, unless otherwise directed by the House, to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions, matters, and those portions of the budget

relating to programs for the promotion of the physical and mental health of the people of the State and for the well-being of youth and aged, and other pertinent matters referred to it by the House.

**RULE 67. COMMITTEE ON CORRECTIONS AND SOCIAL SERVICES**

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Corrections and Social Services, unless otherwise directed by the House, to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions, matters and those portions of the budget relating to programs for corrections, rehabilitation, financial assistance, vocational rehabilitation and social welfare services, and other pertinent matters referred to it by the House.

**RULE 68. COMMITTEE ON PUBLIC UTILITIES**

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Public Utilities, unless otherwise directed by the House, to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions, matters and those portions of the budget relating to programs for public utilities regulation and other pertinent matters referred to it by the House.

**RULE 69. COMMITTEE ON TOURISM**

It shall be the duty of the Committee on Tourism, unless otherwise directed by the House, to consider all bills, petitions, resolutions, matters and those portions of the budget relating to the development and regulation of the tourist industry and other pertinent matters referred to it by the House.

**RULE 70. SELECT COMMITTEE OF HAWAII REPRESENTATIVES**

The Select Committee of Hawaii Representatives shall consist of all the elected House members from the County of Hawaii. It shall be the duty of the Select Committee of Hawaii Representatives to consider all special laws, bills, resolutions, petitions and other pertinent matters of primary concern to the County of Hawaii as may be referred to it by the House.

**RULE 71. SELECT COMMITTEE OF KAUAI REPRESENTATIVES**

The Select Committee of Kauai

Representatives shall consist of all of the elected House members from the County of Kauai. It shall be the duty of the Select Committee of Kauai Representatives to consider all special laws, bills, resolutions, petitions and other pertinent matters of primary concern to the County of Kauai as may be referred to it by the House.

**RULE 72. SELECT COMMITTEE OF MAUI REPRESENTATIVES**

The Select Committee of Maui Representatives shall consist of all of the elected House members from the County of Maui. It shall be the duty of the Select Committee of Maui Representatives to consider all special laws, bills, resolutions, petitions and other pertinent matters of primary concern to the County of Maui as may be referred to it by the House.

**RULE 73. SELECT COMMITTEE OF OAHU REPRESENTATIVES**

The Select Committee of Oahu Representatives shall consist of at least one member from each of the Representative Districts of the City and County of Honolulu. It shall be the duty of the Select Committee of Oahu Representatives to consider all special laws, bills, resolutions, petitions and other pertinent matters of primary concern to the City and County of Honolulu as may be referred to it by the House.

**RULE 74.**

Notwithstanding the number of members assigned to the Committees, the House, by resolution, may change the number of members assigned to any committee.

**RULE 75.**

The Official Rules of Procedure Adopted by the House of Representatives, State of Hawaii, Sixth State Legislature, as set forth above, shall remain in effect until superseded by the Rules of the House of the Seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii; provided, that the Rules may be amended by a majority of the members to which the House is entitled.”

Representative Uechi then explained the amendment as follows:

“Mr. Chairman, the major thrust of this amendment as introduced is to implement, insofar as possible, the planning, programming and budgeting system into the structure and organization of this House.

The proposed rules set out clear lines of responsibility for Standing Committees including a systematic review of those matters relating to revenues and proposed expenditures in the respective area of responsibility. The Committees are given the responsibility to recommend to the Committee on Finance the programs and amounts to be spent which will be consistent with the expenditure amounts allotted by the Finance Committee. It is also made clear that the recommendations by any Standing Committees on bills not directly in the area of responsibility shall not alter the intent, purposes and program recommendations of the Standing Committees having the primary responsibility unless the approval of the Chairman of such Committee is first obtained.

Primary Committee is defined as that Committee whose area of responsibility is most closely related to the subject matter of the bill. The Committee shall, under this amendment, also have the duty to see that the programs have been carried out in accordance with the legislative mandate.

The Finance Committee, under this amendment, shall make all final recommendations to the House. However, such recommendations shall not include any changes in the intent, purposes or program recommendations of the Committee having the primary responsibility for the bill without the prior concurrence of the Chairman of the Committee.”

Representative Uechi stated that the Department of Education, as well as two other agencies, were mandated by this Body to integrate the PPB System into their biennial budget. He stated further that the Senate reorganized under this budget format and that unless the House adopted PPBS, the Senate and House will be operating on different approaches to the budgets.

Thereupon, he urged the members to support the proposed amendment.

Representative O'Connor spoke against the adoption of the amendment.

Following discussion of the amendment by Representatives Kato and Beppu, Representatives Roehrig and Kunimura spoke against the amendment and Representatives Takamine and Iha spoke in support thereof.

Representative Takamine then requested a roll call vote. The Chair requested a show of hands, and upon failure of a sufficient number, ruled that the request is denied.

The motion to adopt the amendment was put by the Chair and failed to carry.

Representative Kato rose on a point of information and inquired of the movant whether or not he would yield to a series of questions, to which Representative O'Connor replied in the affirmative.

Representative Kato then inquired as follows:

“Under Rule 1 of the proposed rules, will the election of the Speaker, Vice Speaker, Majority Leader, Majority Floor Leader, Minority Leader and Minority Floor Leader be combined into one resolution?”

Representative O'Connor stated that the document speaks for itself.

Representative Kato then requested a short recess and the Chair declared a recess at 8:45 o'clock p.m.

At 8:47 o'clock p.m., the House of Representatives reconvened.

Representative Kato, continuing on his point of information inquired whether or not the movant had a set of rules ready for introduction on opening day that differed with the proposed set of rules on the Temporary Clerk's desk.

Representative O'Connor replied that there were several versions of the rules which were ready for submission on opening day by way of a resolution.

Representative Kato then inquired whether or not Rule 1 was the same or if the language had been changed.

Representative O'Connor replied that



the language was changed in some instances.

Representative Kato then questioned whether or not the changes were proposed by the Republican minority.

Representative O'Connor replied that the changes which are incorporated in the document presented were the work of the majority of the majority of this Honorable Body and that he, as the movant, prepared the document.

At 8:49 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

Upon reconvening at 8:50 o'clock p.m., the Temporary Chairman recognized Representative Kato.

Representative Kato then stated that he would proceed to Rule 28 and inquired whether or not the movant would yield to a question to which Representative O'Connor replied in the affirmative.

Representative Kato then inquired whether the rules under consideration required a 2/3 vote of the members present in the House at the time a motion is made to carry a motion for the previous question.

Representative O'Connor replied in the affirmative.

Representative Kato then inquired whether the 1970 Rules of the House required a majority vote.

Representative O'Connor replied in the affirmative.

Representative Kato then inquired whether or not the issue at hand was made a part of the original rules of procedures.

At this point, Representative O'Connor, on a point of inquiry, inquired if the question was germane to the issues before the House.

Representative Kato then inquired whether this change to Rule 28 was similar to a Republican proposal.

Representative O'Connor replied in the affirmative.

At this point, the Chair stated that there is nothing concerning the Republican's rule on the table and ruled the question out of order.

Representative Kato then directed the attention of the movant to Rule 45 and inquired whether a 2/3 vote is necessary to change the rules.

Representative O'Connor replied in the affirmative.

Representative Kato further inquired whether or not the original rules called for a majority vote.

Representative O'Connor replied that he was not sure which original rules Representative Kato was seeking to have answered.

The Chair replied that it was the 1970 rules.

Representative O'Connor then replied in the affirmative.

Representative Kato further inquired whether the same situation applies to Rule 46 insofar as the voting requirement for carrying a motion is concerned.

Representative O'Connor replied in the affirmative and stated that Rule 46 is different from the 1970 rules.

Representative Kato further questioned if this was also true for Rule 75 to which Representative O'Connor replied in the affirmative.

Representative Kato then spoke against the adoption of the resolution.

Representative Aduja then spoke in favor of the resolution and Representative Uechi spoke against the adoption of the resolution.

At this time, Representative Beppu, on a point of personal privilege, stated:

"Mr. Chairman, on a point made by the Representative from the 19th district, it is true that I made a statement that a caucus on the rules be held. The caucus was held. In fact, numerous caucuses were held and any Democrat who was interested in the rules would have been very welcome.

Mr. Chairman, we had three or four variations of the rules prepared for opening day. I don't think it is fair to say that we had one set of rules to work with. The previous speaker spoke about a total rejection of the rules proposed by him or his group. May I state for the record that the acceptance of the rules as proposed by his group was part of a package in which there were about 12 items, including the rules of the House. Since the majority group rejected the rules, or part of the rules as proposed by his group, under his terms, the entire package was out."

Roll call having been demanded, H. R. No. 3 providing rules for the House of Representatives and offered by Representative O'Connor was put by the Chair and carried by a vote of 39 ayes to 12 noes, with Representatives de la Cruz, Duponte, Iha, Kaneshiro, Kato, Kondo, Lee, Nakama, Takamine, Uechi, Unemori and Wasai voting no.

At 9:16 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative Wakatsuki and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:00 o'clock a.m. Tuesday, January 26, 1971.



## 5TH DAY

**Tuesday, January 26, 1971**

The House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1971, was called to order at 11:00 o'clock a.m.

The Temporary Chairman presided.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by the Reverend Doctor Sung Whai Kim, of the Palolo United Methodist Church.

Roll call of the members of the House of Representatives showed that all members were present with the exception of Representatives Carroll and Wakatsuki, who were excused.

The Temporary Clerk proceeded to read the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Fourth Day.

A resolution (H. R. No. 4) declaring the Honorable Tadao Beppu, Representative from the Tenth District, and the Honorable Pedro de la Cruz, Representative from the Sixth District, to be duly elected Speaker and Vice Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature, respectively, was offered by Representative Wakatsuki.

A resolution (H. R. No. 5) providing for the election of George M. Takane as Chief Clerk and Stephen C. Lee as Sergeant at Arms was offered by Representative Beppu.

A resolution (H. R. No. 6) naming the membership, chairmanship and vice chairmanship of the Standing Committees of the House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1971, was offered by Representative Wakatsuki.

A resolution (H. R. No. 7) amending the Rules of Procedure of the House of Representatives and designating the House leadership and Committee Chairmen was jointly offered by Representatives Kato, Uechi, Iha, Lee, Duponte, Takamine, Wasai, Nakama and Kaneshiro.

The Chair here directed the Temporary Clerk to note that H. R. No. 7 was offered at 11:15 o'clock a.m.

At 11:25 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

## AFTERNOON SESSION

The House of Representatives reconvened at 5:13 o'clock p.m.

At 5:15 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

At 5:59 o'clock p.m., the House of Representatives reconvened.

## DEFERRED RESOLUTIONS

The following resolutions (H. R. Nos. 4 to 7) were disposed of as follows:

H. R. No. 4 was read by the Temporary Clerk.

Representative Wakatsuki then moved that H. R. No. 4 be adopted, seconded by Representative Ushijima.

Representatives Wakatsuki and J. Garcia then spoke in support of the resolution and Representatives Takamine and Kato spoke against the adoption of the resolution.

Roll call having been demanded, the motion to adopt H. R. No. 4 was put by the Chair and carried by a vote of 40 ayes to 11 noes, with Representatives Duponte, Iha, Kaneshiro, Kato, Kondo, Lee, Nakama, Takamine, Uechi, Unemori and Wasai voting no.

The Temporary Chairman then appointed Representatives Wakatsuki, Ushijima, Soares and J. Garcia as a Committee to escort the newly elected Speaker to the rostrum.

At 6:20 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

At 6:21 o'clock p.m., the House of Representatives reconvened.

Escorted by the aforesaid Committee, the Speaker took the Chair and thereupon addressed the members of the House as follows:

“Members of the House of Representatives, Ladies and Gentlemen:

We have all gone through a trying ten days—a time when we had so many of our strengths and weaknesses tested. It has been a difficult time, I'm sure, especially for our new House members. As one of them remarked to me, they certainly did not anticipate a 'baptism by fire' when they got elected to serve in the State House of Representatives. This experience is part of the learning process. This is part of the process of acquiring the knowledge we must have to do our jobs. We must all constantly be seekers of knowledge—seekers of new experiences, new thoughts, new ideas. We must know

more than the lobbyists, more than the pressure groups, and more than the media. I think this is only proper because this is our responsibility.

I think we have all learned a great deal from these past few days, both the new House members and the veterans, both Democrats and Republicans. I would also like to point out that what all of us have learned is not or should not be considered a negative experience. It is not the first time competing forces have struggled over the organization of any legislative body nor will it be the last time. However, I am deeply pleased that we have been able to organize and can now pull together our collective resources and talents to work for the attainment of a good life for all of us here in Hawaii. We must chart our course wisely and establish just and proper objectives in the attainment of this goal.

I want to pause here for a moment to personally thank all the members of the House for this organization which finally became a reality. I thank the members of the House, whatever their inclination, position or persuasion.

I would like to mention the important role of the Minority. I appreciate the patience and understanding they've displayed over the past ten days for some of the problems we've had in this particular House of 51 members. The Minority certainly served as an important catalyst in the final organization. And, during the course of the session, I expect the Minority, as Representative Joseph Garcia aptly put it, 'to act as the loyal opposition.'

At this time, the Chair would also like to recognize the fine work done by Representative Jack Suwa as the Temporary Chairman of the House of Representatives. The Chair recognizes that this is the 7th consecutive legislative session that Representative Jack Suwa has served as either the Temporary Chairman or the Chairman for the opening day of the session and I want to say that he is getting better at every turn.

We have already made a beginning this session notwithstanding the unforeseen delay in the organization of the House. We have shared, most of us, the same determination to work hard to make this session a productive one. We have started

much of our work as early as December of last year and have continued to do the work we have scheduled for accomplishment up to the present time.

The Finance Committee has held a number of meetings in early December of last year to review the State's financial position and to study and discuss the application of system management techniques and concepts to the budget presentation and review processes. It has subsequently applied the knowledge gained in this area to the operating budget hearings begun in early January and scheduled for completion in early February.

The Judiciary Committee Chairman and his staff began working on the proposed revision of the penal code in December. The Committee has held a number of meetings and public hearings on the penal code revision and the Judiciary's budget.

The Education Committee has held meetings with classroom teachers from various schools to obtain their views and recommendations on improving our educational system. The Committee also met with members of the Honolulu Police Department regarding drug problems.

The chairmen of most of the other committees have been doing preliminary work on subjects within the areas of concern of their respective committees since December.

I would also like to personally commend all of the committee chairmen, the committee members and the staff of the House who continued to work during the period when negotiations to organize the House were being conducted.

Meetings and budget hearings were held by the Committee on Public Institutions on the Department of Social Services' operating budget; by the Lands Committee on the Department of Land and Natural Resources' operating budget; by the Higher Education Committee on the University's operating budget; by the Agriculture Committee on the Department of Agriculture's operating budget, and by the Housing and Consumer Protection Committee on the Hawaii Housing Authority's budget and the Office of Consumer Protection's budget.

Even with all of these things having been completed, we must now follow through and work even harder toward the accomplishment of our objectives. And in doing so, we must recognize that in dealing with the challenges of the 70's—the pressures and the problems which rapid and revolutionary technology and social changes have brought forth—the states must assert themselves. The states no longer have the option to choose whether they want to assume the responsibility and become involved; nor does the Federal government have the option to choose whether it will involve the states, if we are to solve the problems facing us today. One of our largest responsibilities is the task of making sure that our State government is effectively coping with the rapid rate of technical, social and economic changes in our contemporary times.

While we simply do not have enough resources to meet all of our needs at the same time, we should be able to choose intelligently what will be sacrificed in one area in order to provide for the satisfaction of more urban and desirable needs in another area. Only in this way—in understanding how much can be done, how best it can be done, at what rate it can be done, and at what cost—can we hope to utilize our resources in a manner to produce the most good. This is what we must all bring to bear in the critical examination of the proposals and programs which lie before us in the next few months.

We who are called upon to legislate must legislate wisely and well. We must live up to the community's expectations of full and valuable service. We have access to expert researchers, staff assistance and the scientific problem-solving techniques appropriate to an era in which man's technology has made possible giant steps toward opening the secrets of nature and space.

We, too, must take giant steps to provide for such things as the following:

First, the maintenance of a viable economy with a reach broad enough to include every member of society as a beneficiary;

Second, we must strike an intelligent balance between cement progress and the preservation of nature's resources;



Third, we must provide the opportunity for each individual to obtain the best possible education;

Fourth, we must help to stem the rising cost of living;

Fifth, we must assure the best possible health care for the people;

Sixth, we must be dedicated to the premise that all laws enacted to protect our citizens must be fair, just and enlightened;

Seventh, we must demand a social order in which law and justice prevail;

Finally, we must be sure that in our attempts to do all these things, we ensure that the public receives full value for the tax dollars being spent and that the costs of our public programs be borne as equally as possible by all segments of the public in relation to their ability to so contribute. Within this context, I do not foresee any raise in taxes this session except possibly in the area of taxes to meet our highway needs.

These objectives constitute the basis of our House Majority Legislative Program which will be introduced within a few days. The attainment of these objectives is possible in our political system. We, in this House, can dedicate ourselves to this attainment—to the laying of a strong foundation for the building of our future.

Public leadership means a great deal more than the ability to win elections or to hold a prestigious and powerful position. It means a lot of learning. It means a lot of difficult work. We must learn and we must lead with bold new solutions to cope with the challenges of the 70's.

Members of the House, I am proud to be among you and look forward to meeting the challenges with you.

Thank you very much."

Representative Wakatsuki moved that H. R. No. 6 be adopted, seconded by Representative Ushijima.

At 6:35 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

Upon reconvening at 6:37 o'clock p.m., Representatives Takamine and Iha spoke against the adoption of the resolution and Representative O'Connor spoke in support thereof.

Roll call having been demanded, the motion to adopt H. R. No. 6 was put by the Chair and carried by a vote of 39 ayes to 12 noes, with Representatives de la Cruz, Duponte, Iha, Kaneshiro, Kato, Kondo, Lee, Nakama, Takamine, Uechi, Unemori and Wasai voting no.

H. R. No. 7 was placed on the Temporary Clerk's desk.

At 6:55 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

At 6:58 o'clock p.m., the House of Representatives reconvened.

Representative Kato rose on a point of personal privilege and stated his position as to what he sensed had occurred in the adoption of H. R. No. 6 and the consequences which will follow as a result of the action taken by the House on this resolution.

Representative J. Garcia also rose on a point of personal privilege and replied to the position taken by Representative

Kato on the adoption of H. R. No. 6.

Representative Ushijima, on a point of personal privilege, stated as follows:

“First, we must help formulate State policies and programs by playing an independent part in proposing, considering and enacting legislation. Second, we must appropriate funds for State government and programs, keeping in mind that it is not the dollars to be spent by government, but the results to be achieved, which should guide us. Third, we shall review State administration to make sure that the laws are accomplishing what the legislature intended. And finally, each of us as

legislators has the continuing responsibility of representing our citizens—expressing their interests, answering their requests, and keeping them informed.”

Representative Soares then rose on a point of personal privilege and expressed the role that the House Republicans will be assuming during the legislative session.

At 7:10 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:00 o'clock a.m. Wednesday, February 3, 1971.

## 11TH DAY

Wednesday, February 3, 1971

The House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1971, was called to order at 11:00 o'clock a.m.

The Speaker presided.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by The Reverend James E. Long of the Waikiki Episcopal Chapel.

Roll call of the members of the House of Representatives showed that all members were present.

The Temporary Clerk proceeded to read the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Tenth Day.

On motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, reading of the Journal was dispensed with and the Journal of the Tenth Day was approved.

### SENATE COMMUNICATIONS

The following communications from the Senate (Sen. Com. Nos. 1 and 2) were read by the Temporary Clerk and were disposed of as follows:

A communication from the Senate (Sen. Com. No. 1) informing the House that the Senate of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1971 assembled, had been duly organized and was prepared to transact business with the following officers: David C. McClung, President; John T. Ushijima, Vice-President; Seichi Hirai, Clerk; George Amimoto, Assistant Clerk; and Harvey Kimura, Sergeant at Arms, was placed on file.

A communication from the Senate (Sen. Com. No. 2) transmitting Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 7 in memoriam Jack W. Hall was placed on file.

Representative Takamine moved that S. C. R. No. 7 be adopted, seconded by Representative Judd.

Representative Takamine requested that the following eulogy of Jack W. Hall, written by Mr. Louis Goldblatt, of the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's Union, be inserted in the

Journal.

"Governor Burns, the family of Jack Hall, Brothers and Sisters and Friends. Eulogies are difficult under any circumstances and close to impossible under these—saying goodbye to a dear friend, a fighting comrade, a man who did so much to reshape Hawaii and to cut new ground for the labor movement.

The recounting of his work and specific contributions to the reconstruction of Hawaii has been told in the press. Perhaps in such detail that Jack would have found it quite embarrassing. It has been good coverage—honest—by newsmen who saw themselves as union brothers as well as craftsmen in their trade.

But there are things that they would not and could not know. One would have to have been close enough to Jack, both in his work and in personal relations to see him at moments of decisive action and immediate decision; to watch his reactions under extreme stress. And see him as well at times of relaxation with his family and close friends.

Let me talk a bit about this. Jack was one of the finest sons of the working class. He was cast from the same mold as Bill Haywood, Eugene Debs and John L. Lewis. His formal education ended with high school but his learning didn't stop there. He was self-taught, an omnivorous reader with a breadth of interest in almost every subject under the sun.

The day he went to sea he knew that his lot was the lot of the working man and never was there a breach in his thinking. He had an abiding faith and confidence in the power of men and women who labor for a living to form and run their organizations, determine their own destinies and be a decisive power for change and progress.

This became the story of his life—early strike experiences in the great maritime strike of 1934, continuing at sea and volunteering to lend a hand in the organization of Hawaii. He recognized early the fact that unions built along racial lines, which had been part of the background of Hawaii's many unsuccessful attempts to organize the plantations, was doomed to failure; that only in racial unity and industrial unity

was there the strength to shake loose of the feudalism and paternalism which for so many years had held Hawaii workers in a tight-fisted grip.

World War II broke into his efforts but in 1944 the drive was resumed under the banner of the ILWU with Jack as Regional Director. The rest of the story is one with which all of you are familiar. It was a rough go—the organizational drives, the sugar strike in 1946—the first successful one in Hawaii. The pineapple lockout and its setback in 1947 and the painful job of rebuilding that followed. The 1949 longshore strike where the full power of the Territorial and Federal governments, and self-appointed civic and community groups combined against the strikers; the Lanai strike in 1951 and the final re-grouping of the pineapple workers in industry bargaining as part of the outcome of the strike; all parts of a bigger picture.

Basically, it was the building of a union; fighting off attempts to split and dismember it—reshaping the organization into a single homogenous local; taking on the impact of expulsion from the CIO and facing the slings and arrows of what for many years was a quite hostile community. These are the times you get to know a man.

Certain things stand out in your mind. Jack's love of music for one. He had a great collection of records—long hair, short hair and no hair. It was something to watch him come home after some of the seemingly endless meetings, put on one of his favorite records, pull up a chair and just about bury his head in the loudspeaker. You could almost see the music folding over him, blanketing out the tensions of the day. How happy he was when we managed to arrange for Paul Robeson to come to Hawaii on a singing tour. And like so many of the other new and different things done by the ILWU in Hawaii, Paul Robeson became the first concert artist to sing in plantation communities such as Honokaa, Pahala and Wahiawa.

The home he kept—he and Yoshiko, warm and gracious hosts with their love of people. Whether he was living in Manoa Valley, down at the beach or up on Paula Drive, his house was like a trade union USO. Jack loved to cook—the larger the gathering the better. And like

most good male cooks, he did his share of basting—both of what he was cooking and naturally, basting himself on the inside. While many of us didn't have the talent to join him in the cooking, we at least helped on the other basting. True, in many cases it was a long time before the meal was ready. I still wonder at the resilience of children when I think back on how Mikey and Eric stood the flow of people through Jack and Yoshiko's home. The fact that they survived it is the true test of their love for humanity not always in its best shape.

It was not uncommon for some of these evenings at the Hall home to wind up in a game of poker. I realize that gambling is very uncommon here in Hawaii, still I must admit that many of our members are victim to the vice, although Jack had little patience for some of the poker that is played here such as railroad, big V, small V, kiss-kiss, touch-touch and 3-2. But let it be a game of table stakes and Jack was ready and willing and at his best. There again, that was Jack. Poker that was built on just endurance and manipulation of money held no interest. Table stakes where you bet everything in front of you was another story.

His humor, much of it at his own expense, was part of his love of life and people. He liked a good story—he was an important agent in the moccasin telegraph that carried stories from the mainland to Hawaii and back again.

These faculties helped Jack take things in stride. Reading and music, cooking and friends; philosophy of drink up, talk story and a warm sense of humor. None of it interfered with a phenomenal capacity for work, the careful study of the industry with which we dealt, and the fantastic attention to detail. It was a mighty rare thing for something to get lost in the shuffle, or for Jack's notes and minutes of bargaining sessions to omit anything of importance. Our library, such an important part of the ILWU, was merely a supplement to his memory.

Jack would never cop out, no matter what the pressures. When he was indicted under the Smith Act, an indictment which came about not only because of the McCarthy era which was plaguing the country but because of the unending campaign of vitriol against the ILWU here

in Hawaii—he didn't lose his cool. He refused to succumb to the pressures or blandishments of the government. When government agents indicated to some of our staff people that if Jack were cooperative, the number of those indicted under the Smith Act would be 6 instead of 7, he paid it no never mind, instead he took their effort to recruit him as a party to the frame-up, turned it around and used it to expose the frame-up itself.

His relations with people were right on. If he was tight with you, you knew it; you didn't have to question it or look over your shoulder. There was nothing one sided in his friendship nor was it based on kowtowing or yessing. If there were disagreements, they were on the merits. It didn't interfere with personal friendship.

Jack and Governor Burns were close friends, although many a time they didn't see eye-to-eye on important issues. The friendship grew out of mutual respect. It was a warm thing to watch Jack's relationship with the people with whom he worked, the members and the many people who were part of the trade union crusade. Never condescending, never patronizing.

He reveled in the diversity, beauty and contributions of all people, whether it be in their conversation, their particular brand of humor, their music or their dance.

Jack was good for Hawaii; Hawaii was good for Jack.

It is lucky the way historical necessity and the necessary men hook up together. He was a man who had the ability and dedication to do a job that had to be done. And the challenge itself gave him a chance to do it. He helped turn Hawaii around—a new life came to the people of Hawaii and more important than anything else there came with it the dignity of man that can be built only by self-organization and getting a grip on one's own destiny. It was part of Jack's greatness that he never felt self-important. He knew he was part of a great movement, made possible by the intelligence, courage, and work of thousands, each giving something. They enabled Jack to give his best. And as the union grew and prospered, in large part because of Jack's guidance, it became

more and more an important part of the life of the community. Members were encouraged to lend their time and talents in the fields of education, housing, and the Malama project.

In political action the ILWU began to take on not only the important political and legislative tasks that go with independent political action but to develop within itself the same concepts of discipline that are the essential forerunners for building a labor party.

A part of Jack was the fact that he just didn't back up on the things in which he believed — whether it was banning the atom bomb, trade and recognition of the People's Republic of China, the building of international solidarity or the struggle against the war in Vietnam. Jack as part of the first small courageous group which marched down Waikiki to the hostile comments of bystanders to protest the war in Vietnam and calling for an end to our military adventure.

Many people have asked why did Jack run for international office; why did he move from Hawaii to the mainland? After all, he had made his record here, he had the support and affection of the working people in Hawaii, why give up a sinecure of this sort? All I can say is he did it because he was Jack—he helped turn Hawaii around and he saw an opportunity as a national officer to do his share in turning America around—to do it by building and strengthening organizations like the ILWU—to help do its job of improving the living standards and conditions of its members, but to also help turn things around from war to peace, from armaments to schools and hospitals, from pollution and waste to conservation and preservation of our environment.

A few months ago, the New Yorker magazine carried a lengthy excerpt of a book which is now the source of hectic discussion and argument around the nation—the Greening of America. The book talks of a new movement that arises out of the young and their new set of values that run towards peace, understanding, an end of hatred and hostility, the respect for the environment and the planet on which we live, the end of hypocrisy and prejudice that pervade so much of our daily lives. He had these articles reproduced in great quantity and



many of his friends here in Hawaii received copies from Jack. So he never changed from his fundamental thinking and stayed as young in his ideas as when he first came to these islands 35 years ago. And he kept the same left-wing bent.

Jack was fond of telling the membership the difference between respectability and being respected, and repeating time and again that we were not interested in whether the union or any of its officials became respectable, we just wanted to be respected.

The finest tribute to Jack Hall and so much in keeping with the principle he espoused that the labor movement wants to be respected, not respectable was the stoppage of work at 10 a.m. this morning in his honor. The working people of Hawaii honor not just an individual, but rather the memory of a comradeship in building a great rank and file union movement, in which each had his honorable part. Today they mourn their own. On plantations and docks, in factories and hotels, his thousands of brothers and sisters downed tools. It was an equal tribute that other organizations including the Hawaii State Federation of Labor, the Building and Construction Trades Council, the government workers and teachers joined in this tribute. On behalf of the entire ILWU, we express our appreciation. The members of the ILWU on the mainland followed suit and the telegrams of condolences, sympathy that are pouring in from all over the world are further testimony to the solidarity and faith of organized labor.

Each of us grieves in his own way and mostly, I suppose, in those quiet moments when we're alone. We get angry with the world around us and what we feel is such a terrible injustice and almost all of us, myself included, use the word "loss" when we talk of something like the death of Jack Hall. To use the word "loss" is just plain wrong and it is denigrating to what he stood for and what he accomplished. We can no more lose Jack than we can lose part of ourselves. Hawaii cannot lose Jack anymore than they can turn back the clock for 35 years and undo the changes that have been made. The word "loss" is wrong but I know I speak for everyone here when I say that we're going to miss him and miss him with an overwhelming

ache.

An era is ending—we've got our work cut out for us in getting a new one under way."

Representative Wong requested that the following eulogy, written by Max Roffman of the United Public Workers, be inserted in the Journal:

"Jack Hall, the greatest labor champion Hawaii ever had, died on January 2, 1971.

When he came to the islands, this was a semi-feudal territory. Wages were at starvation levels. The pay was as low as 19 cents an hour as late as 1944. There was no democracy either social, political, or industrial.

Workers' children were subjected to 3rd rate schools. Racial discrimination was rampant at all levels of society.

Jack Hall was the leader in obtaining industrial democracy. He broke the barrier of racial prejudice and produced a union which now has the highest wages in the world for agricultural labor.

Out of industrial democracy grew political democracy and social democracy which has made Hawaii a model of race relations and advanced social legislation.

In this development, Jack Hall stands out as the most important figure on the Hawaiian scene in the past three decades. We mourn his passing."

The motion to adopt S. C. R. No. 7 was put by the Chair and carried.

The Chair declared a recess at 11:04 o'clock a.m., subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 11:20 o'clock a.m.

The House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1971, was called to order at 11:00 o'clock a.m.

'Oh, no, not again!' I whispered. But, in order to play my part in this charade, I politely asked: 'Who are you? What do you want?' 'Do you not recognize me, child? I am the Spirit of America's past! I stood one day in a meadow called Runnymede. I remember it well. That was the day on which individual rights and the dignity of man were born. Mine was also the Guiding Spirit on that warm August day in Convention Hall in Philadelphia when your Constitution was born. I shall never forget it. We, the people—no challenge is too great, no foe is too formidable for as long as we stand in unison and proclaim—we, the people of the United States of America.'

Yes, my son, you have problems. But the problems as well as the privileges are vital parts of your heritage. Please remember that thousands of eager, hungry teenagers around the Globe covet your inheritance of America's heritage today.'

'Walk on the moon with Neal Armstrong, if you like. But, don't forget to return to America for this is your home.' And, as the poet said centuries ago, 'Humanity, with all its fears...With all the hopes of future years...Is hanging breathless on Thy Fate...'

Yes, Mr. Speaker, Akoni Pule served in this House with distinction and honor. I have lost an invaluable friend and colleague and the people of Hawaii have lost a true public servant.

Wednesday, February 24, 1971
