Thursday, February 25, 1971

The House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1971, was called to order at 11:00 o'clock a.m.

The Speaker presided.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by The Reverend Ted T. Ogoshi of the Makiki Christian Church.

Roll call of the members of the House of Representatives showed that all members were present with the exception of Representatives Kimura, Kuroda, Takamine and Wong, who were excused.

The Clerk proceeded to read the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Twenty-Fifth Day.

On motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, reading of the Journal was dispensed with and the Journal of the Twenty-Fifth Day was approved.

The Chair here directed the Clerk to note the presence of Representatives Kimura and Wong.

Representative O'Connor spoke in favor of S. B. No. 41 as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of Senate Bill No. 41.

Mr. Speaker, Senate Bill No. 41 seeks to amend the Constitution of this State to lower the voting age in this State to 18. This proposal, as you know, Mr. Speaker, has twice appeared on the ballot in this State and twice the people of this State have voted down this suggestion.

You might ask, Mr. Speaker, what changes things, in this year of 1971, as regards our proposal to amend the Constitution.

In the interim period between the last elections and today, the Federal government has acted in this area, passing an Act which changed the voting age across the nation in Federal elections, from the age of majority in that jurisdiction to the age of 18.

The Supreme Court of the United States has also acted in this area, saying

that the Federal legislation is constitutional.

Therefore, Mr. Speaker, we have in the State of Hawaii an anomaly which must be corrected—that anomaly being that the age for voting in the Federal elections—the elections for U. S. Senator, U. S. Representative, for President and for Vice-President—would be 18. The age for voting in the State elections would be the age of 20, the age of majority in this State.

The cost and burden to our State and to our election process would be monumental under such a circumstance.

Therefore, Mr. Speaker, your Committee on Judiciary advocates again the placement of this proposal to amend the Constitution on the ballot in the next election in order to correct the situation that now exists, because we feel strongly that a different situation exists in the State of Hawaii today than existed at the time of the last elections.

Therefore, Mr. Speaker, I urge the passage of Senate Bill No. 41.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion to pass S. B. No. 41 on Third Reading was put by the Chair and carried by a vote of 51 ayes, which was not less than two-thirds of all the members to which the House is entitled.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that S. B. No. 41 had passed Third Reading not earlier than 12:05 o'clock p.m.

On motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried unanimously, the rules were suspended for the purpose of taking up bills on Third Reading on the basis of a modified consent calendar.

THIRD READING

The following bills, which were on the calendar for Third Reading, were read throughout and the following actions were taken:

Third Reading of H. B. No. 46.

On motion by Representative O'Connor, seconded by Representative Kimura, H. B. No. 46 passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Duponte being excused.

Third Reading of H. B. No. 52.

Representative O'Connor moved that H. B. No. 52 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kimura.

Representative Roehrig spoke in favor of the passage of H. B. No. 52.

The motion was put by the Chair and was carried and H. B. No. 52 passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Duponte being excused.

Third Reading of S. B. No. 113.

On motion by Representative Suwa, seconded by Representative Akizaki, S. B. No. 113 passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Duponte being excused.

The Chair here directed the Clerk to note that H. B. Nos. 46 and 52 and S. B. No. 113 had passed Third Reading not earlier than 12:01 o'clock p.m.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Consideration of H. B. No. 85, as amended, on Third Reading, which had been deferred to this day.

Representative Kimura moved that H. B. No. 85, as amended, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kishinami.

Representative Uechi offered the following amendment to H. B. No. 85, as amended:

"House Bill No. 85, H. D. 2, is amended by amending section 1 to read as follows:

'SECTION 1. Section 26-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 26-11 University of Hawaii. The university of Hawaii shall be headed by an executive board to be known as the board of regents.

The board of regents shall appoint and may remove an executive officer to be known as the president of the university of Hawaii.

The board shall consist of [nine]

thirteen members, one from each senatorial district [and], [three] one at large[.], one full-time student and one faculty member from the university of Hawaii, and one full-time student and one faculty member from the community colleges; provided, further, that in the instance a student member shall successfully complete his course of study and shall continue to reside in the state prior to the expiration of his term of membership on the board of regents, he may continue to serve in that capacity until his term expires.

No more than [six] eight of the members shall be members of the same political party and at least five of the members shall be former students of the university of Hawaii.

The board shall have power, in accordance with the Constitution of the State and with law, to formulate policy, and to exercise control over the university through its executive officer, the president of the university.

The university of Hawaii as heretofore constituted as a body corporate is continued as the university of Hawaii established by this chapter.’

SECTION 2. Section 304-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

‘Sec. 304-3 Regents; appointment; tenure; qualifications; meetings. The affairs of the university shall be under the general management and control of the board of regents consisting of [nine] thirteen members who shall be appointed and may be removed by the governor. Except as otherwise provided by statute, state officers and full-time students and faculty members of the university of Hawaii and the community colleges shall be eligible to appointment and membership. A full-time student is one who carries a minimum of twelve units. Representatives of the university of Hawaii and the community colleges shall serve as members of the board for two years and shall have the full rights and privileges of the other members.

Every member may serve beyond the expiration date of his term of appointment until his successor has been appointed and has qualified. The board shall at its first meeting after June 30,

elect a chairman, vice-chairman, and a secretary (who shall not be a member of the board), who shall serve until adjournment of its first meeting after June 30 of the next year or thereafter until their successors are appointed and have qualified and whose election shall be immediately certified by the Board to the lieutenant governor. The president of the university shall act as executive officer of the board. The board shall meet not less often than ten times annually, and may from time to time meet in each of the counties of Hawaii, Maui, and Kauai.

The members of the board shall serve without pay but shall be entitled to their traveling expenses within the State when attending meetings of the board or when actually engaged in business relating to the work of the board.’ ”

The Chair declared a recess at 12:02 o’clock p.m., subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:58 o’clock p.m.

Representative Uechi moved that the amendment be adopted, seconded by Representative Kaneshiro.

Representative Uechi then spoke in favor of the motion as follows:

“Mr. Speaker, the amendment before this body this morning is the inclusion of two faculty members in the Board of Regents. This is in line with the amendment on H. D. 2 providing for two students--one from the community college and one from the university. The faculty members also will be chosen with this particular stipulation in mind.

The other amendment that was made was in conformity with the thirteen-member board to include just one at-large seat, whereas, H. D. 2 called for three at-large members.

We feel that the inclusion of the faculty members gives the broadest representation of those who are concerned with representation at the University.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.”

Representative Kimura then spoke against the adoption of the amendment as

follows:

“Mr. Speaker, the amendment essentially calls for the addition of two faculty members to the number as proposed in H. B. No. 85, H. D. 2.

While it is true in terms of total numbers, that there is no increase, the three at-large members cut down to one allows for the two faculty members.

The point for the objection to the adoption of this amendment, Mr. Speaker, is that the Committee in considering the bill and considering this problem to allow students and possibly faculty members to serve on the Board, noted that there were no expressions made by the ones or the group most affected by this amendment and that is, the faculty of the University of Hawaii or the community college.

The record, as far as the Committee is concerned, is completely void of any desire or aspirations on the part of the University faculty and the community college faculty, to serve on the Board of Regents.

On the contrary, as far as the students are concerned, their aspirations and desire to serve have been strongly expressed at our hearings, formally and informally, to the Committee and to the members of the Committee, and it is essentially for this reason, Mr. Speaker, that this Committee in this majority report have felt that the inclusion of faculty members might be an amendment of the law which is providing for something that is not desired by the group that it seeks to provide for in the Act.

For that reason, Mr. Speaker, I would recommend that this amendment be defeated.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.”

The Chair declared a recess at 1:03 o'clock p.m., subject to the call of the Chair.

Upon reconvening at 1:04 o'clock p.m., the Chair recognized Representative Kato.

Representative Kato inquired whether or not the Chairman of the Committee on Higher Education would yield to a

question, to which Representative Kimura replied in the affirmative.

Representative Kato then asked what was the position of the faculty so far as the inclusion of students on the Board of Regents was concerned.

Representative Kimura replied as follows:

“The one person speaking before the Committee's formal hearing on this bill was Dr. Werner Levi, who is the Chairman of the University of Hawaii Faculty Senate. His testimony essentially was that he was opposed to faculty as well as student representation on the Board of Regents.”

Representative Kato then continued:

“Mr. Speaker, if I might try to clarify what the amendment is trying to put over.”

Representative Roehrig then rose on a point of order and inquired if Representative Kato was speaking for or against the amendment.

The Chair ruled that his point was well taken and requested Representative Kato to state his position.

Representative Kato then stated:

“Mr. Speaker, I am speaking for the amendment.

Mr. Speaker, I think it is incumbent on all of us to call upon the Chairmen who are reporting bills to the floor to come out with all of the information that is pertinent to the discussion at hand. I called this to the attention of the caucus that we just completed and I think for the record we should state how each person feels about particular measures.

Now, if Dr. Levi who was representing the faculty or himself as a faculty member stated that he was against the inclusion of faculty, it should be brought out that he was also against the inclusion of students on the Board of Regents.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.”

The Chair stated that the pending motion was for adoption of the amendment. A sufficient number so

requesting it, the Chair ruled that a roll call vote was in order.

The motion to adopt the amendment was put by the Chair and was carried by a vote of 27 ayes to 23 noes, with Representatives Akizaki, de la Cruz, R. Garcia, Inaba, Kihano, Kimura, Kishinami, Kondo, Kunimura, Kuroda, Lunasco, Morioka, O'Connor, Roehrig, Sakima, Suwa, Ushijima, Wakatsuki, Wedemeyer, Wong, Yap, Yim and Beppu voting no and Representative Duponte being excused.

The Chair declared a recess at 1:12 o'clock p.m., subject to the call of the Chair.

At 1:14 o'clock p.m., the House of Representatives reconvened.

By unanimous consent, consideration of H. B. No. 85, as amended, was deferred until tomorrow.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that copies of H. B. No. 85, HD 3, were made available to the members of the House at 1:15 o'clock p.m.

At 1:16 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:00 o'clock a.m., Monday, March 15, 1971.

The House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1971, was called to order at 11:00 o'clock a.m.
