Mr. Speaker, we have present today with us, the prime mover in the life of Dr. Alfred Maneki, his mother.

Alfred is one of two children of the Maneki's and I might add here that his sister, Dahlia, is in India with the Peace Corps. His father passed away when Alfred was only 18 years of age and his mother has had the responsibility of guiding his life.

In talks with Mrs. Maneki, she maintains that it was all his doing and that she had a very small part in his success. She did mention, however, the devotion of many teachers in our educational system who guided and instructed him in the kind of career he hoped to attain.

We are fortunate, Mr. Speaker, to have here with us, one of his teachers, who taught Dr. Maneki for eleven years. She is Miss Alice Penny from the State School for Deaf and Blind.

I feel proud, Mr. Speaker, to offer this resolution on behalf of the members of this Honorable Body.

I might note in passing, Mr. Speaker, that I believe that Dr. Alfred Maneki is the first blind person to have received a Doctorate in Mathematics from Hawaii.

Through you, Mr. Speaker, we have made arrangements to have this resolution translated into braille and be sent to Dr. Maneki at North Dakota State College, where he is presently teaching mathematics.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

THIRD READING

The following bills, which were on the calendar for Third Reading, were read throughout and the following actions were taken:

Third Reading of H. B. No. 26.

Representative Sakima moved that H. B. No. 26, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kuroda.

Representative Sakima then spoke in favor of the bill as follows:

"Mr. Speaker and members of this House:

For some time now, the people of Hawaii have had the educational system run by the Board of Education from malapportioned and unconstitutional school board districts. The many possible legal problems inherent in the Board of Education warrant immediate action by this Honorable Body to initiate corrective proposals. The three bills under consideration today present such a proposal. With your leave, I would like to make one presentation to cover all three bills, to wit, H. B. Nos. 26, 1441 and 1446.

The package consisting of these three bills will offer the people of Hawaii a choice between an appointed or an elected Board of Education and it will be done in this manner:

- A constitutional amendment will be presented to the voters in the next general election providing for an appointed Board of Education.
- 2. If the constitutional amendment is ratified, then the bill providing for a Board of Education appointed by the Governor and providing for elected district school council will take effect.
- 3. If the amendment is not ratified, then the bill providing for an elected Board of Education based on Senatorial

districts will take effect. The final choice will be left to the voters.

The foregoing proposals offer a year and a half exposure before the public makes its choice. This, I think, will be a fair and just way of letting the people decide on how the educational system will be run.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Leopold then spoke in favor of the bill and Representative Kato spoke against the passage of the bill.

The motion to pass H. B. No. 26 on Third Reading was put by the Chair and carried by a vote of 43 ayes to 8 noes, with Representatives de la Cruz, Duponte, Iha, Kato, Nakama, Roehrig, Takamine and Unemori voting no.

Third Reading of H. B. No. 1441.

On motion by Representative Sakima, seconded by Representative Kuroda, H. B. No. 1441 passed Third Reading by a vote of 40 ayes to 11 noes, with Representatives de la Cruz, Duponte, Iha, Kato, Nakama, Oda, Poepoe, Roehrig, Takamine, Uechi and Unemori voting no.

Third Reading of H. B. No. 1446.

On motion by Representative Sakima, seconded by Representative Kuroda, H. B. No. 1446 passed Third Reading by a vote of 48 ayes to 3 noes, with Representatives Duponte, Poepoe and Takamine voting no.

Third Reading of H. B. No. 54.

By unanimous consent, consideration of H. B. No. 54 on Third Reading was deferred until Monday, March 22, 1971.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Consideration of Stand. Com. Rep. No. 213 on H. B. No. 2, as amended, which had been deferred to this day.

Representative Suwa moved that the report of the Committee be adopted and H. B. No. 2, as amended, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Akizaki.

Representative Suwa then spoke in favor of the motion as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, the budget that I hold before me-H. B. No. 2, HD 2—represents the efforts and the product of the 51 members of the House and reflects the operation of the affairs of our State within the financial means of the State of Hawaii. We have taken into account all the necessary needs and requirements of operating our government, and I believe that we have placed proper emphasis in the area of education, higher education and health and welfare of the people of the State of Hawaii.

Mr. Speaker, I wish to extend my thanks to all the members of the House and my staff for the many hours they spent in reporting out this budget.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

At 1:46 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

At 1:47 o'clock p.m., the House of Representatives reconvened.

Representatives Kato, Poepoe and Soares then spoke in favor of the passage of H. B. No. 2, HD 2.

The motion to adopt Stand. Com. Rep. No. 213 and to pass H. B. No. 2, as amended, on Third Reading was put by the Chair and carried and H. B. No. 2, as amended, having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 51 ayes, which was not less than two—thirds of all the members to which the House is entitled.

The Chair here directed the Clerk to note that H. B. Nos. 26, 1441, 1446 and 2 had passed Third Reading not earlier than 1:48 o'clock p.m.

At 1:52 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

At 1:53 o'clock p.m., the House of Representatives reconvened.

DEFERRED MATTER

Consideration of Stand. Com. Rep. No. 229 on H. B. No. 4, as amended, on Third Reading, which had been deferred to this time.

Representative Suwa moved that the report of the Committee be adopted and H. B. No. 4, as amended, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Akizaki.

Representative Suwa then offered the following amendment to H. B. No. 4, as amended:

"H. B. No. 4, HD 1, is amended by deleting in its entirety so much of Item IV D on page 49 thereof as reads:

'Kauai Community College

2. Development of New Campus, Kauai Community College, Puhi-\$1,000

Plans, construction, purchase of furniture, equipment and landscaping, Kauai Community College, Puhi. All prior appropriations for Kauai Community College shall be used for the new campus at Puhi'."

Representative Suwa moved that the amendment be adopted, seconded by Representative Akizaki.

At 1:54 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

At 1:55 o'clock p.m., the House of Representatives reconvened.

Representative Kunimura then spoke against the amendment as follows:

"Mr. Speaker and members of the House:

The Kauai Community College's development of a new campus for this branch of the State higher education system on Kauai has been frustrated for many years. On numerous occasions, it has been the political powers of the Legislature that frustrated the construction of a new campus and its facilities.

Mr. Speaker, when I came to this Legislature this year, I felt I carried a clear mandate from the people of Kauai from looking at the results of the last election. Mr. Speaker, historically, we tried to decide on the site for this community college but since the political bodies could not decide, we agreed to let

the three agencies of government make the selection; namely, the University Regents, the Kauai Planning Commission and the State Department of Planning and Economic Development. Somehow, by some mysterious action or inaction, one agency refused to cast its vote. The University Regents previously voted for Lihue, then by a change of a Regent, switched to Wailua. The Kauai Planning Commission took its stand for Puhi and reiterated many times for Puhi. But the State Department of Economic Development refused to vote on either choice and that is why, Mr. Speaker, I felt it was incumbent upon the Kauai delegation to make this decision because the executive branch refused to do so.

I am going to say this, Mr. Speaker, this particular amendment deleting this entire item in H. B. No. 4, HD 1, is going to frustrate not only the development of the campus on Kauai but also hold up the development of the intermediate section of the Kauai High School. As such, I am voting against this amendment.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

At 1:57 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair,

At 2:00 o'clock p.m., the House of Representatives reconvened.

Representative Kawakami then spoke against the amendment as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, the Select Committee of Kauai Representatives, in deliberating this CIP budget, has decided to include this appropriation in our CIP primarily to exercise its legislative prerogative. The Committee earnestly feels that the people of Kauai again will be shortchanged if this appropriation is deleted from the budget. We have waited 6 long years for a new campus. We have sufficient monies already appropriated and we feel that by taking action, we can have the administration move. The people of Kauai and the students of Kauai will realize a new campus and all the people in the State can benefit by having a new campus.

Mr. Speaker, I think that if this amendment passes, the ramifications will be far-reaching. I feel that we in the House would not be exercising our

legislative prerogative.

Thank you."

Representative Yamada then spoke in favor of the amendment as follows:

"What this amendment intends to do, in effect, is to leave the decision as to the specific site of the Kauai Community College to administrative bodies. The designation of the exact site for a new community college on Kauai presently rests, as I stated before, with administrative bodies. For us now to legislatively pick the site by means of a language change and capital improvement appropriation tying the funds to a specific site, contrary to the language of prior legislative actions, I feel, is not proper legislative practice and should not be found acceptable by this Honorable Body.

I do feel that the acceptance of this amendment will not in any way stymie the creation of a community college on Kauai. In fact, if this Body now locks this fund to a specific site and the administrative decision should go contrary, I feel that this, in fact, would more impede the creation of the Kauai Community College which we, the people of Kauai, have long awaited for. Therefore, I urge the passage of this amendment.

Thank you."

At 2:04 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

At 2:05 o'clock p.m., the House of Representatives reconvened.

Representative Suwa then explained the amendment as follows:

"It is incumbent upon me, Mr. Speaker, to speak in favor of this amendment at this time.

Attempts have been made in previous appropriation measures to include this Puhi site. But the Chair's philosophy and the Committee's opinion is that the prerogative is with the Board of Regents and we are somewhat granting the situation. The Chair's understanding with the Kauai delegation was that if it was a unanimous position, then the Chair

would allow this measure to appear in the CIP, subject to the prerogative of the executive to item veto it. Mr. Speaker, I find this morning that the Kauai delegation is not unanimous in its position. Therefore, I offer this amendment and urge the members of this House to vote in favor of this amendment.

Thank you."

Representative Kunimura then stated:

"Mr. Speaker, for the record, I have here a letter of transmittal from the Kauai Select Committee whereby 3 members signed it without reservation with the appropriation amount inserted which is now to be deleted by this amendment."

Representative Kawakami then stated for the record:

"On the transmittal letter, it was clear as far as my signature was concerned, and I do not want to be accused of being a 'flip-flopper'."

Representative Yamada then stated:

"I would like to add one item to the

original Committee Report reported out of the Kauai Select Committee. I had expressed my reservations of the proper use of the CIP in question. As for the transmittal letter, maybe to my being naive, being new, I took the transmittal letter and signed it as just that—a transmittal letter—and not over verification of every item in the budget."

The motion to adopt the amendment was put by the Chair and carried.

On motion by Representative Suwa, seconded by Representative Akizaki and carried, consideration of H. B. No. 4, as amended, was deferred until Monday, March 22, 1971.

The Chair here directed the Clerk to note that printed copies of H. B. No. 4, as a mended, were distributed to the members of the House at 2:10 o'clock p.m., in accordance with Article III, Section 16, of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii.

At 2:15 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:00 o'clock a.m. Monday, March 22, 1971.

Monday, March 22, 1971

The House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1971, was called to order at 11:00 o'clock a.m.

The Speaker presided.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by The Reverend Robert A. Hawn of the Calvary Episcopal Church.

Roll call of the members of the House of Representatives showed that all members were present with the exception of Representatives O'Connor and Wakatsuki, who were excused.

The Clerk proceeded to read the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Forty-Second Day.

On motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, reading of the Journal was dispensed with and the Journal of the Forty-Second Day was approved.

On motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and unanimously carried, the rules were suspended for the purpose of taking up bills on Third Reading on the basis of a modified consent calendar.

THIRD READING

The following bills, which were on the calendar for Third Reading, were read throughout and the following actions taken:

Third Reading of H. B. No. 639.

On motion by Representative Sakima, seconded by Representative Kuroda, H. B. No. 639 passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Duponte being excused.

Third Reading of H. B. No. 149.

On motion by Representative O'Connor, seconded by Representative Kimura, H. B. No. 149 passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Duponte being excused.

Third Reading of H. B. No. 20.

Representative O'Connor moved that H. B. No. 20, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kimura.

Representative O'Connor then rose to speak in favor of H. B. No. 20 as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of H. B. No. 20, HD 1.

The penal code of the State of Hawaii has not had a thorough revision since 1869. This has been recognized in this Honorable Body by a resolution in 1966 and the Senate of this Legislature in the same year, and was also recognized by the passage of Act 31, Session Laws of Hawaii 1968, which empowered the Judicial Council of Hawaii to set up a committee to thoroughly review the penal laws of the State.

Mr. Speaker, that committee, chaired by Judge Masato Doi, two years ago, produced a definitive work which in essence proposed a thorough and complete review and repeal and introduction of criminal laws which would allow the State of Hawaii to have a progressive penal system both by law and by laws involving sentencing and other matters after criminals have been sentenced in court.

Mr. Speaker, your Committee on Judiciary was referred a bill this sssion, but before this session ever began, your Judiciary Committee in December of last year started hearings on the proposals of the Judicial Council of Hawaii. It is my estimate that your Committee on Judiciary has spent approximately 300 hours of Committee work regarding H. B. No. 20, HD 1 which is before you. In addition, countless other people involved with the Committee have spent many, many hours of time.

This revision of our Penal Code changes in format, the Penal Code of the State of Hawaii to one of clear, concise logic. It brings into the 20th century, the criminal laws of this State and arranges them in a fashion which hopefully for the next century, will aid Hawaii not only in opposing crime and keeping the criminal in Hawaii in its place, but also in dealing with the criminal once the crime has been ferreted out, the conviction obtained and the criminal placed in a method of incarceration, either jail or probation.

Mr. Speaker, this work is one which we strongly advocate to this Honorable Body and we urge the passage of H. B. No. 20. Further, Mr. Speaker, I seek that an interim committee be appointed regarding H. B. No. 20 to work in between this session and the next to clear up any further matters that might need clearing up. We anticipate there will probably be some amendment required in certain areas in 1972.

For these reasons, Mr. Speaker, there have been proposed in H. B. No. 20 several effective dates. The effective date for the measure as a whole is suggested as July 1, 1972, to allow the community, the legal community and the Judiciary to look carefully at this work and come back to us in the next session to make proposals regarding change as they may see fit.

In addition, Mr. Speaker, we have advocated to specific sections to be

effective on July 1, 1971. These are in the areas of criminal trespass of dwellings where we feel that due to Supreme Court rulings in the State, that there is a lack of strong effective laws at the present time to protect the homeowners and dwellings.

The second area that we propose to make effective on July 1, 1971, is the area regarding drug use and drug abuse. The present law of the State seemingly changes and the change should be done by legislation rather than by Judicial action.

Mr. Speaker, I strongly urge that this Body support H. B. No. 20, HD 1.

At this time, I would like to thank the staff of the Clerk's Office, the staff of the Committee on Judiciary and all of the members of the Judiciary Committee for the long hard hours of work that have gone into this piece of legislation.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Judd then spoke in favor of the bill.

Representative J. Garcia rose to speak against the passage of the bill stating that his objection was directed to the provision on marijuana and that said provision in the present form was tantamount to the legalization of this drug in Hawaii.

The Chair stated that the pending motion was for the passage of H. B. No. 20, as amended, on Third Reading. A sufficient number so requesting it, the Chair ruled that a roll call vote was in order.

The motion to pass H. B. No. 20 on Third Reading was put by the Chair and was carried, and H. B. No. 20, having been read throughout, passed Thrid Reading by a vote of 46 ayes, with Representatives Ajifu, J. Garcia, Hansen and Soares voting no and Representative Duponte being excused.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Consideration of H. B. No. 54 on Third Reading which had been deferred to this day.

On motion by Representative O'Connor, seconded by Representative

Kimura, H. B. No. 54, having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Duponte being excused.

Consideration of Stand. Com. Rep. No. 229 on H. B. No. 4, as amended, which had been deferred to this day.

Representative Suwa moved that the report be adopted and that H. B. No. 4, as amended, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Akizaki.

Representative Suwa then spoke in favor of the motion as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, H. B. No. 4, HD 2, supplements House Bill No. 2 in the area of capital improvements. The funding of the projects is within the debt limit of the State of Hawaii. I ask the members to support this bill.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Kihano then rose to speak in favor of H. B. No. 4 as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of H. B. No. 4.

Mr. Speaker, today is a great day for the many citizens of the State of Hawaii as H. B. No. 4 will be voted upon by this Honorable Body.

After much research and deliberation on the Honolulu Stadium, I feel that the citizens of the State of Hawaii with its growing population deserve a 50,000-seat stadium. I feel that too many years have gone by where the citizens and sport fans of Hawaii have made sacrifices playing and witnessing many activities in a second class stadium.

Honolulu stadium is no longer adequate to accommodate the various sport activities of our State.

Therefore, Mr. Speaker, and members of the House, I feel that the 29 million dollars appropriated would adequately provide the building and added facilities needed to accommodate our dedicated and well-deserved citizens of this State.

Mr. Speaker, I urge each and every one of us here in this House to vote in favor of this bill.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Poepoe then spoke in favor of H. B. No. 4. However, he expressed a concern over the doubling of the debt authorization and debt payment over the past four years.

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H. B. No. 4, as amended, passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Duponte being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H. B. Nos. 639, 149, 20, 54 and 4 had passed Third Reading not earlier than 12:35 o'clock p.m.

Representative Suwa, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 247) approving the intent and purpose of H. B. No. 1293 and recommending its passage on Second Reading, with certain amendments.

On motion by Representative Suwa, seconded by Representative Akizaki and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H. B. No. 1293, as amended, passed Second Reading and was placed on the Order of the Day for Third Reading tomorrow, March 23, 1971.

Representative Suwa, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 248) approving the intent and purpose of H. B. No. 1312 and recommending its passage on Second Reading, with certain amendments.

On motion by Representative Suwa,

seconded by Representative Akizaki and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H. B. No. 1312, as amended, passed Second Reading and was placed on the Order of the Day for Third Reading tomorrow, March 23, 1971.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H. B. Nos. 588, 1293 and 1312 had passed Second Reading not earlier than 12:36 o'clock p.m.

Representative Uechi rose to speak on a point of personal privilege with regard to (1) concerns on committee referrals and committee responsibilities, (2) the status of the All Select Committee as a duly constituted committee under the Rules of the House, (3) the duties and responsibilities of the Committee on Federal-State-County Relations and the scope of the functions of the Select Committees, and (4) the past procedure under which bills were referred to the All Select Committee.

Representative Uechi then proceeded to explain the 1970 procedures on referrals and the difference in origin and function of the All Select Committees in the present session, whereupon Representative Wakatsuki rose on a point of order as to whether a discussion on referrals relating to the 1970 session was a proper matter before the House.

The Chair ruled that the point was well taken and directed Representative Uechi to confine his discussion to one subject.

Representative Uechi then continued by noting that in the present session, 135 House bills and resolutions have been referred to the All Select Committee, chaired by the Kauai Select chairman and stating further that Oahu, with the largest number of Representatives in the House, has little control while the Select Committee of Kauai Representatives with the least number of Representatives has been designated the primary Select Committee and its chairman as the controller of the bills.

Representative Kunimura at this time rose on a point of order and stated that he represents the people of this State and not Kauai alone.

The Chair ruled that the point was well taken.

Representative Wong then rose on a point of order stating that under House Rule 6, the Speaker shall refer all bills to Committee, subject to the appeal to the House.

Upon the request of Representative Roehrig, the Chair declared a recess at 12:42 o'clock p.m., subject to the call of the Chair.

Upon reconvening at 12:44 o'clock p.m., Representative Uechi was permitted to inquire of the leadership if it has considered whether the composition of the All Select Committee of 26 members was designed to conduct substantive hearings and that the All Select Committee has not called any hearings on the measures referred to it.

Representative Kunimura rose on a point of order as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I wish he would direct the question to me. I have been here almost 40 days and I have not seen Representative Uechi come to see me about any bill. Is there a lack of communication?"

The Chair ruled that his point was well taken.

Representative Uechi then continued by expressing his views on the reasons for creating the All Select Committee and the designation of the Kauai Representative as Chairman, and made inquiry as to (1) whether the leadership would reconsider and re-refer bills referred to the All Select Committee and (2) why there was a change in the referral policy.

At this point, Representative Wakatsuki rose on a point of order as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, we're sitting here suffering through this dissertation when the speaker is well aware that the door is open to him if he wishes to communicate with the leadership. I know he is seeking publicity but this is not the time nor the place for this."

Representative Kato rose on a point of order and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, what is the point of the prior speaker? May I have that clarified?"

Representative Wakatsuki stated his point as follows:

"The point is that we ought not to be subjected to this dissertation about asking the leadership questions when the questions can be directly made from the speaker through the Speaker's Office, either through the Policy Committee or directly by having an appointment with the Speaker regarding this aggrieved position.

This is not the place, in my opinion, to subject all of us to listening to something that can be rectified if necessary, on a man-to-man basis."

The Chair ruled that his point was well taken.

Representative Kato then rose on a point of information, as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, is it my understanding then that a person cannot rise on a point of personal privilege and state what he thinks are improper practices? Is that the position taken by the Majority Leader?"

Representative Wakatsuki answered:

"Mr. Speaker, the point is that if a person feels aggrieved, he ought to be more specific and not be general as it relates to the operations of the House."

The Chair ruled that his point was well taken and informed Representative Uechi to conclude his remarks.

Representative Uechi then concluded by expressing his concern about the referrals and a hope that each member of the House will be extended every opportunity to create or contribute towards the enactment of good and necessary legislation.

Representative Wasai then rose on a point of personal privilege and spoke on the matter of referral of certain measures to the Committee on Public Employment of which he is chairman, while on other occasions certain measures which he felt were to be referred to his Committee were not.

The Chair then made the following observation:

"Under the Rules of the House, the Speaker has the responsibility of referring all bills and resolutions. More specifically, in answer to your question regarding the referral of certain bills, it so happened that these bills concerned an area affecting County governments."

Representative Wasai stated that this was explained to him and added that at the same time, there were bills that were referred directly from his committee to the Committee on Finance and these were measures pertaining to the County governments also.

The Chair then replied that every bill for referral is scrutinized and those bills that affect the counties directly are referred to the County Select Committee. Those bills that do not have direct relationship with the counties, especially involving financing, are referred to the Finance Committee.

Representative Kunimura then rose on a point of personal privilege and stated as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I feel that many of the

statements were made in our direction—the neighbor islands—especially as Chairman of the Kauai Select Committee.

Mr. Speaker, are we here to represent our respective Islands, or political subdivisions, or are we here to represent all of the people of the State?

I came here, Mr. Speaker, in 1963 to represent all of the people of this State and I took it upon myself to do so on any issue wherever I felt that the people's voices should be heard. Even if it did not have any bearing on Kauai, I made my position known on such issues.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

At 12:56 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:00 o'clock a.m., tomorrow, March 23, 1971.

Tuesday, March 23, 1971

The House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1971, was called to order at 11:00 o'clock a.m.

Garcia, R. Representative O'Connor moved that H. C. R. No. 78 be adopted, seconded by Representative Soares.

Representative O'Connor spoke in favor of the adoption of H. C. R. No. 78 as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of H. C. R. No. 78.

Much the same logic that goes with our proposal to the electorate of this State that our Constitution be amended so that our 18-year olds in this State would be allowed to vote goes behind our support of this concurrent resolution.

The Senate and the House of the United States have proposed by resolution that the Constitution of the United States be amended to allow the 18-year old to vote.

We are faced, Mr. Speaker, in this State, with a situation where the 18-year old votes in all Federal elections. The 18-year old will not vote in State elections.

Mr. Speaker, this anomaly, this problem situation must be solved. Therefore, I would urge this House to vote aye on this concurrent resolution so that in the next election, or the elections to come in this State, we would not have to set up two sets of machinery—one for Federal elections and one for State elections.

I bear in mind, Mr. Speaker, that the people of the State of Hawaii have two times rejected the 18-year old vote, in two requests to amend our Constitution. However, this is a different situation and we must face the fact that we need but one machinery in this State for elections.

I therefore urge all members of this Honorable Body to vote aye on this concurrent resolution.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Devereux then spoke in favor of the concurrent resolution.

The motion was put by the Chair and was carried and H. C. R. No. 78 was adopted.

On motion by Representative O'Connor, seconded by Representative Kimura, H. B. No. 48 passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Kuroda being excused.

On motion by Representative Suwa, seconded by Representative Akizaki, S. B. No. 1 passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, which was not less than two-thirds of all the members to which the House is entitled, with Representative Kuroda being excused.

Third Reading of H. B. No. 491.

On motion by Representative Suwa, seconded by Representative Akizaki, H. B. No. 491 passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Kuroda being excused.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Consideration of Stand. Com. Rep. No. 256 on H. B. No. 454, as amended, on Third Reading which had been deferred to this day.

Representative Kawakami moved that the report be adopted and that H. B. No. 454, as amended, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kaneshiro.

Representative Kawakami then spoke in favor of H. B. No. 454 as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of H. B. No. 454.

The purpose of House Bill No. 454, as amended, is to suspend the right to petition the State Land Use Commission for changes in the boundaries of certain agricultural land districts on the island of Oahu. The amendments to this bill have not altered its basic intent, which is to provide for a period of re—evaluation with respect to converting land classified for agricultural use into land classified for urban use.

Mr. Speaker, over the years, we have

seen the pressures for development make inroads into prime agricultural lands. We are now at the point where we should stop and make an assessment of the competing demands upon our lands. The priorities on the uses of our most precious resource are in dire need of re-evaluation; especially, when what we do now will affect many generations to come in Hawaii.

We therefore must proceed with much caution into the future, and plan for the careful use of our very limited land resources. A moratorium on the reclassification of agricultural land will assist us in arriving at more careful planning and a finding of an adequate balance of the competing demands of our society.

House Bill No. 454 in its original form proposed a five-year moratorium. House Draft 1 amended this to a two-year period.

The reason for this, Mr. Speaker, is that we are anticipating at the 1972 legislative session, the recommendations of the statewide open space plan being prepared by former Secretary of the Interior Stewart Udall's organization, 'Overview'.

It is our understanding that Mr. Udall has already submitted a strong recommendation to the Governor that the State Land Use Commission impose a moratorium on major decisions until the conclusion of the 1972 legislative session.

Recommendations relating to open space areas in our State would certainly assist and affect decisions that the State Land Use Commission will be making. Therefore, your Committee felt it more appropriate to change the time period for a moratorium from five to two years.

House Draft 2 of the bill, which is presently before us for Third Reading, embodies a further amendment which would permit the Land Use Commission to initiate changes in classification during the moratorium period.

It was found by your Committee that an absolute moratorium might impede the implementation of certain compelling public projects—public projects which carry legislative support and directive. For example, the moratorium should not impede the implementation of public housing programs established under Act 105, Session Laws of Hawaii 1970. With such an exception, the bill still embodies the safeguards and objectives of the moratorium.

Also, Mr. Speaker, petitions that are on file with the Land Use Commission will not be affected by the passage of this bill.

Mr. Speaker, I therefore urge the members of this Honorable Body to vote aye on H. B. No. 454, H. D. 2.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H. B. No. 454 passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Kuroda being excused.

The Chair here directed the Clerk to note that H. B. Nos. 48, 491 and 454 and S. B. No. 1 had passed Third Reading not earlier than 11:40 o'clock a.m.

The Chair declared a recess at 11:41 o'clock a.m., subject to the call of the Chair.

Upon reconvening at 12:30 o'clock p.m., the Chair directed the Clerk to note the presence of Representative Kuroda.

On motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, S. B. No. 845 passed First Reading by title and further action was deferred until tomorrow, March 25, 1971.

At 12:40 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:00 o'clock a.m., tomorrow, March 25, 1971.

The House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1971, was called to order at 11:00 o'clock a.m.

By unanimous consent, H. B. No. 74 was recommitted to the Committee on Judiciary.

Third Reading of H. B. No. 435.

Representative O'Connor moved that H. B. No. 435 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kimura.

Representative Devereux then spoke against the passage of the bill and Representative Kunimura spoke in support thereof.

Representative O'Connor then spoke in favor of the bill as follows:

"The civil courts that are abolished by the bill, Mr. Speaker, are courts that are left over from medieval times when women were chattel. In those times, criminal conversation, seduction, alienation of affections were considered extremely vital since women had no real rights in the world, were not considered on an equal basis with men and we were a long way away from the present women's lib movement in the United States.

Mr. Speaker, hopefully, this country and this civilization have come of age and women stand on an equal par with men today. This is reflected by some of the changes in our criminal law which we voted on the other day and this is reflected by the bill which puts a woman on an equal basis with a man and, therefore, Mr. Speaker, I would urge all in this Body to vote for this bill.

Thank you."

The motion to pass H. B. No. 435 on Third Reading was put by the Chair and carried by a vote of 46 ayes to 4 noes, with Representatives Aduja, Devereux, Hansen and Lee voting no, and Representative Iha being excused.

Third Reading of H. B. No. 637.

Representative Kimura moved that H. B. No. 637 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Sakima.

Representative O'Connor then rose and stated that he is presently the attorney representing a party in a lawsuit pending before court in the State of Hawaii in which the subject matter of this bill is an issue and asked the Chair for a ruling as to whether or not there was a conflict of interest.

The Chair ruled that there was a conflict of interest and Representative O'Connor was excused from voting on this measure.

Third Reading of H. B. No. 939.

Representative O'Connor moved that H. B. No. 939 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kimura.

Representative Ushijima then stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of House Bill No. 939.

This bill will change the present State holiday known as Columbus Day to a State holiday designated as Discoverers' Day.

It is not the purpose of this bill to steal any thunder from our Italian friends any more than Presidents' Day takes prestige away from President Washington. Rather, it is the purpose of this bill to honor all discoverers, including the great Pacific navigators such as the Polynesians, Ferdinand Magellan and Captain Cook.

Finally, Mr. Speaker, since Discoverers' Day will fall on the second Monday in October, it will provide an appropriate start for Aloha Week since it recognizes those men who first discovered the islands that now constitute our great State.

Thank you."

The motion to pass H. B. No. 939 on Third Reading was put by the Chair and carried by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Iha being excused.

Third Reading of H. B. No. 1228.

On motion by Representative O'Connor, seconded by Representative Kimura, H. B. No. 1228 passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Iha being excused.
