FIRST DAY

Wednesday, January 19, 1972

In accordance with Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, the House of Representatives convened in Regular Session on Wednesday, January 19, 1972.

The Honorable Tadao Beppu, Speaker of the House of Representatives, presided.

The Chair appointed Representatives Aduja, Akizaki, Devereux, Kawakami, Uechi and Yim to escort the Reverend David K. Kaupu, Chaplain, Kamehameha Schools, to the rostrum for the Invocation.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Reverend David K. Kaupu.

The Chair appointed George M. Takane as Temporary Clerk.

The Chair then appointed Representatives Kimura, Chairman, Ajifu, Fong, R. Garcia, Kato, Lunasco, Poepoe, Takamine and Wasai as a Committee on Credentials.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 10:42 o'clock a.m.

SPECIAL COMMITTEE REPORT

Representative Kimura, Chairman of the Committee on Credentials, presented a report (Spec. Com. Rep. No. 1) stating that the Committee on Credentials had

investigated, considered and reviewed the matter of the seating of Patsy K. Young as a member of the House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1972, to fill the vacancy created by the election of the Honorable Joseph T. Kuroda to the Senate from the Fourth Senatorial District, and finding her qualified and recommending that Patsy K. Young be seated as a member of the House of Representatives.

On motion by Representative Kimura, seconded by Representative Wasai and carried, the report of the Committee on Credentials was adopted.

The Chair declared a recess at 10:45 o'clock a.m., subject to the call of the Chair.

At 10:46 o'clock a.m., the House of Representatives having reconvened, the

said Committee reported to the Chair that the Honorable Herman T. F. Lum was in attendance.

The Chair then appointed Representatives Iha, Kihano, Kishinami, Lee, Suwa and Yamada to escort Representative Young to the rostrum.

OATH OF OFFICE

The oath of office was administered by the Honorable Herman T. F. Lum, in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, to Patsy K. Young as a member of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii.

The Chair then appointed Representatives Wakatsuki and Soares to escort Honorable Herman T. F. Lum to his seat and Representatives Ushijima and J. Garcia to escort Representative Young to her seat.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

A resolution (H. R. No. 2) providing for the election of the Officers of the House of Representatives was offered by Representative Beppu.

On motion by Representative de la Cruz, seconded by Representative Poepoe and carried, H. R. No. 2 was adopted.

The Chair thereupon administered the oath of office to George M. Takane, Chief Clerk; Charles Y. Tomisato, Assistant Clerk; Richard K. Sugita, Sergeant at Arms; and Edward L. Correa, Jr., Assistant Sergeant at Arms.

A resolution (H. R. No. 3) to inform the Governor and the Senate that the House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii was duly organized and ready to transact business was offered by Representative Beppu.

On motion by Representative Kunimura, seconded by Representative Saiki and carried, H. R. No. 3 was adopted.

The Chair appointed Representatives Inaba, Leopold, Medeiros, Unemori, Wedemeyer and Wong to inform the Senate that the House is duly organized and ready to transact business.

Representatives Carroll, de la Cruz, Judd, Kondo, Roehrig and Yap were then appointed by the Chair to inform the Governor that the House is duly organized and ready to transact business.

The Chair declared a recess at 10:55 o'clock a.m., subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 11:05 o'clock a.m.

At this time, the committees reported that the Senate and the Governor had been duly informed that the House is duly organized and ready to transact business.

SENATE COMMUNICATION

A communication from the Senate (Sen. Com. No. 1) transmitting Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 1 calling for the House and the Senate to meet in joint session at 11:15 o'clock a.m., on Thursday, January 20, 1972 to receive such address or greetings from the Governor of Hawaii as he should be pleased to make which was adopted this day in the Senate was read by the Clerk and placed on file.

On motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, S. C. R. No. 1 was adopted.

DEPARTMENTAL COMMUNICATION

A communication from Lt. Governor George R. Ariyoshi (Dept. Com. No. 1) informing the House that the Honorable

Joseph T. Kuroda was duly elected on October 2, 1971, a Senator for the Fourth Senatorial District for a term to expire on November 5, 1974 and that Senator Kuroda was issued a Certificate of Election on November 2, 1971 was read by the Clerk and was placed on file.

At this time, Representative Young addressed the members of the House as follows:

“Mr. Speaker, Governor Burns, honored guests and members of the House of Representatives, Ladies and Gentlemen: It is indeed an honor and privilege to be a part of this body. The task is before us but with renewed faith and ideas and ideals, we can meet the challenge to enact programs and legislation that will make Hawaii a better place for our children and posterity. To this end, I pledge my service.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.”

The Chair welcomed Representative Young as a member of the House and then addressed the members of the House as follows:

“This year marks the first decade of Democratic Leadership in both the executive and legislative branches of our State. Our Governor and a number of today's legislators were among the men who started a movement in the past decade to improve the economic, physical and social well-being of the people of Hawaii.

The great social and economic advances achieved by Hawaii since the early 60's can partly be attributed to Statehood. More importantly, a large measure of credit must be given to a concerted Executive and Legislative effort to create a better Hawaii.

What we in Hawaii enjoy today has been brought about by a peaceful social revolution. It has been brought about by a constant striving for long-term goals, which, at the time they were established, were thought to be necessary for the improvement of our citizens.

There is still much more to be done--new goals to be established and new objectives to be reached--in the light of present day concerns. Our society is not perfect and we who live in it are not

perfect. In trying to improve it further, let us not downgrade the accomplishments, the talents, the efforts and the integrity of those who seek to achieve a just accommodation between conflicting forces in our society. There are often no hard and fast solutions to many of the varied and complex problems facing us today.

To seek to confront the decision-making process with "either/or" demands for immediate action based on one-sided views and opinions is not the answer to solving our problems. Persuasion through reason, not coercion, is the means by which improvements in our society are made.

This is not to condemn the voices of dissent from the prevailing mores, for the lack of such voices would be an indication of a serious illness amongst us. Like the late great president, John F. Kennedy, my experience in government is that when things are non-controversial and beautifully coordinated, there is not much going on. But dissent as a means of change should encompass peaceful methods for educating the public to press for and accept the changes desired. It is not enough to merely call attention to our problems—most of us are aware of them. The need is to provide just solutions and to work together to get them accepted.

Action to be effective must be directed to clearly conceived ends. All change is not growth. All movement is not forward. The art of progress is to preserve order amid change, and to preserve change amid order. These words are not original. They have been said in one way or another for generations and yet the simple truths they contain have been the basis upon which our State and our society have developed. They are the constant companions of those involved in the legislative decision-making process.

The Hawaii Legislature has been ranked among the top ten in our nation—seventh to be more exact—and its procedures for decision-making have been highly commended. I have received many favorable comments from other states on the quality of our legislators and the excellent work of our Legislature in enacting new and progressive legislation. Our Legislature and a number of our laws have often been cited as models for other

states. We are the youngest state and one of the smallest yet we have progressed further and faster than almost any other state in the time since achieving statehood. We have reached such a stage because of our willingness to accept change—our willingness to innovate and to experiment.

It is through the efforts of you members of the House here today, and others before you, that we have been able to do this. It is your willingness to work hard, your open minds and progressive thinking, and your dedication to making Hawaii a better place to live in that have enabled us to make such headway. I salute you.

I bring this up at this time because I feel that you should receive due recognition from the public for your work. Too often the appearance of merit rather than merit itself is praised, much as the appearance of virtue rather than virtue itself is rewarded. We cannot legislate merit and virtue into our legislative processes but we can obtain it through electing dedicated men and recognizing such dedication.

We are now at a time when we have had over a decade of rapid and steady growth in our economy. This has enabled us to obtain the revenues with which to carry out many of our programs to improve the everyday life of our citizens. Our economy now appears to be levelling off, for the time at least. While our revenues have not dropped,—they have in fact continued to increase—the increase is not as much as had been anticipated in our estimates. It is possible that we may encounter declining revenues, depending upon what courses certain factors in our economy, and that of the nation, may take.

We may have to do a little belt-tightening in the coming year. Rising revenues of the past have allowed us to embark upon ambitious plans and programs for a better Hawaii. Now, we must pause to reassess our plans and our programs—to reevaluate how well they have met our needs and to make such changes in direction as may be required by present day needs and priorities.

This does not mean we intend to keep the "status quo." We will attempt to continue present programs and develop

new programs for a better community but we will attempt to do so within the constraints of our fiscal capacity.

We will continue our efforts to bring about even further improvements in the areas of education, health, welfare, and consumer protection, and to combat crime through improvement of our law enforcement and criminal justice systems. We will continue to seek better means of improving the lot of every individual citizen of our State. In addition, we will be dealing with the issues involved in educational quality, growth and direction; pollution control and the protection of our natural resources; and population and urban growth, among others.

I think that at this time, more than ever in the past, our people have come to realize that our economic, social and environmental problems are all intertwined—that what we do in one affects the others and that extreme care is required in seeing that solutions in one area do not create problems in another area.

We in the House have a duty to seek just solutions to these problems. Fellow members, let us begin.

Thank you very much.”

Representative Soares then introduced to the members of the House, Mr. Joseph R. Garcia, Sr, the 85-year old father of the senior member of the House, Representative Joseph R. Garcia, Jr., who was attending his first legislative session.

Representative Soares then addressed the members of the House as follows:

“Mr. Speaker, a year ago your House Republicans took on the responsibility of organizing this august body. In so doing, we realized our contributions would have

to be one of 100% cooperation for all activities and all programs coming out of this body.

We have been able to put together in the interim, programs that we feel are directly needed by all of our public for a better Hawaii. We are all concerned about our economy. We are concerned about the big problems facing us in the area of labor in our shipping strike and the strike by the teachers coming up, by all the problems in housing and environmental control and also by the neglect by some of us in realizing that we are the “honorable.” That we wear the label of public servants that impart responsibility of doing the job for the public who put us here. We must always be mindful of how we conduct ourselves, what we do, is reflected by those who elect us.

Mr. Speaker, your House Republicans are looking forward to the coming year with great anticipation. We want to contribute. We want to play an important part in every facet of this House and I guarantee you all that we will act as the “honorable.” We will act as we believe that we should—all together put our shoulders to the wheel to develop meaningful programs, to develop the kind of life that we all can live in Hawaii.

Mr. Speaker, let's begin the job.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.”

The Chair appointed Representatives Aki, Duponte, Hansen, Kaneshiro, Lunasco and Young to escort the Reverend Brendan Furtado, Director of Sacred Hearts Seminary, to the rostrum to offer the Benediction.

At 11:22 o'clock a.m., on motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:00 o'clock a.m., tomorrow, January 20, 1972.

2ND DAY

Thursday, January 20, 1972

The House of Representatives of the Sixth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1972, was called to order at 11:00 o'clock a.m.

The Speaker presided.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by the Reverend Doctor Chester Terpstra of the Hawaii Conference United Church of Christ.

Roll call of the members of the House of Representatives showed that all members were present with the exception of Representatives Fong, Kato, Poepoe and Wakatsuki, who were excused.

The Clerk proceeded to read the Journal of the House of Representatives of the First Day.

On motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, reading of the Journal was dispensed with and the Journal of the First Day was approved.

At 11:07 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

At 11:15 o'clock a.m., the House of Representatives met in joint session with the Senate, pursuant to Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 1, to receive the Governor's message.

The Chair here directed the Clerk to note the presence of Representatives Fong and Kato.

The Chair then appointed Representatives Ushijima and Soares and Senators Ching and Anderson as a committee to escort the Honorable John A. Burns, Governor of the State of Hawaii, to the rostrum.

The following is the address of Governor John A. Burns (Gov. Mess. No. 2):

“Mr. Speaker, Mr. President, Honorable Members of the Sixth State Legislature, Distinguished Guests and Friends:

Once again we are met, as representatives of the legislative and the

executive branches of government, to consider the needs of our people and to shape, in one measure or another, the future of our society in the time-tested manner traditional to our form of government.

Needless to say, it is always a pleasure, a distinct privilege, and a high honor to join you in the continuing creative endeavor which is the hallmark of our democratic system. There is no more important activity in our process of moving toward common goals than these deliberations leading to the development and articulation of those policies and programs by which the destinies of all of our people are guided.

Let me first of all express my appreciation to you for inviting me to share with you this Administration's views of our present conditions and of our future prospects. I will try to do so very briefly and in broad terms.

This occasion has traditionally been a time for a review of the 'state of the State,' so to speak.

What, then, is the state of the State?

Let me preface the answer to this by noting that while the immediate economic conditions primarily are uncertain, there is still every reason for optimism as to our continued progress in the future.

Our present state of affairs is clouded by a number of factors—by a difficult labor dispute on the mainland that directly affects our major sources of supply, by mixed revenue returns that have more than merely leveled off, by national actions that have been taken in an effort to halt the recession and to curb inflation, by that inflation and high unemployment and a recession on the mainland and by other related developments.

The economic picture, as a result, is presently highly fluid and easily subject to changes.

Nevertheless, whatever difficulties these factors present for us, our overall state of affairs should be viewed in the light of history and in broad perspective.

We have every reason to hope for and

to strive for improvements—and what is the real worth of life without problems and without challenges to human endeavor?

I know that you share with me the firm determination to accept the challenges offered to us, to express our gratitude for the blessings we do have and to work in common purpose, to seek meaningful resolution in the tasks that are our responsibility.

Consider our basic conditions today: Hawaii's people are well fed, better clothed and better housed than ever before. We have a solid economic base which each year becomes more diversified, increasing in stability. Most of us have good health, while the ill and the infirm have good health care. Our standard of living has steadily risen. We have, except for a distressed minority which merits our continued concern, steady employment in a variety of useful and satisfying fields. We have superior institutions of learning for our children.

We have recreational facilities that are the envy of much of the world. We have unlimited entertainment at the touch of a finger and we have freedom to travel to the ends of the earth. Our people are among the most progressive and enlightened of all the nation, and we have the gifts of peace and harmony, political freedom and social equality.

Of course, a substantial measure of credit for all these conditions must be given to you of the Legislature for the enlightened approach you have taken in meeting Hawaii's needs.

We must, then, as we begin a new legislative year, acknowledge first that we are endowed with great blessings. If we see difficulties and further trials ahead, let us view them with equanimity. Let us approach our State's problems in this spirit and, as we have in recent years, with a sincere desire to work together in rational and earnest discussion and endeavor to find solutions to our problems.

You and I know that there is always more work to be done, that the perfection of our system of laws and of programs of public service is a never-ending task.

We know, too, that this process demands labors that remain largely unrecognized. More often than not, genuinely meaningful and productive public service lies in these unheralded endeavors, more than in glamorous public pronouncements couched in dramatic and high-sounding phrases. The latter, too, often die aborning.

None of us needs reminding of the difficult tasks that confronts us in the weeks ahead. There are no easy answers to the balances we must seek to insure continued progress and prosperity for all.

You and your predecessor legislatures have been most understanding and generous in providing the means and the programs to meet the heavy demands of the decade past. You have been imaginative, innovative and liberal in authorizing a wide range of new programs and services to better the quality of life in these Islands.

We have, as a result, a loyal, talented and highly capable corps of public employees in all of our general services as well as in our educational institutions.

As I noted in this same forum a year ago, the firm foundations that were built during the Sixties served us well in weathering the widespread effects of the national recession and they still serve us. You will recall, too, that there were already signs of uncertainty in our own economy and that caution in our spending programs was dictated in the light of then developing trends.

It is to your credit again that due recognition was taken of the uncertain times that we faced, that responsible measures were thus incorporated in the total budget programs that you approved for the current biennium.

Your prudence was demonstrated in the committee report on the budget bill in which 'appropriate executive action' was called for should the trend in income or expenditures deviate from projections of a year ago.

The confidence that you have placed in the Executive is deeply appreciated and it is honored. I take it as an expression of our mutual respect for our respective responsibilities.

The latitude you accorded to the Administration was indeed timely. As you all know, and perhaps we ought to look at, due to a complex of unfortuitous developments, revenues have fallen well below amounts anticipated.

You may recall that my budget message last year indicated that tax revenues for 1970-71 were estimated at \$357 million and further that projections for the current biennium were based on a modest 9 per cent increase over past year's collections. Actual revenues thus far reported have required downward revisions of anticipated resources. Collections for the past fiscal year amounted to only \$350 million, off by \$7 million. Under our present uncertain economic conditions, revenue estimates for the current fiscal year have ranged from \$9 million to \$22 million less than had been hoped for in the next biennium. The total anticipated deficit for the biennium could range as high as \$46 million.

Strict measures were clearly called for.

Pursuant to the guidelines you have set, therefore, we have imposed a freeze on new State hirings, with the exception of public school teaching personnel and of positions vital to public welfare programs. Consonant with the program you have approved, executive exemption has also been made and will continue to be made on positions which must be filled for the protection of the life, health and safety of our citizenry.

The hiring moratorium, coupled with companion actions on workload increases and expansion funds can be expected to effect a savings of \$20 million during the biennium, provided it is strictly adhered to.

The anticipated deficit can be further reduced by revising existing public policy, governing investments of the Employees' Retirement System. The recommended action in this case can reduce the State's share of pension contributions by more than \$13 million.

The outcome of Congressional action on pending legislation on revenue-sharing with the States and other Federal funds could provide further fiscal relief. But there are no assurances of these Federal grants at this time.

Adjustments in other areas of revenue sources are possible to help ease the strain in which we find ourselves, and I know that you will be examining each possibility carefully in the days ahead.

In short, while the State is very much in a bind, if all the breaks that could develop fall in our favor, the two-year deficit presently projected can be reduced to a manageable level.

Nevertheless, it will take all we can muster, in imagination, in further innovation and in general understanding of our total problems, to do all that we need to do with what we can expect to have during the biennium.

But beyond the immediate difficulties, we must continue to bear in mind the longer term needs of our State and our people and our desires for the finest quality of life of any people anywhere.

Here again, the larger view is of value in setting our priorities.

You have recognized, in establishing a Temporary Commission on Population Stabilization, that we can take positive steps to provide for better balance among our Islands in terms of population distribution and economic and social activity.

It makes little sense that 82 per cent of our people should crowd themselves on less than 10 per cent of the land area of our State, creating a density of more than 1,070 persons per square mile on Oahu, while the Neighbor Islands have a combined density of only 25 persons per square mile. The problems on this island need appropriate and timely responses, but we should examine such responses closely lest they serve mainly to compound these same problems in the future.

More than ever, it is imperative that we take a balanced approach to our larger State goals. In a sense, the misfortunes of our times present an opportunity to reassess, to regroup our resources and to redress those imbalances while insuring further progress.

We can do this in our housing programs, in the development of our educational institutions, in meeting our total environmental needs, and in a

variety of other ways that call for State initiative.

Let us be entirely candid in examining this matter: If the State government does not take the initiative in this, no one else will. People are not about to resettle or remain where there is little, if any, prospects for a livelihood and opportunities therein must be diversified.

I am convinced, too, that our unemployment problems can be better met by viewing our goals in statewide perspective.

This approach should have an ameliorative effect also on a matter in which I know you share great concern: That of meeting our responsibility to those in need, a responsibility that constitutes a substantial share of our total budget. The sheer weight and increasing numbers and costs of our public welfare programs preclude the luxury of simple answers. Yet, there is an obvious relationship between this problem and that of urban growth and of population imbalances.

Ultimately, of course, the real answer lies in a full employment economy, one that makes the most prudent use of our total resources which offers the widest possible set of opportunities for self-development.

At this point in time, we can more readily achieve this state by first taking a close internal look at our present systems--at what we have, what we are doing, where we are doing it, why we are doing it, how, and by making the necessary adjustments in this period of regrouping in preparation for the longer haul ahead.

Your President and your Speaker, in their remarks to your respective bodies yesterday, sounded a common theme with which I can fully concur.

This is indeed a time to be stamped 'The Responsible Years.' This is indeed a time for each citizen to adopt the credo, 'Hawaii will do her best for me--if I will do my best for Hawaii.' This is indeed a time for consolidation and conservation, for reassessment and reevaluation. The programs which we have designed to contribute to the quality of life of our people, doing what we want them to do,

are we duplicating and are we wasting our resources? A reassessment and reevaluation.

We can afford little else; nay, we can afford nothing more. It is most opportune that our budget allocations are presently being phased into the P.P.B. system during this period. The transition to this method of program and financial management provides an excellent opportunity to thoroughly examine each element in our system, all of the methods by which we attain our goals, by which we support our programs and meet those programs, to insure its efficiency and compatibility with our larger goals.

In our previous meetings together, this Administration has offered for your consideration thoughts and suggestions relating to matters of vital concern to all aspects of life in Hawaii.

We have discussed proposals to better our educational institutions and in this, we will continue, in our public schools and our university, matters relating to tax reforms, to stimulate economic development commensurate with our resources and our abilities--to assert our rightful role in the larger sphere of Pacific affairs--to maintain balance in our environmental concerns so that the natural treasures we enjoy today will continue to be assets tomorrow, while insuring, at the same time, the kind of society that will provide the social, economic and political climate for optimum enjoyment of these resources to future generations.

We have noted also the cultural treasures which are uniquely Hawaii's and of the need to inculcate respect and appreciation for all of our values in our heritage so that the life of every citizen will be enriched, will have more meaning for himself and for his fellowmen. We have discussed all of these things in the context of Hawaii's past, her present and her future; we have discussed these and many more specific elements that affect your deliberations as components of public policy.

In each instance, we have emphasized that there is much in Hawaii that must be cherished and preserved, even as we meet the continuing need to adjust to change and to stay abreast; nay, to keep ahead, wherever possible, of the times. And

while change is essential to continued progress, as your Speaker noted so aptly, we must insure that the changes we institute are progressive and not regressive.

In all of these matters we have raised for public examination, your past responses and your initiatives have given us effective and well-conceived means for contributing to the perfection and the perfecting of our society. I have every confidence that, working together in concert, we will continue to achieve necessary improvements for the benefit of all of our citizens.

Your President and your Speaker noted yesterday that the Hawaii Legislature is rated seventh in the Nation by the Citizens Council on State Legislatures. Perhaps the Council had not been informed that your performance last year in the view of one expert was judged a lackluster one.

But notwithstanding the armchair critics who are so ready to find fault in others, and with all due respect to the judgment of the Citizens Council, I must observe that this ranking, as with the wire service ratings of our Rainbow basketball team, is somewhat misplaced. In my opinion, Hawaii belongs closer to the top, in both cases.

Neither is it by accident that this is so. Hawaii and her people have always been and, therefore, have always attracted the finest.

It is with confidence, then, that I close again with the invocation of Kamehameha the Third to the legislators of his day: 'May the Almighty enlighten your counsels and guide you in the paths of truth and justice.'

Mahalo and God Bless you."

The Senate President then stated:

"Governor Burns, thank you again for delivering to us a very well reasoned and thoughtful state of the State message.

Thank you also to the Speaker and the House for their hospitality to the Senate."

THIRD READING

Third Reading of H. B. No. 1680-72.

Representative O'Connor moved that H. B. No. 1680-72, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kimura.

Representative O'Connor then spoke in favor of the passage of the bill as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of this bill.

The subject matter of social study of custody of children in case of divorce was contained in an Act enacted last year. As a result of the experience of the Family Court in the State of Hawaii over the past six months, the Court has suggested that the provision so requiring mandatory counseling where there is a minor child of the marriage under the age of 14 be amended so as to make counseling discretionary on the part of the judge. Evidently if discretionary on the judge, this will allow the court to order social study and counseling under circumstances where there is some dispute concerning the custody of minor children.

For this reason I urge the passage of this bill seeking an amendment to the law making this particular provision discretionary rather than mandatory.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H. B. No. 1680-72 passed Third Reading by a vote of 48 ayes, with Representatives de la Cruz, Devereux and Judd being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H. B. No. 1680-72 had passed Third Reading at 11:30 o'clock a.m.

SECTION 2. Senate Bill No. 1014, S. D. 1, H. D. 1 is amended by appropriately renumbering Section 12 and Section 13 as Section 11 and Section 12 respectively."

Representative O'Connor moved that the amendment be adopted, seconded by Representative Kimura.

Representative O'Connor then explained the amendment as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, your Judiciary Committee, in considering the overall fabric of this domestic relations legislation, felt that in divorce cases the children should be represented in certain instances and felt strongly that their benefit and their future would be better served if attorneys were appointed by the court in some cases to represent them, exclusive of the parents who are involved in the divorce. For this reason, Section 11 was added to this bill by your Judiciary Committee.

After the bill was introduced on the floor, it became apparent that this narrow area of representation which is created by Section 11 might deprive the family courts of our State of the ability to appoint attorneys for children and other types of litigation. For example, paternity suits. For this reason, a re-evaluation was made of Section 11 and it became apparent that today the family courts of Hawaii have the ability and do appoint attorneys in situations which this particular piece of legislation is directed at.

Further, it was difficult in this area because the family court budget today does not have the funds to appoint attorneys for indigents from the family court. This matter is being handled by the Legal Aid Society here in Honolulu and by other attorneys elsewhere of like caliber.

For this reason Mr. Speaker, after deliberation, the amendment proposed to this Senate Bill No. 1014, SD 1, HD 1, is to remove Section 11 entirely."

Representative J. Garcia then inquired whether Representative O'Connor would yield to a question.

Representative O'Connor replied in the affirmative.

Representative J. Garcia inquired:

“Should the amendment be adopted, would this in any way preclude any youngster from getting legal advice at a time of a divorce proceeding?”

Representative O'Connor replied:

“Not at all. The youngsters today are being represented by attorneys. In the instance where there is no attorney for the youngsters, the court today is appointing such attorneys and the Legal Aid Society is being appointed by the Court to represent indigent children.”

The motion to adopt the amendment was put by the Chair and carried by a voice vote.

By unanimous consent, consideration

of S. B. No. 1014, as amended, was deferred until tomorrow, February 10, 1972.
