

## 28TH DAY

Monday, February 28, 1972

The Speaker presided.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Consideration of S. B. No. 310, as amended, on Third Reading, which had been deferred to this day.

Representative O'Connor moved that S. B. No. 310, as amended, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kimura.

Representative O'Connor then rose to speak in favor of the motion as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of Senate Bill No. 310, SD1, HD2.

Mr. Speaker, too long the drug laws of the State of Hawaii have needed modification. Too long has the process of drug manufacture, wholesaling, prescription and other handlings of drugs which might be dangerous to the community gone unchecked.

The passage of this bill will enact a comprehensive method of handling the paper work in drug manufacture, drug prescription and in pharmacies at a State level.

Under this particular bill, drugs will now be traced from the time of order until the time of legitimate consumption.

By enacting this type of regulatory statute, it is hopeful that the illicit drug traffic will be cut to a minimum and many of the problems which we have today in Hawaii which stem from illicit drug traffic will be eliminated.

The bill is based upon a Federal model which puts drugs into five separate categories based upon the potential harm to users. The five categories are established in Washington by the Department of Health, Education and Welfare. We have followed these categories quite closely in Hawaii except in the areas of barbituates and amphetamines, where due to local knowledge, your Committee found that these drugs are heavily abused in Hawaii and are more dangerous than the suggested categories from Washington. For that reason, we have advanced these drugs from schedule 3 in the bill to schedule 2, making their possession and their regulation more stringent.

Mr. Speaker, I strongly recommend to this body the passage of this bill to

update the drug laws of our State.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker.”

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and S. B. No. 310, as amended, passed Third Reading by a vote of 48 ayes to 1 no, with Representative Lee voting no, and Representatives de la Cruz and Judd being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that S. B. No. 310 had passed Third Reading at 11:35 o'clock a.m.

Garcia, Inaba, Kaneshiro, Kato, Kihano, Kishinami, Kondo, Kunimura, Lee, Lunasco, Morioka, Nakama, O'Connor, Oda, Roehrig, Soares, Suwa, Uechi, Unemori, Ushijima, Wakatsuki, Wasai, Wedemeyer, Wong, Yap, Yim, Young and Beppu.

A resolution (H. R. No. 199) requesting the Department of Education and the Department of Personnel Services

to grant tenure to educational assistants, departmental assistants, general aides and follow-up aides was jointly offered by Representatives Wasai, Akizaki, de la Cruz, Duponte, Iha, Inaba, Kaneshiro, Kato, Kawakami, Kihano, Kimura, Kondo, Kunimura, Lee, Nakama, O'Connor, Roehrig, Suwa, Takamine, Ushijima, Wakatsuki, Wedemeyer, Wong, Yap, Yim and Young.

A concurrent resolution (H.C.R. No. 27) requesting the Governor to proclaim annually a "Safe Boating Week" was jointly offered by Representatives Wedemeyer, Akizaki, de la Cruz, Duponte, R. Garcia, Iha, Inaba, Kato, Kawakami, Kihano, Lee, Nakama, Roehrig, Ushijima and Beppu.

At 11:38 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 11:40 o'clock a.m.

#### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Consideration of Conf. Com. Rep. No. 2 on H. B. No. 20, as amended, which had been deferred to this day.

Representative O'Connor moved that the report of the majority of the Committee be adopted and H. B. No. 20, as amended, pass Final Reading, seconded by Representative Kimura.

Representative O'Connor then spoke in favor of H. B. No. 20, as amended, as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, approximately 100 years ago in the State of Hawaii, the first penal code for the State was adopted. At that time, it was a composite of a variety of measures which has grown up over the short period of time when criminology and penology had become a problem in a growing kingdom. Since that time, that penal code has been changed in a hodge-podge fashion, often without explanation, resulting today in the criminal law of the State of Hawaii being mixed-up, confusing and oftentimes difficult to understand. The judges, people accused of crimes, attorneys and other people in the penology system are oftentimes without ability to understand and without ability to properly utilize, charge or dispense justice to the person

charged with crimes.

For that reason, Mr. Speaker, approximately 7 years ago, an effort was initiated to revise the entire criminal law of the State of Hawaii. That effort has resulted in my being able to stand here today and move for the final passage of the bill which is under consideration.

At this time, Mr. Speaker, I think it will be well for me to mention some names of people who have given unselfishly and without hesitation of their time, intelligence and effort in arriving at the product which is before us. First of all, I would like to mention the names of those individuals who served on the Committee on Penal Law Revision of the Judicial Council of Hawaii. This was a Committee which was convened approximately 5 years ago. The Chairman was Masato Doi. This Committee took from many statutes of many different states, ideas, concepts, background—took from our own criminal law from the days of the Kingdom of Hawaii, the Republic of Hawaii and then the State—and put together a comprehensive document which codified many many phases of the criminal law.

These men and women included Mr. J. Russell Cades, attorney; Mr. Mack Hamada, who at that time was the Assistant Prosecutor for the City and County of Honolulu; Mr. Arthur Holbrook; Judge Samuel P. King; Pat Putnam of our own Legislative Reference Bureau; Dr. Allan Saunders of the University of Hawaii and Mr. Myer Symonds, the attorney.

They put in two years of work, countless hours of argument, talking, threshing through different ideas and different problems. I think a tremendous amount of thanks should go to Mr. Don Galbreath who was the reporter for that Committee and did much of the actual writing of the basic document. The document which was formally drafted by this Committee on penal law revision was brought to this legislature in 1970. Because it came late in that session, the legislature at that time established an interim committee to work on this particular document. Interim work was begun on the penal code by the Judiciary Committee of the House between the 1970 and 1971 session and when the 1971 session began, the Judiciary

Committee of the House and the Senate continued work on this matter.

I would like to acknowledge the tremendous effort put into this document by the Judiciary Committee of your House. The Judiciary Committee has spent hours and hours of time, both in committee work and in drafting, mulling over the various problems which have been posed, going through different offenses and trying to make rational, logical decisions on the social problems raised by the draft given to us by the Committee on Penal Law Revision. The members of the Committee are: Representatives Kimura, Roehrig, Sakima, Wedemeyer, Lee, Yap, Wong, Duponte, Kawakami, Judd, Yamada, Medeiros, Carroll and Aduja.

At this time, I would like to compliment those Representatives who served in that interim committee—Representatives Kawakami, Roehrig, Judd and Yamada. Representative Judd is not with us this morning, but Mr. Speaker, a tremendous amount of thanks should go to him as an individual because he has spent hours and hours of time working on this piece of legislation.

I would also like to thank my staff. It may seem like a small thing but when you stop to think about a secretary typing 400 pages of a bill, not once, not twice, but three and sometimes four times, it stretches into long, long hours of effort, and several secretaries have worked in my staff last year and this year and have done that, together with the attorneys who have been assigned to the House Judiciary Committee.

Speaking of the bill itself, Mr. Speaker, the bill goes into all sorts of aspects of the criminal law. It touches on procedures, it touches on penology, it touches on corrections, it defines and redefines many of the crimes themselves that we have been bothered with over the years in this State. It takes the old 100 years code and it makes of it a modern, updated correctional code which will be of tremendous benefit to the State. It redefines and establishes firmly such crimes as murder, manslaughter, negligent homicide, assault, kidnapping, unlawful imprisonment, criminal coercion, rape, sodomy, other sex crimes, burglary, trespass, property damage, littering, theft,

robbery, forgery, deceptive business practices, commercial bribery, escape, bail jumping, perjury, bribery of witnesses, jurors, disorderly conduct, prostitution, obscenity, pornography, gambling, drug and many, many other ancillary smaller crimes which have required definition in this State for years and years and have not up to this time ever been defined. In short, Mr. Speaker, it is a thoroughly comprehensive, completely integrated criminal code of which Hawaii has had vital need for and it should serve well for hopefully the next 100 years in this State.

I would like to speak briefly on certain sections of this bill which have raised some controversy. Mr. Speaker, the drug section of this bill has been completely redrafted by your interim committee. It ties in with a proposed bill from the Federal government which we enacted in this Body last week—the Uniform Control Substances Act. It keeps the rationale which Judge Masato Doi's committee initially proposed that the pusher should be the person primarily at fault and primarily prosecuted and sentenced in such a thing as a drug abuse or drug possession charge. This rationale is carried through together with the rationale that has been advocated by the Uniform Control Substances Act.

Many of the comments made in this Body when this bill came before this Body for final enactment last year were considered strongly by your interim committee and I am happy to say that some of the objections raised on this floor by certain of the Representatives last year were taken into consideration and if they look carefully at the drug act, they will see that those particular problems which were raised here no longer exist and the drug section of the bill is comprehensive and well thought through.

The sex laws adopt the approach that a consensual act between consenting adults in the area of sex should not be prosecuted. This has been the philosophy of the prosecuting attorneys of the various counties and rather than have a hypocritical situation exist in the State where we had laws on the books such as fornication and adultery which were never prosecuted, these laws have been removed and the sex laws of the State have been tailored to fit the crimes of

abuse and physical violence where prosecution is required and deterrent needed.

In the area of murder and the sentencing for murder, we have followed the approach to modern penology where there is no sentence of life without parole for any crime except a crime of heinous murder and the interim committee followed the lead of the House last year in retaining the murder crimes which involve the killing of a police officer in the performance of his duty, the witness of a murder case, the murder by a hired killer, murder by one in prison as those crimes which will continue to have the sentence of life without parole. But because of an input received from the men now incarcerated in Oahu Prison, we have provided for the ability at the end of 20 years, where the Board of Pardons and Paroles can automatically forward to the Governor an application for commutation of those sentences and if a prisoner has lived a life of productivity without blemish, he can hopefully at the end of 20 years, have his sentence commuted.

I would like to speak for a minute, Mr. Speaker, on the gambling provision in the law. The gambling provision in the law is a provision which has to do with the current philosophy and the current practice in our community as regards the crime of gambling. Gambling is proscribed and the use of gambling devices and gambling of any nature is a crime. We have, however, provided an affirmative defense to the crime of gambling. The affirmative defense is that of participating in a game which is purely social, from which no one derives a profit, from which no establishment nor organization derives any sort of benefits whatsoever. Because of the concern felt in the community due to the fact that Oahu, Hawaii, are tourist resort areas, it is made clear in the committee report that this type of gambling cannot be conducted in bars, hotels or any other public place. It could not, under the definition that we have utilized, provide the accommodation necessary for such gambling. I have noticed, Mr. Speaker, that there are some concern raised recently by certain of the Police Department concerning this provision of the penal code. I am happy to report, Mr. Speaker, that this concern is unnecessary because the police work in this area will not be changed one wit by the gambling

section which we proposed.

The social gambling area is a gambling area only having to do with a defense which is an affirmative defense. Therefore, policemen will still be able to raid, make charges, and bring to prosecution anyone that they find involved in a gambling game of whatever nature. The burden is upon the individual concerned to raise the affirmative defense provided if he so desires.

I have had communications, as has my co-chairman of the interim committee, Senator Ushijima, with the police people involved and I have pointed out this particular aspect of the gambling crime to them which they seemingly overlook when they made certain criticisms to certain legislators recently.

Mr. Speaker, we will propose as an effective date for this particular piece of legislation, January 1, 1973. This will provide time for the bill to be printed. It will provide time also for it to be read again and it will allow the bill to be enacted shortly before the convening of the next session of the legislature. Therefore, we will have two full benefits in having this period of time established. We will have the benefit of allowing the new criminal code of the State to have wide dissemination throughout the State and simultaneously the effective date will be close enough to the next session so that if there are any provisions in the code which badly need rectification, it can be rectified in the next session of the legislature.

As you have seen, Mr. Speaker, the drafting and proofreading and handling of a piece of legislation of this nature is indeed quite difficult. We have had to send the bill back several times to have corrections made and hopefully, it is completely corrected and worth the passage of today. But, if there are any errors on it and I trust there are not, they can be corrected in the next session.

Mr. Speaker, I ask that the members of this Body look carefully at all the work that has gone into this particular piece of legislation, look carefully at its provisions, realize that literally hundreds of people have testified regarding this piece of legislation. I ask that my fellow members of this Body vote aye for this particular piece of legislation.

Thank you."

Representative Yim then spoke in favor of the bill as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I am in full accord with most of the provisions contained in House Bill No. 20, HD 1, SD 1, CD 2, but with one exception; namely, those provisions under the heading 'Gambling Offenses'.

Mr. Speaker, I can appreciate that the bill as written attempts to permit social gambling like golf bets and home poker games though professional gambling remains a crime in spite of the arguments set forth by the chairman of the Judiciary Committee. It is that part pertaining to professional gambling that I am most concerned. I am still not certain whether this bill does control professional gambling. I am not certain whether this bill is but a beginning for professional gambling to flourish in Hawaii and I am not certain whether all the loopholes are covered so that professional gambling in no way is actually being legalized.

Mr. Speaker, because of these uncertainties, I do have reservations on those provisions relating to gambling offenses and I do hope if this bill passes this year, that next year, this Honorable Body should review all those provisions under the heading, 'Gambling Offenses'."

Representative Aduja then spoke in favor of the bill, as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I direct your attention to marijuana possession. Since the time we started debating the topic when this Body made it a felony, I maintained then that possession of marijuana must be treated as a medical case and not a criminal case. Throughout the years when possession of marijuana was a felony, a clamor for a closer look at the problem was the order of the day as more young people were caught by the claws of this heavy penalty. This resulted in the passage of a law allowing the judges the discretion to find the violation a felony or a misdemeanor.

Much has been written about marijuana and the effects on the individual. For a while, reports indicated that there is no lasting effect on the person and that it is less harmful in comparison to users of hard liquor. Also

demonstrated is a finding that users of marijuana do not necessarily graduate to harder drugs. True, present day tests made of animals all show bad effects but these findings are not medically binding on human beings.

Mr. Speaker, let me assure you that I am not defending or suggesting the legalization of marijuana. Far from it. I see, however, that marijuana is part of a lifestyle and we cannot legislate a control, for this attempt would be futile.

Mr. Speaker, the penal code's approach to possession of marijuana is a step in the right direction. Possession of an ounce of marijuana is a petty misdemeanor and carries a jail sentence of a maximum of 30 days or a fine of not more than \$500. This change carries no stigma. It will free the circuit court, for I understand marijuana is responsible for the heavy workload of the criminal section.

The beauty of the entire drug section in the penal code, Mr. Speaker, is the graduating penalty that becomes heavier depending upon the quantity and the dangerous effects of drugs on a person, especially to the minors. It attacks the heart of the drug problem by penalizing the dope peddler or the pusher. Catch the pusher, punish him severely, and you will reduce the drug problem.

I shall vote aye on this, Mr. Speaker. Thank you."

Representative Sakima then stated that he is in full accord with the passage of House Bill No. 20, as amended, but that he had some reservations on the social gambling aspect of the bill.

His concern was what influence social gambling will have on the youngsters. He suggested that this Body look into this section of the bill next session after watching what happens when social gambling is permitted.

Representative J. Garcia then spoke against the passage of the bill as follows:

"At the outset, Mr. Speaker, it is only fair to commend the Chairman of the Judiciary Committee, his committee members, and all those who labored so strenuously during these past years to evolve such a document. But it is also

true, Mr. Speaker, that sometimes one small loophole can create havoc. I speak specifically against the social gambling feature of this document.

The Chairman of the Judiciary Committee alluded to the fact that the Police Department, though expressing concern in the past, do not have any concern on this subject. But let me point out to you, Mr. Speaker, that the Chiefs of Police of every island of every county are against the socialized gambling aspects of the penal code. They expressed their concern unequivocally and they reiterated instance after instance that the passage of the penal code is actually the first step toward the legalization of gambling in the State of Hawaii.

Take the Police Department of the County of Maui. Chief of Police Abraham Aiona stated, and I quote, 'The legalization of social gambling would, in my own personal feelings, lend weight to the promotion of illegal gambling activities which would certainly become prone to infiltration by organized crime interests. The gambling laws under the proposed penal code would encourage organized crime activities in Hawaii, having the benefit of a legal umbrella under which to operate.'

Let us go to the Island of Kauai and I again quote out of context. Chief Roy K. Hiram states, 'In my opinion, relaxation of gambling laws will encourage organized criminal growth, facilities and paraphernalia will be in demand and can be legally provided by organized criminal elements. Increasing numbers of long shots will appear to facilitate the heavy losers. Organized crimes would invest in seemingly reputable businesses, hotels, bars, restaurants and other businesses to accommodate the increased numbers of players.'

From the City and County of Honolulu, Deputy Chief Charles Duarte states, 'It is our contention that the gambling laws proposed will most certainly encourage organized crime in Hawaii. Gambling is big business to organized crime. Where law enforcement may be hampered or frustrated in enforcing gambling provisions, as we believe this law will, the forces of organized crime are quick to move into the area. Last year when the possibility of gambling was mentioned, more than one

mainland connection began to make plans to move into our State.'

From the Island of Hawaii, Chief of Police Fergustrom states, 'We are irrevocably against relaxing gambling laws in any way. It is certainly not in the best interest of our people of the majority of the population. Relaxing our laws can only lead to more lawlessness and build up our criminal elements. We do not need this in our community. We have a heavy enough load at the present time. Passing the proposed gambling laws under the penal code would only tend to increase the organized crime element in the State of Hawaii.'

The United States Attorney in Hawaii, Robert Fukuda, stated, 'The practical effect of the social gambling aspect in the penal code will be to legalize gambling by making the enforcements of gambling laws virtually impossible.'

These are documents which were sent to Senator Andy Anderson, Minority Floor Leader, in the Senate. We have been very fortunate to have been able to get copies of these letters.

I want to point out the gravity of this section to members of this House because those of us who have served as public servants over the years know that it is only wishful thinking to say let us pass a bill today; next year or the year after, we will amend it if we find it to be defective. We know laws that have been passed and amended, have taken years before they materialized. If this measure passes with this obvious defect, you can be certain that the legalized criminal elements of our State would do everything humanly possible to not to have this section amended. This section actually, Mr. Speaker, is protection for the defendant and not the prosecutor.

What about the effect of the home as one of the Representatives raised a few moments ago. Certainly, socialized gambling is taking place today--we all know that. It takes place on the golf course, it takes place in our clubs but what would be the effect when people know that you don't have to worry about being pinched because the cops will find it hard to find who the organized gambler is as against the one who is just an amateur.

I ask the members of this Honorable Body to take this section into cognizance because one small loophole in a very large document can make a difference of whether or not legalized gambling comes to Hawaii or stays away from our shores.

I, therefore, ask every member of this Honorable Body to vote down House Bill No. 20.

Thank you."

Representative Roehrig, in speaking for the passage of the bill, stated:

"Mr. Speaker, the proposed penal code offered to the people of the State of Hawaii is most up-to-date, well thought of fabric, of criminal law procedure which I feel can be found anywhere in this country of ours.

This Conference Committee draft represents the product of a number of years and thousands of men hours, time, effort, oftentimes, frustrations, and the part of the general public, the Committee on the Penal Law Revision of the Judiciary Council of Hawaii, research staff, members of the legislature and many others. I believe that the end result of our collective effort is outstanding. It has been said that the life of man and the law must be kept closely in touch one with the other. We can adapt the life of a man to the present law, then you must adjust the law to meet the life of man. The only point in reforming the law from time to time it to make our life work to be more bearable.

It is well to mention here some of the highlights of our efforts as I see them as I had the good fortune to serve on the interim committee and the conference committee to consider this matter.

For the first time in the history of our State, we will codify the so-called man's state of mind in order to charge the accused of a criminal offense. To those practitioners here in this august body, they can tell one and all that in the past the case law in this area is a hodge-podge of conflicting decisions. We have provided for the punishment of white collar crimes, including the criminal responsibility of cooperation. We have codified diverse areas of case law on the various defenses such as self defense,



justification, duress. We have provided an up-to-date definition of the defense of insanity together with humane commitment procedure. We have mandated that in the case where a defendant is less than 22 years of age and he has been convicted of a crime, before sentencing can be pronounced by the Judge, there shall be a pre-sentence report prepared. This is particularly important if we are to nip in the bud a young man's potential career of crime. We have provided the court with the power to dismiss its own motion, criminal charges when in the court's opinion the charges although technically sound, may appear frivolous or insignificant under the circumstances.

In the area of sentencing for offensive murder, we have been given special consideration to four areas of particularly gruesome homicide and provided punishment accordingly. Life imprisonment without parole, subject to the review by the Governor after 20 years of incarceration. There were legislators who felt that punishment in this area to be more severe. Likewise, there were others that felt it should be less. The proposed punishment in this area, I feel, is a fair resolution of our collective conscientious.

In the area of sexual criminal conduct, we have deleted certain sexual offenses such as fornication and adultery. While I personally would not have preferred the decriminalization of the offense of adultery, I am nevertheless satisfied that the overall fabric which we have woven into this bill, the community will not be ill-fed by our action.

In the area of gambling, much alluded to this morning, Mr. Speaker, we have finally given recognition to the hypocritical 'ostrich with his head in the sand' attitude with which we have approached the community's activities as regards social gambling in the homes, on the golf course, sporting events, you name it. I think that one aspect should be clearly understood and that is the concept of social gambling is a defense to prosecution. We have not said per se that gambling is legal. We anticipate that it is going to be business as usual for the Police Department. They have the opportunity, they have the manpower and the ability to break up any game where gambling supposedly is taking

place and then it is incumbent upon those who are participating in the game to come forward and prove by a preponderance of the evidence that it was not hard-core gambling, that it was a social game, that there was no rake-off, that it was not professionally organized.

I think this is critical. We have provided a mechanism for the neighborhood poker game on Saturday night the opportunity to enjoy comradeship, to be given a forum where criminal implication will not persevere. And I think that, as regards the young people in the community, one of the things they have said about us adults is that we are hypocrites. And I think that in the area of gambling is one area where we have been hypocritical with the young people. They see us doing it at the present time, they know it goes on and they know it is against the law but yet we do it anyway. I think this will go some measure to assure the young people that we are going to be honest with them once and for all. If we are going to have social gambling, we are going to do it legally in our homes and we are going to decriminalize it.

I would hope that in our tourist destination areas, we will not have gambling niches. And I think by the mechanism we have provided in this bill, that any fears will not arise, Mr. Speaker.

For that reason, I urge all members of this Honorable Body to vote in favor of this measure. Thank you very much."

Representative O'Connor then rose and made a few comments as a result of a previous address by Representative Garcia, as follows:

"I find it strange, Mr. Speaker, that we, last year, took the combined Judiciary Committees of the House and the Senate to Kauai, Maui, Hawaii for the purpose of listening to testimonies. At each one of those meetings, we had the Chiefs of Police of each of those counties come to testify and not one of them said a single thing about gambling. To have those Police Chiefs write letters to a Senator who is not a member of that committee or those committees at the time, nor served in the capacity of one inquiring into this particular matter, it is strange that they would write letters as they did at a time when the interim



committee work and the Conference Committee worked and this particular measure was completed.

I have investigated this particular situation as I investigated this input to that particular Senator from the Honolulu Police Department and I find that there is a complete lack of understanding either generated by the inquiry because I did not know what the inquiry was or generated by the lack of understanding of the individuals in their answers.

Mr. Speaker, we had police officers from the Honolulu Police Department at almost every single one of our committee meetings, interim and last year. We amended the proposal given us by Judge Masato Doi in this area to make it extremely more conservative as the Judicial Council suggested. The Judicial Council suggested that in gambling, any participant in any game who did not get a rake-off of the game should be a player. We felt that this was an extremely liberal attitude to take in gambling and we, as responsible legislators, realizing that this tremendous hypocrisy exists in this community concerning actual social gambling activities, amended this section to a point where it is restrictive in the extreme.

As pointed out by a previous speaker, gambling in itself is not changed by this affirmative defense. For example, if a police officer sees a fight and charges the participants with assault and battery, it is up to the participants to then raise a defense or self defense, if they so desire, and they must prove that defense. In this instance, the gambling statute remains intact and it is up to the person charged to raise a defense that he is a player under the strict terms laid out in our statute, and the game in which he was participating was restrictive. This is not an element of crime, this is an affirmative defense. Take, for example, the letter written to Senator Anderson by one of the Police Chiefs. It says the following 'the proposed amendment contained within Part III will in our opinion be more difficult to enforce than the present statutes.' Presently all those present may be arrested as participating in a gambling game. That the proposed code will require the officers, prior to making any arrest, determine if the game where the money is being lost or won is a social

game or one in which gambling is being promoted or advanced, is absolutely incorrect. It is a complete misunderstanding of the law as drafted and the law which we hope will be enacted. The law provided no such thing. It allows the police officer to make an arrest in gambling exactly as he does today. If he walks into a situation where there are cards or dice or money involved, he may make an arrest. It is up to the participants to raise as an affirmative defense the fact that the game may have been social and in deciding on whether or not that affirmative defense should stick, the Judge or the jury before whom he is brought, may take many factors into consideration. Such factors as whether or not the people involved had been involved with the take or rake-off of the game or whether there was rent being paid for the premise, or whether there was a pot of money set to one side which obviously was for the purpose of doing something other than simply gambling.

Mr. Speaker, I would suggest that there is a complete lack of understanding as regards the section proposed and the affirmative defense as defined in our bill. For these reasons, Mr. Speaker, I trust that this talk has clarified a little bit the circumstances under which this narrow defense may be raised. I urge the members of this Body to vote aye for this piece of legislation.

Thank you."

Representative J. Garcia then responded to Representative O'Connor's comments, as follows:

"Let me point out at the outset that Senator Anderson made inquiries of the various Chiefs of Police. Why they did not testify at meetings is inconsequential. Of importance is what they have written and what they have stated.

Let us take a good look at some of the arguments that were advanced about this being social gambling. It defines a player and everything else. Actually what you have is a downhill trend because you do not define socialized gambling as such, you do not define the player as such. It begins to come in a downward trend. Also, there can be five professional gamblers gambling. There will be no money evident--they may be playing with chips and there isn't an abundance of

money changing hands at the gambling game. Who is going to say this is not social gambling.

Irrespective of the arguments that have been advanced here, I ask one simple question, can all of the law enforcement agencies in this State be wrong and only those who worked on this document right? I think the matter is serious enough for us to take a very good look at this section because once we open the door, once the horse has disappeared, it is going to be pretty hard for the State to close that door again."

The motion to adopt the report of the majority of the Committee and to pass H. B. No. 20, as amended, on Final Reading

It has come to mean that other obligations have been placed on our youth at this age.

In the last legislative session, this Honorable Body, together with many other states in this country, went along with an amendment to the United States Constitution which changed the age of voting to 18 in this State and all State elections.

This was to follow the amendment made by the Senate and the House of the United States changing the voting age in all Federal elections to 18. Following this trend, eight other states have changed their age of majority to 18 within the past year or two.

Today, Mr. Speaker, I urge the members to vote in favor of this bill in following the trend which is sweeping across the nation and to give the young adults who so richly deserve and who so tremendously need the obligations, rights and privileges of adulthood at the age of 18.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representatives Aduja, Uechi and Ushijima then spoke in favor of the passage of the bill.

The motion was put by the Chair and S. B. No. 1318-72 passed Third Reading by a vote of 45 ayes to 4 noes, with Representatives Ajifu, Lee, Oda and Yamada voting no and Representatives Judd and Kato being excused.
