### THIRD READING

Third Reading of H.B. No. 323.

On motion by Representative Kawakami, seconded by Representative A. Chong and carried, H.B. No. 323, having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 49 ayes, with Representatives Kunimura and Wedemeyer being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 323 had passed Third Reading at 11:59 o'clock a.m.

### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Consideration of H.B. No. 325 on Third Reading, which had been deferred to this day.

Representative Kawakami moved that H.B. No. 325, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative A. Chong.

Representative Kawakami then rose and spoke in favor of the passage of the bill, as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, House Bill 325 is a plain bill—not glamorous. It seeks to accomplish a plain objective—fairness.

It deals with public land leases. It does two things: One, it allows a farmer to have a 45-year lease on public land if he raises tree crops such as citrus, avocado, coffee, mangoes and guava. Two, it

requires the government to pay this farmer for the value of his trees if the government cancels the lease for some public purpose.

How does this differ from the law we have today? One, at present, only the farmer raising macadamia nuts is allowed a 45-year lease. Two, if the government now cancels a lease, the farmer is paid only for an unharvested crop but nothing for his trees. Is this fair?

The law giving the 45-year lease to macadamia nut farmers was written with the recognition that the trees require much investment and several years of growth before producing a first crop. As you know, citrus, coffee and other tree-crop orchards also require several years of growth—some seven or eight years—before producing the first fruit. This bill simply recognizes that other tree-crops, not just macadamia nuts, require longer initial periods of growth and that these other tree-crops, once mature, like macadamia nuts, produce fruit for many years—sometimes 20 or 30 years.

This bill does exclude bananas and papayas. Whether bananas and papayas are trees or not trees is debatable. That is not the point here! Papayas and bananas are excluded because they produce fruit in a very short time and their total years of production are few. If the government needs the land for a school or housing, the farmer can be notified and arrangements made so these short-term plants can have their full bearing period.

We talk a lot about saving agriculture and saving open space. This bill goes beyond talk. This bill says to the avocado farmer: 'I believe in you. I believe in what you are trying to do. Because I believe in you, I will allow you to lease public land for a long enough period to pay back your heavy investment in capital and time and labor. I will give you enough time to succeed. And if I find that the public need for your land is greater than your need, I will at least pay you for your trees.'

For such a plain bill—aimed mostly at fairness and faith—it seems to have generated a lot of interest, particularly from my colleagues across the aisle. I appreciate their interest in agriculture and applaud their efforts to move agriculture forward in this State. I am sure the

farmers in Hawaii are pleased to know they have the support of both the Democrats and Republicans.

Mr. Speaker, since we are united in this effort, I, therefore, urge the members of this Honorable Body to vote 'aye' on House Bill 325."

At this time, Representative Aduja, on a point of information, inquired if tree-crops would also include ornamental trees such as coconut, Christmas trees, douglas fir and bonsai trees.

In answer to Representative Aduja's question, Representative Kawakami replied that the bill refers to tree-crop orchards and that it is assumed that they are fruit bearing trees.

At this point, Representative Wong rose to speak against the bill, as follows:

Mr. Speaker, I think the intent and purpose of helping our farmers in getting a fair share for their labor is an admirable one. However, Mr. Speaker, I would be remiss if I did not express my concern to this Honorable Body in the section dealing with the residual value of trees taken.

Mr. Speaker, I feel that this particular section is not clear. We are talking here about a value on a residual kind of productivity. It is my feeling that what we have done here in this measure is to predict the life expectancy of tree-crops in Hawaii by designating it to 45 years. I think a more reasonable approach, Mr. Speaker, would be that the bill be amended to read that consideration should be given to the life expectancy of the crop under discussion. Because of this concern, Mr. Speaker, I feel that I must vote against this measure.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

At 12:08 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

At 12:24 o'clock p.m., the House of Representatives reconvened.

Representative Ajifu, on a point of information, inquired if Norfolk pine is included as a tree crop.

Representative Kawakami replied that the Department of Land and Natural Resources has taken the position that, although the Norfolk pine may take about two years for maturity, after the main tree is cut, suckers appear and the tree runs into perpetuity.

Representative Ajifu then stated that banana is also regenerative. He further stated that after the main stump is chopped, suckers appear. Representative Ajifu inquired as to the rationale of the deletion of bananas from this particular section.

Representative Kawakami then stated that bananas and papayas are considered short-term crops. He further stated that the Department of Land and Natural Resources, in its withdrawal of leased land for public purpose, can notify these farmers that certain portions of the land will be taken so no replanting should be done. He also stated that, as far as bananas are concerned, if it can be guaranteed that bananas can send up suckers every year, they probably could go along with including bananas as a tree crop.

The motion was put by the Chair and, roll call having been requested, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 325 passed Third Reading by a vote of 41 ayes to 8 noes, with Representatives Ajifu, Cobb, R. Garcia, Hapai, Oda, Soares, Wong and Young voting no and Representatives Kunimura and Wedemeyer being excused.

The Chair here directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 325 passed Third Reading at 12:29 o'clock p.m.

At 12:36 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:30 o'clock a.m. tomorrow, February 15, 1973.

The Chair here directed the Clerk to note that H.B. Nos. 338, 615, 327, 329 and 334 had passed Second Reading at 11:25 o'clock a.m.

Representative Young, for the Committee on Housing, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 55) approving the intent and purpose of H.R. No. 12 and recommending its adoption with certain amendments.

Representative Aki, on a point of information, inquired what is meant by "community development programs."

Representative Young then stated:

"Mr. Speaker, in our State the Legislature and the administration have long realized that housing cannot be separated from the total community environment. The federal government also has come to recognize that simply building houses without paying attention to other related factors is not sound. Therefore, the housing programs begun under our great President Franklin Delano Roosevelt have been complemented by new programs such as urban renewal, neighborhood facility grants, basic water and sewage facility grants, public facility loans and open space grants. All of these community development programs are affected by the President's freeze. To ignore these programs and concentrate only on housing would be a return to a dismal past. Let us instead face forward to the future and take positive steps to make it a bright future for all our people."

Representative Aki then stated:

"Mr. Speaker, my concern is that these

are very important programs we are talking about which are very beneficial to our State and its people, especially to the low-income families. I wonder, Mr. Speaker, if it would not be better to treat each of these areas as a separate resolution. We are all very much aware that housing is our number one problem in the State of Hawaii today. By adding on other programs to this resolution, I am afraid that we might de-emphasize our real problem of housing and thereby lessen its chances of support in Congress and with the President. Mr. Speaker, I think we should send to the President only the strongest and clearest resolution possible and this is why the four members of the Committee signed with reservation. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

At this point, Representative Young spoke in favor of the resolution as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, House Resolution 12, House Draft 1, expresses our concern over President Nixon's order not to approve any new commitments of federal funds for housing and community development programs. The freeze on funds applies to programs of the Federal Department of Housing and Urban Development, the Farm Home Administration, as well as programs in several other agencies. The State faces a serious financial situation with heavy deficits likely to occur and cannot assume the burden of putting up the money which the federal government normally provides. Our need for more and better housing at prices within the reach of all income groups, particularly low and moderate, have never been greater. We must meet this need. We cannot do it alone.

This resolution recognizes the plain fact of life that housing and community development programs must continue to be a joint federal-state program. I urge the members to support the resolution."

On motion by Representative Young, seconded by Representative Yuen and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.R. No. 12, as amended, was adopted by a roll call vote of 49 ayes, with Representatives Iha and Wedemeyer being excused.

### UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Consideration of H.B. No. 651 on Third Reading which had been deferred to this day.

Representative Lunasco moved that H.B. No. 651, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Takamine.

Representative Saiki then offered the following amendment to H.B. No. 651:

"Section 1. House Bill 651, H.D. 1 is amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. Section 387-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended to read:

'Section 387-2. Minimum wages. [From and after January 1, 1970] (a) After June 30, 1973 and until June 30, 1974, every employer, except as the director [of labor and industrial relations] may provide pursuant to section 387-9 and except as provided in this [paragraph] subsection and subsection (b) hereof, shall pay to each employee employed by him wages at the rate of not less than [\$1.60] \$1.80 per hour. After June 30, 1974 and until June 30, 1975, every employer, except as the director may provide pursuant to section 387-9 and except as provided by this subsection and subsection (b) hereof, shall pay to each employee employed by him wages at the rate of not less than \$2.00 per hour. After June 30, 1975, and until June 30, 1976, every employer, except as the director may provide pursuant to section 387-9 and except as provided by this subsection and subsection (b) hereof, shall pay to each employee employed by him wages at the

rate of not less than \$2.20 per hour. After June 30, 1976, every employer, except as the director may provide pursuant to section 387-9 and except as provided by this subsection and subsection (b) hereof, shall pay to each employee employed by him wages at the rate of not less than \$2.40 per hour. The hourly wage of a tipped employee may be deemed to be increased on account of tips if [such] the employee is paid [at least \$1.40 per hour] not less than twenty cents below the applicable minimum wage by his employer and the combined amount he receives from his employer and in tips is at least fifty cents more than the applicable minimum wage.

(b) Subsection (a) hereof and paragraph 387-9(1) to the contrary notwithstanding, any employer may employ a person who is (i) under the age of eighteen, or (ii) who is a full-time student for at least five months of the calendar year during which the employment occurs and is under the age of twenty-one, at a special minimum wage rate not less than 80 per centum of the minimum wage applicable under subsection (a) hereof or \$1.60 per hour, whichever is higher; provided, however, that no employer may employ for a period in excess of one hundred and eighty days any person who is under the age of eighteen but who is not a full-time student at the special minimum wage rate authorized hereby; and, provided further that, no employer may employ any person who is under the age of eighteen but who is not a full-time student at the special minimum wage rate authorized hereby who has been employed by any other employer or employers for an excess of one hundred eighty days at the special minimum wage rate authorized hereby.

Section 2. Material to be repealed is bracketed. New material is underscored. In printing this Act, the revisor of statutes need not include the brackets, the bracketed material, or the underscoring.

Section 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval."

At 12:02 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

At 12:03 o'clock p.m., the House of

Representatives reconvened.

Representative Saiki moved that the amendment be adopted, seconded by Representative Fong.

Representative Saiki then spoke in favor of the amendment, as follows:

"This amendment creates a special student differential in this proposed minimum wage bill. The amendment follows a national precedent as established in the Federal Fair Labor Standards Act of 1966, Title 29 of the U.S. Code, Section 214 of Chapter 8. The purpose of this section was to create job opportunities for students seeking work experience.

Here in Hawaii part-time jobs for our students are difficult to find. Yet many depend on this income to continue their education. As early as 15, unskilled students seek to enter the labor market. There are few opportunities indeed. This minimum wage bill—without a student differential—forces students to compete for jobs with experienced adult labor.

At the same time, we have in Hawaii an industry which offers numerous opportunities for student employment and has in the past come to rely heavily on this available seasonal labor force. I refer, of course, to the pineapple industry. During 1971-72, more than 16,000 temporary seasonals were hired by the pineapple industry. Of this group, 77 percent were students. On the plantations, 82% of the students were 17 years of age or younger. In the canneries, 67% were 17 or under. Many of these youngsters were receiving their first work experience.

The pineapple industry in Hawaii is already seriously threatened. Indeed our entire agricultural industry has suffered in recent years as evidenced by the closing down of several sugar and pineapple plantations. At the root of the problem is the high cost of production in Hawaii. We should not increase the inability of our local industries to compete in mainland markets by legislating still higher costs of production here in Hawaii.

In the interest of a balanced economic future for our State, I strongly urge the adoption of this amendment."

Representative Lunasco then spoke against the amendment, as follows:

“Mr. Speaker, there is pending federal legislation which contains what is called a student differential; that is, a worker under 18 will receive a minimum wage lower than that of a worker over 18. I find this strange, Mr. Speaker, in view of the ongoing equal rights movement which calls for equal treatment under the law regardless of age and sex.

Those of you who have worked in the pineapple fields know that working in the fields is hard work and I cannot see a student, because of his age, being below age 21, would be paid a different rate. For that reason, Mr. Speaker, I strongly urge all members of the House to vote this amendment down.”

Representative Takamine then spoke against the amendment, as follows:

“House Bill No. 651 as introduced proposed to change the present minimum wage of \$1.60 an hour to \$2.00 an hour on July 1, 1973 and to \$2.20 an hour on July 1, 1974.

Your Committee on Labor and Employment has weighed various views and opinions in discussing this measure and House Bill No. 651, HD 1, represents a compromise of all testimonies and opinions.

We have amended the original bill and reduced the \$2.00 an hour effective July 1, 1973, to \$1.80 an hour. We also formulated a progressive increase so that minimum hourly wage should be \$2.00 July 1, 1974; \$2.20 July 1, 1975 and \$2.40 July 1, 1976.

Mr. Speaker, the hourly minimum up to \$2.00 an hour is below the poverty level guideline set by the Office of Economic Opportunity.

When President Nixon set in motion the wage and price control, the Court set aside his wage guideline of 5.5 per cent for those receiving less than \$2.75 an hour.

In essence, the Court said that anything below \$2.75 is too low.

Further, Mr. Speaker, the minimum living wage today is \$7,500 for a family

of five—\$1.80 an hour means \$3,744 a year, or less than 50 per cent of \$7,500. House Bill No. 651, HD 1, will still be in the poverty range—far below the minimum standard.

This is one of the several reasons that your Committee, Mr. Speaker, feels that House Bill No. 651, HD 1, should not include any differential for students.

A student should not be discriminated against. Today, in most instances, they produce just as much or more than the adults with whom they work. In fact, many students hold jobs normally occupied by adults because our minimum wage today is too low. Employers do not hire students unnecessarily.

During the Committee hearing, the spokesman for the pineapple industry spoke about the poor economic conditions of the pineapple industry. This is true, Mr. Speaker, but their problems involve more than minimum wage as reflected in the report made by the Department of Agriculture.

Our discussion here today regarding minimum wage comes well after the announcements of Kauai Pine closing down and the two companies on Molokai planning to phase out operations by 1975.

A student differential is not the answer.

I personally hope that within the years designated in House Bill No. 651, HD 1, the Legislature can still raise the minimum wage so that those people working at the minimum wage can be accorded the financial dignity that all of Hawaii's wage earners, adults as well as students, deserve.

At least, House Bill No. 651, HD 1, without this amendment, is a step in the right direction. Let us take that step unencumbered by this discriminatory amendment.

I urge this Body to vote down this amendment.

Thank you.”

Representative Saiki then responded to the previous speaker, as follows:

"I think there was some allusion to equal rights and equal pay. I would like to make it very clear that I strongly endorse the concept of equal pay for equal work but this concept of equal pay for equal work is hardly relevant if a student does not have a job."

Representative O'Connor then spoke against the amendment, as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I am going to vote against the amendment but I would like to clearly state at this time what I feel would be the position of the law of the State of Hawaii—the Wage and Hour Law—and more particularly as it pertains to what is set forth in this amendment.

Section 387-9 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes clearly sets forth the intent of this Legislature as it pertains to learners, apprentices, part-time employees, students attending public and private schools, colleges, universities, business schools, etc. and the intent of this Legislature has been, since 1941, that such students be employed at a wage less than the minimum wage. This section clearly sets forth to the Director of Labor and Industrial Relations this intent and allows him to, by rules, provide for the employment of these people.

Mr. Speaker, I feel that this section does embody in itself the intent that these types of people be employed and be employed so that they understand how to work and will be given employment.

I understand that there is some misinterpretation of this statute in that people feel and maybe the Director of Labor and Industrial Relations feels that the statute does not pertain during long vacations. I don't find that in the statute and if that misinterpretation needs to be clarified by additional legislation, I, for one, feel that it should because I think the intent of the statute is plain and the intent pertains exactly to that matter.

I am going to vote against this amendment, Mr. Speaker, because I think our statutory language already contains sufficient language in this area."

Representative J. Garcia then responded by saying that the intent of the law is insufficient and further stated that it is what the law says that actually

counts.

The motion to adopt the amendment was put by the Chair and, roll call having been requested, the amendment failed to carry by a vote of 15 ayes to 35 noes, with Representatives Aduja, Ajifu, Aki, Amaral, Carroll, W. Chong, Fong, J. Garcia, Hapai, Medeiros, Oda, Poepoe, Saiki, Soares and Yamada voting aye and Representative Wedemeyer being excused.

Representative Lunasco then spoke for the passage of House Bill No. 651, as follows:

"House Bill No. 651, as amended, will accomplish one very simple thing—it will allow a working person being paid a minimum wage to earn a minimum living.

By way of explanation, I submit only three figures: The U.S. Department of Labor has shown that a lower standard of living for a family of four in Honolulu requires \$8,597 annually. The Federal Government's poverty level income criteria for the State of Hawaii is \$4,850 annually and the wages of a full-time worker in Hawaii at the present minimum wage amounts to \$3,200 annually.

Therefore, I say again, Mr. Speaker, that this bill before us will simply allow a person working at minimum wages to earn a minimum living. Even after four years when the proposed ceiling of \$2.40 an hour takes effect, this will still only bring a worker's annual pay up to the poverty income level of \$4,850. I ask you, Mr. Speaker, how many of us sitting here today can live on \$4,850 a year?

This figure will be achieved four years from now, not right away. This is because the bill provides for a yearly increase of 20 cents over a period of four years. In recognition of the impact a sudden wage increase would have on employers, a gradual transitional period is recommended.

Some of the opponents to this bill feel that this Legislature should wait for Congress to increase the federal minimum wage. That may be true, but during the 1972 Congressional session each House passed its bill increasing the federal minimum wage, but both bills died. And when we know that we live in one of the most expensive states in the nation, we

cannot afford to wait for federal legislation.

I also don't think this bill is an abdication of legislative responsibility as far as our State economic forecasts are concerned. If anything, it should result in employers taking on a more responsible role. It provides a reasonable time period for businesses to adjust to the increased wage by improving productivity rather than laying off workers.

Analysis of past minimum wage increases under the Fair Labor Standards Act show that if such increases are modest and made during a period of healthy business activity, no overall decline in employment occurs. Furthermore, on an overall basis, no evident adverse employment effects have been experienced in Hawaii from past increases.

Mr. Speaker, this bill does one thing—it allows a minimum wage earner, in a few years, to earn a poverty level income. I, therefore, ask my fellow Representatives to vote aye on House Bill No. 651, HD 1.

Thank you."

Representative Amaral then offered the following amendment to House Bill No. 651, HD 1:

"SECTION 1. House Bill 651, HD 1, is amended to read as follows:

"Section 1. Section 387-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read:

Sec. 387-2. Minimum wages. [From and after January 1, 1970] After June 30, 1973 and until June 30, 1974, every employer, except as the director [of labor and industrial relations] may provide pursuant to section 387-9 and except as provided in this paragraph, shall pay to each employee employed by him wages at the rate of not less than [~~\$1.60~~] \$1.80 per hour. After June 30, 1974, every employer, except as the director may provide pursuant to section 387-9 and except as provided in this paragraph, shall pay to each employee employed by him wages at the rate of not less than \$2.00 per hour. The hourly wage of a tipped employee may be deemed to be increased on account of tips if [such] the employee is paid [at least \$1.40 per hour] not less than twenty cents below the applicable

minimum wage by his employer and the combined amount he receives from his employer and in tips is at least fifty cents more than the applicable minimum wage.'

SECTION 2. Material to be repealed is bracketed. New material is underscored. In printing this Act, the revisor of statutes need not include the brackets, the bracketed material, or the underscoring.

SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval."

At 12:23 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

At 12:24 o'clock p.m., the House of Representatives reconvened.

Representative Amaral moved that the amendment be adopted, seconded by Representative Saiki.

Representative Amaral then spoke for the adoption of the amendment, as follows:

"This amendment, Mr. Speaker, recognizes the need of a reasonable upward adjustment to the Minimum Wage Law. At the same time, this amendment takes into consideration our high unemployment rate, especially on the island of Maui, which is the hardest hit area in the State of Hawaii.

I am concerned, Mr. Speaker, of the impact a large increase in minimum wage over a definite period of time can mean to a small business community. With the constant interruption of shipping, with a multiple of tax increases staring them in the face, these businesses do need serious consideration.

I am concerned, Mr. Speaker, over the supermarket chains, the small stores, the service stations, independent farmers, the independent pineapple growers and the seasonal student help. These businesses, both large and small, and their employees, need our consideration.

This amendment, Mr. Speaker, also provides for an equitable constant differential between the minimum wage payable to the said employee and others. Mr. Speaker, let the Seventh Legislature adjust the minimum wage law to \$2.00 per hour by 1974, but let the next

Legislature, the Eighth, review the situation again in 1975.

I urge the adoption of this amendment.

Thank you."

Representative Lunasco then spoke against the amendment, as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, your Committee on Labor and Employment discussed this matter and the matter of whether the Legislature in 1976 could be committed to this bill. A law that is passed today at no time commits the Legislature two years from now. We can come back and if it is necessary, amend the present law.

Mr. Speaker, we took into consideration many of the small businesses, service stations and chain supermarkets. As a matter of fact, most of the chain supermarkets pay a wage above the minimum wage law and they employ a lot of students.

For this reason, Mr. Speaker, being that it was under consideration, I hope that all members of this House vote this amendment down."

Representative O'Connor then inquired whether Representative Amaral would yield to a question, to which Representative Amaral replied in the affirmative.

Representative O'Connor then inquired whether or not the proposer of the amendment is relying on Section 387-9 for the intent of this body in that area since the amendment before the House does not contain a student differential.

Representative Amaral replied in the negative.

The motion to adopt the amendment was put by the Chair and failed to carry.

Representative King then stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I find myself in a very peculiar position—arising to speak in favor of the motion when I am really against it.

It seems to me that all of the facts offered by both the Chairman of the

Labor and Employment Committee and Vice Chairman indicate that at this time, we should not simply be raising the minimum wage to \$1.80 but to \$2.00 an hour as of July 1st of this year. I think what the Vice Chairman said about the federal guidelines not applying to our minimum wage below \$2.75 an hour and what the Chairman said, that is, if we pass this bill then in a few years we will bring those at the lowest level to the poverty level, would indicate very strongly that we should at the present time raise the minimum wage to \$2.00 an hour rather than to \$1.80 an hour. It seems to me that the argument of what we are trying to do to protect small businesses might better be met, not by taking away from those at the very bottom of the economic ladder, but by protecting small businesses by exploring the possibility of tax credits for them.

However, the arguments being made is in effect that half a loaf is better than none. I don't think that this is even half a loaf and although I am well aware that if you take a slice of bread and shred it, what you wind up with is crumbs. Because I think a slice of bread is better than none, I am going to vote in favor of this bill."

Representative Ajifu then rose to speak against the measure, as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I think we all recognize the intent and justification embodied in the proposed legislation.

My concern, Mr. Speaker, is the upward revision with the incremental increase bringing it up to \$2.40 per hour as the minimum after June 30, 1976. I am concerned of the many small businesses who are operating on a marginal level, like the service stations, small restaurants, bakeries, small dry goods store and many others that will be directly affected by the proposed increases.

My other concern, Mr. Speaker is with regards to the pineapple industry. The question is, will pineapple production in Hawaii stabilize at the new 40,000 acre level at the end of 1975 or will there be further decline? I think the answer will lie in what we do here, Mr. Speaker.

The one basic problem and a big problem that the industry face as a

producer is the high cost of production. Mr. Speaker, this legislation will increase the industry's handicap in competing with our mainland domestic fruits and juices.

Mr. Speaker, I have used pineapple production as an illustration because I see a far greater effect on the total agricultural industry."

Representative Leopold then spoke for the passage of House Bill No. 651, HD 1, as follows:

"I don't believe we should leave minimum wage legislation up to uniform Federal law if the present minimum wage is not sufficient for a worker to maintain his family at a minimum standard of living.

The record shows very clearly that those who are at or near the bottom of the income structure have in general made a considerably slower rate of income progress than others in higher income brackets. There are those who say that the wage increases will be inflationary, but our economy has in the past proven itself strong enough to afford justice for our working poor."

Representative Oda then spoke against the measure, as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, it would be remiss for me not to say a few words regarding this measure for upon the passage of this bill, a way of life within a community will die.

I need not mention the economic impact of what this measure will mean for the State. I can only speak for what it will mean to Wahiawa. Jobs which many of my personal friends will lose, and some have already lost, summer jobs which my daughter and her friends depended upon, and jobs for students from other areas such as Aiea, Kahuku, Pearl City, Waipahu, Waialua and Waianae will not be available. Mr. Speaker, it may be an inevitable situation but one that I certainly cannot expedite.

Mr. Speaker, I urge you and the members of this House to preserve a way of life in Hawaii."

Representative Roehrig then expressed his concern, as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I am going to vote aye on this bill because it has merit as social legislation affecting the welfare of our working people of this State, but in doing so I am constrained to voice for the record certain serious concerns I have on the effect of this bill on the future of our pineapple industry.

We have been served notice about the proposed pine phase out on Molokai by 1975. We are aware of the efforts by Mayor Cravalho and his task force in their efforts to find a solution for pineapple.

We are aware that the pine industry will consider acceleration of their phase out if a student worker differential is not included in this measure similar to the one Representative Mink has proposed in Congress.

Mr. Speaker, your Committee on Agriculture has the responsibility to look toward the short and long range development of that industry. This measure may have a chilling effect on the continued existence of the pineapple industry in Hawaii.

I only hope the Senate will take the time to consider this bill before adopting it. In its present form, we are playing Russian roulette with agriculture."

Representative Wong then expressed his reservations by stating that the testimony to date is that irrespective of how we raise the minimum wage, we will still be in the poverty area at the end of 1976.

He further stated: "I, too, like my colleague, Representative King, express this concern because as an ex-labor man, I think it should be higher but I also think as she does, that at least we are making an attempt to move. I will vote for this bill but I do have some reservations relative to the rate. I think it is too low and I want the record to so indicate."

Representative Ajifu then rose and moved for deferral of the passage of this measure until the report from the pineapple industry was received, seconded by Representative Soares.

The motion was put by the Chair and failed to carry.

Representative Kato then rose to speak in favor of the measure.

The motion was put by the Chair and, roll call having been requested, H.B. No. 651 passed Third Reading by a vote of 38 ayes to 12 noes, with Representatives Aduja, Ajifu, Amaral, W. Chong, Fong, J. Garcia, Hapai, Medeiros, Oda, Poepoe, Saiki and Soares voting no and Representative Wedemeyer being

excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 651 passed Third Reading at 12:40 o'clock p.m.

At 12:43 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Ushijima, seconded by Representative J. Garcia and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:00 o'clock a.m. Monday, March 5, 1973.
