We have been developing agricultural parks throughout the State of Hawaii, Mr. Speaker, and I can attest that Mr. Thompson has taken tremendous strides in the development of these parks, not only in these parks,

but the expansion of the existing ones.

So, Mr. Speaker, I would like to commend the introducers of the resolution and also thank Mr. Thompson for a job very well done. I think we are all going to miss him.

The Chair replied:

A concurrent resolution (H.C.R. No. 32) requesting the establishment of a joint interim committee to recommend a measure for estimating the rate of growth of the State's economy and limiting general fund appropriations was offered by Representative Suwa.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 3:25 o'clock p.m.

DEFERRED MATTER FROM EARLIER ON THE CALENDAR

H.B. No. 11, HD 1, on Third Reading:

Representative Suwa moved that H.B. No. 11, HD 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Morioka.

Representative Kamalii then rose and stated that she had an amendment to offer to House Bill No. 11, House Draft 1.

At 3:27 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair, "for the purpose of preparing and distributing the amendment."

The House of Representatives reconvened at 3:35 o'clock p.m.

Representative Kamalii offered the following amendment:

"SECTION 1. House Bill 11, H.D. 1 is amended by amending line 10 on page 1 to read:

'revenues of the State the sum of \$[2,148,293] 2,007,750 or so much thereof'."

Representative Kamalii moved that the amendment be adopted, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Kamalii then stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of the amendment.

Mr. Speaker, there is an old joke about a down-on-his-luck gambler who took his last \$5 to the race track and bet it on the long-shot in the first race. He won \$200. He put all of that money on the next race, and won again. By the last race of the day, he had won over \$250,000, and he bet it all on the tenth race. That last horse came in last, and he left the track broke. Outside the field, he ran into a friend who asked him how he had done. 'Oh, not bad,' he said, 'I only lost \$5.'

Maybe that's the right gambling attitude, Mr. Speaker, but it's no way for us to run a business. Our budget, Mr. Speaker, is like that gambler: How did we do? Oh, not bad, we only gained 7 percent. Well, that 7 percent represents an increase of \$250,000 in the operating expenses of the House and the Senate.

I would be among the first, Mr. Speaker, to support a 5 to 7 percent salary increase for session and permanent employees of the Legislature. However, that 7 percent increase could be accommodated within the amount appropriated for last year's session. According to my calculations, based on the monthly reports circulated by the Legislative Management Committee, during 1978, there was a total appropriation for legislative salaries of \$1,452,250;

of that amount, \$1,360,463.97 was expended. Mr. Speaker, that excess from the appropriation is sufficient to cover a 6 to 7 percent increase in salaries this session. Thus, a return to the 1978 levels as proposed by my amendment would allow for salary increases. However, Mr. Speaker, according to information which we received this weekend, no such salary increase has been authorized.

Further, I would like to submit the informal breakdown of positions and salary levels which you gave me -- the positions and salaries which have only been authorized by the Speaker of the House -- and such power does not rightly reside in that office. Mr. Speaker, you have ignored your Legislative Management Committee and, further, compromised the integrity of your Finance Committee which acted in good faith when it passed a lump-sum budget for the House. This lack of proper committee review has been compounded. The 1979 authorizations have been made without a timely House resolution describing positions and setting salary ranges. Such authorizations have also been made without a necessary revision and acceptance of the 'Administrative and Financial Manual.' These appropriations have also been authorized without any assurance that criticism contained in the State Comptroller's audit of January 19, 1977 to January 17, 1978, have been corrected. May I submit this information for inclusion in the House Journal at this time, Mr. Speaker, to save time?"

The Chair replied:

"If there are no objections, the Chair will accept that for inclusion into the Journal."

Representative Kamalii thanked the Chair and continued her remarks, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I resent that our lump-sum budget gave the impression that we were holding a responsible line on salary inflation.

So, where is the increase proposed by House Bill No. 11, House Draft 1, going? I have received several answers. One, we have the 'impression' that supplies and contract services will increase in cost. Certainly that would seem to be a reasonable assumption -- everything costs more today than it did yesterday.

However, Mr. Speaker, in the last audit which covered the period of January 19, 1977 and January 17 of 1978, the State Comptroller noted that we did not follow prescribed public bid procedures for items in excess of \$4,000 or the more stringent requirements for purchases in excess of \$8,000.

Our impression of expenses may be self-inflated. We may be basing our sense of increased cost of paper on past errors of buying at too high a price.

I have also been told that another reason for the 7 percent over-all increase is the difference between an election and an off-year. Especially, the willingness to take trips and attend conferences is greater in an off-year such as this one.

Mr. Speaker, I attended a national conference -- the National Conference of State Legislatures in Washington, D.C. I found it valuable and useful. It was especially helpful that we discussed at length the President's recommended 'Wage-Price Stabilization Program' at that meeting. I now wish that all of my colleagues had attended. A genuine application of those 5 - 7 percent guidelines on this budget would save the taxpayer of this State more than our travel expenses would account for. That is the assumption of such travel, that we come back with ideas to save money -- not that we should hide such trips in the confusion of a non-election year.

I have also been told by you, Mr. Speaker, that the over-all increase could be placed in a miscellaneous category. The explanation for that move is that at some time in the past -- I suspect somewhere in the boomdays of the late 1960's -- a formula was worked out between the House and the Senate to maintain appropriation levels at some par relationship. Well, I'm not in a position of knowledgeability about the expenses of the Senate. My suspicion would be that they're using many of the same flawed elements of fiscal management which I have indicated of House thinking.

All of which may be beside the point. I do not agree that the integrity of that old formula is more important than a sensible, defensible budget.

Which brings me back to the substantive intent of my amendment. Our budgetary procedures should have reflected the same rigor and tough-mindedness which is expected of all other departments or agencies of the State. I have offered

this amendment to explicitly indicate the kind of questions which may reasonably arise from line-item budgeting. It is fundamentally the lump-sum appropriation which discourages open discussion and ultimate accountability.

Some may be curious as to why I have directed all of my attention to the legislative budget and ignored the amounts allocated to our legislative support agencies, Mr. Speaker, for the very fact that your Finance Committee did request, and did review line item budgets from these agencies. They all came before

the Finance Committee and justified their requests and their position counts. The proper procedures and budgetary accountability were maintained. I wish that I could say the same of our internal practices.

I urge you, my fellow colleagues, to support this amendment and take the first step to fiscal responsibility by this House.

Representative Suwa then rose to speak against the amendment to House Bill No. 11, House Draft 1, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, let me assure you that when the Finance Committee reported to the House floor the legislative expenditure, we did not consider ourselves as going to the race track. Let me assure you, Mr. Speaker, that whenever the Finance Committee reports items to the floor, we are very concerned, with the taxpayers of the State of Hawaii foremost in mind.

What the amendment does, in essence, is to reduce the House expenditure by \$140,000 or so. Mr. Speaker, this House record speaks for itself. Whenever there is a surplus, it is refunded back to the General Fund. We have not, in the history that I am able to review in the past twenty years, has the Legislature gone into deficit spending.

Mr. Speaker, the \$148,000, or \$140,543 to be exact, although may sound, as the Minority Leader has spoken, as the 7 percent increase, but Mr. Speaker, some of the on-going expenditure, as compared to last session, is that the Con Con mandated the Legislature for a five day recess so that we can be better legislators and we accept that, Mr. Speaker. In doing so, \$68,000 or so, close to \$70,000, half of it is spent on the mandate by the Constitution and this \$70,000 is only for the House, Mr. Speaker. Although the Minority Leader talked about the total increase of the Senate and the House, the amendment deals with the House only. It does not deal with the Senate, Mr. Speaker; therefore, I will strictly address the expense of the House.

Mr. Speaker, \$70,000 of the \$140,000 is the demanding part of the Con Con -- the language stated by statutes. In trying to comply with the Con Con amendment this session, Mr. Speaker, yes, we can implement this year, but some need in-depth studies. For example, the Finance Committee itself, regarding the total spending limits, Mr. Speaker, that in order to come out with a good, sound recommendation by law, we need to have interim work in this area. There are many, many other areas. I'm sure the Hawaiian Affairs Department, the Committee on Hawaiian Homes, Department of Land and Natural Resources, I'm sure, is going to do some in-

depth work so, Mr. Speaker, the \$140,000 increase will primarily be eaten up by trying to fulfill the mandate of the Constitutional Convention, but it will be remiss for me to say that is all the increase.

Mr. Speaker, last year's appropriation of \$2,007,750 will naturally leave some surplus, Mr. Speaker, but in comparison from last year to this year, the Minority Leader mentioned about election year and off-election year travel, but that is a very small part of it. I think the rules of the House prescribe that next year or this interim, after this session, is a carry-over session and many of the bills, resolutions will be carried into the next session and many interim work will be necessary in order to have an outstanding work done by the Legislature in benefitting the taxpayers, Mr. Speaker.

The spending now, Mr. Speaker, is an investment. It's not going to the race track and betting on something that we don't know, Mr. Speaker. But as the Minority Leader has spoken about the travel to Washington, D.C., she recommends that all of the House members should have gone there.

Yes, Mr. Speaker, there are many, many other areas and I think the foremost objective of this coming session is that the cost item will reflect the capabilities of this House as to where we are trying to go, Mr. Speaker.

As you know, Mr. Speaker, we were rated No. 7 nationally, but today, Mr. Speaker, if we were to rank, I don't know whether we are in No. 7. Travelling to other states, in comparison, I can see that we may qualify on openness in government, yes, we improved quite a bit. But in other areas, like electronic data processing system, computerization, Mr. Speaker, it's a good thing that we appropriated a sum of money last year for us to go into status computerization so that we can retrieve the status of bills by computer in updating.

But let me say, Mr. Speaker, there are many areas that we would like to improve. And this is the area, Mr. Speaker, that will cost money. The Legislative Reference Bureau cost item reflects the most increase.

At this point, Representative Kamalii rose on a point of order and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I believe the Chairman of Finance is now at another area. If we are going to speak to the total

appropriation that we are increasing, then we must speak to the \$562,000. If we're going to now discuss the Legislative Reference Bureau, the Ombudsman, the Auditor, I think my amendment only addresses itself to the House and not to these agencies."

The Chair responded, saying:

"The Chair believes that the Representative from the Big Island is speaking in support of the increase and making the connections to the legislative arm agencies of this Legislature", and directed Representative Suwa to "proceed".

Representative Suwa continued, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Mr. Speaker, I would urge the members of this House to defeat this amendment because the \$140,000 increase, let me assure you, is a good investment in conforming to the wishes of the people that have approved the amendments of the Constitution. Therefore, Mr. Speaker, I urge the members to defeat this amendment.

Thank you."

Representative Kamalii, in rebuttal, stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I want to thank the Chairman of the Finance Committee for giving us additional information as to where this \$140,000 is going to be spent. Up to this moment, we have only been able to deal with sketchy figures that we have received in our negotiations and what our Finance Committee members have brought back to leadership. If we are going to follow, Mr. Speaker, what our Finance Committee has returned to us which was attached to the bill in the Finance Committee, all well and good, because, then, I know exactly where the \$140,000 is going to go. But, Mr. Speaker, this is not where the money is going to go. We talk about studies; we have in this appropriation bill \$150,000 that I don't know where it's going to be spent, and it says here, 'Special Studies'. Okay? That has nothing to do with the \$140,000 that I'm addressing myself to. That has to be answered yet.

Mr. Speaker and fellow colleagues, this is the first time that we're able to find out, if you're interested, where our monies are being spent

and who's going to allocate it for per diem, for travel, for stationaries, communications, rentals, repairs, miscellaneous, printing of the Journals. I don't know where it is going to be spent, and this is my whole thrust of getting this out into the open so that we might all be aware of our responsibilities here. I'm quite aware that we must come up with \$63,109.25 for the five-days extension, and that is computed by our monthly report put out by our Legislative Management Chairman. So, these are the only figures that we have and, I hope, if more information can be given us at this point, Mr. Speaker, right on."

Representative Peters then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak against House amendment to House Bill No. 11, House Draft 1, and I say this devoid of gambling implications as was enumerated by the Minority Leader.

Mr. Speaker, we have a major responsibility in this process. We are recognized as an independent component of government. We are the Legislature, devoid of the administration who has obviously far greater amounts of resources to carry on or carry out the mandates of this body. The Judiciary, as well, has far greater resources and we do the similar kind of thing. We have a responsibility to our constituency to address the major issues that come before us. It will have a major impact on the lives of every individual in this State and we can't take a gambling chance on that. No ifs or buts about it in my mind.

I think the Chairman of Finance has done an outstanding job in explaining exactly where that 7 percent increase will go, obviously by way of constitutional mandate. We have a recess of five days -- one week. During that period of time, we can't expect our staff to remain idle. They're going to be paid and they're going to be working very diligently and very responsibly. Okay? And that's going to cost money -- approximately \$70,000 -- 50 percent of this \$140,000 increase.

You've read the Majority package and know the individuals that we have in this House, the kind of responsibilities that they have as individual chairmen and members. They're going to be working very, very hard, Mr. Speaker, to address these major issues -- issues that we cannot rush into; issues that are going to take a lot of time, a lot of studies on our part, because we

want to make those decisions in the final analysis that are responsible, and it is going to require a lot of interim work. Mr. Speaker, I think that you pointed out in your address to this House on Opening Day that there are lots of amendments that will require statutory language, things that we cannot just rush into. It is going to require a lot of interim work.

Where are we going to have the resources for that purpose? Part of that is where it's at -- the additional \$70,000. I think the Chairman of Finance pointed out very clearly and I hope, through our discussions, the Minority Leader will take back this amendment and take a far more responsible position regarding House Bill No. 11, House Draft 1.

I urge all members to vote down this amendment to this bill.

Thank you."

Representative K. Yamada then rose to speak against the amendment, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, the Minority Leader seems to implicate that members of the Minority who sit in Finance did not have sufficient information to bring back to their caucus. I'd like to point out to the members of this body that each individual, at least several of them, signed the Committee Report indicating that they were completely satisfied with the contents of the bill and with the contents of the Committee Report. So, I don't know where she gets her information from but, apparently, it's not from some of the Committee members who are in the Minority and who do sit in Finance.

As far as the 7 percent is concerned, Mr. Speaker, I think it's quite clear that the inflationary rate throughout this country, especially here in the State of Hawaii, has exceeded 7 percent. Indeed, although there is a national standard today that we keep the inflationary cost down to 7 percent, that's not necessarily the reason why it's been indicated at 7 percent in this particular bill. I think the Chairman of the Finance Committee adequately explained that and he did provide a breakdown to each individual member precisely where the 7 percent is going to be expended. And that particular proposal, Mr. Speaker, the Minority Leader has in her hands right now.

I think it's also quite clear that when we take into consideration the various expenditures of this Legislature, including paper, telephone, and a great number of other things which this body utilizes, the cost has greatly exceeded 7 percent, and we're doing our best to keep it within that expenditure limit. The Majority Leader explained that because of the five-day break, there is going to be additional costs involved, additional costs for the salaries of the staff members.

Let's go even further. The cost for the unemployment compensation which has to be paid later, and this is not of our own doing; it's mandated by the Constitution. We must do it; we can't get away from it.

In looking at some of the points which was raised by the Minority Leader, Mr. Speaker, I think she refutes her own argument. The fact that we returned several hundred thousand dollars this session alone from the past two years budget indicates that this House is not taking an irresponsible stand. We are controlling the expenditure of our funds, and only if there are sufficient amounts remaining, we do return it to the general budget. So, I think it is clear that we are not going to the race track, but the monies have been controlled by this Legislature for the past two years in a very careful manner, and that is why we have the additional amount to return this year.

The other point that I would like to make along this line is that if you were to go back the past several years in this Legislature and look at the percentages of the increase in cost, it does greatly exceed 7 percent. But this year, we vowed that we were going to keep it at 7 percent although some of those items were thrust on us. Some of the expenditures we must make in accordance with the constitutional amendments. I think that's a reasonable stand, Mr. Speaker.

Let's go on and take a look at some of the other points that she raised. She said, well, it's going to be lumped into the miscellaneous section of the budget. That's not true. If the Minority Leader were to take a look at what she has in her hands, Mr. Speaker, it does give a breakdown of precisely where the 7 percent is going.

Let's go on and take a look at some of the other points that she made. She mentioned that there was a formula worked out between the House and Senate. Well, this was a long time

ago and if the Minority Leader would recall the conversation that we had, it was not dealing with the 7 percent or any of the proposed legislative budget, but we simply were not going to divide the budget of the Legislature -- one half for the Senate, one half for the House. That's unfair because we got twice as many members as the Senate does. And that was where we were working with the proportions, not necessarily what's being proposed in the budget today.

She says that her amendment explains where the monies are going to be spent. Well, I'd like to remind the Minority Leader that if she were to take a look at her amendment, it simply removes the 7 percent proposed increase for the budget. It doesn't explain where the additional monies are going to come from for the payment of the salaries, for the payment of the increase in the cost of supplies, for the increase in the cost of the operation of this House. So it doesn't explain anything, but it is an irresponsible stand simply to cut off the monies that have been proposed by the Finance Committee.

For these reasons, Mr. Speaker, I don't think that this amendment was very well thought out. I think it needs a great deal to be desired and for that reason, I ask all of the House members to vote it down.

Thank you."

Representative Lacy then rose to speak in favor of the amendment, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I desire to speak for the amendment in rebuttal to the last remarks made by the Minority Floor Leader. . . I'm sorry, Majority Floor Leader. My pardon, sir. You have to understand, for those in the gallery and all, that I am a freshman; this is my first time to speak before this honored body, Mr. Speaker, and I'm sorry I have to speak in rebuttal and not for some other items.

I rise to speak in opposition to this wording by the honored Majority Leader because he is really questioning somewhat the integrity of some of us who signed the Committee Report. I wish to let you know, Mr. Speaker, that I did sign the Committee Report recommending the acceptance of the Committee's recommendation to this House. It was my understanding that the points dealing with our own legislative budget will receive

a detailed review in the Legislative Management Committee prior to its being considered for this Third Reading. I disagree completely with the Majority Floor Leader when he says it was looked at in detail.

Let me explain to you how this Finance Committee works, honored sir. Every one of the departments of this government. . ."

The Chair interrupted and stated:

"Representative Lacy, the Chair would appreciate it if you will address your remarks to the Chair."

Representative Lacy continued his remarks, stating:

"Yes, sir, Mr. Speaker, I'm sorry.

Mr. Speaker, the way in which we normally review our budget, as I've been trained in the last two weeks, is that we look at each item and I want to use one as an example because it was referred to that. We did have a close review of this budget number and in that number would be salaries. It showed an increase in salaries, Mr. Speaker, that our Committee was recommending if we take that as being the exact amount intended. In no way did we question why the increase. We did not know how many employees that our House has so we do not know why we need more money. This is the only budget so far that we have looked at that we have not questioned such a change. Having assurance that it would get a review in the Legislative Management Committee, we felt that those details would be brought out and that the Minority membership would be informed such as would be satisfied by the Third Reading. No such conduct has been done. It is my understanding from my leadership that no meeting of the Legislative Management Committee has gone into detail and, therefore, Mr. Speaker, I cannot concur that Section 2 has been reviewed in any way the same as all other departments of our government had been reviewed.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Segawa was recognized and he stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to speak against this amendment to House Bill 11, House Draft 1, especially to the remarks made by the Minority Leader regarding trips made by legislators and the implication that these trips may not have the value in the way

that she sees it although she has admitted that. . ."

Representative Kamalii interrupted on a point of order and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, that is not what I said. I said that if everyone should take these trips, and I'm not against taking trips. It was very valuable to me."

The Chair then said:

"Representative Kamalii has clarified her statement, Representative Segawa. Proceed on that basis."

Representative Segawa continued his remarks, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, if she will let me continue, I think she implied that there are more trips made on off-election years, and I think it's understandable and reasonable that a person has more time on an off year from an election year. In regard to when we adjourn in an election year, we adjourn in April, as in other years, and many of us begin our campaign soon after. In fact, many do not come back after October and some in November. While in an off year, we have at least a half year that we may want to take some trips. But as far as this, you know, I feel that, for the record, the implication to me was somehow more trips are made and it's not germane to our spending of our funds in the House. I think it should be made clear that the people that have attended have really learned, and a lot of these legislators travel at the loss of their own personal funds. And the kind of per diem that is allowed really is very short. I think we have \$45 to travel to the mainland, and in many instances, we have no control on the kind of lodgings that is allowed us and we may find ourselves paying \$35 to \$40 a day and find that we have very little for our meals. Even in our inter-island trips, Mr. Speaker, we have \$30 on off session time and I find myself finding a hotel room for \$20 to \$23 a day which leaves me very little for my meals. I take trips and I think I have to pay for it out of my own pocket because it really doesn't allow me enough from my per diem, but I do it in the sense that it is part of my job, and I want it on record that these trips are not frivolous. I think they are very valuable, and invaluable to the legislators, and in this regard, I think I don't

see how, in many instances, we can say that a legislator is going to take an x number of trips here or away, and depending on the kind of involvement he may have and the amount of expenses involved to where he may be going.

And so, I believe that in the case that we're trying to fund for legislative areas, it is not that simple to tie down as we would like to tie down the departments, coming in from many past experiences in what they've done. I think we have different legislators here with different experiences, different years of service, the new ones may want to go just to learn, and with this kind of consideration, I think it is very important that we realize, in many cases, we cannot pin down all the expenses to the 'T', and so I urge all members to vote against this amendment."

Representative Anderson was recognized and he stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I didn't intend to speak today and I'm a little nervous because it is my first time also.

I've listened to the Majority Leader talk about the salaries of the people and how hard they are going to work, and I don't think there is a person on this floor that's doubting that. That's not one of the things that we are worried about, nor are we worried about the compensation because it is my understanding that that comes from the General Fund. The trips are not what we are after.

As a new member, and as a person that feels that we should have some fiscal responsibility, I don't like to receive a piece of paper with a budget on it that does not explain everything so that I can completely understand what I'm voting for. In the beginning, when this was first brought up, I looked at it -- 7 percent didn't sound bad -- but when you have dollars that are being expended and you do not know the reason why, I question that.

That's the reason that I am in favor of this amendment, and I would urge everybody on this floor that feels that they owe their constituents and the people of this state, the time to come out and go for fiscal responsibility -- I hope it's today.

Thank you."

Representative Kunimura then rose and stated:

"I intended to speak this afternoon because it's my responsibility as chairman of the Committee on Legislative Management to explain if there is any doubt as to why we are appropriating this large sums of money for the operation of this House.

Yes, Mr. Speaker, about two years ago, we upgraded practically all of the typewriters in this House. . ."

At this point, Representative Ikeda interrupted on a point of order.

Representative Kunimura then said:

"Mr. Speaker, I'm speaking against the amendment, and I thank the lady for calling my attention.

Well, we upgraded all the typewriters in this House because we had many, many vintages of typewriters here, going back some thirteen, fourteen years -- old IBM Selectrics and old IBM prior to the Selectric -- and it has always been the bone of contention of the Minority, and I don't blame them because they got the worse typewriters in the House, being the low man on the totem pole and the newcomers in the Majority side felt bad once too -- the old ones -- and it was the few lucky ones and I wasn't it. But, anyway, Mr. Speaker, we had some monies left over and we had a real good buy because the Senate of the State of Hawaii had a long lease on some brand new typewriters. Then the company chopped off their rental and, therefore, we were able to purchase these equipment under the Senate's name because they had the option to purchase and we did practice that avenue and upgraded every typewriter in this House. Every individual has the same basic typewriter -- Selectric with correction tape. Whether you came yesterday or you've been here twenty years, there is no discrimination there now. Okay? But it takes time. Then subsequently, Mr. Speaker, we bought some equipment for the Printshop and I am one who does not believe in having different makes of equipment from different companies in the same operation because the parts and repairs are going to run you broke. So, we bought three printing equipment and last year, we bought some papers, and good thing we did because if we didn't, we would be just full of hot air and without anything to print on because

there is a big paper strike now on the mainland. We can't even get the yellow birds, you know, that we print our Committee Reports on, like I reported the other day. So, this committee honestly is a management. You gotta take a look and you gotta buy it when they are available; you gotta buy in quantity, and never did we go out and give any special consideration to anyone. We'd always get the lowest bid and we take the State bid procedure and whatever they bid on State bids, these contractors would be called and if they would give us the same price too, so nobody's cutting corners, nobody's getting rich, nobody's getting fat. But, anyway, after the criticism by the Department of Accounting and General Services, and I see Mr. Murakami flew the coop right now because I was going to use his name. Without coming to understand what it is all about, they saw black and white -- we were not going through the bidding procedure. Yes, we knew that. You gotta move, you gotta move fast. So, they wrote us up and all right, we cease and desist. This year, we don't even have yellow paper because you know what? I wasn't going to recommend buying anything without bidding. By the time we were ready to bid on it, they ran out of yellow paper.

Well, anyway, Mr. Speaker, if I may, this is the only operation of the entire State of Hawaii which is over a billion dollars today that has a monthly statement as to our expenditures. No other department -- the Department of Education, University, Land and Natural Resources, Department of Health, the Senate of the State of Hawaii -- nobody files a monthly statement, how many trips are taken, how much it cost to do this, and how much telephone bill. Everything's recorded and every member of this House has a copy of this monthly statement. What else you want? I can't understand this.

And may I, Mr. Speaker, you know, I wasn't going to bring this up, but you know something, bit by bit, the mouse ate into the cable, and you know, even the biggest cable in the world, if you gnaw on it, bit by bit, and like the last straw that broke the camel's back, you keep adding straws on the camel and the back is going to break.

It was just this morning, the Legislative Management Committee approved and recommended to the Majority caucus that the Republican's request for two positions at \$720 a month be approved. Okay? And we had a caucus and we

said, okay. It's a legitimate request, we can't deny what is fair, and they were so notified by our leadership. Okay?

You know something? I wonder if this amendment is a declaration of intent that they are not going to go on any more trips, they want to cut off their telephone after the session is over, they not going to use the Xerox or postage. Everything we use, everything we do here cost money, and if anybody can say that the Speaker of the House or anyone else is walking home with a balance of the big crop because everything that is left over is lapsed into the General Fund to be reappropriated again by the Legislature for the operation of the State and I, therefore, Mr. Speaker, would like to urge all members of this House to vote against this nonsensical amendment."

Representative Ikeda then rose to speak in favor of the amendment, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I think our Legislative Management Chairman has most ably justified past expenditures. That's not what we are talking about today. I don't think we would have a problem this afternoon if future expenditures were as ably justified, and I think that's our whole point. I think we got the cart before the horse. If Legislative Management had met and had made certain determinations as to where this money should be budgeted, even in round figures, so that we would have some idea as to how this money was going to be spent, and where the ceilings were for such things as salaries, per diem, travel expenses, etc., I don't think many of us would have the kinds of doubt that we do now, and this amendment would not have been offered. But this has not been the case. Legislative Management met only this morning, to my knowledge, and as the Chairman has indicated, to take up certain questions which he has elaborated on which I hope he is not using as a means of intimidation this afternoon.

My whole point, Mr. Speaker, is that proper procedures have not been followed and had it been followed, we probably wouldn't have this problem. We wouldn't have the questions that we have right now. . ."

At this point, Representative K. Yamada interrupted on a point

of order and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I don't think we are debating on the procedures but I understand on the amendment to House Bill No. 11, House Draft 1."

Representative Ikeda responded, stating:

"That is exactly what I am speaking on, Mr. Speaker", and continued her remarks:

"If the 7 percent increase was based on actual expenditures rather than the appropriated figures, we wouldn't need an increase. That's our whole point.

The Majority Floor Leader earlier stated that we were returning \$700,000 to the General Fund. I think his figure was off, frankly, but the point is, if we are indeed returning this amount of money and if we didn't spend it in the previous session, why then are we asking for 7 percent more? That's the only thing that we've been asking and we haven't gotten our answers to, and in that light, I urge everybody to vote in favor of this amendment."

Representative Kunimura was recognized and he stated:

"I'm very, very happy that the Assistant Minority Floor Leader has advanced the cause for the Majority in defeating this amendment because if you have a monthly statement, a running account of the expenditures of the entire appropriation for the House in this operation, item by item, and not a single new item was added to that particular gross category, and you have that last one delivered to you for the month of January and that's exactly what it is and it was ably put by the Chairman of the Finance Committee. That recess alone is going to cost sixty plus thousands of dollars. Okay?

I know I've been here quite long and I don't think it's because we want to travel, we have time to travel six months that we take a trip. The Speaker of the House recommends who goes and for what reason and the Republicans make their recommendations as to who shall participate in these very valuable excursions and conferences. I'm not degrading these trips -- they're very necessary. But I'd like to say this, that somehow, there's more travelling going on off-election years and I guess we all know why. You all don't want to be accused of going on a junket. I don't think the people of this State,

the majority of them, feel that way, but somehow, politicians are getting shy, but that's the way it is, and I'm pretty sure this being an odd numbered year, there's going to be lots of request for travel and I say, by golly, that's the most reasonable form of education for people here who make such big decisions, you know, that's going to affect so many people. You don't want ignorant people making decisions and big decisions. Okay? We need people who go out and take the time and spend their own time and their own money, if necessary, part of their money, to go out and look at what the other part of the world is doing and come back and then decide how they should move in solving our problems.

So, that's the way it bounces, Mr. Speaker, that yes, we did not have an item by item budget rundown, but we have that monthly -- every month, it is submitted by Mrs. Kotake, our very capable accountant, and you have it for your records, so I don't think holding a committee meeting to show the spread. . . I think that's superfluous, unnecessary. Okay?

Thank you."

At 4:31 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

Upon reconvening at 4:35 o'clock p.m., the Chair recognized Representative Evans and she stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of the amendment. In doing so, rebut statements that have been made from those opposing the amendment.

Mr. Speaker, I'd like to take the members back to the original amendment since we have strayed afar from the amendment which indicates that the bill will be amended on line 10, page 1, to read: 'revenues of the State the sum of', and what we're doing is going back to \$2,700,750 -- last year's budget. We're trying to hold the reins on that and this, as I said, as far as I am concerned, came from the Finance Committee. If the funding is going to be all in salaries for session employees and regular employees, it should be indicated as such. Up to this point, we have not received that information.

I would like to take my colleagues' time with further inclusion into

the record, indicate the sums spent: \$1,052,252 for session employees, and now remember, this is 1978. Mr. Speaker, regular employees, \$400,000; annual allowance, \$76,500, and Finance Committee is indicating the same for this year; per diem (session), \$25,000, the same for this year; intra-state, \$30,000, same amount for this year; out-of-state, \$25,000, no increase over last year; travel (session), \$8,000 last year, \$10,000 this year; intra-state, \$20,000, same as last year; out-of-state, \$55,000 for 1978 and the same projected for this year; stationery and office and other supplies, same -- \$50,000 spent last year or appropriated last year; communications, postage and telephone, last year appropriated \$65,000, this year, \$70,000; delivery and hauling, \$3,000, same appropriated for this year; rental equipment, \$95,000 appropriated last year, \$100,000 this year; repair equipment, \$20,000 last year, this year \$25,000; office equipment and furniture, \$3,000 last year, appropriated this year, \$5,000; miscellaneous, \$25,000, this year the same; printing of Journal, \$40,000, this year the same; contingency funds, \$15,000, this year the same.

Whether or not with an election year or off-election year, all we are doing in this amendment is holding the Legislature to the reins of last year -- the same that our taxpayers and constituents are having to face throughout the State.

Mr. Speaker, it was also addressed that a lot of these additional monies would be going for Con Con amendments and the studies that have to be done. I believe that the actual report to fulfill Con Con mandates should be done by a bill. Definite citation of scope and nature of studies and appropriate separate items, not through legislative operations.

It was indicated that we receive monthly statements. I'm sure all of us, to run our own budgets at home, if we did it this way, we would be in a hell of a mess. I don't consider this to tell me anything as a member of this House at all. When we have asked for information over the last four years, through request, we have not received any further information than this piece of paper.

It was indicated that this amendment is a nonsensical amendment, and I would like to address the Speaker and members of this House, that we are not being nonsensical. We are serious in what we are attempting to do.

It was also indicated that this is the straw that broke the camel's back because the Minority was given two positions -- a few crumbs to shut us up. . ."

At this point, Representative Say interrupted on a point of order and stated:

"I believe this is an internal matter at this time."

The Chair replied:

"Representative Say, she was alluding to the fact that Representative Kunimura's statement was not factual. In what Representative Evans implies, you are correct. Representative Evans, will you proceed on that basis."

Representative Evans continued her remarks, stating:

"Rebutting the statement that has been made, Mr. Speaker.

When a lot of money is at stake, it is very hard to. . . anyway, I would like to close with this: that we, in the Republican caucus, have requested this kind of information that we finally have received, however accurate it is to present to this body for decision, and again I repeat, this was the straw that broke the camel's back."

Representative Kunimura was recognized and he stated:

"I did not say the two positions are the straw that broke the camel's back, but many, many requests -- small ones. It always takes many straws to break the camel's back -- one position here, one position there, one trip here, one trip there, one extra telephone call -- these are the straws that break the camel's back."

At this time, Representative Evans requested a roll call vote.

The Chair then said:

"The Chair would like to state that much has been said on this floor alluding to what the Chair had said and also as to the Chair's management of the House finances, suffice it to say that the Chair is very comfortable and, frankly, very proud of his management of the House finances."

The motion to adopt the proposed

amendment was put to a vote and failed to pass by a voice vote.

Representative Garcia then rose on a point of order and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I believe a request was made for a roll call. Was there any indication from the Chair that that was recognized one way or the other?"

The Chair replied:

"The Chair did not recognize a voice from the fields."

Representative Evans, on a point of order, stated:

"It wasn't in the fields, Mr. Speaker. I said, 'Roll call, Mr. Speaker'."

Representative Peters then rose on a point of order and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, may we have proper decorum on this floor. The previous speaker was not recognized. As a consequence, her voice was a voice in the wilderness."

Representative Evans remarked:

"I'm glad you're talking about proper decorum. We should be using that all the time."

The Chair replied:

"We will."

At 4:42 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

Upon reconvening at 4:50 o'clock p.m., the Chair recognized Representative Sutton and he stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak against House Bill No. 11, House Draft 1."

Directed by the Chair to "proceed", Representative Sutton stated:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

As you know, Mr. Speaker, House Bill No. 11, House Draft 1, is a bill that appropriates expenses for our operations, the Senate's operations, and incidental operations of the Legislature.

Mr. Speaker, we of the Legislature, should be like Caesar's wife and be beyond reproach. Thus, we should be the first ones in this day and age of fiscal constraint enunciated by the President to stop inflation -- not to

increase the budget. Mr. Speaker, there is an 8.5 increment in the cost of the Legislature and its support agencies in House Bill 11.

Mr. Speaker, it is true that the President has stated that a 7 percent increase is the ceiling, but in his State of the Union address given in Washington, D.C. on the 23rd of January, 1979, Mr. Carter brought out certain basic points. He stated that, 'We must re-double our fight against the persistent inflation that has racked our country for more than a decade. That is the most important issue. . .', according to Mr. Carter, that we face today.

Mr. Speaker, we know that inflation is a burden for all of America, but it is a disaster for the poor, the sick and the old, those on fixed income who find that their dollar is today worth but 50 cents compared to ten years ago. No American family, Mr. Speaker, should be forced to choose among food, warmth, health care or decent housing because the cost of any of these basic necessities has climbed out of reach.

Mr. Speaker, the President of the United States is of the same party you are, sir, and that your Majority is -- Democrat Party -- and yet, it seems that, today, with the discussion on the amendment and what we have before us, that we are following President Jimmy Carter more than you are, or your colleagues on that side of the aisle.

Mr. Speaker, it is very important that you recognize that the single most important thing that a state such as Hawaii can do to comply with President Carter's request is to hold down public-sector spending. All I ask, Mr. Speaker, is that we should try to consider all the consequences of what we, the Legislature, do, remembering that we are the example. Certainly, Mr. Speaker, no one can object to that. A nagging inflation rate here in Hawaii of 8 or 9 percent which has gone to 10 percent on food in this last month and which has persisted for over five years has shown little signs of abating. Therefore, Hawaii's lawmakers, all of these 51 honorable people before me. . . excuse me, 50 honorable people, I was including myself as honorable. I am on the Finance Committee and, you know, I was the only one that signed this, 'I do not concur', and I have incurred the wrath of probably the nicest gentleman, the hardest working

gentleman in this whole place, the Chairman of Finance. I hope he will forgive me sometime.

The quandry of inflation, Mr. Speaker, which faces Hawaii is shared by other states and local governments in varying degrees. The State of California, with its Governor Brown, has now come out and said in so many words that he believes that balancing their budget is the most important thing for the State of California. Evidently, Proposition 13 reached him in time and he seems to have changed positions. But so much for Governor Brown, and so much for the State of California. Let's come back, Mr. Speaker, if we can, to Hawaii. Here, we have the highest cost of living of any place in the United States except Alaska and, Mr. Speaker, we are taxing each and every one of the people in these islands \$831 per person. That's the fourth highest state in taxation. So, give them this terribly high cost of living, this terribly high taxation and then, Mr. Speaker, show them that we, in this Legislature, say, listen, in order to accomplish the mission, we must have our budget increased for our own selves by 8.5 percent. We are not setting the example we should, Mr. Speaker.

Now, it is true that in our Finance Committee, we spent hours and hours since the 11th of December, trying to get greater efficiencies of programs, greater efficiencies of agencies, and we hold each and every person, including Eileen Anderson, including Lieutenant Governor King, to very meticulous cross examination, finding out justification for any change, any raise, and any position count. Yet, in our own Finance Committee, Mr. Speaker, we did not have the position count before us and we had, as our own Donna Ikeda said, 'the cart before the horse'. We took it up in Finance before it went to the honorable gentleman from West Kauai and his Legislative Management Committee. We did have the cart before the horse.

Mr. Speaker, we may be caught up in the six months or so in the economic cycle of recession and inflation. As you know, Mr. Speaker, we have 70 percent of all the income of this State coming from the tourist dollar and coming, Mr. Speaker, from people who make up their minds like you and I as to whether we shall travel, and travel is a luxury. It's the first thing that is cut, so we must not be deceived, Mr. Speaker, into doing things that may be counter-productive six months from now. Mr. Speaker, when we're talking about travel, and

talking about the degree of dependence, I think it is important for us to understand that travel to Hawaii is not getting in your car and motoring down to the next motel. It's a long airplane trip, and people make this decision on many factors. One of the factors is how much is it going to cost them to eat when they come out here. So inflation affects them. We have to compete with places like Mexico that has a currency situation that makes it attractive. We have to compete with the Caribbean, we have to compete with all resort areas that can offer this kind of beautiful climate. Therefore, Mr. Speaker, we have an industry which is now our main source of income that is terribly vulnerable to any type of recession, or if you want to call it depression. Let's hope we don't have a depression. Let's hope we don't even have a recession but, Mr. Speaker, we here in this Legislature, and specifically you, because you are our leader. . . don't look so surprised. And a fine leader, too, very fine, and one very well versed in parliamentary law but, Mr. Speaker, you must set this leadership, you must tell us that we, the Legislature, must not set an example and say, okay, fine, we have to go 8 percent up. You cannot find anything that is more in the eyes of the public than when I brought the pension and pay raise bill, and I sued you, sir, and I sued the Governor. I sued every person in this State who is of executive position, and I said, listen, we must not have a pension and pay raise bill, we can't afford it, it wasn't properly done. . ."

At this point, the Chair interrupted and said:

"Representative Sutton, I think the Chair has been giving you a lot of room. If you would confine your remarks to the expense bill, I am sure every member on this floor would appreciate that."

Representative Sutton continued, saying:

"I so shall. I shall indeed, but I do want to bring out that we must attempt to protect the taxpayers of Hawaii which have, as I said, one of the steepest tax takes in the entire nation. I gave you a figure of \$831 which was in the last 'U.S. News and World Report', and I said, Mr. Speaker, that we should set an example and that's why I drew the analogy.

Now, Mr. Speaker, the Legislature remains practically status quo on cost in the year 1978 for both the Senate and for us and we did very well. We returned \$91,000 to the General Fund. I don't know how much the Senate did, but we returned \$91,000 to the General Fund. Now, all of a sudden, in the year when we are expecting a recession, while we have this tremendous dependence on the tourist industry, where we find ourselves urged by your President, my President, James Carter, to have fiscal restraint and stop this inflation, and he specifically said in his address and this is, I quote verbatim: 'Three months ago, I outlined to the nation a balanced anti-inflation program that couples responsible government restraint with responsible wage and price restraint. It is based upon my knowledge that there is a more powerful force than government compulsion -- the force created by the cooperative efforts of millions of Americans working toward a common goal. . . ' and of their public servants which you, sir, and I are. 'Business and labor. . . ' and I am quoting from James Carter and he is speaking in the Congress of the United States on the 23rd of January. 'Business and labor have been increasingly supportive. It is imperative that we in government do our part. . . ' We know that our own gentleman over here that comes from Hawaii and he is a very able labor union leader. We know that he settled within James Carter's restraint and that he followed it meticulously, and he is a member of this body, and I have talked to him about it, and commended him about it, and he said that it was a difficult decision.

Now, Mr. Speaker, if business and labor are going to be supported, shouldn't we, Mr. Speaker? I can prove that we are already 1.5 percent above 7 percent, and I would support a basic proposition, Mr. Speaker, if we would do this. If we would look at the basic proposition of what we spent last year -- actually spent -- and then we were to say, alright, 5 percent and no more -- no more. Take exactly the amount that would mean the appropriation less what we returned to the General Fund and have 5 percent increment. That I would support because I think that would be perfectly legitimate.

We do have to accomplish the missions that the head of the Legislative Management has shown us; we do have to accomplish the missions that you told us about on Opening Day; we do have to accomplish the missions of the Governor of this State.

This is not, by any chance, an idle group. These are very stimulating people. I have never met more stimulated minds than the new people that have come into this House, and these people work and work hard. We see them on the House floor but we see them mostly in committees -- probing, trying to find out. They are sincere individuals. I have a hunch some of them may be coming along with me, Mr. Speaker, on this.

Mr. Speaker, I do know my ten minutes is coming to a close. . ."

Representative Larsen then rose and stated:

"I was just going to comment, Mr. Speaker. I think ten minutes has been exceeded. I was going to ask if we were going to take it for a while longer."

At this point, Representative Narvaes yielded his ten minutes to Representative Sutton.

Directed by the Chair to "proceed", Representative Sutton continued his remarks, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I do want to thank the honorable gentleman from my neighboring district of Kalihi. He has half of Kalihi and I have the other half, and he was very kind indeed, and thank you, Mr. Narvaes.

Now, Mr. Speaker, if we take systematic steps to curb inflation's impact in this beautiful State of Hawaii, we must start with our own legislative appropriations in this House and, Mr. Speaker, I know that we can do it, and I think that we have seen the key to it.

Mr. Speaker, before I close, I should like to address your attention to the \$150,000 appropriations labeled, 'For Special Studies'. Now, Mr. Speaker, you and I are attorneys-at-law and we deal with interpretations. Sometimes, people say that we went to law school and we had our minds narrowed. I think maybe they have been narrowed like a pencil. We don't always get the broad picture but right here, can I address your mind to item 6?

Item 6 is tanomoshi language. Mr. Speaker, I know about tanomoshi because when I was five years old, I got in one. Mr. Speaker, tanomoshi language means that ten of us join here and one guy really benefits

and the other nine go home empty-pocketed. Mr. Speaker, why do I call that tanomoshi language? I think you are very, very kind and very, very charitable to let me go this far because you know what I'm coming to. I'm coming to. . .or by the way, this lei was sent by Mr. Holt's aunt to me. We're coming to the language, Mr. Speaker, if I can find it here; otherwise, I'll have to use my photostatic memory but it's something like this. It is item 6, that such other purposes as may be determined by the joint action of the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and that is you, sir, and that means you're getting together with Mr. Wong and the two of you. . .and I realize it that no court in the world would ever convict the two of you for conspiracy -- you don't get along that well. But, Mr. Speaker, this is tanomoshi language. . ."

At this point, the Chair interrupted and remarked:

"The Chair agrees with you on that remark."

Representative Sutton continued, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I am fully aware of the basic proposition that you are fair-minded. I've had five years of great tolerance but, Mr. Speaker, I don't know what Mr. Wong would do. He sometimes, early in the morning, pushes me off the corner. He comes from my area and I don't like to give him a proposition where he has a blank check to spend these monies. I have never heard of this. I have taken a CPA exam and I passed, but I never sat in an auditor's office, so you could call me a three-quarter or 99 percent CPA, or whatever you would want to but, Mr. Speaker, I have never heard in accounting language anything of this nature to describe how funds are going to be spent. Our own State Representative Kinau Boyd Kamaliif brought this point out very dramatically by saying that she could not understand what 'Special Studies' were, and she could not understand how these 'Special Studies' could then be whimsically tied to the whim of you and Mr. Wong. Therefore, Mr. Speaker, I would ask that we try to delete that item 6.

Now, to proceed back and wrap this up, I think that we have all read the papers. We know that Iran is in turmoil, we know that Saudi Arabia. . .and we have an economy here that is so dependent upon OPEC prices that our Public Utilities Commission lets the public utilities raise their

rates solely on the basis of the price of oil, and I think that we all remember standing in line from 4:00 o'clock at gas stations. Now it is highly possible that we will have something of that nature again and, therefore, inflation is a terrible thing hanging over the heads of the people of these islands 2,500 miles away from the nearest coastline.

I feel, Mr. Speaker, that we, the legislative body, must set the example, that we must set it right here now and so I ask all of my colleagues, particularly these brilliant, magnificent new freshmen, to go along with me and vote down House Bill No. 11.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Larsen then rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"I feel that I have a large weight on my back after that last fifteen minutes. I would like to address myself to one specific point and not ramble around the countryside, nationally or world-wide. One thing we did not hear from and I'd like to acknowledge to the freshmen that there is a problem here. They better have their machetes available because when we get introduced to the primrose path, it meanders up through the Nuuanu Valley and they would have to figure out what to do about that.

Anyway, my point here is that we are not voting for a 7 percent increase in the budget as has been explained earlier. We all realize that some of these funds are already being obligated and we are voting more for budget increases of between 3.5 percent to 4 percent.

I had some problems with the budget adjustment myself. When you look at it, half of the budget is going for a mandatory increase in our staff salaries and the balance is for cost increases throughout.

I would favor voting for this bill and urge all members to do so.

Thank you."

At this point, Representative Sutton asked for a roll call vote.

The Chair then said:

"The Chair would like to remind the Representative from Nuuanu that on Third Reading bills, we

do have roll call."

Representative Kamalii then rose to speak against House Bill No. 11, House Draft 1, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, the arguments we presented in favor of our amendment are valid arguments against this measure. I would like to just briefly emphasize two major points.

We are violating proper budgetary procedures. Granted, the nature of the Legislature, particularly our unusual calendar year rather than a fiscal year, and a 60-day acknowledged full-time body, requires budgetary flexibility. However, such flexibility should never be bought at the price of losing accountability. To see these additional funds as a kind of sliding slush fund to be used when the need arises, rather than according to item guidelines, is highly questionable at best.

Further, this 7 percent was arrived at by increasing levels of appropriation instead of using expenditure figures. We are using those magic numbers which give us the greatest latitude, not those figures which would assure the public of proper accounting. If we were to use last year's expenditures, then we are more than \$120,000 in excess of the 7 percent presented.

As you can see, Mr. Speaker, we compound our errors and confound the public.

I am recommending that the Legislative Management Committee be charged to meet, in the meantime, immediately to correct these flaws and to report back to this body. I must vote against this bill and I urge my colleagues to do likewise."

Representative Suwa then rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"In speaking for House Bill No. 11, House Draft 1, Mr. Speaker, the investment made on this budget is to increase the capability of the legislative process whereby a minimum investment now, in reviewing the one billion dollar budget, Mr. Speaker, the Legislature will have the capability necessary to scrutinize the executive budget.

More importantly, during the interim, the supplementary budget can be prepared. In the area of supplementary budget, corrections can be made where there is an over-budget and where there is a deficiency, you appropriate. In that area, Mr. Speaker, this money

will be well spent, not mentioning the Con Con requirement.

Mr. Speaker, a question was raised regarding item 6, page 3, lines 19 through 21, of House Bill No. 11, to do with \$150,000 of 'Special Studies' assigned to the Auditor's Office. Mr. Speaker, in reviewing the past, some of the unpredictable session requirements for studies and more studies, in light of justification for this legislative action, or program to be implemented in the next year or so, it was felt that the Auditor's Office has the capability since it is divorced from the political arena in describing the scope, specification of the studies, and choosing the right people to do the work, and not necessarily by your office or by the President's Office in choosing some of the studies to be contracted.

So, in support of this bill, Mr. Speaker, once again, I would like the Minority, likewise, to change their minds, that we are putting this investment in the right perspective and not necessarily wasting the taxpayers' money. The investment today may scrutinize the executive budget in the proper perspective so that we may realize much larger savings. Therefore, Mr. Speaker, I urge the members of this House to support this House Bill No. 11, House Draft 1.

Thank you."

Representative Kamalii then rose and inquired whether or not the Chairman of the Finance Committee would yield to a question to which Representative Suwa answered in the affirmative.

Representative Kamalii then asked:

"I just want clarification here with respect to the \$150,000. It says in the Committee Report: 'For special studies and other purposes to be jointly determined by the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, which may be used for salary adjustments not included in the amounts budgeted for the agencies.' What does that mean?"

Representative Suwa answered:

"Mr. Speaker, exactly what is meant is that, in light of the collective bargaining taking place and in light of some of the justification, you may have to adjust some of the line agencies' request, and for that

reason, instead of budgeting the salary increase in some areas, we have a section that they can go to and still use it within the \$150,000 for the adjustment rather than having to come back for deficiency appropriation for the line agency -- legislative arm, maybe."

Representative Kamalii then asked:

"Are the employees of the agencies. . . do they not come under the collective bargaining agreements now, or don't they belong to a union?"

Representative Suwa answered:

"Many of them are exempt from Civil Service status, Mr. Speaker, in light of that position they hold to service the Legislature."

The Chair then stated:

"The Chair would like to state that the employed personnel of the Legislative Reference Bureau, Auditor's Office, and I believe the Ombudsman, do not belong to any bargaining unit."

Representative Kamalii then asked:

"Mr. Speaker, could you give me a position count for all of those agencies?"

The Chair replied:

"I will be happy to furnish that upon request. I do not have it in my mind at the present time."

Representative Kamalii thanked the Chair.

The motion to pass H.B. No. 11, HD 1, on Third Reading was put by the Chair and H.B. No. 11, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO PROVIDE FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE LEGISLATURE, THE LEGISLATIVE AUDITOR, THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU, AND THE OMBUDSMAN", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a roll call vote of 40 ayes to 9 noes, with Representatives Anderson, Evans, Ikeda, Kamalii, Lacy, Marumoto, Medeiros, Narvaes and Sutton voting no, and Representatives Kobayashi and Lee being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 11 had passed Third Reading at 5:22 o'clock p.m.

At 5:23 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened

at 5:25 o'clock p.m.

ADJOURNMENT

by Representative Evans and carried,
the House of Representatives adjourned
to 11:30 o'clock a.m. tomorrow, Wednesday,

STANDING COMMITTEE REPORTS

Representative Kunimura, for the Committee on Legislative Management, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. Representative Sutton then rose to speak in favor of H.C.R. No. 5:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to rise in favor of the adoption of this excellent measure.

Mr. Speaker, as you know, the greatest problem facing the United

States of America today is inflation. Today, your dollar, in just ten years, depreciated fifty cents. Go to the grocery store, Mr. Speaker, and you will find out what I am talking about.

Mr. Speaker, we established, after World War I, a federal reserve system. We gave the federal reserve system the power to work a discount, to work reserve requirements on the member banks, to go in the open market and buy and sell bonds. We gave them the tools that we hoped would control inflation, but we forgot one factor -- and that was M-1. M-1, Mr. Speaker, is the money supply, and they print money just as fast as the Congress of the United States creates deficits.

It is difficult, Mr. Speaker, for you to conceive of this because here in Hawaii we come out with a balanced budget. That is why it is so appropriate that the head of our Finance Committee should submit this resolution, because it's his job (and Lord knows he gets ulcers and doesn't sleep too well) but he still has to balance his budget.

Now, Mr. Speaker, we are asking the Congress of the United States, and we will be joining twenty-seven other states that have already passed it, that we have a constitutional amendment which will require, fiscally, a balanced budget. Admittedly, this will have a traumatic effect, but we have an escape clause, and that is in cases of emergency, a balanced budget could be omitted.

It is a rather strange thing, Mr. Speaker, that you and I have been through a recent presidential campaign where we heard about balanced budgets, yet we will be going to the people with a proposition of a forty-six billion dollar deficit this year, eighty billion dollars the year before, seventy-two billion dollars the year before that, and since 1961 we have seen the dollar depreciate as these budgets and deficits required the printing of M-1, namely money.

And so, Mr. Speaker, I would ask you and my distinguished colleagues here to give this particular resolution their 100% endorsement.

I thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Throughout her life 'Iolani Luahine represented a re-dedication: a re-dedication daily of her commitment to the art and meaning of the hula, especially of the ancient chants. Each day, there was her re-dedication to the principles and teachings of the kumu hulu, to maintain the integrity of the ancient culture and to share its richness.

Auntie 'Io daily practiced the cultural integrity which always, in her lifetime, must have seemed undervalued and almost forgotten. But she lived to see the re-dedication of so many others to assure that the native Hawaiian culture would not disappear from the islands. It almost seems that she lived up to the day of being assured that others would continue.

The dance and culture which she embraced will live. But there will never again be another Auntie 'Io. Her place will never be filled. Aloha no, 'Io."

Representative Peters also rose to speak on H.C.R. No. 46:

"Mr. Speaker and members of the House, this resolution honors the memory and achievements of 'Iolani Luahine. Our words, however, could not capture the essence of her mano'o, of her special spirit.

You all know and recognize the seriousness which she extended to her dances. The true essence of Auntie 'Io was in her mischief, in those eyes that danced even though her hands were still.

I have no doubt, Mr. Speaker, that she is dancing even now. Her name means 'Sacred Bird of Heaven', the symbol of royalty of the most high. Perhaps she is now the ultimate expression of that name, and in our memory she is still the menehune and the priestess of the dance which she so deeply personified.

Thank you."

Bellinger for his outstanding and dedicated service to the people of Hawaii as civilian aide to the Secretary of the Army and as Chairman of the U.S. Army Civilian Advisory Group in Hawaii, which was adopted by the Senate on February 14, 1979, was placed on file.

On motion by Representative K. Yamada, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, S.C.R. No. 28 was adopted.

DISPOSITION OF MATTER PLACED ON THE CLERK'S DESK

By unanimous consent, H.B. No. 11, HD 1, as amended by the Senate, was taken from the Clerk's desk.

Representative Suwa moved that H.B. No. 11, HD 1, SD 1, having been read throughout, pass Final Reading, seconded by Representative Morioka.

The Chair, at this time, recognized Representative Sutton to speak against H.B. No. 11, HD 1, SD 1, whereupon he asked:

"Mr. Speaker, if I run out of my ten minutes, will you give me your ten minutes?"

The Chair replied:

"I will have to take that under advisement."

Representative Sutton then spoke against the bill, stating:

"Now, Mr. Speaker, as you know, House Bill 11, House Draft 1 has come back from the Senate with a very minor deletion of \$3,403 that has to do with the fact that the Commission on Ethics did not set a ceiling so, in effect, Mr. Speaker, this is the same bill that we had before us the start of the week.

Now, Mr. Speaker, we, the Legislature, should set the example such as we did just a few days ago when we passed a resolution asking the Congress of

the United States to have a constitutional amendment whereby they would not exceed the income and receipt coming to the Congress of the United States of America in any one fiscal year and we became the 28th state, Utah having passed it on the first of February. It seems, therefore, that we should be consistent and not have anything inflationary and, Mr. Speaker, this is inflationary because it exceeds the guidelines of the President.

I would also like to point out to you, Mr. Speaker, that we have here on page 3 of the bill, item 6, we have an item that says: 'Such other purposes as may be dependent by the joint action of the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.'

Mr. Speaker, that is not in the best accounting and professional method that should be used. An account should be stated and an account should be specified and there should be a name applied there to it. When we put \$150,000 contingent upon the approval of two gentlemen, worthy as you are to make that decision, Mr. Speaker, the point is that we do not have the best accounting principles involved therein. So, I would like my colleagues to consider the inflationary process here, seeing the fact that we are exceeding the President's guidelines, being that we are making an action inconsistent with what we did a few days ago, and finally, Mr. Speaker, with all due deference to you, that we should not give you a blank check.

Mr. Speaker, I would ask my colleagues and I see some very brilliant new members of this body and, very frankly, they have startled me with their great intelligence and, maybe, they will come along with me and vote no.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The Chair remarked:

"I am certain that they will use their intelligence and you will be startled."

Roll call having been requested, the motion was put to a vote and H.B. No. 11, HD 1, SD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS TO PROVIDE FOR THE EXPENSES OF THE LEGISLATURE, THE LEGISLATIVE AUDITOR, THE LEGISLATIVE REFERENCE BUREAU, AND THE OMBUDSMAN",

having been read throughout, passed Final Reading by a vote of 42 ayes to 9 noes, with Representatives Anderson, Evans, Ikeda, Kamalii, Lacy, Marumoto, Medeiros, Narvaes and Sutton voting no.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 11 had passed Final Reading at 12:14 o'clock p.m.

At this time, Representative Narvaes was recognized to make a late introduction and he introduced Mr. Holt, "a very distinguished resident of Kalihi", and father of Representative Holt, to the members of the House.

Representative Kunimura then rose on a point of information and asked:

"May I ask, on a point of information, the reason for your being leied this morning?"

The Chair answered:

"Some young students presented me with this beautiful lei in order to recognize Valentine's Day. The Chair would like to extend to all of your spouses, boyfriends and girlfriends a Happy Valentine's Day."

Representative Kunimura responded:

"Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker, and might I suggest that we declare everyday as Saint Valentine's Day because I've never seen such aurora of a smile and glow from the podium as I have in the past 17 years."

The Chair replied:

"The Chair concurs with you."

Representative Kamalii then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, along that same line, we, from the Republican caucus, wish to extend to you a very Happy Valentine's Day, and I hope you continue to conduct yourself with love and understanding throughout the rest of the session."

The Chair replied:

"We always do."

At 12:20 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative K. Yamada, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned until 11:30 o'clock a.m. tomorrow, Thursday, February 15, 1979.

Thursday, February 15, 1979

The House of Representatives of the Tenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1979, convened at 11:30 o'clock a.m., with the Speaker presiding.

On motion by Representative Kunimura, seconded by Representative Kawakami and carried, H.R. No. 376 was adopted.

A resolution (H.R. No. 377) honoring Clara Spencer Levy on the occasion of her eightieth birthday, commending her for being a model mother, grandmother,

great grandmother, and friend, and wishing her continued happiness and long life was jointly offered by Representatives Peters, Aki, Blair, Crozier, Hagino, Hashimoto, Honda, Inaba, Kamalii, Kihano, Kiyabu, Kobayashi, Kunimura, Lacy, Larsen, Lunasco, Machida, Masutani, Medeiros, Narvaes, Sakamoto, Say, Segawa, Stanley, Sutton, Takamine, Takitani, Toguchi, Ushijima, Uwaine and K. Yamada.

On motion by Representative Peters, seconded by Representative Aki and carried, H.R. No. 377 was adopted.

By unanimous consent, the following resolutions (H.R. Nos. 374 and 375 and 378 to 380) and concurrent resolution (H.C.R. No. 67) were referred to the Committee on Legislative Management and further action was deferred until Tuesday, February 27, 1979:

A resolution (H.R. No. 374) requesting stabilization of the entertainment industry was jointly offered by Representatives de Heer, Aki, Baker, Blair, Dods, Honda, Kihano, Kiyabu, Lee, Lunasco and Toguchi.

A resolution (H.R. No. 375) requesting a report on Pohukaina School was offered by Representative Stanley.

A resolution (H.R. No. 378) requesting a review of the State Director of Health's proposed solutions to problems of administration, staffing, and facilities at Maui Memorial Hospital was offered by Representative Takitani.

A resolution (H.R. No. 379) requesting the State Energy Office to report on Hawaii's fuel allocation contingency plans was jointly offered by Representatives Uwaine and Hashimoto.

A resolution (H.R. No. 380) commending the Women's Studies Program of the University of Hawaii and requesting permanent status for the program was offered by Representative Stanley.

A concurrent resolution (H.C.R. No. 67) requesting stabilization of the entertainment industry was jointly offered by Representatives de Heer, Aki, Baker, Blair, Dods, Honda, Kihano, Kiyabu, Lee, Lunasco and Toguchi.

At this time, Representative Lunasco was permitted to make a late introduction and he introduced 60 special education students from Kahuku High School. They were accompanied by their teachers, Mrs. Augustine, Mrs. Anae, Mrs. Miyahara, Mr. Nakamura and Mr. Baldner.

Representative Suwa then extended birthday greetings to Representative Inaba and asked Representative Hashimoto to present the honoree with a red carnation lei.

Representative Inaba thanked the members of the House.

Representative Evans then rose on a point of information and asked:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to know that on the Saturdays throughout the session, if bills will be available in the Clerk's Office; at least Third Reading and Final Reading bills, so that the public can come in and obtain copies. Will they be available?"

At 12:11 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

It is expected that Committees do have decision-making; have your Committee Reports ready for printing; and that the Reports will be ready for action on Tuesday, February 27th, which means that all of us should be prepared for a long legislative day. It is intended that the session will convene at 11:00 o'clock a.m. so the Committees should schedule their hearings accordingly for that particular day."

The Chair would also like to announce that during the recess, the public is invited to the House to visit the respective Representatives' offices; that all the bills introduced so far will be available to the public at the Chamber level and also at the Policy Committee Room on the third floor. Staff will be available at all times from 8:00 o'clock a.m. to 4:30 o'clock p.m. to assist the public during those hours."

At 12:30 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:32 o'clock p.m.
