By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the Twenty-First Day was deferred.

At 11:35 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

Upon reconvening at 11:37 o'clock a.m., the Chair directed the Clerk to note the presence of Representatives Blair, Fukunaga, Hagino and Kawakami.

#### SENATE COMMUNICATION

A communication from the Senate (Sen. Com. No. 18) returning House Concurrent Resolution No. 53 which was adopted by the Senate on February 13, 1980, was read by the Clerk and was placed on file.

At this time, the Clerk read House Concurrent Resolution No. 53 commending Minoru Hirabara and recognizing his contributions to the people of Hawaii.

Representative Sakamoto then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I have had the opportunity and pleasure of serving with Mino as a member of the State Central Committee as its Party treasurer. Through the years, I have known Mino to hold optimistic and positive views concerning the Party's organization and programs. He has encouraged the younger people to become involved in the democratic process and on many occasions afforded the responsibility of carrying out various programs, chairing committees, running the State convention, and chairing the last presidential campaign in Hawaii.

# THIRD READING

The following bills, which were on the calendar for Third Reading, were read throughout and the following actions taken:

# S.B. No. 1946-80:

On motion by Representative Morioka, seconded by Representative Inaba and carried, S.B. No. 1946-80, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATION FOR COLLECTIVE BARGAINING COST ITEMS", passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Garcia being excused.

### S.B. No. 1947-80:

Representative Morioka moved that S.B. No. 1947-80, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Inaba.

Representative Sutton then rose to speak against the bill:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to draw your attention, please, to the wording in the Bill for an Act making appropriations that 1947-80 has -- 'Section 1. This Act is recommended by the Governor for immediate passage in accordance with section 9 of Article VII. . .' Therefore, because of the emergency that he has put, this will supersede the actual supplementary budget.

'Section 2. The purpose of this Act is to appropriate or authorize, as the case may be, funds for the fiscal biennium 1979-81, to cover the adjustments authorized by chapter 89C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, for State officers and employees excluded from collective bargaining.'

Now, Mr. Speaker, if you concentrate very carefully because we come to the meat of what concerns me -'The intent of this Act is to provide the necessary fund authorization and appropriations to allow for the immediate and retroactive implementation of comparable salary increases and other cost adjustments. . . '

Now, would you, for one minute, allow me to read from a 'Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary' and it has a dateline of 1979, and I am looking, Mr. Speaker, at the word 'comparable' It says here comparable is an adjective. It says: '(1) capable of or suitable for comparison; (2) equivalent, similar.' So, if we look at that word 'equivalent' and we go back and we look at that sentence again, and this is in the actual Act -- 'The intent of this Act is to provide the necessary fund authorization and appropriations to allow for the immediate and retroactive implementation of' and we put the word 'equivalent' salary increases. . . ' If you are going to give equivalent salary increases to all excluded employees, you will be in violation of our existing statutes because our existing statutes which is 89C, 'Adjustments authorized: limitations, restrictions, says that, 'Any provision of law to the contrary notwithstanding, the compensation, hours, terms and conditions of employment, and other benefits for public officers and employees who are excluded from collective bargaining shall be adjusted by the chief executives of the State or counties, the board of education, the board of regents, or the chief justice, as applicable.' and they have three sections: '(1) For excluded officers and employees under the same compensation plans as officers and employees within collective bargaining units, such adjustments shall be not less than those provided under collective bargaining agreements for officers and employees hired

on a comparable basis. . . ' and '(2) For officers and employees covered by chapters 77 and 297, no adjusted compensation shall exceed ninety-five percent of the maximum compensation allowable under section 26-53.'

Now, Mr. Speaker, if you will allow me to go to section 26-53, 'Deputies or assistants to department heads. The salaries of first and second deputies or first and second assistants to the head of any department of the State shall be set by the director or executive officer concerned. Effective July 1, 1975, et cetera, 'effective January 1, 1976, the salaries of first deputies or first assistants shall be not more than \$40,000 a year. Then we come down to 26-54, 'Administrative director of the State. The salary of the administrative director of the State shall be set by the governor and shall not exceed. . .', and we have limitations of the persons; the University of Hawaii is another limitation.

Were we to pass this and were a court to construe that the intent of this Act is to provide comparable raises, and a court, maybe by a class action case brought by a group of the University of Hawaii professors, should say in so many words, you have to give them equivalent raises because we have this ambiguity mixed right into the very Act that we have before us.

What would happen? This is what would happen. We would have by the end of 1979-80, a group of 11 employees who would exceed the limits that I have just given you, and in the fiscal year 1980-81, we would have a great deal more -- maybe as high as 333 people. And what we have done is to put a statute on the books which has ambiguity.

There is always a question in law whether one conflicting statute supersedes another. That is a very good question. The superseding part. . .

Now, Mr. Speaker, could I have Mr. Medeiros brought to attention, please. I am giving a talk here. You just said a while back that we are going to have decorum."

Directed by the Chair to proceed, Representative Sutton continued:

"Mr. Speaker, what I am concerned about is the latent ambiguity that we are putting in. We can very easily correct this if we will work out a scheme whereby we provide some statutory correction to 89C at this time. All we have to do is make this correction

prior to passing this appropriation and this is a concern that has been brought to the Attorney General.

Now, as you know, Mr. Speaker, my father was an Attorney General of this State. At that time, he rendered an opinion. At that time he said, 'My opinion is just as good as it lasts until there is an adjudication by a court.'

Mr. Speaker, what we are up against is that an adjudication has not been rendered -- an opinion -and let me show you where this opinion of the Attorney General falls down. We have a very nice young boy -- four years out of law school who has given us this opinion, and I am very happy that he did because he has gone through the same reasoning I have just given you, but then he comes with the following: 'With regards to the first question, we believe that the phrase, 'comparable salary increases' in Senate Bill 1947-80 must be construed in relation to the rest of the bill. The stated purpose of the bill is to cover the adjustments authorized to fulfill this purpose as Senate Bill 1947-80 provides appropriations in a lump sum amount for excluded employees. There is no language in the bill indicating that it supersedes 89C in any way.

There is language and the language is very clear. . . right here in the bill that we are passing! What is that language? The language says, 'The intent of this Act is to provide the necessary fund authorization and appropriations to allow for the immediate and retroactive implementation of comparable', which we have now shown to be equivalent, 'salary increases and other cost adjustments to excluded State officers and employees for the fiscal biennium beginning July 1, 1979. There it is, right in the statutes, and the Attorney General does not even look at that.

Now, Mr. Speaker, we had a Finance meeting. At the Finance meeting, we had testimony. At the testimony, we had Mr. Robert Taira, Mr. Botelho, and Mr. Botelho was standing at one end of the room, Mr. Taira at the other. Then at the table we had four of the top labor unions of this State and these representatives were Mr. Epstein, two others, and Mr. Trask. Now, Mr. Trask is a friend of mine; he lives in my district. I represent him. I call him Uncle Kawika and he is a brilliant man, but we just happen to have a little disagreement here and he

brought out that the word'comparable' means 'the same as'. If it means 'the same as', there is no question that every one of these 333 people, through the biennium, must receive those raises.

Let me just show you, Mr. Speaker, how correct Mr. Trask is. I am not his advocate and I am not his attorney; he has never hired me as such to the best of my knowledge and won't necessarily in the future, but he has made a very excellent case. He has pointed out that comparable means 'the same as', and therefore, that these people should get those raises and that was his testimony. It was beautifully presented. And all I am doing is saying his testimony is now on the tape in the Finance Committee.

You have seen from my arguments that we are buying ambiguity. We are buying ambiguity until we clarify by a statutory amendment to 89C, and I say that we should follow, and if I may, Mr. Speaker, quote you, 'Do not worry about quantity of legislation, worry about the quality.' If we worry about the quality, let's get proper legislation. Let's vote no on this now.

Thank you."

Representative Morioka then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of Senate Bill 1947-80 and in so doing, I would like to clarify some of the concerns expressed by the previous speaker.

This bill, Mr. Speaker, is an appropriation bill and it goes to provide funds to take care of the excluded employees. The concern that is expressed, we have an opinion from the Attorney General's office and if I may read from the opinion. . . 'We believe that the phrase, 'comparable salary increases', must be interpreted in view of the stated purpose of the bill; for instance, to provide appropriations for pay increases that are authorized by chapter 89C. Section 89C, Hawaii Revised Statutes, clearly indicates that only adjustments made in accordance with this chapter supersedes other statutes.'

The Attorney General also says that, 'Senate Bill 1947-80 does not allow any increases in the salaries of excluded employees beyond the limitations specified in chapter 89C.' Also, it states that, 'In view of the questions that were raised, we believe that neither sections 89C-2 or 89C-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, will be violated if Senate Bill No. 1947-80

or House Bill No. 1853-80 became law.'

Therefore, Mr. Speaker, I urge that every member vote for this measure.

Thank you."

In rebuttal, Representative Sutton stated:

"Mr. Speaker, four times in reading the Attorney General's report, the chairman read the words, 'we believe.' Nowhere in a court decision do you ever hear a court say we believe. They say we adjudicate.

Therefore, Mr. Speaker, what we have is only one man's opinion and that opinion does not even address the fact; that in the Act itself we have this language brought out in testimony before the Finance Committee by Mr. David Trask and he read the language as follows, and it is in your statutes: 'The intent of this Act is to provide the necessary fund authorization and appropriations to allow for the immediate and retroactive implementation of comparable salary increases.'

There it is! Any court of law is going to look to what is the intent and the intent is embodied in the statutes. Therefore, you have this latent ambiguity and because you have this latent ambiguity, you are buying trouble. Clarify it one way or the other, but clarify it.

Thank you."

Representative Kunimura then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of this bill and in so doing, I, too, am armed with the opinion of the Attorney General of the State of Hawaii, the constitutional legal officer of this State, and thank God, we have only one. Just imagine if we had a dozen or so attorney generals; we would be spinning in circles rather than trying to get our work done.

Mr. Speaker, I asked this Attorney General's office if Senate Bill 1947-80 would be a vehicle appropriating funds for adjustments authorized by 89C and that in so doing, my query was: Would it supersede the statutory limitations in sections 89C-2 and 89C-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes? And the Attorney General's reply was in the negative, and it

states further in the next paragraph that it clearly shows and it reinforces the majority of the Finance Committee members' feeling and thinking that this, in no way, can be construed as a vehicle amending the statutes of the State of Hawaii, but rather, it is an appropriations act and the confirmation is a prohibition in the Constitution that one title, one subject matter in the body of the bill, and this is in the title an appropriation act, and the body of the bill is to appropriate the funds, so it cannot be seen in any other light, even suspicion of latent ambiguity and, Mr. Speaker, it has been established that the Attorney General's opinion is the opinion and not the decision of the court and that is why it is so stated as an opinion. They cannot adjudicate, but if any member of this House or taxpayer of this State want to go to court and test the validity and constitutionality of this Act, then they are free to do so. But if we are going to be stymied to wait for the court to adjudicate some of the ambiguities proclaimed or claimed to be inherent with the bill, then it is going to take more than 365 days for a body like the Legislature to enact anything.

Therefore, Mr. Speaker, anything beyond what has been said on the floor about we should wait, we should amend the statutes, to wipe out or explain 95 percent, is a pure attempt of derogatory tactics and I will not stand for it, and I urge all members of this House to vote for this bill."

Representative Sutton then rose and Representative K. Yamada, on a point of order, stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I think the gentleman that just stood up has spoken twice already."

At 12:35 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:36 o'clock p.m.

Representative Kamalii then rose to speak in favor of S.B. No. 1947-80.

"Mr. Speaker, it was my concern several days ago when I appeared before the Finance Committee to point out the possibility that there might be a question of legality of this bill. The Representative from the 15th District was also present at that time and because of our concern of legality of this appropriation bill and the wording, we wrote for an opinion from the Attorney General. I have that opinion and it was delivered

to me this morning. And I have been assured by this opinion from the Attorney General's office that this bill, S.B. 1947-80, cannot be used to supersede the salary limits set by chapter 89C of our statutes. Those excluded civil service employees who have now run into the ceiling set by our laws will then be denied the salary adjustments accorded other exempt employees. I find that this situation may cause some unhappiness, especially among those division chiefs who will not receive a pay increase and probably deserve one. However, Mr. Speaker, it is far more important to my mind that we maintain the integrity of our professions than that we attempt to circumvent these provisions. If it is the wish of the majority of this House to give those raises in excess of \$38,000, then Mr. Speaker, it is imperative that those adjustments be made openly and publicly.

Thank you."

Representative Kunimura then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to again speak in favor of this bill and in so doing, I would like to extend my warm aloha and deep sense of gratitude to the honorable Minority Leader.

In their house, like ours, we should tolerate differences of opinion and the Minority Leader appeared before the Finance Committee, Mr. Speaker, and she tried, and when the majority voted to report this bill out, she did the right thing to go to the Attorney General for an opinion, and I respect her for that, and I encourage such moves and such strategy, and I have deep aloha because we may have different approaches to solving the problem the way we had to solve the problems of the State of Hawaii, and I would like to, Mr. Speaker, extend to the Minority Leader my deepest aloha and thank you."

The motion to pass S.B. No. 1947-80 on Third Reading was put by the Chair and carried, and S.B.

No. 1947-80, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING APPROPRIATIONS FOR ADJUSTMENTS AUTHORIZED BY CHAPTER 89C, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 49 ayes to 1 no, with Representative Sutton voting no, and Representative Garcia being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that S.B. No. 1946-80 had passed Third Reading at 12:15 o'clock p.m. and S.B. No. 1947-80 at 12:40 o'clock p.m.

At this time, Representative Sakamoto was granted permission to make a late introduction and he introduced Mr. Tadao Okimoto, a member of the State Democratic Central Committee from the Big Island.

Representative Lunasco then requested permission to waive the 48-hour notice on House Bill No. 2076-80 which relates to the abolition of the Board of Education to be heard tomorrow, February 15, 1980

Permission was granted by the Chair.

Representative Evans, on behalf of the minority, wished the majority members a "Happy Valentine's Day", and "especially to a newly married member of the House."

Representative K. Yamada reciprocated and wished the minority a "Happy Valentine's Day."

The Chair then said:

"The Chair would like to go a step further and wish all of your spouses also a Happy Valentine; those who are not married, to all their girlfriends."

### ADJOURNMENT

At 12:45 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative K. Yamada, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned until 11:30 o'clock a.m. tomorrow, Friday, February 15, 1980.

At this time, the Speaker assumed the rostrum.

### SUSPENSION OF RULES

On motion by Representative K. Yamada, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the rules were suspended for the purpose of taking action on substantive resolution, Senate Resolution No. 25.

Representative K. Yamada moved that Senate Resolution No. 25 be adopted, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Evans rose to speak in favor of S.C.R. No. 25:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of S.C.R. No. 25 and in doing so may I say that we had an amendment to offer if it had been a House Concurrent Resolution; however, it is not our intention to hold up the legislature or the recess. We would like to clearly deliniate what the purposes of the recess are.

We believe that the primary purposes of a recess are to give the public time to review all the bills that have been introduced in both Houses and to provide an opportunity for legislators and constituents to communicate on matters before the legislature. This, Mr. Speaker, is taken from the Constitutional Convention of Hawaii, Standing Committee Report No. 46, August 23, 1978, Page 7. They also believe that this recess is to permit legislators and their constituents to meet free from the time constraints that are concomitant with regular legislative days as intended by the framers of the constitution. We urge the adoption of the resolution.

Representative Peters also rose to speak in favor of the resolution:

"I would like to point out, Mr. Speaker, that the State House of Representatives will again use the upcoming 5 day recess to encourage greater public participation in our legislative process. A program similar to those presented last year during the legislative recess will be scheduled. It is anticipated that public turn-out this year will be greater as more and more people become aware of the purpose behind the constitutional recess.

Our committees will continue to hold public hearings. Regular Sessions have been suspended from February 19 until February 25. All current legislative proposals will be displayed for review in the chamber level and in Policy Committee Room 326. There will also be daily showings of films on the lawmaking process in the capitol auditorium, and interested groups are urged to contact their representatives' offices for tours of the capitol.

The recess will allow the public the opportunity to gain a better perspective on all the bills that have been introduced; equally important, legislators will have the time to obtain feedback from the community on these proposals.

As you know, Mr. Speaker, the delegates voted an amendment to Article III of the State Constitution requiring the State Legislature to recess for not less than 5 days within a particular period during its regular session. The amendment allowed the legislature to determine the date of the mandatory recess. As you know, Mr. Speaker, we are adhering to that amendment, adhering to the constitutional provisions as adopted by the people of this State. The majority concurs. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion to adopt S.C.R. No. 25 was put by the Chair and carried.

### INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

Whereas, Muhammad Ali has been an ambassador of goodwill for the United States of America to Africa, representing the President of the United States in a very difficult mission; and whereas, he has flown down here and was with us last night to help encourage boxing amongst the younger generation so that we can produce our own Henry Peters and John Medeiroses; whereas Muhammad Ali has shown the tremendous capacity to always turn the other cheek and be a person who could take any amount of punishment without dishing out any dirty blows, and he is coming over to these chambers. He is a little late; he is over with the Mayor; he has sent word that he is coming over. We have a very busy

schedule and we do appreciate, Mr. Speaker, your honoring this gentleman.

Would you give me the authority to present this certificate and could I get your signature on it for certification?"

The Chair answered:

"Your request will be granted."

Representative Sutton continued:

"And there is a lei here -- a beautiful lei -- and we will ask Barbara Marumoto in the name of everybody here to give him that lei."

Upon reconvening at 10:05 o'clock p.m., the Chair ruled Representative Kamalii out of order on her point of privilege of the House.

"Mr. Speaker, I am in order. I have Cushing's; we have gone through this before. As you know, neither Cushing's nor Robert's address the privilege of the House; therefore, it does revert to the common parliamentary law, and if you will bear with me I would like to read this again for the members of the House. Cushing's nor our House rules cover the points.

At this point, Representative K. Yamada interrupted on a point of order and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I believe that the Chair has already ruled and the question of the privilege is not debatable at this point."

Representative Kamalii again appealed the ruling of the Chair.

The Chair then said:

"The Chair's ruling has been appealed. All in favor of sustaining the Chair's ruling, will say 'aye'; all those opposed will say 'no'. The question is: Shall the Chair's ruling be sustained?"

The motion was put to a vote and the Chair's ruling was sustained by voice vote.

Representative Kamalii rose and asked by the Chair, "For what purpose do you rise?", Representative Kamalii answered:

"I again rise on a point of privilege of the House."

Directed by the Chair to "state your point", Representative Kamalii stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I asked you earlier whether you were going to resign.

The Chair interrupted and stated:

"Representative Kamalii, the Chair has ruled and the same point that

you are raising. . . you are out of order."

Representative Kamalii said:

"I haven't finished. How can you rule me out of order?"

The Chair replied:

"You have stated the question."

At 10:07 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

Upon reconvening at 10:13 o'clock p.m., Representative Kamalii rose and asked by the Chair, "For what purpose do you rise?", Representative

Kamalii answered:

"On a point of personal privilege."

Directed by the Chair to "state your point", Representative Kamalii stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I just want to say that through your silence, you are not going to resign."

## ADJOURNMENT

At 10:14 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative K. Yamada, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned to 11:30 o'clock a.m. tomorrow, Wednesday, February 27, 1980.

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of this resolution as a bipartisan measure. I've had the privilege and great pleasure of serving in the legislature during

Dr. Mills' term here and he has shown us that the bi-partisan line encompasses the entire land territory of Hawaii. He has shown me, Mr. Speaker, that we, as legislators, are here for only one reason, and that is to serve the people of Hawaii, not the party, not any vested interest. I have always admired and liked Dr. Mills and, I hope, in adopting this resolution this morning that we will not be voting for an Outstanding Hawaiian in the sense of ethnic background, but an Outstanding Hawaiian finally recognized for the many years of devotion and dedication to the people of Hawaii -- the Number One Citizen of Hawaii representing the ethnic and aboriginal group of Hawaii. I would like to request that my colleagues give Dr. Mills a rousing vote of confidence for his continued dedication and good service to the people of Hawaii. Thank you."

Representative Segawa also rose to speak on H.R. No. 229:

"Mr. Speaker, I would be remiss if I did not say a few words in behalf of this resolution and all the good things it says. I have had the privilege of being associated with Dr. Mills for the past several years in the health area, and I would have to say that Dr. Mills is one of the few physicians who gives generously of his time which is a valuable asset for doctors. For other doctors, it means being on the job and doing their thing in their profession, but Dr. Mills, as head of the voluntary cost containment health program has spent many many hours in trying to hold down costs in the health area. I have listened to him and. because of his past political and governmental experiences, he has been an invaluable person who contributes toward the political and governmental process in understanding not only the mechanics of health care, but the mechanics of government as it is involved in health. And so as we pay tribute to a person who has been chosen the Outstanding Hawaiian person in the State of Hawaii, I look to him as a person who is an outstanding citizen of this great State of Hawaii, as well as this great nation of ours, the United States

of America. I would like all my colleagues to give him a resounding acceptance this morning. Thank you."

Representative Sutton then rose to speak on H.R. No. 229:

"Mr. Speaker, I think that all of us, when we hear the name George Mills, envision a real hero, not just to the Hawaiian people but to all of us in Hawaii. This man was a great athlete, he is a great citizen of Hawaii, he is a great doctor and I think it was a magnificent thing for him to bring the expertise of his profession into politics because there are so many in my profession that come in, attorneys, but so few that are doctors. As I look around here the only person, really, who is comparable in any type of education is our own leader, Faith Evans, who is a nurse. But very few doctors want to give up that lucrative profession, even for a short period of time. And it was a sacrifice on the part of Dr. Mills. And by his side is a magnificent partner, Bobbie. And I feel that she, as well as the doctor, are being honored by us today and so may I, by implication, amend the resolution to include his lovely wife, Bobbie."

"I would like to speak in favor of House Bill No. 2214-80, HD 1. More than 50,000 of Hawaii's citizens are physically, mentally or emotionally handicapped. Traditionally in this country, disabled citizens have been viewed as a social service problem. Consequently, billions of dollars are spent annually to sustain these people at a survival level and completely ignoring their aspirations to rise above their handi-

caps in achievement or gainful employment. Goodwill Industries has provided a rehabilitation program by which handicapped citizens can learn a skill and go on to achieve economic independence and a more satisfying life. The majority of handicapped adults in the State are now working or being trained to work. By training and supporting these individuals in their employment goals, these citizens are being transformed from dependents of the State into wage earners. Rehabilitating the handicapped is productive for the State, but more importantly, it builds selfesteem and positive attitudes.

One of the best methods of achieving the integration of handicapped citizens into the labor force is through an extended shelter workshop o At this time, such a program does not exist in Hawaii. This workshop is designed to provide a work environment and employment activities with specific individual goals intended to assist the handicapped person in progressing toward normal living and productive vocational status. The workshop provides for employment in the regular job market if the potential exists, or employment for an indefinite period within a sheltered workshop if regular employment is not feasible.

There is a definite need for a permanent extended sheltered workshop in Hawaii. Goodwill was selected to provide this program because, once in the needed facility, Goodwill will provide sheltered training and employment at no cost to the State.

The location, land, and program have already been chosen. All that is needed are State monies to complete the project and allow Goodwill as a non-profit organization to operate by saving the State billions of dollars in social service costs and to help severely handicapped citizens find their right place in society."

Representative Sutton requested that the Journal note that he fully concurred with the remarks inserted by Representative Say.

Now, Mr. Speaker, I turn to your Committee Report and it says: 'The purpose of this bill is to amend Section 11-23 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes, by deleting the terms 'insanity or feeble-mindedness' and 'non compos mentis'. . .' Now, non compos mentis is a word in our Constitution and you, Mr. Speaker, would be putting on the books something in conflict with our Constitution.

Therefore, I would urge you, Mr. Speaker, to vote against this bill, and thank you."

Representative D. Yamada then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, all this bill attempts to do is to eliminate mental incapacities by automatic striking from voter lists. It has nothing to do with what the prior speaker is talking about."

## · THIRD READING

Representative D. Yamada moved that H.B. No. 1918-80, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Honda.

Representative Evans then rose and requested that her remarks, in favor of the bill, be inserted into the Journal, and the Chair, noting that there were no objections, so ordered.

Representative Evans remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of House Bill No. 1918-80.

The framers of the United States Constitution noted, with characteristic brevity, that one of the basic obligations of government -- any government -- is to ensure the 'domestic tranquility.' Now, over 200 years later, we must concede that this goal is far from being realized. Crime, not only in Hawaii but throughout the United States, has reached truly epidemic proportions.

The very environment in which we live and work bears the telltale signs of this great problem: the elderly triple-locked in their homes at night, our beaches and parks a virtual no-man's land and a security guard stationed in the lobby of every apartment building.

For several decades, our strong

humane traditions have urged us to provide protections, rights and assurances for those who stand accused or even convicted of crimes. I, for one, endorse the spirit — if not the outcome — of this movement. I cannot endorse its outcome for the simple reason that, in too many instances, the protection of the average, law-abiding citizen has been sacrificed in favor of protection of the accused. Chief Justice Warren E. Burger expressed this same concern at a recent meeting of the American Bar Association, and I quote:

'A system of justice that provides the greatest protections for accused persons must not fail in the basic function of a civilized society -- protection of all its members. When people came out of the trees and caves and banded together in tribes, villages and towns, they did so for mutual protection, They gave up the right to self-help, but our criminal justice system is not giving the kind of protection contemplated by that exchange. Of course the constitutional guarantees for the protection of accused persons must be enforced, but society has an obligation to protect not just some, but all its people.'

House Bill 1918-80 is, in my opinion, a significant step towards the correction of the imbalance observed by the Chief Justice. It sends a clear and unequivocal message to those who might violate our society's — indeed, any civilized society's — standards that these violations will not be taken lightly. It sends a clear and unequivocal message to citizens of the State of Hawaii that these violations will not be lightly dismissed. And it sends a message to future generations that we were concerned about the values which they would inherit.

The bill provides that a person who has been convicted of a class A felony — such as first degree rape, sodomy or robbery — shall be sentenced to a mandatory term of imprisonment of twenty years without possibility of being placed on probation. Although I approve of the bill's intention of prohibiting probation for class A felons, it is unfortunate that it does not expressly prohibit the granting of paroles to such offenders.

Similarly, although I approve of the bill's intention of providing for a mandatory term of imprisonment of 20 years for class A felons, it leaves unchanged the fact that the minimum sentence will continue to be set by the Hawaii Paroling Authority.

Although neither of these criticisms is fatal to House Bill 1918-80, they

do indicate that it will not provide us with a once-and-for-all solution to the problems we face in the field of our criminal justice system. Likewise, the bill should not blind us to the fact that there are many other areas of our penal code which stand in need of re-examination and, perhaps, revision.

For instance, this bill does not cover second degree or third degree rape since these are class B and class C felonies. But third degree rape is the rape of a person who is mentally defective or mentally deficient. Does it make any sense at all to classify the rape of a mentally defective person as a lesser crime? Does this accord with our most basic sense of fairness and justice? Should not our penal code provide for mandatory terms of imprisonment for this and many other offenses against the person?

I am no less concerned about a special category of criminal conduct which has increased dramatically in recent years and are collectively referred to as 'bail crimes.' I do not need to cite specific instances to remind members of the House that some of our most vicious crimes are committed by persons who are free on bail. We are all painfully aware of their repeated occurrence. We must come to grips with this problem as quickly as possible. In particular, we must determine precisely the extent to which criminal conduct persists by persons on bail awaiting trial for serious crimes. And we must examine our statutes relating to the standards for release on bail in the light of this information.

Thus, although I support passage of House Bill 1918-80, I would urge members of the House to regard it as just the first step in the long and arduous process of restoring the public's sense of confidence and security by serving notice that these criminal acts will not be tolerated. As representatives of the people of Hawaii, this is our trust.

# Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 1918-80, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE PENAL CODE", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Garcia being excused.

# H.B. No. 2097-80, HD 1:

On motion by Representative D. Yamada, seconded by Representative Honda and carried, H.B. No. 2097-80, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO ELECTIONS", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Garcia being excused.

# H.B. No. 2357-80:

On motion by Representative D. Yamada, seconded by Representative Honda and carried, H.B. No. 2357-80, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO CRIMINAL HISTORY RECORD INFORMATION", passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Garcia being excused,

#### H.B. No. 2259-80:

On motion by Representative D. Yamada, seconded by Representative Honda and carried, H.B. No. 2259-80, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO CRIMES", passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Garcia being excused.

## H.B. No. 2292-80, HD 1:

Representative Lunasco moved that H.B. No. 2292-80, HD 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Say.

Representative Evans then rose and requested that her remarks, in favor of the bill, be inserted into the Journal, and the Chair, noting that there were no objections, so ordered.

Representative Evans' remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of this bill, but I would like to point out one reservation.

House Bill No. 2292-80 would allow children enrolled in alternative educational programs to be exempted from compulsory school attendance.

My concern, Mr. Speaker, lies in the possibility that students enrolled in these alternative programs might then feel free to drop out of the programs.

We would then face the question of whether these individuals would then be compelled to attend regular public schools, once they drop out of alternative programs.

This question must be answered very specifically by the Department

of Education in its rules and regulations relating to participation in alternative programs, if we are to pass this bill into law.

The Department of Education must spell out that any student who is not regularly attending classes at an alternative school must immediately be enrolled in regular public school classes.

This is especially relevant in a case like the Olomana Alternative School program. Here, many of the participants would have been drop-outs from traditional public school classes. If there were no compelling legal requirement that these young people continue their schooling until the age of 18, it could be difficult to keep these students in the program.

While it may be commendable of the committee to amend the original bill and remove the lowering of compulsory school attendance ages, I am concerned that this additional exemption in the law might lead to unexpected problems unless the question I have raised is remedied.

Whether this is done by the Department of Education or through a statute is not important. What is important is that this potential 'loophole' is taken care of.

Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 2292-80, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO SCHOOL ATTENDANCE", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Garcia being excused.

# H.B. No. 2532-80:

Representative Say moved that H.B. No. 2532-80, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Stanley.

Representative Sutton then rose to speak in favor of the bill when Representative Say made the following request:

"Mr. Speaker, could Representative Sutton's testimony that was submitted to the Committee be inserted into the Journal so that he doesn't have to speak this evening?"

At 10:15 o'clock p.m., Representative Kamalii requested a recess and the

Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

Upon reconvening at 10:16 o'clock p.m., the Chair stated:

"The Chair has not ruled on Representative Say's request. The Chair will direct the request to Representative Sutton."

Representative Sutton then rose to speak in favor of the bill and the Chair said:

"In so doing, I am to understand that you do not agree with Representative Say."

Representative Sutton answered:

"Mr. Speaker, I don't feel that his thoughts are relevant."

Representative Say then rose on a point of information and said:

"Mr. Speaker, I believe my thoughts are relevant because it does include the speaker who is going to be speaking this evening in support that he has already testified at my committee hearing on this particular measure in support of the Spirit of Queen Liliuokalani.

Thank you."

The Chair then recognized Representative Sutton "to present his arguments."

Representative Sutton thanked the Chair and stated:

"I rise, Mr. Speaker, to speak in favor of House Bill 2532-80.

The statute as currently interpreted, Mr. Speaker, permits the permanent placement of State purchase works of art only in newly constructed buildings. This is a sound State policy that I heartily endorse. For example, we would not want our historic Capitol grounds to become cluttered with an overabundance of sculptures. What we do want to guarantee is that only exceptional works of exceptional personages would grace our Capitol complex.

Now, Mr. Speaker, H.B. No. 2532-80, before us tonight, authorizes permanent placement of one such exceptional sculpture and only this one sculpture titled, 'The Spirit of Liliuokalani'. This sculpture is now being completed by the world-renowned artist, Ms.. Marianna Pineda, who was selected and commissioned by a very illustrious jury. This jury and sculpture were authorized by Act 173, Mr. Speaker, passed by the Eighth Legislature in 1975.

Act 173 also stipulated that the finished work is, and I quote: 'To be placed for permanent display at the State Capitol. This choice location was also recommended by the Sculpture Jury, the State Foundation on Culture and the Arts, and the Comptroller of DAGS. Act 173, Mr. Speaker, also found that, and I again quote: 'The representation of the monarchy in the State Capitol will bring to the people of the State and our many visitors, increased awareness and a permanent reminder of the people who played important roles in the development of Hawaii.' I believe this nearly completed sculpture will clearly fulfill the mandates of Act 173 and the visions articulated by the Legislature five years ago when I first joined you, Mr. Speaker.

My dear colleagues, I urge immediate passage of this worthy bill so that our Capitol complex can be permanently adorned by the sculpture of this extraordinary Hawaiian monarch.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 2532-80, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE PLACEMENT OF THE SCULPTURE 'THE SPIRIT OF LILIUOKALANI' AT THE STATE CAPITOL COMPLEX", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Garcia being excused.

## H.B. No. 1975-80:

On motion by Representative Uechi, seconded by Representative Inaba and carried, H.B. No. 1975-80, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE MEAT INSPECTION ACT", passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Garcia being excused.

## H.B. No. 2172-80:

On motion by Representative Uechi, seconded by Representative Inaba and carried, H.B. No. 2172-80, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PLANT AND NONDOMESTIC ANIMAL QUARANTINE", passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Garcia being excused.

At 10:21 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 10:26 o'clock p.m.

# H.B. No. 1969-80, HD 1:

Representative Shito moved that H.B. No. 1969-80, HD 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Blair.

Representative Holt then rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, one of the features of this bill is its amendment of the definition of 'lot', 'houselot', 'residential lot', and 'residential houselot' to include two- as well as single-family residences. This alteration would grant owners of duplexes the opportunity to purchase a leased fee interest to their land under the Hawaii Land Reform Act (HRS, Chapter 516), an alternative presently denied them under the existing statutory definition of residential lots.

Mr. Speaker, the Hawaii Land Reform Act was designed, in part, to accomplish the preservation of a finite resource and to alleviate a statewide shortage of fee simple residential land by affording lessees under long-term leases the chance to acquire fee simple title to the lands on which their homes are situated.

In passing the Land Reform Act, this body recognized that providing the people of this State with the choice to own or take a lease of their land was essential to the promotion of the 'public interest, health, welfare, security, and happiness.'

Mr. Speaker, I do not believe that it was the intent of this body to exclude owners of duplexes from their consideration when formulating legislation to enhance the fullest enjoyment of residential land through acquisition of fee ownership.

Mr. Speaker, passage of House Bill 1969-80 will remedy the omission of two-family residence owners from the receipt of benefits accruing to owners of single-family dwellings under the residential leasehold conversion law. I urge all of my colleagues to vote in favor of this bill.

Thank you."

Representative Narvaes then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of House Bill 1969-80.

Mr. Speaker, when I first ran for

office when I was 21, one of the first things that I was asked to do when I campaigned in a certain area was to work for conversion of the leasehold interest in a certain piece of property in Kalihi and we are very close to making that a reality today. These people and the Kamehameha Terrace fall under a special situation, and thanks to the Chairman of Housing we are closer to making that a reality today.

Mr. Speaker, I have some more comments in favor of this bill and I would like to have the rest of my speech entered into the Journal, if I may, so that we can get on with our business."

The Chair, noting that there were no objections, so ordered.

Further remarks by Representative Narvaes are hereby inserted:

"House Bill 1969-80 would allow anyone with equitable interests in leasehold lots under agreement sales to be eligible to buy the fee interest under the Land Reform Act.

It expands the definition of 'lot' to mean a parcel of land that is a place of residence for one or two families.

This expansion in the definition of leasehold lots is an essential one, for it clears up a terrible disparity in the law. Previously, since the land reform law was enacted, only single-family residential lots were eligible for leasehold conversion. Homeowners of leasehold units in duplex residences were at a disadvantage, because they were not able to utilize the provisions of the leasehold conversion law to purchase their homes in fee.

The disadvantage was especially acute where State condemnations of leasehold tracts were involved. Because government could intercede in this manner for single-family house lots to convert to fee, the benefits of the Act were denied to those homeowners living in leasehold duplex units.

Many families in my district, especially, are in this predicament. Because of the congested nature of the Kalihi area, duplex houselots are a common occurrence.

I helped the people of Kalihi to organize a year ago to seek this amendment in the leasehold law to allow equitable treatment for duplex housing units. On their behalf, and on my own behalf, I must extend my appreciation to the introducer of this bill, Representative Shito, for righting a serious oversight.

Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 1969-80, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PROPERTY", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Garcia being excused.

## H.B. No. 1980-80, HD 1:

On motion by Representative Blair, seconded by Representative Segawa and carried, H.B. No. 1980-80, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO DENTISTRY", passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Garcia being excused.

## H.B. No. 1880-80, HD 1:

On motion by Representative Blair, seconded by Representative Shito and carried, H.B. No. 1880-80, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO MOTOR VEHICLES", passed Third Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Garcia being excused.

# H.B. No. 1877-80, HD 1:

On motion by Representative Blair, seconded by Representative Shito and carried, H.B. No. 1877-80, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO INTOXICATING LIQUOR", was recommitted to the Committee on Consumer Protection and Commerce "to make some technical amendments."

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. Nos. 1831-80 and 1918-80 had passed Third Reading at 10:13 o'clock p.m.; 2097-80, 2357-80 and 2259-80 at 10:14 o'clock p.m.; 2292-80 at 10:15 o'clock p.m.; 2532-80 and 1975-80 at 10:20 o'clock p.m.; 2172-80 at 10:21 o'clock p.m.; 1969-80 and 1980-80 at 10:30 o'clock p.m.; and 1880-80 at 10:31 o'clock p.m.

At this time, Representative Nakamura rose on a point of personal privilege and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, at this morning's session, a member of this House was addressing the Speaker and inadvertently I locomoted my body across between the member of the House addressing the Speaker. For this infraction of the House rule, I would like to offer my apology, and for this unintentional discourtesy to the member of the House, I have privately apologized to him."

The Chair said:

"Apology is accepted."

At 10:34 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative K. Yamada, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned until 11:30 o'clock a.m. tomorrow, Friday, February 29, 1980.

Representative Takamine then rose to speak on H.R. No. 254:

"Mr. Speaker and members of this House, it gives me great pleasure to speak on behalf of this resolution recognizing the achievements of Myer C. Symonds.

Sy, as he is known to his friends and in fact, to practically all who know him, is a distinguished lawyer who has been practicing law in Hawaii for the past thirty-three years. He is a respected member of the Hawaii bar and I would say a dean of that bar. All his professional career in Hawaii he has been a lawyer for the ILWU and has fought to uphold the rights of labor and of working

men and women; but even more than that, he has fought to uphold the democratic and legal rights of all the many and different clients he has represented.

This has been most recently recognized by the Hawaii ACLU which has honored him (as well as his long-time partner, Harriet Bouslog) with that organization's Allan F. Saunder's award for significant contributions to civil liberties in Hawaii.

By the way, Mr. Speaker and members of the House, Harriet Bouslog is now being honored in the other House.

I could say much more, but all I will say now is Sy, you certainly deserve that award and you certainly deserve recognition from the people of Hawaii for all the positive and progressive things you have done for them in your long career. Mahalo."

Representative Kunimura also rose to speak on H.R. No. 254:

"Mr. Speaker, just a few words because if I were to speak on all the things that Sy has done for many of us who still retain some of the scars of the great battles of the 40's bringing Hawaii to what it is today, it would take me the whole month of March, even to the end of the session. I just want to emphasize here that Sy had the ability to make lots of money, he had the opportunity because of his ability, but he chose rather, to serve the needs of the working man, and this is the kind of dedication you see very, very rarely in the legal profession because, we must admit, the dollar buys most everything. But sometimes, somewhere, the good Lord sends great people like Abe Lincoln and so many others, but compared to all the people who have lived in this country up until now and those that will be living in this country - in this world, they are but one grain of sand in the entire beach and Myer is one of those very rare, rare persons and I would personally like to thank him very much for coming on the scene and

helping us to win our battles and the great economic battle that shaped Hawaii to what it is today. And I hope the generations in the future will pay tribute to people like Myer Symonds for Hawaii would never be what it is had it not been for people like Myer Symonds."

Representative Sutton then rose to speak on H.R. No. 254 and requested that these same remarks also be applied to H.R. No. 253:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of this resolution honoring Myer Symonds because I have gained a great reverence for the work that he has done.

It was my privilege to serve as law clerk to the late federal judge, Delbert E. Metzcher and immediately upon graduating law school until two and a half years later, I had the privilege of watching the anatomy of a very difficult situation in our nation's history. It was during this period as law clerk in the federal court that I saw the immense dedication of the honoree to the Bill of Rights and to helping people whose causes and whose own names were one of damnation.

Nowhere, Mr. Speaker, had McCarthyism spread with more venom than here in our beautiful Hawaii, the land of Aloha. And the courage to take unpopular cases meant that one was indicted by guilt by association and this insidious thing was magnified by the media. It was a period of hysteria, Mr. Speaker, and pure hate, and it shocked me beyond belief and made my admiration of our honoree even greater.

It is with great humiliation that I add that this admiration will continue and has continued as long as I, myself, have been a federal judge, an elected official, a person honored in two wars with the highest honor, an athlete who has played in the finest bowls there are in this nation. But nowhere in any of my experiences did I ever exhibit the courage that the honoree has because he had to do what Abraham Lincoln called that last full measure of devotion. A

lawyer does it by giving his life to the law and a soldier does it on the front ranks in the trenches by giving his life to his country."

At this time, Representative Stanley presented the honoree with a flower lei while Representative Takamine presented him with the resolution.

A resolution (H.R. No. 253) recognizing the achievements of Harriet Bouslog was jointly offered by Representatives Takamine, Aki, Anderson, Andrews, Baker, Blair, Crozier. de Heer, Dods, Evans, Fukunaga, Hagino, Hashimoto, Holt, Honda, Ige, Ikeda, Inaba, Kamalii, Kawakami, Kihano, Kiyabu, Kobayashi, Kunimura, Lacy, Lee, Lunasco, Marumoto, Masutani, Medeiros, Morioka, Nakamura, Narvaes, Peters, Sakamoto, Say, Segawa, Shito, Silva, Stanley, Sutton, Takitani, Toguchi, Uechi, Ushijima, Uwaine, D. Yamada, K. Yamada and Wakatsuki.

On motion by Representative Takamine, seconded by Representative Kunimura and carried, H.R. No. 253 was adopted.

Representative Takamine requested that the following speech be inserted into the Journal:

"Mr. Speaker, it gives me great pleasure to speak on behalf of this resolution recognizing the achievements of Harriet Bouslog.

Harriet has been practicing law here for many years and started out as the first lawyer for the ILWU back when things were tough, I mean really tough, for the working people and their unions.

She pioneered the legal attack on many of the laws of the then Territory of Hawaii, which were used to suppress and penalize the aspirations and struggles of the sugar and pineapple workers for a better life. As a result of her efforts those laws were written off our books.

She also defended in those early years people like Aiko and John Reinecke, whom this legislature only recently recognized had been unfairly treated and removed from their teaching positions because of their beliefs. And Harriet also defended and saved from execution Majors and Palakiko, in a case which led to the abolition of capital punishment in Hawaii by the legislature.

Harriet's achievements in fighting for and defending the democratic rights of people have been most recently recognized by the Hawaii ACLU which has honored her (as well as her long-time partner, Myer Symonds) with that organization's Allan F. Saunder's award for significant contributions to civil liberties in Hawaii.

I could go on to say much more in behalf of Harriet, but all I will say right now is, Harriet, you certainly deserve that award and you certainly deserve recognition from the people of Hawaii for all the positive and progressive things you have done for them in your life as a lawyer."

At 11: 55 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess for the purpose of greeting the honoree.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:08 o'clock p.m.

At this time, Representative Kunimura rose to speak against the passage of H.B. No. 2346-80:

"Mr. Speaker, I usually do not like to make any comment on Second Reading and referral to another Committee, but I feel that I must rise today and speak against this measure because this measure is so devastating, as I see it, taking rights away from the working man.

This morning we honored two people who have dedicated their lives to the cause of the working man and now we have H.B. No. 2346-80, immunity from third party liability re workmen's compensation. Mr. Speaker, the bill as I see it, and the law as it stands today, is the employer and employee representing the employer, when it comes to workmen's compensation cases, are immune from suit by a third party, and the philosophy behind this immunity is because the employer protects the employee by workmen's compensation insurance.

Now, to give immunity to any other party, whether it be a corporation, individual or even a union, is to dilute the God given right of the working man to have his right to sue for damages taken away. This is so serious, this is so contrary to what I believe to be the rights of the working man, that I must rise and register my opposition to this bill because I feel, and I've seen in the past, 99.4% of the trade unions honestly and truly represent and protect the working man.

But there are some unions that merely collect dues and use the working man as a cow in a dairy; and for this kind of union, I feel that protecting them from any suit and giving them immunity is like putting them out of the reach of the working man and I feel very strongly, Mr. Speaker, that I would be very ashamed of this House and what we've stood for all these years if this matter

would even pass Second Reading and be referred to another Committee. Bills of this nature should die a dishonorable death in the Committee; and therefore, I rise this morning to speak against the motion to refer to Judiciary.

Representative Takamine rose to speak on H.B. No. 2346-80:

"Mr. Speaker, I see that on the signature page, there are nine signatures signed free and clear. There is no question that we have several members signing this report with reservations. Because of the many questions that were asked by the Committee members, we had a very lengthy discussion on this matter. I feel that the majority feels that this bill should go to the Judiciary for further consideration and I think that this is a good bill. The whole intent and purpose of this bill is to try to get the union members active. In trying to further the workers' compensation act, we want to see as many participate as possible. Because of the kind of suits that are now taking place, this would cancel such participation when in fact the recommendation is to partici-

This bill is to make sure that those working people who are working today will get the best representation, the best help on the job so that they'll be working; therefore, I speak in behalf of this bill and that it should go to the Judiciary for further consideration."

Representative Kunimura spoke once more on this bill:

"Mr. Speaker, the number of Committee members signing a report does not in any manner, shape or form make a wrong right. And, Mr. Speaker, the argument in favor of this bill is if the unions are not given immunity, they will not participate in trying to correct some inequities in the safety rules the company may be violating or correct the working conditions. This is hogwash.

When a union that is doing their job properly, not only the union,

but the working man under OSHA and the Hawaii State OSHA, and the unions can participate with OSHA. I find this is a cop-out, this is a very weak reason to take away the rights of the working man if he is not represented properly, if he was hurt because the union did not, or did something wrong, or agreed with the company in allowing this kind of dangerous situation to exist, then the union should be sued. Anybody doing the right thing should never be afraid to be hauled before the court. This is our system and the judges and the courts - if a person is innocent and not guilty of whatever charge, that person will be found not guilty and be free. But to take the right away from the working man to bring his grievance before the courts of this state is a travesty of justice beyond the imagination, Mr. Speaker, and I would like to say that for those who signed free and clear, that's their right, but it does not make a wrong right for now or forevermore. Thank you."

## The Chair responded:

At this time, Representative de Heer rose and requested that his remarks, in favor of House Resolution No. 40, HD 1, and House Concurrent Resolution No. 13, HD 1, be inserted into the Journal, and the Chair, noting that there were no objections, so ordered.

Representative de Heer's remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to speak in favor of House Resolution 40, HD 1, and House Concurrent Resolution 13, HD 1.

In recent months and years, there has been a growing awareness and opposition on the part of the public at large, and communities in general, throughout the world to call a moratorium on nuclear testing, energy development, and waste storage and disposal. Perhaps more importantly, there is increasing evidence of an insidious and ubiquitous problem of low level radiation affecting the health and well-being of people, plants, and water resources.

In another round of this battle, the White House announced that the Administration is giving serious consideration to the use of areas of the Pacific Basin as a place to store and dispose of nuclear waste, by-products, and spent fuel. We in the Pacific, and in Hawaii in particular, have again had to come face to face with anxiety, frustration and terror produced by this announcement.

The Resolutions recognize the unique place Hawaii holds in the center of the Pacific, and the attendant leadership responsibility, in light of the potential danger of radioactive water pollution to a population highly dependent on its surrounding water resources and the food supplies therein.

These measures help to assert the position that we must maintain awareness and control over our nuclear related issues. It doesn't matter whether the near-catastrophe at Mile Island was due to human failure, mechanical failure, or sabotage. The point is that avoiding nuclear disaster requires three kinds of total perfection in an imperfect world, namely, human perfection, mechanical perfection, and perfect security. This is virtually impossible

as matters now stand.

Already too many citizens of the Pacific community, particularly Eniwetok Atoll, have directly experienced the pain suffering, dislocation and hardship of nuclear related miscalculations. These direct experiences we in the Pacific have, the increasing numbers of alarming cases against military testing and misleading Federal government propoganda is sufficient cause for Hawaii's voice to cry out in opposition to such proposals without equivocation.

Release of nuclear waste into the Pacific Ocean would be tragic. The potential of radioactive contamination of the oceans by the shifting currents would be a terrible price to pay. In the event of such a catastrophe, the two-thirds of the world population that lives within 200 miles of the Pacific rim and the food chains on which they are dependent would all become vulnerable. Clearly we would be asked to risk an unprecedented long term calamity and health hazard, and a monumental if not impossible short-term cleanup problem.

We must not allow this proposal of Pacific nuclear storage to continue. The Pacific is not a wastebasket for the rest of the nation or the world to dispose of their nuclear garbage.

I always attempt to be constructive and positive in my approach to public issues. However, in this instance my wits are no better than the best minds who have worked long and hard on this problem, yet failed in producing an acceptable alternative. The adoption of my resolution in speaking for Hawaii's Legislature and its people, attempts to echo not only our sentiments but also those of our sisters and brothers who comprise the Pacific Basin community. We must all refuse to join the experiment to become guinea pigs ourselves, or least of all, allow our children to carry the burden of our errors.

This action and that of Senator Spark M. Matsunaga in Congress, go a long way in making certain that Hawaii's concerns are heard, recognized, and understood by all parties involved. Further, I wish to commend the continuing efforts regarding this issue-complex on the parts of my fellow Representatives Kawakami, Larsen, and Fukunaga, among others.

What is at issue for Hawaii and the Pacific, is the preservation of our future generations, our food chain, our environment, our economy, and our unique quality of life; forever

more."

Now, we are talking, sir, in terms of the Hawaii Revised Statutes134-7, ownership or possession by fugitive from justice or by a person convicted of certain crimes. In other words, it's the old concept of a felon with

a gun. It is my feeling that we should leave that particular section as strong as we possibly can because one of the facts and figures that were put out by the FBI report indicates that a felon with a gun is the exact thing that we wish to control and that is where we are having repetitive crimes and crimes of violence.

Therefore, I would urge you, Mr. Speaker, to vote against this bill although there are other parts of the bill that have some good qualities. Maybe, possibily, the head of our Judiciary Committee would like to recommit it but at this time, I am speaking solely on the question of asking you, Mr. Speaker, to vote against this.

Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B.
