Representative Fukunaga rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, one of the things that has really struck me about the comments that I've seen in support of Ralph Oshiro's selection of Teacher of the Year is the amazing way that he has inspired his students, parents, colleagues and friends.

"One of Mr. Oshiro's former students summed up her teaching experiences in the following way: 'I have been motivated because I was living proof of a person who has gained a good self concept by being part of a positive classroom atmosphere. I was an eighth grader at Dole Intermediate School when Mr. Oshiro began his teaching career. At that time, I was very impressed by the dedication that he showed to the band by making large personal loans to acquire new instruments for the students, making improvements on the condition of the band room, organizing a band booster program to raise money for student activities and giving up countless hours to help us reach first which resulted in bringing our band from a C rating to an A rating. I respected him for caring enough to want to instill a sense of pride in a group of students who were not only looked down upon because of where they lived, Kalihi, but also because they were a C band. I admired him because this very special dedication and devotion did not stop or reach a plateau, but instead grew with every year of teaching.

When I first discovered that Mr. Oshiro was team teaching a workshop on classroom management, I became very excited because I had observed his classes many times after I graduated from Dole Intermediate and I knew how successful he was in his management technique. As I listened to Mr. Oshiro speak, I realize that all the things he talked about, treat students with respect and dignity, trust them, give them responsibilities and organize your time well for optimum success, were basic human qualities that all people should have. I became aware of the fact that many of the values that I hold dear to me about students, or all people for that matter should be treated is the outcome of the way I had been treated by Mr. Oshiro for the past ten years.

What it all comes down to for me, is that classroom management is not a method or technique. Good management is knowing me and my values and then being consistent and honest with my students in order to gain their respect. When I have a student that can look back at his or her year with me and not have felt that he or she was managed, but instead treated like a human being with rights and feelings, then I will have become a good teacher. I thank Mr. Oshiro for allowing me to grow in his classroom ten years ago, and for continuing

to be a source of encouragement and guidance to me now.'

"It is these kinds of qualities, Mr. Speaker, that we are privileged to honor today."

At this time, Representative Fukunaga introduced Mr. Ralph Oshiro to the members of the House.

Representative Fukunaga then continued to introduce Mrs. Joan Yanagi, Vice-Principal of Stevenson Intermediate School, Mr. Thomas Otaguro, President of the Band Boosters Club and Kristin Kumashiro, band President.

Introduced in the gallery were the members of the Stevenson Intermediate Band, band parents: Mrs. Laura Nakanishi, Mrs. Norma Miyamoto, Mrs. Leslie Matsuno, Mr. Kent Matsuno, Mrs. Karen Otaguro, and Mrs. Lorraine Liu.

Representative Fukunaga closed her introductions with Mrs. Bessie Oshiro, wife of the honoree.

At this time, leis and certified copies of the resolution were presented to the honorees.

Representative de Heer rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I'm speaking today not only as a representative of the thirteen district but as a former alumnus of Stevenson band program and I remember in the old days, which was not so long ago, when our band director had to keep us quiet, she had a whistle that she would blow and everyone would be disciplined because we were that rowdy.

"Needless to say, I didn't end up in music. I ended up in politics which was a questionable choice at that time, I suppose.

"But I think we've seen such a tremendous improvement in that program and I would like to thank the parents and teachers for giving myself the education that allowed me to serve here in the legislature, as I'm sure my district colleagues share.

"It is a real constructive and positive program and we look forward to having the Teacher of the Year from our district again next year."

Representative Liu rose to note

that the Mrs. Liu who was introduced in the gallery by Representative Fukunaga is his aunt.

So Representative Kiyabu and I had to condense this resolution and I'm awfully sorry, Mr. Speaker, but to report to you that we were unable to reduce it shorter than what it is, and it's the longest resolution yet, at four and a quarter pages long and may I say this, Mr. Speaker, that I never knew what music was because I came from an immigrant family and I can say this, that when I was young I tried to learn ukelele and my father thought it was a waste of time and stupid and I was ordered not to play ukelele because time was so precious that I had to feed the chickens and dig the garden, weed the garden, and I must say this, that this world would be a very dull place if we didn't have people like Mrs. Guerrero and the great entertainers because they make life a little easier to bear and make time a little

easier to spend."

At this time, Representative Kunimura introduced Mrs. Guerrero to the members of the House.

Representative Kunimura then introduced her sons, Samuel and Howard, who were in the gallery.

Representative Kunimura continued:

"Accompanying Mrs. Guerrero on the floor of the House is Kanoe, Marjorie and her husband Phillip, and our very dear friend Haunani and Marvin."

Representatives Kobayashi, Kiyabu and Kawakami proceeded to present leis and the certified copy of the resolution to the honoree.

Representative G. Hagino rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, all too often we take for granted the things that we see and come into contact with daily. We have been told time and time again about the beauty of our islands. Yet we drive to work daily, passing the Koolaus, Diamond Head, Koko Head, the Pali, or the beaches

routinely.

"I've lived here since 1963 and I've never been to the Pali lookout. Why you may ask. It's because I've fallen into the rat race called survival and I have just not taken the time to enjoy our islands.

"Often times it takes someone from the outside to prod us and awaken us to the beauty and uniqueness of our islands. Such a person is Dr. Roger Jones, producer of the series "The World About Us". British Broadcasting Corporation, and Dr. Jones in particular, recognized the beauty of our islands and our intriguing wildlife.

"It's ironic that the BBC is filming these educational series instead of our local film makers. The students at the University of Hawaii and the people around the world will benefit from these films and perhaps they will get a better appreciation of our Hawaiian heritage.

"Dr. Jones and the BBC have come nine-thousand miles to show us the beauty that surrounds us. I urge Dr. Jones and the BBC to come back here again."

At this time, Representative G. Hagino introduced Dr. Roger Jones and his scientific advisors, Dr. Ken Kaneshiro and Steve Montgomery.

Representatives Fukunaga, Hashimoto and Chun then proceeded to present leis to the honorees and Representative D. Hagino presented certified copies of the resolution.

Representative G. Hagino added in closing:

"Dr. Kaneshiro and Steve Montgomery are themselves well known for their outstanding contributions to the field of science. SUSPENSION OF RULES

On motion by Representative Stanley, seconded by Representative Rohlifing and carried, the rules were suspended for the purpose of considering a resolution.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

A resolution (H.R. No. 168) honoring and commending Dr. C. Henry Kempe for his extraordinary and lasting contributions in the fields of health and medicine and other disciplines was jointly offered by Representatives Matsuura, Blair, Hashimoto, Tungpalan, Toguchi, Aki, Albano, Anderson, Andrews, Baker, Chun, de Heer, Dods, Fukunaga, D. Hagino, G. Hagino, Hirono, Honda, Ige, Ikeda, Isbell, Kamali'i, Kawakami, Kiyabu, Kobayashi, Kunimura, Lacy, Levin, Liu, Marumoto, Medeiros, Monahan, Morioka, Nakamura, Nakasato, Narvaes, Okamura, Sakamoto, Say, Segawa, Shito, Stanley, Takamine, Takitani, Taniguchi, Waihee, Wong, Yamada and Peters and was read by the Clerk.

Representative Matsuura moved that the resolution be adopted, seconded by Representative Hashimoto.

Representative Marumoto then rose to speak in favor of the resolution,

stating:

"Dr. Henry Kempe was instrumental in helping to develop the total spectrum of care for child abuse and neglect in Hawaii.

In 1959, he was the visiting professor at Children's Hospital where he introduced local pediatricians to the 'battered child syndrome.' This laid the basis for the child abuse reporting law in Hawaii and the creation of the Child Protective Services Center.

Later, in 1971, he brought his multi-disciplinary team from Denver for a conference on child abuse and neglect. He provided training on the use of the multi-disciplinary approach to acute crisis intervention and the use of para-professionals as lay therapists.

In 1976, he spoke at a statewide conference on the need for early identification and the recognition of the high risk mother which stimulated the development of the State Council for Child Abuse and Neglect and the statewide program for prevention under the Hawaii Family Stress Center. The stress center is a private entity which operates under Kapiolani Children's Medical Center and provides the coordination for six family support service programs in the only statewide child abuse and neglect prevention network.

We, in Hawaii, owe Dr. Kempe a debt of gratitude for his inspiration and leadership in dealing with the problem of child abuse.

Mahalo."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 168 was adopted.

Representative Matsuura then rose to introduce the honoree, stating:

"Mr. Speaker and distinguished colleagues, I am very pleased to have the honor to introduce the resident of the State of Hawaii who has been recognized and honored, not only in the United States, but internationally, for his pioneer work in the area of child abuse and neglect, and in the development of the small pox vaccine. However, his real recognition lies in the lives of countless of children today and of those yet

to be born for whom he is the supreme advocate. He has accepted the challenge twenty years ago that every child that is born is entitled to an ideal childhood -- loved and nurtured in a safe, secure home by caring and concerned parents, not to be robbed or denied of this heritage. He had the vision which far exceeded the boundaries of established medical science that it was not enough to ensure that the child's physical well-being was tended to, but it was equally, or even more important, that the life within that child be allowed to grow without hindrance so that the adult that emerges would fully be equipped to carry on the duties and demands of the human race. It took personal courage, integrity and sound scientific approach to explode the myth that all parents, by their nature, protect, love and nurture their children but, in fact, there are parents who are unable to nurture, but on the contrary, harm and even destroy the children. He continues to work hard to make society aware that the children born of these parents indeed need an advocate who will respect and protect their inherent right to an ideal childhood.

On behalf of all the children of the world and their parents, let me express our deepest appreciation for your work and contribution.

Mr. Speaker, I now have the honor to introduce Dr. C. Henry Kempe and his wife, Dr. Ruth Kempe."

Representatives Tungpalan, Marumoto and Kihano presented floral leis to Dr. Kempe and his wife while Representative Hashimoto presented the honoree with a certified copy of the resolution.

At 11:47 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair, "for the purpose of extending our personal gratitude and aloha to our honored guests this morning."

Wednesday, March 3, 1982

The House of Representatives of the Eleventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1982, convened at 11:30 o'clock a.m., with the Speaker presiding.

Representative Say's speech is hereby inserted:

"A few days ago, your Committee on Higher Education received testimony from the University of Hawaii's Board of Regents regarding H.B. No. 2876-82, HD 1. In effect, the Board wants authority to establish an appropriate salary for the University President. The superficial purpose and intent of this bill appears non-controversial. After all, the Board now maintains management and control of the general affairs, and exclusive jurisdiction over the internal organization and management, of the University. It would seem consistent to allow the Board to establish the President's salary, right? Wrong! Emphatically wrong!

Let us not be fooled by superficialities. Let us instead strike at the core of the issue, and realize a most disconcerting purpose and intent. According to the Board's testimony a few days ago. . .and I quote. . . 'The basis of comparison or standard, which should be used in establishing an appropriate salary for the President, should be related to academic salaries nationwide rather than to positions

in Hawaii State Government.'

I personally do not appreciate euphemisms where money is concerned. Lay it on the table. The Board's purpose and intent in support of H.B. No. 2876-82, HD 1, is to establish a salary for the University President above that of our governor's.

Thus, if we are to attract highly qualified candidates for the President's position, the salary must be competitively high -- too high for our State. Has the Board forgotten that the University President is a public servant to Hawaii's people, just as the governor is a public servant to Hawaii's people? Has the Board forgotten that the governor, as a public servant, undoubtedly provides greater public service than any other public servant in our state? Compensation for a public servant in our state must not depend on nationwide standards but on what we in Hawaii are able to provide for to our own needs and on our local standards.

To be sure, I am not opposed to attracting the most highly qualified candidates for any public service position. However, if I use the Board's logic in a more generalized manner, I would have to conclude that we must raise the salaries of all public servants in order to attract the most highly qualified candidates for all these positions. We can go on indefinitely with this argument until our State budget is 90 percent salaries alone! The Board is guilty of shortsightedness, of not placing the University President's position in proper perspective, in relation to all other public service positions throughout the State of Hawaii, beginning with the governor above the University President and down to all other public officials.

Obviously, the Board does not wish to see their President's salary so low. After all, there is too much of a disparity. . .and I quote the Board's testimony once more. . . 'the disparity between the salary of the President of the University of Hawaii and the salaries being paid at comparable institutions elsewhere.'

I am skeptical, because if and when the Board gains authority to establish the President's salary, then there may very well be a discouraging disparity between the University President's salary and the salary of the governor of the State of Hawaii. When such a situation arises, we shall not be able to attract highly qualified candidates for the office of governor, because the governor's salary again and again and again, as well as everybody else's salary

ad infinitum, ad nauseum.

I would prefer to believe that, regardless of the University President's salary, within reason, we shall always find a few good men and women qualified and committed to the task rather than to the salary. We already have during the past many years of the University's history. What makes the Board think that we have not? Apparently, we have found good Presidents without having had to raise the salaries to comparable nationwide levels.

I would prefer to believe that, rather than what the Board wants in authority.

Thank you very much."

Representative Isbell then rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

Mr. Speaker, the last time I spoke on this bill was at the close of the last session at which time, as you recall, this bill was before us and it became Act 133. At that time, I expressed concern that the judge for the Third Circuit was going to the Big Island all right but it wasn't going to the West side; it was going to be primarily in Hilo. This measure before us today, House Bill 2319-82, permanently provides that this judge will be styled and hold court in West Hawaii.

Many of my colleagues here today have a professional interest in our Judiciary but few can explain why our State has a First, Second, Third, and Fifth Judicial Circuit Courts, but no Fourth and it was created in 1882 by her majesty Queen Liliuokalani. The Third Judicial Circuit Court included the districts of Kohala, Kona, and Kau (all of West Oahu) and the Fourth

Circuit was on the Hilo side.

In 1943, by way of Act 141, the Third and Fourth Judicial Circuits were consolidated into one to be known as the Third Circuit, permanently located in Hilo and provided that two annual court trials would be held on the West side of the island.

In 1972, this proviso was deleted and then all the courts were held in Hilo.

We, in West Hawaii, not only believe permanently styling a judge in West Hawaii will create savings for litigants, their counsels, and the judicial system as a result of decreased travel costs, but also see it as a homecoming and a re-enactment of our last Queen Liliuokalani's intentions.

I look forward to her inspiration that will be provided to each legislator by placing a statue, in fact, of this great and independent ruler on the makai side of our Capitol within view of my tiny office.

Further, I wish to applaud the Senate's adoption of Standing Committee Report No. 19-82 on February 17th, confirming the Honorable Judge De Silva as our Circuit Court Judge. Judge De Silva, too, was Kona grown and, thus, the people of West Hawaii look to approval of House Bill 2319-82 as a 'homecoming', not only for the Third Circuit, but for Judge De Silva as well. And, next year, I think probably we'll work to make it a separate circuit in West Hawaii.

On behalf of all those whom this measure will benefit, I want to thank the Judiciary Committee and ask all of you to please support this bill.

Thank you very much."

Representative Kunimura then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, some interesting facts were brought up on this matter and I request this bill be deferred to the end of the calendar so I can check it out. Seriously."

At 12:20 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

"I rise to thank you, Mr. Speaker, for the clarification and I think I read a little too much into Representative from Kona's enthusiasm in her floor speech for this wonderful thing that happened.

Erdman in Mokuleia from March 9 to 11. This conference is established under Chapter 317 of our Hawaii Revised Statutes. The purpose of this conference is to provide students in secondary schools an opportunity to identify, discuss and arrive at recommended solutions to major youth problems with emphasis on school problems that require the attention and joint action by the students, the Department of Education, and the Legislature.

Some of the areas that will be discussed at this conference are the need for a full-time student activity coordinator, the lack of funds for learning materials, stricter punishment for students who break rules, drug and alcohol abuse in the schools, programs on survival and job preparation skills, lack of vocational training, and better counseling for college-bound students.

Mr. Speaker, it seems to me that these problem areas are those that we ourselves are trying to solve. Perhaps, if we got together, we may be able to come up with some solutions.

The theme for the conference this year is how to be satisfied; we ought not to be satisfied with mediocrity when excellence is within our reach.

Mr. Speaker, these students will be coming from all parts of our State. I would like to invite all my fellow Representatives to take the time to meet and talk with these students.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Dods' speech is hereby inserted:

"Mr. Speaker, the search for a general aviation facility is now older than some of the people who work in this building. We have tried many approaches and we have discarded even more, because this body could not agree on how to proceed in solving this problem. Mr. Speaker, I really have no preference on how we solve this problem, as long as what we decide to do is safe. . . and has a reasonable chance for success in the very near future.

Mr. Speaker, this bill would authorize the Department of Transportation to acquire one of those operational Oahu military air facilities -- Kaneohe Marine Corps Air Station, Wheeler Air Force Base, or Barbers Point

Naval Air Station. As everyone here is aware, one year ago, I did not think it would be possible to obtain joint use of a military airfield. Today, it seems that we might have a better chance of outright owning one of these airfields than was ever thought possible.

The Reagan Administration has indicated that it may consider selling unused or un-needed federal facilities. I believe, Mr. Speaker, that this marks a 180 degree change in direction for the Federal government. I also hope that no one is trying to pull our legs on this matter, because I think we can make a strong case that one or more of these facilities is pathetically under-used or un-needed.

Please bear in mind, Mr. Speaker, that I consider Army, Navy, Marine and Air Force airports to be part of a statewide system of military air facilities. I would like to present some figures, based on the Oahu General Aviation Master Planning Study -- also known as the Kentron Study (OGAMPS) -- which was completed in January of 1977. These figures indicate the practical annual landing capacity for the total number of take-offs and landings that can be handled at Wheeler, Barber's Point and Kaneohe:

Wheeler	-	275,000 to 295,000 operations
Barber's Point	-	412,000 to 625,000 operations
Kaneohe MCAS	-	397,000 to 531,000 operations
		1,084,000 to 1,451,000

Mr. Speaker, the capacity of these airfields ranges from 1.084 million to 1.451 million operations each year.

Now, Mr. Speaker, I am using 1975 data as an indicator of what the actual activity was at these airfields -- activity which I do not believe has grown significantly:

Wheeler	-	165,000 operations
Barber's Point	-	160,000 operations
Kaneohe MCAS	-	<u>122,000</u> operations
		447,000 operations

Mr. Speaker, even if we assume that operations have increased by one third, or approximately 150,000 operations, we still have a maximum figure of less than 600,000 operations. These figures seem

to indicate an unused capacity of from 484,000 to 851,000 operations each year.

Mr. Speaker, OGAMPS (Kentron Study) ranked Wheeler as the twelfth best site for a reliever airport, Kaneohe as the sixth and Barber's Point as the second best site on Oahu. Mr. Speaker, I might say that we could even help the military out by allowing them joint use of the airport we might end up buying. And, Mr. Speaker, if you are wondering how we are going to pay for this airport, I might point out that we could use the off-site duty free concession revenues to pay for what will be an expense of the entire State Airport System.

I strongly encourage all of my colleagues to vote 'yes' in support of this bill."

However, not to be negative on the situation, I do believe that we should go ahead and support this report; however, on matters of this importance and the amount of money that is being discussed which could be anywhere between 5 and 32 million dollars should be dealt with in a more careful way.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 11:49 o'clock a.m.

SUSPENSION OF RULES

On motion by Representative Stanley, seconded by Representative Rohlfing and carried, the rules were suspended for the purpose of considering bills on Third Reading on the basis of a modified consent calendar.

THIRD READING

The following bills which were on the calendar for Third Reading, were read throughout and the following action taken:

H.B. No. 2222-82, HD1:

Representative Takamine moved that H.B. No. 2222-82, HD1 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kawakami.

Representative G. Hagino rose to speak against this bill stating:

"Mr. Speaker, this bill states that Anguilla rostrata will be brought in only for scientific and experimental reasons. And I have no doubts that extreme measures will be taken to prevent the escape of these eels. However, that is what scares me, for the precautionary measures taken in these experiments will be entirely different from the measures that will be actually used in commercial practice.

"To be economically feasible, the unagi will have to be raised near a source of fresh water, and no amount of safeguards will prevent the escape of eels due to human neglect, human curiosity, floods or high waves. The first two examples, human neglect and curiosity need not be elaborated because it is a common day experience. Floods and destruction due to high waves are unpredictable. Take the Wahiawa Bridge as an example. A large crane working on the bridge structure, was submerged overnight due to high waters. If high waves were to destroy the unagi pen, people would say that the young cannot survive in a marine environment. That is true, but they will not die automatically. Who knows how long they can survive in salt water? They have been known to survive for hours traveling on moist land.

"The Anguilla genus has an uncanny sense for fresh water. They have never been found to be heading in the wrong direction. Mr. Speaker, it has been said that Anguilla rostrata will not be able to reproduce here. That may be true, but the Anguilla family of eels is found world wide in areas as close as Tahiti and there is actually very little known about the actual reproductive habits of these eels. It is doubtful that these eels in the Pacific area go to the Sargasso Sea to reproduce. Even if the unagi were not able to reproduce, they have long life spans, sometimes lasting for thirty years or more. In this period of time, native species of opai and opu will be wiped out.

"I remember going on a Boy Scout camping trip at Kolekole

Park on the Big Island and swimming down the rapids there. One of the things I will always remember is looking down the bottom as I was traveling down the river, and seeing thousands of orange eyes of the opai staring back at me. Mr. Speaker, I shudder to think, that the next time I go down the rapids, I may see two big unagi eyes staring back at me.

"The history book is full of well intended experiments that have gone awry. I would like to read some of these experiments that have failed: 'large mouth bass placed in Lake Atlan, Guatemala, to promote tourism in the late 1950's, desimated native populations of minnow, frogs and crabs, leaving 50,000 Mayan Indians with almost no protein rich food.

"The introduction of a single predatory fish, the toucanary, into Gatun Laki, Panama caused quantitative and qualitative changes that have affected populations from tertiary consumers to primary consumers. The accidental release of the walking fish in Southern Florida from outdoor holding ponds of local aquarium dealers may be the most harmful introduction to any North American area so far witnessed because of its severe competition habits. Other species which have caused great damage to native aquatic systems at the expense of the public include lampreys, European carp, talapia and gambusia, the mosquito fish.

"All these experiments were done in the name of economic development. In fact we do not even know if it will be economically feasible to raise these eels here.

"Mr. Speaker and fellow Representatives, our environment is too fragile and small to tamper with. Several weeks ago, a resolution honoring Roger Jones and the British Broadcasting Company was passed. In an interview that preceded the resolution, Mr. Jones stated: 'people will be able to get a better appreciation of what a heritage Hawaii has. A heritage that is being ruined by the introduction of exotic plants and animals, and exploitation. I am not against trying to improve our economy. But I see grave consequences if this bill is passed. People say who cares if the opu and opai become extinct. Remember that the nene goose and the American buffalo was at one time very close to extinction. Now that they have come back, I think that

we all take pride in having the nene as our state bird, and the buffalo as an American symbol.

"Mr. Speaker, I urge my fellow representatives to vote no on this bill."

Representative Matsuura then rose to speak for the bill stating:

"Mr. Speaker, the intent of this bill is to permit the importation of one species Anguilla rostrata into Hawaii for experimental or other scientific purposes upon such terms as the Board of Agriculture may deem necessary to protect the native biota.

"I, too, had a lot of concerns about this bill in the beginning, so I read all of the past testimonies, newspaper articles, research articles and two books relating to the anguilla and other eels.

"I read about the 300 feet long eel seen in the Ganges River in India. In 1930, the Danish anguilla expedition caught a leptocephalus, which is an eel larva, which measured over six feet. It is big considering that an adult eel six feet long originates from a larva which is only five centimeters long. According to this calculation, a six feet larva would grow into a genuine sea serpent of 250 feet long. I hope my Midway fishermen don't hear about this story.

"In regards to breeding, Aristotle came to the conclusion that the anguilla originated from the mud. And to this day, after centuries of reseach, no one has yet been able to reproduce the anguilla in fresh water of in the sea under all kinds of experimental conditions. It took over 35 years of extensive research just to locate the breeding grounds of the North American and the European species of anguilla. This area is identified as the Sargasso Sea which is thousands of miles away from the fresh water streams of Europe and North America. The Sargasso Sea is the only place where scientists have located the early stages of the Anguilla rostrata and Anguilla anguilla larva. It is interesting to note that no mature eel has ever been caught from the sea.

"It appears that two species, Anguilla rostrata and Anguilla

anguilla, two distinct species morphologically and anatomically, go to the Sargasso Sea for breeding purposes. The adult never returns. The larva from one species goes back to Europe while the other goes back to North America. Why they don't get mixed up makes a very fascinating story.

"I realize some of the concerns that some of you may have in regards to escape and the anguilla reproducing in our streams. If that should ever happen, we would indeed have something better than a gold mine or an oil field, because we would be the only place in the world that would be capable of reproducing the anguilla in captivity. However, our wish will not come to past because the anguilla needs a very complex micro-environment to reproduce, which may include a combination of water temperatures, 17 degrees centigrade, 3.55 per cent salinity, a precise photoperiod, nutrition and so many other things, which I will not mention now.

"Now, for my defense of the anguilla. If the Anguilla rostrata could sue for being maliciously maligned in the past, it would most likely win. True, there are eels that bite, some that crawl on land, some that generate electricity, but this anguilla is not like other eels. It is a true fish, a true fish, having scales, gills, fins and other anatomical parts that characterize that same class of fish which includes trout, bass, perch, thousands of other species. Its snake like appearance and the terrible remarks indentifying it with toilet bowls, and some of the remarks made in caucus, unfortunately, has prejudiced so many that its reputation as a delicacy fish has been severely damaged.

"However, let it be known that roast eel is traditional on Christmas eve with the Mediterranean people, smoke eel is a favorite among Germans and Scandinavians, jellied eel is relished by the British, not to mention the kabayaki in the Orient.

"I would like at this time, Mr. Speaker, to mention as part of the history of anguilla in Hawaii, to recognize the contribution of Representative Richard Kawakami who has persisted, even against the worst case of media abuse that I am aware of. I have no reser-

vations of this ever becoming 'Richards' folly'."

Representative Albano rose to speak in favor of the bill stating:

"In speaking in favor of this bill, I would like to share with the distinguished members of the House, of my experience of this particular specie of fish. I was born in the countryside of the Phillipines where my house was near a river. My father used to fish and one of the biggest catches that he would make was an eel. It is a very delicious fish and we always enjoyed eating this kind of fish.

"Whenever I go to the Phillipines, I'm always looking for one of my relatives that would serve this kind of dish when I go there. But I found out, that at this time, this particular fish has been extinguished and we could not find any eels any more in the river. It is contrary to the belief of many, that eels would extinguish some fishes of the country. My experience prove it to be the contrary, and this is why I speak in favor of this bill."

Representative G. Hagino rose for the second time to speak against the bill stating:

"Just for a point of clarification, the order anguillaformes include many of the commonly known marine and fresh water eels, including the morays, the congors, snake eels, worm eels and deep water snipe eels, for they are all of the same family. Despite some of the reservations, I still feel that even though it is a fish, it could be very dangerous to have that here.

"I would like to clarify that one of the most dangerous fish is Jaws and also the piranha is also fish. I would like to close with the well known phrase: 'all that slivers is not silver'."

Representative Rohlfing rose to speak against the bill stating:

"Very briefly, in opposition, I'm not going to make any major remarks that will enlighten anybody except that I think we should defer to our elders and particularly when it comes to environmental things, I'm reminded of Senator

Doc Hill always saying before he made a vote: 'when in doubt, vote no'."

At this time, Representative G. Hagino moved for a roll call vote.

At 12:02 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:04 o'clock p.m.

Representative G. Hagino then withdrew his request for a roll call vote.

At this time, Representative D. Hagino moved for a roll call vote.

At 12:04 o'clock p.m., at the request of Representative Waihee, the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:06 o'clock p.m.

Representative D. Hagino then withdrew his request for a roll call vote.

Representative Anderson rose to speak in favor of this bill stating:

"It's nothing earth shattering, but three years ago when this bill came up, I voted against it. At that time, we were going to get more information on it. It still has not happened. This bill calls for an experiment and if we don't have an experiment then how the heck do we ever find out if its going to be a viable type of aquaculture for this state, or if it's not going to be. And just to say no because of a lot of people saying that we have doubts that this is going to get out and into our streams, all over. If it's going to be in an area that is going to be closely watched, and it's going to be for experimental purposes so we find out once and for all if it's going to be good, I think that we should use your heart and your minds and vote aye.

The motion to pass H.B. 2222-82, HD1 entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO ANGUILLAFORMES", on Third Reading was put by the Chair and carried by a vote of 36 ayes to 13 noes, with Representatives Baker, Chun, Dods, Fukunaga, G. Hagino, D. Hagino, Hirono, Ikeda, Lacy, Liu, Okamura, Rohlfing and Waihee voting no and Representative Kamali'i and Sakamoto being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 2222-82 had passed Third Reading at 12:08 o'clock p.m.

On motion by Representative Kunimura, seconded by Representative Kiyabu and carried, H.B. No. 2561-82, HD1 entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE MANAGEMENT OF STATE FUNDS", passed Third Reading by a vote of 49 ayes, with Representatives Andrews and Nakasato being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 2561-82 had passed Third Reading at 12:08 o'clock p.m.

H.B. No. 2839-82, HD1:

Representative Kunimura moved that H.B. No. 2839-82, HD1 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kiyabu.

Representative Kamali'i requested that her remarks in favor of H.B. No. 2839-82, HD1 be inserted in the Journal and the Chair noting that there were no objections, so ordered.

The remarks of Representative Kamali'i are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, in 1978 the citizens of this state voted for a much-needed tax review commission. Four years later, they are still waiting for this commission to become a reality - and the imperative for such a review has only intensified.

Our State Constitution is the highest expression of public will in Hawaii. But that expression was violated and ultimately subverted by 1) a Governor who waited until the last legal day to nominate the commissioners, 2) a state Senate which confirmed those nominees but refused to provide necessary funding, and 3) this House which, regardless of good intent, attempted to change the mandate of the commission from an independent review, to one directed at our own piecemeal efforts to reform tax laws.

No wonder the first commission resigned in protest.

This year, this attempt to restore

integrity to the commission and to encourage its work must be supported and made a reality. Why?

Whether we have consciously acknowledged it or not - the only on-going review and change in our total tax structures have occurred with our virtually-wholesale adoptions of all federal tax code changes. Although enacted a year after the national changes and usually with slight modifications, we have acted in total and frequently blind trust that such federal shifts would be appropriate for Hawaii.

That is no longer the case.

The sweeping changes adopted by Congress last year may have, on the whole, been necessary for national economic recovery. It does not logically or financially follow, that these same broad changes would be of benefit to the State of Hawaii.

I can think of one major amendment in federal corporate taxes, for example, which is now regretted by many members of Congress: the "selling" of corporate losses to profitable companies to report as their loss.

In the area of personal income taxes, we need to thoughtfully consider whether we should adopt the three-year, 25% cuts now mandated at the federal level.

We cannot make these determinations without a total and comprehensive review, without an integrate reform of every aspect of state taxation.

I feel strongly about this measure, Mr. Speaker. My only regret is that there was not more discussion or a hearing on my proposal to reconstitute this tax review commission as an explicit legislative tool. All efforts to reform our taxes have been initiated by the Legislature, not by the Executive Branch. And it recognition of where the interest and the statutory power resides for such reform I would have preferred a commission named by the Legislature and directly accountable to us.

However, even those considerations are obviously over-ridden by the greater need to simply begin. And with that commitment, then I will vote for this bill and encourage all others, especially our colleagues in the Senate, to do the same."

Thank you."

Representative Rohlifing rose to speak against the bill stating:

"I rise to speak only briefly against the measure and I do not intend to make a speech but let me refer to my remarks on the last session relating to the tax commission bill."

The motion to pass H.B. No. 2839-82, HD1 entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE TAX REVIEW COMMISSION", was put by the Chair and carried by a vote of 48 ayes to 1 no with Representative Rohlifing voting no, and Representatives Andrews and Nakasato being excused.

H.B. No. 2562-82, HD1:

On motion by Representative Kunimura, seconded by Representative Kiyabu and carried, H.B. No. 2562-82, HD1 entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO DEPOSITS OF PUBLIC FUNDS", passed Third Reading by a vote of 49 ayes, with Representatives Andrews and Nakasato being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. Nos. 2839-82, and 2562-82 had passed Third Reading at 12:10 o'clock p.m.

H.B. No. 2246-82, HD1:

On motion by Representative Chun, seconded by Representative Nakamura and carried, H.B. No. 2246-82, HD1 entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO VISITATION AND SUPPORT", passed Third Reading by a vote of 49 ayes, with Representatives Andrews and Nakasato being excused.

H.B. No. 2098-82, HD1:

On motion by Representative Nakamura, seconded by Representative Taniguchi and carried, H.B. No. 2098-82, HD1 entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 707-741, HAWAII REVISED STATUTES, CREATING TWO CLASSES ON INCEST", passed Third Reading by a vote of 49 ayes, with Representatives Andrews and Nakasato being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk

to note that H.B. Nos. 2246-82, and 2098-82 had passed Third Reading at 12:11 o'clock p.m.

H.B. No. 2099-82, HD1:

By unanimous consent, action on H.B. No. 2099-82, HD1 was deferred one day.

H.B. No. 2045-82, HD1:

Representative Blair moved that H.B. No. 2045-82, HD1 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Hirono.

Representative Monahan then rose to speak against this bill stating:

"I think that when you try to convert an existing structure, such as this bill is suggesting, you can have some serious structural problems relating to that building.

"In order to provide for these kinds of structural problems, you can find that one solution leads to another problem, and another solution leads to another problem, and can cost a great deal of money. For the most part, many of the people that we are talking about in terms of condominium conversions, deal with people of limited economic ability.

"We know that when these construction costs begin to multiply, that cost is going to be passed on to consumers who are the least capable of assuming that cost.

"As I look at this bill, I find some other problems. I see the fact that there is no real review procedure which I would consider to be competent. And we could raise the question of whether the Real Estate Commission, and those members on it, are really qualified to make a judgement regarding "the economic feasibility of solar energy devises and heat pumps" in all condominium conversions.

"We could raise another issue. There may be a possible violation of the state's equal rights protection in our State Constitution. This law tends to discriminate against condominium conversions and those people that are doing that sort of thing. Perhaps it should be applicable to all new construction, all new

condominiums, all new homes, and so forth.

"As I look at the present law, it seems that the government is quite properly represented in several key areas. The present law covers protecting the public's financial interests to make sure no one is ever robbed of their money. There is also the protection of the public's health and safety interests. But it does not address any specific structural methods to accomplish this.

"If we are going to have a bill that mandates this, that we have solar heating or heat pumps, then why not a specific kind of roof which conserves energy, perhaps windows, the government could come in and tell us what kinds of lights should be in the building, and almost anything else that could be justified in the name of energy.

"It's very difficult for anyone to be opposed to solar and heat pump devices I have one myself. But indeed, the future may find other areas of electrical energy which might be more applicable than these particular devices. We are now looking into geothermal energy, perhaps in some areas of the Big Island, OTEC, windmills and other devices.

"And so basically, I see this as an unnecessary intrusion of government into the free market. I believe that the present body, if we are going to have government intrude into this area, is probably best able to cope with local variations, and I am not advocating this, would probably be the county government.

"But my position at this point is in opposition to H.B. No. 2045-82, HD1, and I hope I will have your consideration."

Representative Narvaes rose to speak against the bill stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I have a few concerns about H.B. No. 2045-82, HD1. This bill does not specify what percentage of the hot water heating requirements of a condominium conversion is to be provided for by solar energy devices. That lack of specified percentage leaves the door open to many abuses. For example, a developer could install one single panel and say

that he has satisfied the law.

"It is very commendable to attempt to reduce the state's dependence of fossil fuels through this measure, but technology, especially in the area of solar energy is advancing very quickly. Representative Monahan mentioned several types of alternatives that people can turn to now and in the future. We have things like photovoltaics which is coming on board very quickly. We have some experimental homes in this state now: one in Molokai, one in Kalihi, one in Pearl City. It's not quite economical today to produce electricity for the average home utilizing these photovoltaic cells, but scientists are predicting some major breakthroughs to occur pretty quickly.

"For example, in three years, if the breakthrough were to happen, and this bill were to be in existence, you would have some problems if condominiums were to put up solar panels to heat water with, and they have expended monies there. They would later have to retrofit the building, take off those panels, put these photovoltaic panels on the roof. There would be extra costs in retrofitting them again.

"Mr. Speaker, to require condominium conversions to have this type of solar energy, especially without a percentage in it, is a big mistake.

"Mr. Speaker, I have a lot of other concerns, but based on that and some of the things that Representative Monahan said, I think we should kill this bill."

The motion to pass H.B. No. 2045-82, HD1 entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO SOLAR ENERGY DEVICES", on Third Reading was put by the Chair and carried by a vote of 36 ayes to 13 noes, with Representatives Anderson, Ikeda, Isbell, Kamali'i, Lacy, Levin, Marumoto, Medeiros, Monahan, Morioka, Narvaes, Rohlfing and Wong voting no, and Representatives Andrews and Nakasato being excused.

H.B. No. 2295-82, HD1:

On motion by Representative Blair, seconded by Representative Hirono and carried, H.B. No. 2295-82, HD1 entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAII REGULATORY LICENSING REFORM ACT", passed Third Reading by a vote of 46 ayes to 3 noes, with Representa-

tives Lacy, Kamali'i and Rohlfing voting no and Representatives Andrews and Nakasato being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. Nos. 2045-82, and 2295-82 had passed Third Reading at 12:18 o'clock p.m.

At 12:21 o'clock p.m., at the request of Representative Yamada, the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:25 o'clock p.m.

At 12:26 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Stanley, seconded by Representative Rohlfing and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned until 11:30 o'clock a.m., tomorrow, Thursday, March 11, 1982.

The Hawaii Nurses Association continues to be recognized and accepted as the official voice for nurses and nursing in Hawaii."

Representative Chun then introduced Mrs. Rosie Chang, President, and Mrs. Marion Poirier, Executive Director, of the Hawaii Nurses Association.

Representatives Segawa and Kobayashi then presented white carnation leis to the honorees while Representative Chun presented them with certified copies of the resolution.

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of this bill.

Mr. Speaker, the purpose of this bill is to establish and to fund a statewide program to combat organized crime. Such a program, especially in anticipation of national reductions in LEAA grants, will create a necessary state counterpart to coordinated and comprehensive prosecution of organized crime.

Especially the now-lacking coordination of cross-county efforts will be encouraged and enhanced by this measure. This vital comprehensiveness, further, will not be hampered by an imbalance of county resources -- as was possible in the first version of this bill with its requirement for matching county funds.

My only hesitation, Mr. Speaker, about this measure, and they are concerns which I have voiced repeatedly in this chamber over the years, are:

(1) A final resolution and confrontation of continuing public questions about the possible linkage of government officials and organized crime, and

(2) The continued but ill-defined assertion of state influence and virtual creation of a State Police Force without proper or adequate controls.

Let me take these concerns separately.

First, the shadow of organized crime within the halls of government. Ever since the Doi report on the syndicate six years ago, no formal action to repudiate the serious charges of collusion has ever been conducted.

It would be my hope that this statewide coordination of county activities would lead in this direction. Certainly, with the advent of elected county prosecutors and a presumed greater political independence, that glaring omission may finally be met. That objective is at least a part of my motivation in voting for a million-dollar program.

But will there be a corresponding affirmation of such independence from the state?

Such a program could, if that were the purpose, seriously hamper cooperative county investigations. Such must never be the case.

However, gradually encroaching state police powers conveyed through various departments could accomplish just that kind of indirect intervention by a lack of coordination or worse.

The over-riding good of this program, however, must be supported. And these concerns are again raised for the purpose of drawing attention to potential conflicts or weaknesses.

With a faith in our abilities to balance such concerns, I urge, Mr. Speaker, the passage of this bill."

Representative Narvaes then rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I realize that the interest rate ceiling can no longer be left at the 9.5 percent figure that is set forth in the statutes. I believe, however, that to avoid an excessive drain on the debt service. . . an excessive drain that the debt service would have on the general fund, a tight rein must be kept on the rate at which bonds are sold. The House, unlike the Senate, has wisely decided to put a ceiling of 14 percent on the interest rate. Even this, however, is not enough of a limit.

Mr. Speaker, the Legislature has the responsibility to keep the rate as low as possible when bond sales are still possible. This rate has declined from its high point of 13.44 percent and is forecast to decline even further. In addition, the Director of Budget and Finance has testified that the Department's practical ceiling has been and may continue to be 13 percent.

Mr. Speaker, for these reasons, I strongly urge the rate to be set by statute at 13.5 percent. The difference between these two rates may seem small but in the long run, it is not. The Department of Budget and Finance estimates that a half percent difference in interest to

amount to over \$8.6 million over the twenty year life of the bonds. This amount will be paid by the general fund for each yearly issue of bonds.

Mr. Speaker, the general fund is already in jeopardy because of federal budget cuts, declining revenues, and the necessary return of excess funds to the taxpayers. To further burden the fund at such a time would be neglecting our duty to the taxpayers of this State to keep the operations of government on a sound, fiscal basis.

Mr. Speaker, the Legislative Auditor has warned that the State's current practices of issuing general obligation bonds has placed the general fund in difficulty. We have an obligation to amend these practices in such a way that the State incurs neither high debt service nor massive borrowing from the general fund. This can best be done, I believe, by limiting the sale of bonds to the rate of 13.5 percent.

For this reason, Mr. Speaker, I am going to vote no on this bill."

Representative Kunimura then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I cannot allow irresponsible statement be made on the floor of this House. But, Mr. Speaker, if anyone feel that the general fund of this State is in jeopardy, then that person had better rise and vote against every measure that we are about to vote on or have already voted on expending funds. Contrary to what was stated here on the floor, Mr. Speaker, we are not in jeopardy, but if we really want to stop and be conservative, then don't approve capital improvement projects; don't try to stop the Mississippi down at Louisiana because it is going to cause a terrible flood. Stop it at the head waters and that's the approval of the C.I.P. I have never seen the gentleman who spoke against this bill vote against C.I.P. yet."

Representative Narvaes, in rebuttal, stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I am sorry if the wise chairman of Finance has not understood clearly what I am referring to. Mr. Speaker, what I am trying to do is point out to this Legislature that we have to start looking at these things with a little bit more vision. And I do understand that we have a problem right now. We have to raise the interest rate ceiling because if we don't have government building any projects right now, we wouldn't have anybody building projects in

the State probably because things are that bad. So, I would like to see the interest rate raised but when the Department of Budget and Finance and when the Director of Budget and Finance says in Finance Committee that 13.5 is sufficient, then I buy that and this bill raises it to 14 percent.

To the chairman of the Finance Committee, I understand what he is saying but I am looking at things, hopefully, with a little more vision."

Representative Kunimura then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I am pretty sure he didn't mean it but it seems to be that someone is trying to allude that I do not have vision.

Mr. Speaker, we set the limit last Special Session to 12 percent and they were not able to float the bond at that rate because it exceeded 12 percent. They have been borrowing from the general fund surplus and this we cannot tolerate too long. And, Mr. Speaker, it only affords them a reasonable ceiling, and I am pretty sure that the Administration is not unreasonable, but on the contrary, Mr. Speaker, I have heard complaints after complaints throughout these chambers and throughout the community that our Governor is fiscally too responsible because he doesn't go for broke in selling bonds and go like hell in the election year with capital improvement projects.

Mr. Speaker, 14 percent is just the ceiling. I have every confidence that if it is close to 14 percent, unless it is a very important, critical matter, they will not float it at that rate. But their forecast, Mr. Speaker, wiser men, more experienced men, and women in the nation's capital and in New York where they decide much of the financial going-ons in this country and the world, have predicted. . . some say it is coming down -- interest is coming down -- and others say it is going up again. And the reason why we pegged it at 14 percent, Mr. Speaker, is because it would be like hell for you and the President of the Senate to call a special session again."

Representative Rohlfing then rose and spoke in favor of the

measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I must say that it is a Catch 22 proposition; it does place us in a dilemma because, certainly, if we float bonds at the rate of up to 14 percent, we are mortgaging the future of a lot of young people as well as ourselves. But we are in that dilemma of trying to solve the problem which comes from trying to keep some kind of continuity of capital improvements and employment in the community, to be able to provide the things that the community needs over a long period of time, and to finance them over a longer period of time rather than trying to finance them out of the general fund. And that is what I think is the greater evil that we are trying to solve here with this measure -- to put some reasonable ceiling on it for a period of time but to have it drop dead and go back as soon as possible to a lower rate.

Having taken a position personally of concern to the Governor with respect to the provisions that exist in the statutes for what amounts to back door borrowing from the general fund, I feel that the Legislative Auditor's report should be heeded, and that report says that we are and have put the general fund surplus in some form of jeopardy by considerable borrowing therefrom, and I think that we have to act on this bill favorably to prevent that sort of thing from continuing. And, hopefully, the message will be that responsible management of fiscal affairs does require not going too far in any extreme on these two ends of the see-saw.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

"Mr. Speaker, as you are aware, and my colleagues are aware, this bill addresses the Hula Mae Fund. Presently, the law as it stands, discriminates against the person who has taken the initiative to invest in a vacant land by excluding such a person as an eligible borrower. This bill eliminates this discrimination.

The history of the statutes, commonly referred to as the Hula Mae Fund, was established primarily to provide lower interest cost loans through a state sanctioned, tax-exempt revenue bond in order that persons could borrow funds

to build their initial home.

Mr. Speaker, I emphasize the purpose again and that is to provide lower interest loan for the purchase of a home.

This year, we have passed legislation to provide for funds for conversion of leasehold houselots. And, this again, is an attempt to help those who are in need of funds. But, Mr. Speaker, we forget the person who has had the initiative to invest in a vacant land. We have passed this bill in previous years and we have always been blocked in the Senate. Mr. Speaker, we have compromised this situation and this position because we wanted to provide the funds in Hula Mae for the use by the people of this State, but I believe we have compromised long enough, that we need to take a stand that we eliminate such a discrimination.

Mr. Speaker, the Senate has had no valid reasons; they have expressed some fears of speculation when we allow this kind of fund for persons who have already invested in a vacant property.

Mr. Speaker, the law adequately provides that in order that a person cannot speculate on land and still be able to qualify for such a loan. His assets, as described in the law, would eliminate such a person who exceeds such limits from qualifying for this loan.

On this basis, Mr. Speaker, I urge you and all my colleagues to unanimously support and pass this bill.

Thank you."

allow elderly persons with the lowest income, the SSI recipients whose income is \$279.90 a month, lower than the general welfare assistance program, an increase worth \$35 of State food coupon stamp that can be used to buy needed food. Many elderly persons on SSI are having difficulty in maintaining a decent standard of living and expenses targeted for food are cut to pay for shelter and utilities. However, there is a point when food expenses cannot be reduced anymore, even when some have resorted to eating cat food as a last resort for cheaper food.

SSI is a federal program which establishes a maximum grant. The State is allowed and does permit a State supplemental grant but can only increase the cash amount so much without endangering other federal grants like the federal food stamps and the medicaid eligibility.

To be able to alleviate the SSI recipients' plight, the State Food Coupon Program was an alternative we chose to adopt. The State Food Coupon Program under this bill provides an increase in the elderly's food purchase while not jeopardizing eligibility to other programs which the increase in social security did last year.

Another reason for favorable consideration of this bill is that the State will gain experience in administering a totally State-operated Food Coupon Program if indeed the new federalism of President Reagan is going to come to pass. Experience in the administration of the State Food Coupon Program will be invaluable if the transfer does occur.

Fellow legislators, I urge your vote for this bill.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

On motion by Representative Nakamura, seconded by Representative Taniguchi and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 2479-82, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO FAMILY COURTS", passed Second Reading and was placed on the calendar for Third Reading.

Representative Nakamura, for the Committee on Judiciary, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 614-82) recommending that H.B. No. 3138-82, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be placed on the calendar for Third Reading.

Representatives Sakamoto and

On motion by Representative Fukunaga, seconded by Representative Takamine and carried, the joint report of the majority of the Committees was adopted and H.B. No. 2327-82, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO AGRICULTURE", passed Second Reading and was placed on the calendar for Third Reading.

Representatives Sakamoto and Tungpalan, for the majority of the Committees on Water, Land Use, Development and Hawaiian Affairs, and Culture and the Arts, presented a joint report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 617-82) recommending that H.B. No. 1251, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be placed on the calendar for Third Reading.

Representative Fukunaga moved that the report of the majority of the Committees be adopted and H.B. No. 1251, HD 1, pass Second Reading and be placed on the calendar for Third Reading.

Representative Anderson then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I wasn't going to say anything this evening but I would like to speak in behalf of the bill with reservations.

Mr. Speaker, some years ago, we asked the Department of Land and Natural Resources to give us a criteria to follow for a live-in park. Many of us here have put in different bills and they have gone down the drain and until such time as the Administration themselves put out the criteria for live-in parks, it will never pass. And the reason being that I am standing tonight is that I don't think it is fair to a group of people, year after year after year, to be told that they are going to be able to live comfortably in a live-in park when in reality we have never really addressed the problem.

Now, until such time that we find out a complete criteria, as far as this bill goes, it has done a fine job but when you find out that if a live-in park is really going to be on this island, inter-state, or if there is going to be numbers included, if it is going to be strictly for fishing, is it going

to be all types of Hawaiian culture. These things have never been addressed and I don't think it is fair to any one group of people to be, month after month, living in a place and they are never really going to know if they are going to be thrown off.

For that reason, Mr. Speaker, I am in favor of this bill because I know that they have done a lot of work on it and it is a step in the right direction but I would hope that we would be able to answer the other questions, and I hope everybody goes aye.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the joint report of the majority of the Committees was adopted and H.B. No. 1251, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO STATE PARKS AND RECREATION AREAS", passed Second Reading and was placed on the calendar for Third Reading.

"Mr. Speaker and members of this honorable body, I am talking this evening in regards to commending one of our fellow colleagues, along with the Finance Committee, in doing an extremely good job in analyzing the budget of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs.

Those of you who may have been at the Office of Hawaiian Affairs Lokahi yesterday afternoon, that this House was criticized on the part that we did not supplement their original budget request. I take it from personal pride and intelligence, and responsibility -- fiscal responsibility, Mr. Speaker -- that the Chairman of the Committee on Water, Land Use, Development and Hawaiian Affairs did an extremely

fiscally responsible job in representing this House.

For those members who are on the Finance Committee ought to say for those of you who pumped up the Office of Hawaiian Affairs Trustees in saying that you will get the money -- let me say this, you were not fiscally responsible. You want to play games this evening. . ."

At this point, Representative Kamali'i rose on a point of order and stated:

"Where do we go with personal privilege? I want to know this because when I stand up, I don't want to be called out of order."

The Chair stated:

"Representative Say, the point is well taken."

Representative Say then asked if he could continue wherein the Chair answered:

"Representative Say, when the bill comes up for Third Reading, you will have the opportunity of expressing your observations in favor or against."

Representative Say proceeded to say, "Well, let me say this. . ."

The Chair then ruled Representative Say out of order.

Representative Say responded:

"If I am out of order, thank you very much, but you have not allowed me the opportunity of speaking on behalf of my constituents.

Thank you very much."

At 11:20 o'clock p.m., Representative Takamine asked for a recess and the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 11:22 o'clock p.m.
