FIRST DAY

Wednesday, January 19, 1983

In accordance with the provisions of Section 10 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, the House of Representatives of the Twelfth Legislature of the State of Hawaii convened in Regular Session on Wednesday, January 19, 1983. The Honorable Herbert A. Segawa being the Representative at the time present who was elected from the First Representative District of the State of Hawaii, called the House to order at 10:00 o'clock a.m.

The National Anthem was sung by Ms. Marlene Sai followed by Hawaii Pono'i sung by Mr. Palani Vaughan.

Representative Segawa then appointed the Honorable Whitney T. Anderson, Robert Bunda, Marvin S.C. Dang, Clarice Y. Hashimoto, Joan Hayes, Joseph P. Leong, Arnold Morgado, Dennis M. Nakasato and Calvin K.Y. Say to escort Reverend Abraham K. Akaka to the rostrum.

Reverend Abraham K. Akaka then invoked the Divine Blessing.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

A resolution (H.R. No. 1) declaring the Honorable Herbert A. The House of Representatives reconvened at 10:40 o'clock a.m.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

A resolution (H.R. No. 2) declaring the Honorable Henry Haalilio Peters, Representative from the Thirty-Eighth District, and Daniel J. Kihano, Representative from the Fortieth District, as Speaker and Vice Speaker, respectively, of the House of Representatives of the Twelfth Legislature of the State of Hawaii was jointly offered by Representatives Kiyabu and Tungpalan and was read by the Temporary Clerk.

On motion by Representative Kiyabu, seconded by Representative Tungpalan and carried, H.R. No. 2 was adopted.

The Temporary Chairman appointed Representatives Peter K. Apo, Russell Blair, Michael Crozier, Marvin S.C. Dang, Richard A. Kawakami, Ken Kiyabu, Avis Kiyabu-Saball, Richard M. Matsuura, Arnold Morgado, Frederick W. Rohlfling, Kathleen Stanley and Eloise Yamashita Tungpalan to escort the newly elected Speaker to the rostrum whereupon the Temporary Chairman presented the gavel to the newly elected Speaker.

The Speaker took the Chair and stated:

"Thank you folks, very, very much.

Before I begin some very important observations that I have to share with all of you, it is customary that in the deliverance of those observations, certain key individuals in our State are present. The Governor, Lieutenant Governor and other dignitaries will be joining us very soon."

At 10:43 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair, to await the arrival of the Governor, Lieutenant Governor and other dignitaries.

Upon reconvening at 10:49 o'clock a.m., the Chair addressed the members of the House and their guests as follows:

"Governor Ariyoshi, Mrs. Ariyoshi, Lieutenant Governor Waihee, Mayor Kunimura, Mayor Matayoshi, Mayor Anderson, Mayor Tavares, Congressman Akaka -- aloha.

To our many dignitaries, to our friends, to our relatives, our loved ones -- aloha. E komo mai -- please come in, our house is yours.

In a time when our great nation is faced with the highest level of unemployment in over forty years; in a time when our nation's economy is severely depressed; in a time when debts pile upon debts, deficits upon deficits, industries close and companies are bankrupt; in such a time, we can truly say, 'Hawaii is a special place.'

Even though our skies are dotted with invading clouds of layoffs, take-backs, recalls -- there is no cause for despair. Hawaii will weather the economic storm.

But, despite our optimism, we recognize

that revenues are down and the budget must be balanced. A seemingly inevitable result of even a short-term decline in revenues, is an outpouring of proposals for new revenues. However, the answer is not to enact piecemeal amendments or look for a 'quick fix.' Our effort should be to develop a comprehensive strategy which addresses both our future requirements and our immediate financial needs.

We have the opportunity and the responsibility to implement such a strategy by re-establishing the constitutionally mandated Tax Review Commission with adequate funding so that the commissioners can develop and present the alternatives for legislative action. It will be more than foolish, it will be tragic if we continue to make decisions which effect our economic environment without the benefit or knowledge of the alternatives which could be so readily available.

It makes sense to refer all proposals that would substantially change the way our State government gets its money to the Tax Commission, excluding only those proposals which carry such overwhelming benefits that immediate passage is clearly in the best interest of our citizenry.

It has been suggested that one such exception might be a hotel room tax which is re-invested to promote the long term strength of our visitor industry. Our minds are not closed but the burden is on the proponents. The use of hotel room tax dollars in this manner provides us with another guideline for reviewing economic proposals this session. Mainly, they should ripple out, not trickle down.

The phrase 'ripple out' makes clear that each new economic development has a multiplier effect. For example, a high tech research center may generate and attract other new industries, related services and investments. Just as a pebble tossed upon still water creates motion, these economic catalysts should cause activity which can only be viewed in a positive manner given this current, flat 'no growth' period in our economy. And those enterprises which demonstrate a long term commitment to Hawaii should be positively encouraged, even favored.

The experts tell us that business is attracted to an area which offers cheap labor, proximity to major

markets, tax benefits, investment capital and quality research and engineering facilities.

While Hawaii appears to be at a disadvantage in some of these areas, there are many factors which make Hawaii an attractive location. And 'location' is one of these factors. As an editor of *Business Week* magazine observed, the balance of trade seems to be shifting from the Atlantic to the Pacific and, as all of you know, Hawaii is strategically located in the middle of the Pacific. This shift in world economic activity presents a strong inducement for business to come to Hawaii.

Our location, our diversity, our unique mix of American, European, Pacific and Asian cultures; and a stable society are some of our notable advantages which tell the world that Hawaii can be especially good for business.

The encouragement of long term business investment in our State requires our commitment to the development of our greatest resource. Even in this cost-conscious time, money spent on human capital is the single most important investment we can make. All the programs and proposed economic alternatives are worthless if tomorrow's citizen is not prepared to handle the often disruptive economic changes which are occurring at an ever-increasing rate. Therefore, we must invest now in our human resources. From comprehensive computer training in our public schools to training and re-training our current workforce and those who are unemployed, our preparation for tomorrow begins today.

While government must not be afraid to take the lead, it must always be willing to share the responsibility. Through joint efforts with the private sector, we may be able to match public and private funds to develop talents and skills needed by private enterprise. And it is expected that the University of Hawaii and our community college system will play a very crucial role.

However, in our desire to insure our future, we cannot ignore the present. The economy, crime, education, employment -- areas which affect the quality of our life and our land -- these are also areas of immediate public concern today.

In the movie 'The Candidate' -- I am sure that all of you have seen that -- Robert Redford plays an idealist who runs for office only to have a forum for his ideas. Even his campaign

manager predicts defeat. When he does win, and as the movie ends, he turns to his manager and asks, 'What do I do now?'

While winning is 'the end' in movies, it's 'the beginning' in real political life. And it is our constituents who asked us after the recent election, 'What will you do now?'

How will you solve the problems that can be solved? How will you manage the problems that seemingly evade solution?

We realize there are no easy answers. With less flexibility than it is comfortable to admit, we must remain within current income projections for the present time. Subsequent alternative solutions may be developed by the Tax Review Commission. Further, an interim committee will review State and County responsibilities to determine the need for additional taxing powers by the respective counties.

While debate over public safety versus individual rights may reflect changing public attitudes, and while we have made frequent legislative amendments to our criminal justice system, the underlying philosophy of our Penal Code which was established over ten years ago has never been comprehensively reviewed. Therefore, there are problems of conflicting or even contradictory statutory provisions. We will, therefore, initiate a review of the State Penal Code. At the same time, with the multi-million dollar appropriation, we will start construction on a new prison facility.

We will raise the drinking age.

We are planning to make kindergarten mandatory. And, at the other end, we may request the University of Hawaii to expand its evening degree programs.

With the scarcity of land being a primary factor in the high cost of housing, we will consider redesignating marginal agricultural and conservation land for urban residential use. And, of course, we remain committed to the adoption of the State functional plans.

By continuing our efforts at health care cost containment, we will show our commitment to the idea that critical health services should be available to all our residents.

To conserve and protect our agricultural lands, we shall implement Article XI, Section 3, of our State Constitution. We will aid the sugar industry as well as the pineapple industry by appropriating money for research development and promotion.

In accordance with federal guidelines, enterprise zones shall be created. Enabling legislation will be introduced to establish international banking facilities.

Public safety will be the basis for proposals to resolve the difficult issue of where to locate a general aviation airport.

We shall review the minimum wage. We will consider how best to help ailing companies survive these rather lean times.

We shall explore ways to harness the ocean's energy, establish standards for geothermal exploration, and capture the sun and the wind. We will seek to reap the benefits of ocean leasing, and harvest, without damage, the bounty of our seas including the farthest islands.

The City and County of Honolulu will get an energy boost with our grant of authority for issuing bonds to build a facility to change waste into energy.

These are some of the issues to be worked on during the next sixty days. Our only promise is to put forth our very best effort and to be fair and open to all. We ask all of you to join us in this effort and together, really together, we can assure that Hawaii shall remain a very special place.

Thank you."

At this time, the Chair presented the Vice Speaker of the House of Representatives, Representative Daniel J. Kihano, to the members of the House and their guests and asked the Vice Speaker to join him at the rostrum.

The Chair recognized Representative Rohlfling, Minority Leader, who then rose and stated:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

Governor and Mrs. Ariyoshi; Lieutenant Governor Waihee, my colleague from the seat next door of the last session; our distinguished mayors from Oahu, Kauai, Maui and the Big Island, Congress-

man Akaka, distinguished guests, my colleagues, and all of our citizens here today -- aloha.

On this special day of leis, music and parties, a particular mahalo and aloha to our families and our friends without whose efforts we would not be here today, and whose help we are going to need in the next sixty days of our labors. Also, a special welcome to twenty new Representatives and members of this body. They are the new blood that we always say we need more of and it's great to have all of you aboard.

The success of the two-party system in the United States stems from the fact that both parties have provided an accommodation within their ranks for people of varying views. This has been possible because both parties agree on certain basic objectives; for example, the welfare of our people. I often disagree on the means of reaching these goals -- my experiences being that in some ninety-some percent, we do agree, however. Whenever an election brings either a change of party in control of the government or further bolsters the numbers of the majority, a revolution doesn't result in our State. Instead, there is a toughening of the leaner minority and a reaffirmation of its traditional role.

That role is, first, to point out the errors or deficiencies that we perceive of the party in power, often called the watchdog function. Secondly, to develop and present to the Legislature, and ultimately to the electorate at large, the proposals and programs that would be implemented if the voters chose the opposition party in the next election, and in arriving and making those proposals, and acting in that manner, to try and make government work for the people effectively within our system.

More important than our differences, in terms of parties here, I think it is appropriate to speak of the things that bring us together. For the first time, each of us, alone, all fifty-one on this floor, represent the people of a narrowly defined geographic area. The philosophy behind the small, single-member districts is summed up in the word 'accountability'.

Hawaii's basic strength lies in her diversity -- just like the diversity of the fifty-one individuals and the strength represented here in this

body. But when diversity erodes into deep division, the welfare of the people is no longer served. In diversity, there can be a special kind of unity, however -- the unity to which both the Speaker and I are asking all of us to re-dedicate ourselves today; a unity through which we will resolve as many problems of our islands as we can in the coming session and thereafter by a melding of differing legislative inputs.

I want to acknowledge for myself and my colleagues on this side of the aisle, the leadership and the fairness that has been given to us by the Speaker, and I look forward to our working together this year. In the last two years, I have come to appreciate, particularly his concern for the institution, the Legislature, and particularly the integrity of this House. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

And I would be remiss if, at this point, before I leave discussion of the Legislature, I didn't acknowledge also the professional and very helpful efforts of our leading officers of the House -- our Clerk, our Sergeant-at-Arms, and those who work on our permanent staff. Their professionalism and dedication to the work of this Legislature are the kinds of things that put us in a position to the work that we must perform.

Bringing us together also, possibly in a more ominous way, are the challenges of our times. In many parts of this country, factories have closed or cut production drastically. Industry in America moved out of the East to the South and then to the West. And then, it moved, in many cases, overseas. Between 1950 and 1980, direct foreign investment by U.S. controlled businesses increased a fantastic sixteen times, from \$12 billion to \$192 billion.

We, in Hawaii, are familiar with the process. Our local agriculturally-based corporations acquired mainland management and ownership. Unions became more powerful, and the cost of business rose markedly. These corporations, many of them at least, invested overseas and more Hawaii plantations closed. Can anyone wonder why there is a deepening sense of insecurity rising out of the collapse of the traditional base of our communities? This kind of collapse has led to a new 'war between the states' -- an increased cutthroat competition for capital investment. Hawaii must compete, but we can also work with the other states so that we are not divided and conquered unfairly. We can and we must attract

Pacific and Asian investment to our shores. We can and we must encourage the growth and expansion of more locally-owned businesses. We can and we must establish a combination public and private investment agency that can aid our older industries and provide start-up capital for these new local businesses -- businesses that use our indigenous resources and employ our people.

It is incumbent upon government to act as an active catalyst -- to bring business and labor together in a three-way venture for economic survival of our State. The laws we write and the policies we set must lead to sound conservation and management of our natural resources, and the improved education of our varied human resources. Our laws and policies must encourage business and labor to risk both their capital and their sweat, to give young people opportunity and old people the security that they so richly deserve. Reliance on the marketplace as the one and only judge of who gets how much and what, has failed in the past and it will fail again.

Mr. Speaker, I was born and reared in Hawaii. So much and as much as anyone here, I want to keep Hawaii Hawaiian. It is important to see our heritage, not as something that isolates us, but rather, as something that gives us much to contribute to the world community, and a willingness to adapt ideas that emanate from outside Hawaii to our needs. Let us keep our pride in our uniqueness, enjoy our special language, our relatively unfrenetic lifestyle, and our aloha spirit, with one difference -- use it or lose it. If we don't make our diversity work for us, if we don't let our specialness spur us on to greater intellectual pursuits, if we don't share aloha with that fast-paced world out there, Hawaii will become an economic and intellectual mid-Pacific backwater.

A prominent Jesuit scholar put it this way: 'The age of nations is past. It remains for us now, if we do not wish to perish, to set aside the ancient prejudices and build the Earth.' Time may be short. Let's use it for the benefit of all of our people.

Mahalo nui loa and aloha."

Representative Blair, Majority Leader of the House, was recognized and he stated:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

We've heard your words this morning and I believe we've received your message. So, on behalf of the majority caucus, let me just say that we look forward to working with you, and with our colleagues in the minority caucus, to meet the challenge and make the most of the opportunity which our constituents have given to us to turn the words that we have heard today into solid accomplishments in the next sixty days.

Thank you."

FOURTH DAY

Monday, January 24, 1983

The House of Representatives of the Twelfth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, convened at 10:00 o'clock a.m., with the Speaker presiding.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Mr. Richard Wood, representing First Church of Christ, after which the Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representative Levin, who was excused.

At 10:07 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

Upon reconvening at 10:34 o'clock a.m., the House of Representatives met in joint session with the Senate, pursuant to House Concurrent Resolution No. 1, to receive the Governor's address. (Gov. Msg. No. 1)

At this time, the Speaker introduced to the members of the Twelfth Legislature the First Lady of Hawaii, Mrs. Jean Ariyoshi; Lieutenant Governor John Waihee and Acting Chief Justice Herman Lum.

The Speaker then introduced the Dean of the Consular Corps in Hawaii, Consul General Chong Hoon Kim of Korea, and other members of the Consular Corps.

The Speaker then welcomed the various Department Heads of the State of Hawaii and Military Dignitaries in attendance.

The Chair then appointed Representatives Blair, Segawa, Stanley, Rohlfing and Marumoto and Senators Kuroda and Henderson to escort the Honorable George R. Ariyoshi, Governor of the State of Hawaii, to the rostrum.

Representative Stanley then presented Governor Ariyoshi with a white carnation lei on behalf of the Senate and the House of Representatives.

The Speaker presented to the members of the Twelfth Legislature, the Honorable George R. Ariyoshi, stating:

"Ladies and Gentlemen of the State of Hawaii, please join me in extending our very best Aloha and

welcome to the Governor of this great State of ours, the Honorable George R. Ariyoshi."

The Governor addressed the Joint Session as follows:

"Mr. President, Mr. Speaker, Members of the Legislature, and My Fellow Citizens:

"Today, as a new year begins, as the new Legislature comes into being, as we feel a sense of renewal, it is useful for us to pause and take a look at the past -- and also to focus on the future. We have come here this morning to 'take stock' -- to find out where we stand.

"The members of the Legislature have invited me to come to this rostrum, and I begin by thanking you for that invitation. This is more than a ceremonial 'thank you,' for I regard the next several minutes as valuable time, indeed.

"This is also an opportunity for the people of Hawaii, as they look in on television, to find all of us in the same room -- but not having an argument.

"The news media report frequently on the issues and philosophies that divide us, and cause us to argue. But though the executive branch and the legislative branch of your state government may be adversaries from time to time, we are not enemies. And the underlying purpose we all share is exactly the same.

"We are all looking for 'the best Hawaii.' And since none of us has all the wisdom or all the power to find it immediately, we talk, and we clash, and then we vote.

"Thomas Jefferson said that 'democracy begins in conversation.' And I want to assure you that our democracy here in Hawaii, though it may occasionally flare up on the surface like Kilauea, is -- down underneath -- solid as a rock.

"When I speak to you of my concerns about Hawaii this morning, let me assure you that I do so within a framework of confidence and hope. We have some big problems, but none of them are beyond our capacity to solve. All we must do is remain imaginative...and energetic...and

fair to everyone.

"A State of the State speech usually goes into great detail about the achievements of the past year, but I am going to change that pattern this morning. We have just come through an election year, and in a long political campaign, the achievements of an administration get a lot more than just passing attention! So let me state them more briefly today, and let me say that I will not be covering in detail the issues of Housing, Education, or Health and Human Services, nor will I talk at length about my administration's proposals to continue our war against crime, although crime is still a matter of great concern to me. Not because these areas are unimportant, but simply because their details will be reflected in the budget and other bills that will be coming down to you soon.

"Let's look at what we've done:

"Together, we have developed a splendid public education system and university system.

"Together, we have established a substantial level of support for the needy people of our community -- support that ranks with the nation's best.

"Together, we have provided an improved measure of opportunity for all of our people.

"Together, we have made progress in finding the best ways to use our precious land.

"And together, over the past few years, we have worked together to improve our criminal justice system...

...to support the development of alternate energy technologies...

...to help Hawaii become an international center of research in astronomy, ocean science, tropical agriculture, aquaculture, human services, and many other areas of study...

...to support an intelligent diversification of our economy, whose growth has provided nearly 90,000 new jobs since 1973 for our citizens...

...and to maintain a sound fiscal program that provides a reliable level of government services.

"Having achieved this level of

government, we must now work to maintain it. Even though we are moving into a time of falling revenues and fiscal austerity, I want you to know that I am dedicated to the continuity of these achievements. We must preserve them, for they are the very essence of our progress.

"We must strengthen our state health system's ability to provide essential services to our community in the areas of care and prevention. We must improve our school system and our University, searching for both efficiency of operation and academic excellence.

"We must continue to evaluate our human services programs, so that we get the most out of them for our needy citizens. This is a time of truly painful cutbacks in the aid that they've been getting over several years from the federal government.

"We must persevere in the development of alternate energy sources -- ocean, geothermal, solar, wind and biomass. And, in this area, we have become a model for our nation and for the world.

"Let us not be misled by the fact that oil prices are coming down today. In the past decade, they have gone from \$3.60 a barrel to as high as \$40 a barrel, and they are now down to \$32 a barrel. This recent decline in price is good for all consumers, but it could be a short-lived benefit.

"We cannot depend on prices continuing to fall, even though Alaskan and Mexican crude oils are now part of the world supply, and even though China is planning to come on stream. The price of oil remains as volatile and as unpredictable as ever. It depends on too many factors that are beyond our control.

"So let us continue to cultivate our own energy garden. In the long run, no matter what happens, the fossil fuels of the earth are going to run out -- and they may run out sooner than we think. For the population of the earth is going to increase from 4.2 billion people today to over 6 billion by the turn of the century. It will become increasingly important that we turn to the renewable resources available to us.

"The State of Hawaii is in a position of natural leadership here. The fact is that we have an obligation

to continue -- an obligation to ourselves, and to millions of people who live thousands of miles from our islands. Today, we can make the transition from successful experimental and demonstration technologies to successful commercial technologies that can go right 'on line.' Let us keep going.

"The larger fact is that we have got to energize our economic base across the whole spectrum of economic activity.

"Though we cannot control the final developments, we are committed to stand firmly behind those historic island enterprises, pineapple and sugar. These enterprises have experienced shattering difficulties in recent years, yet they continue to add significantly to the Gross State Product.

"Our largest industry, the visitor industry, is of great importance to Hawaii both now and for the future. We must be sure to provide whatever support is necessary to keep that industry as an asset to our community.

"We must also enhance the opportunities for made-in-Hawaii products in both the manufacturing and food industries.

"We must facilitate the growth of film and TV industries.

"And we must continue to diversify our agricultural industry. Ten years ago, diversified agriculture was not the major industry it is today. The public and private sectors -- through hard work and imagination -- have created a major export industry out of papaya and guava and macadamia nuts, flowers and plants and foliages! Diversified agriculture is not a small industry anymore. The 1981 gross income from diversified agriculture, which also includes dairies and livestock, was \$192 million -- almost as much as pineapple brought in 1981!

"Let me focus for a moment on aquaculture -- another unique industry that we have brought into being. Aquaculture is growing, but not growing as rapidly as it can. In fact, some aquaculture operations have stopped because of inadequate management practices, lack of well-trained workers and in some instances, poor financing.

"How can the state help? I believe

that it's time for a more comprehensive approach, a more business-oriented approach. If we can develop a systems-oriented management organization, an organization that can take into account the many diverse factors involved in this new and unfamiliar industry -- the economic, technical, financial, social, educational and political considerations -- then we will be on the right track. To handle this assignment, I will shortly appoint an ad hoc Aquaculture Industry Development Committee. Their agenda will be to come up with an Industry Development Plan that uses a systems approach. When that plan becomes a reality, and its recommendations implemented, then aquaculture will have a better chance to survive and grow, for the Plan will coordinate the activities of all Hawaiian resources in this complex field -- from basic research all the way to 'hands on' growing and marketing.

"Yes...we must persevere in 1983. And we must also make some plans that look realistically at our state's income and at our state tax policies. In both of these important areas, today is a good time for a clear re-assessment.

"In this period of economic trouble, we have been a lot more fortunate than other states. All across the nation, states have been increasing taxes, cutting services, and curtailing vital programs. Though Hawaii's position is basically stable, though our unemployment rate has fallen to 7%, there are some dangers ahead to which I must alert you.

"In the past 6 months, there has been a drastic downturn in the growth of our state government revenues. While we had anticipated an increase in our revenues this fiscal year of 17.6%, it is now predicted, 7 months into the current year, that the increase in revenues will be only 8.2%. We have known for many years, though, that state government revenues can fluctuate, and in the good years we have been careful not to spend everything that has come in. We have sometimes been criticized for not spending our surpluses, but we have carried over those surpluses for just this type of situation, and the money we have carried over is serving us well now.

"I would like us to respond by tightening our belts, by holding the line on taxes, by restricting our spending whenever we can.

But at the same time, I do not want Hawaii to stand still. If we spend and plan with good common sense, there will be no emergency, and there will be no state deficit -- and we shall remain one of the few states in the union in a strong fiscal position.

"While tough times may lie ahead, let us not retreat. Let us accept this challenge with good will. Let us use the adversity to bring out the best in all of us. Let us pass through this challenging period in a constructive way -- and so create a better future. If we work together now we can begin to solve these problems even before they are upon us!

"Since our system of imposing state taxes has become increasingly complex and controversial, I am recommending the establishment of a Tax Review Commission. You remember that two years ago, a group came together to study the tax situation, but money to continue their work was voted down by the Legislature before there were any conclusions that could be put into action.

"The last time there was a comprehensive tax review was in 1965, and the piecemeal patchwork developed as our tax program since then is in need of a thorough reassessment.

"One of the most important things the new commission will be asked to study is the efficiency and the equity of the tax and financing relationship between the state and the counties. The commission may find that it is time to reallocate where tax money comes from, where it goes, and exactly how it is spent in terms of services provided. The commission may look at the tax burden caused by property taxes relative to the burdens caused by other types of taxes, such as income tax and the excise tax. It should also consider whether the tax structure creates disincentives in some of our activities, and whether that structure makes us less competitive than we should be in the world marketplace.

"It is important that the results of the Tax Review Commission's work be given wide publicity, because the fair imposition of taxes and the resolute collection

of them are at the heart of a good democracy. And when this situation prevails, a people stand willingly behind their government -- even in bad times.

"Let me talk for a moment about another important reassessment that we must now make. The problem can be seen simply by asking a few questions.

"Does the State of Hawaii regulate business to the extent that businesses here find it hard to compete in the national or world economy because of that regulation?

"Are we somehow penalizing people in the private sector?

"Are we doing everything we can to help Hawaii develop new industries to provide economic growth in the future?

"If there are disincentives to doing business here, can we reduce them or find some incentives to offset them?

"The reassessment we must make deals with our attitude towards business in Hawaii. I have my own answers to those questions, but it is part of my job to ask others to think about those questions as well, and to share with the people of our state some of the thoughts and ideas that come from that consideration.

"To help that consideration take place, I will be forming two groups of people from business, labor and the public sector.

"The first group will be asked to identify various alternatives for the development of our state's economy over the near and more distant future. They will be asked to put together a realistic list of economic activities that we can pursue to help Hawaii to meet the economic challenges we will face in the future.

"The second group that I will be putting together will be asked to deal with a related, but somewhat more complex issue. I will ask this group to address the question of, 'Are we an anti-business state, as some have contended? If so, what do we do to change that?' They will need to look at many different areas such as labor laws and the possibility of streamlining or centralizing our permit systems; our tax laws and government rules and regulations.

They will be asked, if it seems necessary, to offer suggestions for legislation or changes in the policies of government and private enterprise.

"One thing I want to assure you about -- and I think many people already know it -- I am heartily in favor of a healthy, vibrant business community. As the head of a branch of the public sector of this state, I have never forgotten that the money for public change and development is basically generated by the private sector -- the business sector -- and comes to the state in the form of taxes on private enterprise. I understand that, and I think my record justifies that.

"But I also believe that government and business and labor, though they are usually portrayed as antagonistic, actually have a lot in common. Government and business and labor, for example, are searching for 'the best Hawaii' -- for only in the best Hawaii can they be at their best.

"And if you look at the citizens who get up in the morning to go to work and to buy food and clothes and pay off the mortgage, their aims are remarkably similar no matter where they work. Consider this:

"In government as in the private sector, we need a high level of directed energy.

"In government as in the private sector, we must make realistic plans for the future. Plans that stand a chance of working.

"In government as in the private sector, an important part of our task is persuading people that we are on a workable path.

"In government as in the private sector, we must be willing to persist.

"The problems cannot be solved overnight. They cannot even be identified overnight!

"And from this theme grows another idea: regardless of where we work or what our political beliefs are, we are all citizens before we are anything else.

"Like it or not, we have emerged into the modern world. Today our state possesses those two sure symbols of the modern world -- a great international airport... and great traffic jams!

"And today, we find that Waikiki and other parts of our city of Honolulu have been greatly developed, with densities and heights unthought of a generation ago.

"There are some aspects of that earlier and gentler Hawaii that we do miss, but I believe that, by and large, most of us would agree that the changes in Hawaii in the years since World War II have been substantial and desirable.

"The changes will continue, and we must manage them sensibly -- but there is one thing that I hope won't change. I touched on it in my Inaugural Address a few weeks ago.

"I hope that in the matter of how we treat each other, we can keep to the old Hawaiian ways. The flame of the Aloha Spirit sometimes flickers and grows dim, but it has never died. But we must remember that only we can keep it alive.

"The prominent social scientist, Daniel Yankelovitch, published a book not long ago on what he calls, 'the new rules in American life.' One of his findings is that after nearly two decades of a self-centered search for self-fulfillment, people are now returning to the idea of making a commitment. A commitment to another person, to a community, or simply to a set of values.

"Well, that's nothing new to us here in Hawaii. From the very beginning, although we have been a diverse people, we have had a commitment to being 'one people,' and we have had considerable success. For the values of this society here in these islands are unique and rich.

"Those values are a blend of a sense of compassion, of 'live and let live,' with the more active sense of search and adaptation that has been brought here by thousands of individuals over the years. The blend is as good a basis for a civilization as any that I know. Please... let us resolve to hold fast to that old spirit. It is one of the most precious things that we possess.

"I see at this time a chance for the people of the coming generation -- your sons and daughters and mine -- to make a real difference

in the unfolding events of the next 20 years, just as the people of our generation have done in the past 2 decades.

"The young people today will not be seeking, as we did, to cope with the trauma of a World War, nor will they have to outgrow the limitations of a 19th century plantation society. But they are faced with the task of finding economic success and fulfillment in a fast-moving, complex world. And they are faced with the challenge of meeting the rising expectations of people everywhere. I contend that a touch of the Aloha Spirit will help to see them through.

"Let us now swing the searchlight around for a look at the future. I wish to talk about our potential leadership in the New Pacific, and then I want to be specific -- about two programs that can help point us toward that leadership, not in the dim, distant future, but just as soon as we turn our minds to them and get them going.

"The economic and cultural development of our world has shifted from the Atlantic Basin to the Pacific Basin. This is a theme that you will continue to hear from me while I am Governor -- and perhaps even beyond! I regard it as the major economic and social development in our lives today, and, I am anxious that we take full advantage of it.

"Being here, the only American state in the midst of the Pacific, the only state entirely surrounded by the water that makes up 71% of our planet, we must realize that Hawaii has the chance and the need to lead in this great oceanic development.

"In the years ahead, we can use our financial base, our educational base, our information base, our research and technical facilities, our market opportunities, and especially our understanding of the various cultures, to take the lead in dealings with the Pacific Ocean area. We have much to offer the people of the Pacific. And, they, in turn and in many ways, can enrich our lives.

"We are doing important, useful things in the Pacific Basin today. We have been able to help other Pacific Islanders by providing technical assistance in forestry and personnel

management matters, by providing assistance in health services and medical training, by training airport firefighters, by sharing some of our knowledge about aquaculture, alternate energy, and tropical agriculture, by helping with the development of bi-lingual education programs, and by offering opportunities for education at the vocational and university levels. We are also active participants in the Pacific Basin Development Council. This task, though, of playing a role in the New Pacific is as much a task for the people as it is for state government. You must see the opportunities. You must grasp them. You must act. But everything flows out of your being informed. Expanding our knowledge about the lands and people of the Pacific region will surely help us to begin thinking in constructive directions.

"It should also be noted that there are some individuals in Honolulu this very morning meeting at the East-West Center, who are living symbols of this idea of 'The New Pacific' in their own countries. They have come as leaders in the East-West Center's Pacific Island Conference, which promotes useful regional cooperation among the various Pacific Islands. Among those present are Prime Minister Ratu Sir Kamisese Mara of Fiji, Governor Peter Coleman of American Samoa, Prime Minister Michael Somare of Papua-New Guinea, and Premier Sir Thomas Davis of the Cook Islands. Just last week, the East-West Center Board of Governors met here to discuss the progress of the East-West Center in moving towards a greater role in the educational growth in our Pacific region.

"Our state was host, also, to the Pacific Islands Area Seminar, where wide-ranging Pacific issues were discussed.

"And, also, last week, many important people from the Pacific attended the Pacific Telecommunications Conference here in Honolulu.

"We are at present developing a new program that fits handsomely into the idea of the 'New Pacific,' and I will be sending its legislative proposal to you in the near future. This is the background:

"Our world today is undergoing a revolution in electronic technology. Satellites for global communication... microelectronics for computers...robotics

for industrial and ocean resources development... fiber optics and lasers for a multitude of uses in medicine and in industry... these and other marvels are here right now.

"Hawaii is perfectly situated and completely capable of leadership in high-technology research, development, and commercialization.

"Many of our people have been educated and trained for competence in science.

"The East-West Center and the University of Hawaii -- with their various schools and research organizations -- are both ready to play an important part.

"Leadership in high-tech can also be provided by our government and private sector agencies, by established companies, and by our many international outreach projects.

"Our special opportunity is to become the high-technology catalyst for the new Pacific! Nations with the most advanced state-of-the-art technologies can come here, pool their knowledge and skills, and achieve their scientific and industrial goals. And right now, our people stand ready to help. The participating countries would benefit from our ideal location and infrastructure -- and we would benefit in many ways by having these activities in our islands.

"It is for these reasons that I will propose this year the establishment of a High Technology Development Corporation.

"I should also note that I have been communicating with the Japanese government about assisting Hawaii in the development of an institute for high technology research and development. I am aggressively pursuing this and I will keep you informed about this progress.

"Our High Technology Development Corporation would have several jobs to do:

"It would be responsible for identifying available lands and for developing the financing, and the design of industrial park areas devoted entirely to high technology.

"It would be able to issue revenue bonds to raise funds.

"It would be able to plan for a spectrum of activity in the parks, including manufacturing and sales and teaching and research.

"It would carry through to commercialization what has been developed through research.

"It would work in harmony with independent, but related efforts in our Counties.

"It would support public and private goals of increasing revenues, job opportunities, and profits.

"The High Technology Development Corporation would be similar in structure and action to our Aloha Tower Development Corporation, which is already proving its merit. And it would also be similar to the 'Silicon Valley' idea which has been so successful in the San Francisco area and in the Boston area. But our 'Silicon Valley' would also be linked to the activities of our highly successful Foreign Trade Zone, and this should be an additional incentive to locate here.

"I regard this as a clear-cut opportunity for all of us, and I hope you will look favorably upon this legislation when it reaches you.

"The second proposal that deals with our role in the New Pacific relates to our ability to overcome barriers created by our island geography and the distance from other areas that accompanies that geography. Specifically, I refer to the improvement of our ability to move our goods in and out of Hawaii by air.

"The marketing process for goods manufactured or grown in Hawaii is hampered today by the fact that there is not enough cargo space on the planes that travel to and from Hawaii that is reliable, frequently available, and not subject to interruptions in service.

"I ask that the Legislature consider the question of whether the state government can usefully step in to better organize, first, the transport of our products -- either through contract arrangements with airlines, or, if necessary and more cost-productive, by the state purchasing or leasing planes to move these products -- and second, the storage of these products at the other end.

"Let me add quickly that we do

not envision cutting into the business of profitability of today's operating airlines in any way. It may be that we can solve this problem through working directly with them -- even though their emphasis has always been, and appropriately, the carrying of passengers rather than freight. We are simply looking for some innovative ways to meet the needs of our community.

"There is a third item that I will mention only briefly, since it is really not far enough along at this point to discuss in detail.

"It is a system now being studied and structured in which private citizens, using private vehicles and a micro-computer program, would schedule and provide public transportation -- in other words, individualized mass transit that could supplement our existing mass transit systems or other future systems.

"A willingness of the people to cooperate is at the heart of a proposal like this. And of course, there are very complex insurance and liability problems that need to be solved. At this point, it is appropriate for the Administration and the Legislature to look at this proposal with a candid, open mind, to receive public input, to study, debate and thereafter, to make whatever decision is deemed appropriate.

"And finally, though they have been much discussed in the past, let me remind you that the State Functional Plans -- all 12 of them -- are still to be legislated in the near future. And the near future, I hope!

"It has never been my style to spend time twisting arms to get something done. I believe that if you propose something, you must be patient. You must wait until your colleagues see some value in it -- or reject it. Well, we have passed the underlying legislation, but we have not faced up to the difficulties of passing the Functional Plans. And I know that that is a much more difficult task, but if we really believe what we are saying about the State Plans, then I urge you to pass them. They will enable us to look ahead intelligently, and to plan properly. Then, we will find it easier to deal with every single item that has been

discussed here this morning.

"The future can best be stated, I think, as an endless series of questions, for that is what the future is.

"But we are not helpless in the face of the future. We can address the questions because we know about the past.

"We can address them realistically, yet with a sense of imagination.

"We can address them factually, yet with a sense of intuition.

"And we must address them with zest, and not with anxiety or despair. For we are one state in a nation that is the world's greatest monument to change. A democratic government is always walking the fine line between what can be imagined and what is possible. And if human imagination does not stay out there in the lead, we will get nowhere.

"Carl Sandburg once wrote:

'What you must have first is the dream that you can do it. And then...you must begin.'

"So let us approach the year ahead with a sense of hope. The statistics point toward an economic recovery, though it may be a slow one. We can take heart from the statistics, but let us take heart too from Sandburg's idea of a dream of a better future.

"This is, as you know, the beginning of my last term as Governor. And I want to conclude these remarks with a pledge to the Legislature and to all the people of Hawaii that this is not going to be a caretaker administration, or a lame-duck administration, or an administration that has run out of steam. On the contrary, I am even now quite conscious of the amount of time left -- and I shall be working hard, together with you all, against the deadline to get as much accomplished as I can. As I observed in the Inaugural Address, right down to the last day, I shall be trying my best to be a good governor.

"Though four years may seem to be a long time to some, to me, it is only a matter of 1,461 days. At the end of that time, I want you to know that though I will no longer be your Governor, I shall continue to search with you for the 'best Hawaii.'

"Like 'the more perfect Union' mentioned

in the Constitution, it is difficult to define 'the best Hawaii,' and even more difficult to achieve it. But it is not hard at all to sense whether we are moving toward it as a goal -- or away from it. It is my hope, and belief, that we are moving toward it.

"Mahalo and Aloha."

Senate President Richard Wong then rose and stated:

"Thank you very much Governor for sharing with us your dreams and aspirations for the 'best Hawaii'. Perhaps in the ensuing days we will look forward to specific legislation to carry out these dreams and aspirations.

"I think also at this time it is apropos, Governor, to announce the birth of a baby girl to Senator Hagino and his beautiful wife Cindy, because after all, she will be the benefactor for the things we do today.

"Again Governor, thank you very much for your words of wisdom. If there be no objections by the members of the Joint Session of the Legislature, I hereby declare the session adjourned."

At 11:15 o'clock a.m., the joint session with the Senate adjourned and the House stood in recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 11:43 o'clock a.m.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

The following resolution (H.R. No. 72) was read by the Clerk and disposed of as follows:

A resolution (H.R. No. 72) relating to the Rules of the House of Representatives of the Twelfth Legislature was jointly offered by Representatives Blair, Rohlfling and Kihano.

Representative Blair moved that the resolution be adopted, seconded by Representative Kihano.

Representative Ikeda rose to speak for the measure with reservations stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I note that on page 11 of the attachment that the House proposes to amend Rule 33.1 regarding bills passing third reading. By deleting the language, the 48 hour period shall commence with the placement of a printed copy of a bill in the form to be passed on the desk of each member.

"Mr. Speaker, I realize that the rule is in compliance with the Constitution of our State that the bills will

be made available to the members of the House for at least 48 hours. I feel, Mr. Speaker, that this deletion, which specifically states when the 48 hours begin is most important and I would like to remind this body that, by reading a portion of the Committee Report of the Constitutional Convention on this particular subject that the reason the required time was lengthened from 24 hours to 48 hours, according to the report, was because your Committee believed that enlargement of time from 24 hours to 48 hours during which a Legislator or a constituent could review a bill before Third or Final Reading would help both Legislator and constituent to avoid hasty decisions and surprises regarding the bill.

"In bringing this to this body's attention, Mr. Speaker, I hope that as we get down to the more hectic days ahead of us, that expediency in terms of moving things on here, does not take precedence over the public's right to know, which I feel is the basic reason why this Constitutional Convention made this particular amendment. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Marumoto rose to speak in favor of the measure with reservations stating:

"Mr. Speaker, although I will vote in favor of the amendments to the Rules of the House, I rise to voice my reservations concerning the amendment to the rule dealing with the 48 hour availability of all bills before they pass Third and Final Reading.

"Although the amendment before us embodies the wording of our State Constitution - 'No bill shall pass third or final reading in either house unless printed copies of the bill in the form to be passed shall have been made available to the members of that house for at least 48 hours'. I feel that the more precise language of our former House Rule 33.1, which stated, ' . . . the 48 hour period for a bill shall commence at the time printed copies of the bill in the form to be passed are placed upon the desk of each member of the House. . . .' ensures that the public and all of us in this chamber will know exactly what we are voting on.

"As you well know, in the recent

past, the Senate chose to interpret the word 'available' to mean when a bill is presented to the Clerk's office. Should this House incorporate the Senate's practices and the Senate's definition of availability, it will be a step backwards for sunshine. When will we know that a bill is in the Clerk's possession? Do we rely on a phone call from the Clerk's office? Do we wait for the House Journal to be printed? How accurate will the clocking be? At least when a bill is placed on our desks, there is a specific time frame that can be associated with its becoming available. It is in place for all to see.

"In the rush and fatigue that accompany the closing days of the Legislature, and though I trust our Clerk and Clerk's office implicitly, the chance for human error, or perhaps that opportunity to hide human error, it may be simple or expeditious to change the hour of availability by a stroke of the pen to meet the 48 hour or some other internal deadline.

"In order to fulfill our role as responsible elected public officials, we need to have the freedom to study a bill, some are over an inch thick, for 48 hours with the guarantee that we can do so in the setting of our choosing - our office, our home, with advisors, experts, with constituents or other interested parties. It should not be a rushed procedure. We should not be rushed, harried, or pressured to quickly review a bill in the Clerk's office because five other people are waiting to review it.

"I do not believe that many people out there, the public, really care whether a bill is a 'Senate Bill' or a 'House Bill'. They only care that the laws we pass are good and fair laws. For the life of me, I cannot think of any major piece of legislation that suffered because the vehicle for it did not come from the House first. This petty game of one-ups-manship is unnecessary homage to an anachronism of an earlier day of legislative form.

"Most of us ran on a platform of accessibility, openness, and a desire to make this mysterious legislative process less so. Many of you who are here for the first time, perhaps realize this the most, since you still see yourselves as grassroots. Mr. Speaker, two wrongs do not make a right.

"Let our work be made available

for all in a fair and reasonable way. Let us remember not to sacrifice the public interest, the public's right to know, and our responsibility to carefully study legislation which will affect every life in this State for expeditiousness and political gamesmanship. Thank you."

Representative Blair rose to speak in favor of the measure stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I think all of th members of this body probably agree with the statements that were made by the members from across the aisle. However, as we've noted in those speeches, the protection that was afforded in the Rules of the Senate proved not to be sufficient last year. History has, therefore, demonstrated that the way to address the problem is through a constitutional amendment to clarify Article III, Section 15, I believe it is, to specify within the Constitution when a matter become available.

"It is quite frankly too loose in the Constitution and we hope that we can have legislation in this session to correct that. I think that's the proper way to do it, and I'm happy to see that it will be a bi-partisan effort. Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 72 was adopted.

THIRD READING

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 2 had passed Third Reading at 11:45 o'clock a.m.

H.B. No. 3, HD 1:

Representative Kiyabu moved that H.B. No. 3, HD 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kawakami.

Representative Kiyabu then rose to speak in favor of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of House Bill 3, House Draft 1.

As you well remember, Mr. Speaker, several years ago, we passed legislation setting up the first Tax Review Commission. But time and funds ran out without the Commission being able to complete its work. As an extension of time and additional funds were not forthcoming from the Legislature, the Commission members resigned in mid-1981. This bill will enable the Governor to appoint a replacement commission to continue the work that was started nearly three years ago.

The job of the Tax Review Commission

is to evaluate the State tax structure and recommend revenue and tax policies to the Legislature. Under this bill, the Commission must report to the Legislature prior to the 1985 session.

Mr. Speaker, in the Finance Committee hearing, there was a lot of discussion about the scope of the Tax Review Commission's work -- whether the Commission should concentrate on one or two taxes or be as comprehensive as possible; whether the study should include real property taxes; whether the statute should spell out the scope of the Commission's work. Your Committee decided that the law should remain flexible, but that the Commission should have some guidelines from the Legislature. We've expressed these guidelines in the Committee report.

We anticipate that the scope of the Commission's work will largely be focused on the income tax and the general excise tax. There are two reasons for this: One, these are the taxes that affect just about every person here in this State; and two, that these taxes generate about 85 percent of our general fund revenues. But in the Committee report, we ask the Tax Review Commission to not limit itself to these two areas. The Commission should address other taxes and other areas of concern. The study should be as comprehensive as possible, given the constraints of time and money. Even the real property tax, which the counties have control over, should be considered in conjunction with other taxes. I think these guidelines will point out to the Commission what the Legislature expects by way of this study, but at the same time, the Commission won't be hamstrung by too many restrictions.

Another thing this bill does is to allow for the immediate appointment of the Commission. And upon appointment, the Commission will immediately be able to begin its work. This, we feel, is important in order to give the Commission as much time as possible to do its work. Along this line, Mr. Speaker, I would strongly urge the Senate to move with all due speed in passing this bill after this House has done so. And upon enactment of this bill, I urge the Governor to move quickly in making the appointments.

Mr. Speaker, the time is ripe for a thorough assessment of Hawaii's tax structure. I urge my colleagues to vote aye on this bill.

Thank you."

Representative Rohlfing then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I don't think any of the members who were here in the past several sessions will be surprised that I have a few words to say on this subject. . .that's all history. I am speaking in favor of the bill with reservations.

In the past, there has been, I think, a very clear question of whether the Legislature has, in effect, abdicated its responsibilities for the development of tax policy. We have piecemealed on various pieces of legislation and acted in an ad hoc manner, sometimes wisely and sometimes possibly not so wisely.

In voting for this measure, I have to say that I have finally come around to full circle to the realization that the Legislature isn't going to do anything on an in-depth manner until it gets somebody from outside to tell us what to do. And the matter is so critical in that we have to take a good look for the future -- the kinds of problems that we have now to financing this State, that there no longer can be any delay. Already, with the fact that if this Commission becomes funded, and in place, pursuant to this bill, we still have two more years before we get a full report and that, too, may well be long past the time that we should have taken action. There may be alternative means. We can move in the interim before this report comes in to consider some of the things that must be done in the long run and not depend solely upon the report.

There have been many studies conducted by consultants. All you have to do is look at the ferry boat reports, the inter-island steamship reports, to see what happens when the Legislature gets a report that it doesn't agree with. They sit in the files and gather dust. So, let us hope that is not the case with respect to the Tax Commission's report.

And so, Mr. Speaker, I am voting for this measure because I see it as the only way we are going to be able to establish policy.

Thank you."

Representative Ikeda then rose and requested that her remarks, in favor of the bill, be inserted into the Journal and the Chair, noting that there were no objections, "so ordered."

Representative Ikeda's remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of House Bill 3, House Draft 1, with reservations.

Mr. Speaker, there is no doubt in my mind that a comprehensive review of our State's taxation system is long overdue. That is why I supported similar legislation two years ago. (1981)

However, there are several things that bother me about this bill.

First of all, we are appropriating \$400,000 for the Commission's use without providing the Commission with any parameters or guidelines for what we expect from them. We are instead leaving it up to their 'informed judgment.'

Yet, Mr. Speaker, as the former chairman of the Tax Review Commission said upon resigning, and I quote, 'We are laymen -- we are not trained to conduct tax research. All of our "I thinks" would not amount to anything. We needed something more reliable than our own opinions. We wanted to have some support behind what we were going to recommend.' (Honolulu Advertiser, 7/1/81)

It is no secret that the former Tax Review Commission planned to hire a professional consultant to do a thorough review of our tax system and I guess that much of this proposed appropriation is intended for that same purpose. Mr. Speaker, the members of the former Commission were astute citizens and I doubt that a new panel will be able to do much more than the former panel was able to without a consultant.

Given the reluctance of the Senate to go along with the funding for this purpose in the past, I feel that, at this point in time, it would be more prudent and perhaps less expensive and certainly less time consuming to have the Legislative

Auditor conduct a complete review of our State's taxation system. I have introduced legislation to do just that. If, after the Auditor completes his task we still feel that we should have it reviewed by a Commission (perhaps to meet constitutional requirements), we could then turn the report over to one. In this way, we could save the taxpayers some money since staffing and headquarters for a commission wouldn't be needed. In fact, Mr. Speaker, I'm still wondering how our initial \$40,000 appropriation was spent and what, if anything, did we get for it. I don't need to remind anyone here that early predictions of diminished revenues and an impending budget deficit will make this session extremely difficult. We must be certain that funds appropriated are spent wisely and that the programs we support are justified. We have a responsibility to learn from past experiences before we end up compounding mistakes.

Fortunately, Mr. Speaker, there is still time to either act on alternatives or to make some necessary changes in this bill before it becomes law. For these reasons, I will still vote in favor of this measure.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 3, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE TAX REVIEW COMMISSION", having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 48 ayes, with Representatives Levin, Takamine and Wong being excused.

Mr. Speaker, in a speech by our late Governor John Burns, Thursday, April 11, 1974, he is quoted as saying: 'Indeed, we are one people. We are one people, we are one State. Therein lies the secret to our success.'
