"Mr. Speaker, I would like to take advantage of this opportunity to indicate to this body - first of all, I think that it's no secret that the Office of Hawaiian Affairs has had some tough sledding in the House for many reasons, but my purpose today is not to launch out on a history lesson.

"As we are aware, OHA has been surrounded by many problems that have been based in the incumbencies placed on their ability to spend those monies which they received as their 20 per cent pro rata share of the 5-F public land trust.

"Resolutions like this which mandate the Office of Hawaiian Affairs to work more closely with State departments on existing programs that service Hawaiians, native Hawaiians as well as the general public, provide a tremendous opportunity for the Office of Hawaiian Affairs

and other State departments to develop close working relationships. And although I don't think that the intent of this resolution was initially to have exploration to take place in the possibility of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs of actually coming forth with some supplemental funding out of the public land trust, it is certainly a great possibility that I personally would like to see pursued and a possiblity which I have indicated to the trustees of the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. And for that reason I support this resolution and I encourage this House to perhaps develop more resolutions along these lines encourag ing the Office of Hawaiian Affairs and our State departments to work more closely together for the betterment of not only the Hawaiian people, but also for the people of the State of Hawaii. Mahalo."

# INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

A resolution (H.R. No. 392) commending and recognizing the Society of Afghan doctors and health personnel outside of Afghanistan, and its official representative in Hawaii, Mohammad Ghafar Osmanzai, for humanitarian efforts in seeking support for the relief of fellow Afghan refugees was jointly offered by Representatives Jones, Andrews, Apo, Dang, Hagino, Hee, Ikeda, Isbell, Leong, Medeiros, Menor, Morgado, Okamura, Rohlfing and Say.

Representative Jones then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, House Resolution 392 which we just passed refers to commending and recognizing the Society of Afghan doctors and health personnel outside of Afghanistan, and its official representative in Hawaii, Mohammad Chafar Osmanzai, for humanitarian efforts in seeking support for the relief of fellow Afghan refugees.

About three years ago, as I was freezing to death, looking out over the Khyber Pass and seeing the refugees coming up the Pass, my heart was touched very much as I remembered my own evacuation of my family under the leftist bombs and bullets of the Syrians, trying to get my family out of Lebanon, and the fear that I had in making sure my family stayed alive. Around the world right now, not only in Lebanon and the Middle East and Afghanistan, there is a great battle going on for the freedom of men and women.

As I went to visit the camps there and saw the poverty, I was touched in an even deeper way as many people there sleep when it gets down to below zero at night, and all they have is

a little cardboard and stay in these refugees' camps. And to see the cream of the crop of Afghanistan living in these camps, many of whom speak four or five languages, having been educated many years beyond most of ourselves, it was quite a humbling experience. To see the courage of these people really touched me in a very deep way.

Most of us here in our great island are not aware of the fact that almost 900,000 Afghan people have been killed, many of them by chemicals, by bombings, many other ways that the Russians are using to exterminate the will and the freedom of these great freedom-loving people. And I found out the existence of this organization here in the islands and I became very interested because I know, for my wife and I, we want to be involved in ensuring that support does get through to the refugees -- humanitarian support especially.

For this resolution here, I am very glad and thank you for passing it today. We have, here in Hawaii, the Society of Afghan doctors and health personnel outside of Afghanistan, an international organization raised up to provide humanitarian aid to the Afghan refugees living right now in the northwest frontier provinces of Pakistan."

Representative Jones then introduced Mohammad Ghafar Osmanzai and members of his family, together with some refugees "who have made it all the way to our islands."

Wednesday, March 23, 1983

The House of Representatives of the Twelfth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1983, convened at 11:30 o'clock a.m., with the Speaker presiding.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Reverend Kenjo Urakami representing Jodo Mission of Hawaii, after which the Roll was called showing all members present.

The Clerk proceeded to read the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Thirty-Fifth Day.

## UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Stand. Com. Rep. No. 615 on H.C.R. No. 2, HD1:

Representative Andrews moved that the report of the Committee be adopted and H.C.R. No. 2, HD1 be adopted, seconded by Representative Hagino.

Representative Rohlfing rose to speak against the resolution stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in opposition to the adoption of the resolution

before us and the functional plans represented thereby, and with your permission, I would like to make some general remarks with respect to the functional plans as a whole that are coming up this morning on the entire agenda and have those apply, rather than to be specifically directed to the education plan itself."

The Chair replied:

"Please proceed."

Representative Rohlfing continued:

"Mr. Speaker, I have given the measures before us some thought since yesterday and I must admit, yesterday, feeling that really is it worth getting up and talking about this here today or is it important. And thinking about it overnight and also talking to several of my colleagues, I have the feeling that it is important . . . that we at least address some of the thoughts that we have about these plans.

"I think, Mr. Speaker, in prior sessions, our views have been stated and our reluctance in some cases to adopt these plans in their entirety has been stated on the floor to some extent, and I don't want to repeat that. I want to go on to more general comments.

"Mr. Speaker, it's hard to pick up any one of these plans and say you disagree with what is in there. Certainly you can look at the first two, three pages of these plans and agree with the objectives. For example, in the agriculture plan, we're seeking to preserve the sugar and pineapple; we're seeking to diversify our agriculture. Well, I certainly don't want to stand here and argue that we don't want to do those things. But in spelling out in detail in these plans, you run across just maybe even in a random page that you pull out and read a particular policy or program that might be implemented, and you see titles of agencies that are supposed to be working on this, and frankly I don't know sometimes, what even those initials mean when I look at the plan. Now I can find out, yes. I can research what it is, or I can call a state agriculture department and maybe find out.

"But the point that I'm getting at is that I think that what we're doing here today is adopting 'holusbolus', so to speak, as the lawyers often say ... the whole thing on a carte blanche basis. It puts us on record as the Legislature in supporting all things that are in these plans. And I think that come the next session, we're going to have testimony on various programs, on budget items and so forth, where somebody's going to come in and say, 'well, it's in the plans. You adopted it, you're stuck with it'. And we'll say, 'Gee, well we really didn't think so, and I don't remember that, and where did it say that?', and so forth.

"I wonder whether it's good legislative policy to adopt these plans in the detail that they are set forth. Frankly, I do not know what is in every plan. And I've been here a couple of years, and before that dealing with subject matter of public concern. I wonder about the freshmen members of this body. How much do you know about the plans and what they provide for this time, to adopt them, to vote for them, to place them in effect in a form of quasi-law, if nothing else.

"True, we've been told that they're guidelines. They are not immutable. They can be changed. Yet, by taking this action in adopting the plans, we put the stamp of legislative approval on everything that's in here as of now. And I wonder too, whether or not we are not being, when you look at the plans themselves, in the manner in which they are expressed, that we are not attempting, sort of as the inside power structure, to place the people who are not in the power structure, who are out there, in the position of having to overcome something that we are doing here, should they want to change those policies that are being adopted. And I say, maybe not adopted with our eyes wide open.

"I think that these plans certainly could be used be the administration in policing the executive agencies of the government, in seeing that the tasks are carried out, overseeing throughout the flexibility of leadership by the Governor and his department heads. But to again, place this with a legislative stamp, I think raises grave problems."

Representative Say interrupted on a point of clarification stating:

"Before this body here, we don't have the bill or Act 100 which has created the State Plan. What we have here this morning is the house concurrent resolution addressing each individual functional plan and the speech that is being given by the minority leader does not reflect the functional plans of these particular areas. Right now we are on the higher education functional plan and I hope that he would address his comments to the higher education functional plan."

The Chair answered:

"Representative Say, the Chair has ruled by way of allowing Representative Rohlfing to have a broader view on the functional plans as opposed to taking up each functional plan as they arise by way of the calendar to expedite things on this floor this morning. Please proceed, Representative Rohlfing."

Representative Rohlfing continued:

"Mr. Speaker, I do not intend to belabor the subject. I think my points are clear and I did not want to get into individual plans as to take the time of this body.

"My last comment, Mr. Speaker, would be this, that the plans can be useful for the administration. They could be adopted by the Governor as he did last year after they did not pass the Legislature and be useful for his purposes. But to adopt them as legislative policy, in my judgement, is not sound. And for that reason, Mr. Speaker, I will cast a negative vote on all of the functional plans this morning."

Representative Andrews rose to speak for the measure stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I did not intend to speak today, but butterflies catch up with me here rather quickly - but, in light of what our minority leader has said, I feel that it is important that I respond.

"First of all, my role or the role of my committee here has been one of coordination. Coordinating the various committees that involve plans - the Higher Education Committee, the Transportation Committee, etc. - and I commend those chairmen for the very good job and the hard work that they've put in. I'm proceeding slowly to let the butterflies run away.

"In that process of coordination, I think we begin to see better

what we're really doing here - what we're doing with the functional plan and the Hawaii State Plan process. We realize that in this state, and the way that we proceeded in the past, that we come about with many problems. Problems with the private sector, problems with the county, that we are very much faced with at this time. And as we look into the future, or make an attempt to do so, we try to resolve those problems, and we realize that those problems really came about because of a lack of communication - communication with the private sector, with the counties, with ourselves. We have created the vehicle here, a process, a process by which we have opened the communications through the policy council which includes the counties and the members of the private sector and business, through the advisory councils which includes the same, and we develop that communication that will assist us in the direction that we choose. And it is hopefully through that communication and that direction that involves all of us, including ourselves at the Legislature, that will help to prevent those problems that we have today from coming about in the future as we proceed in the direction in that road to tomorrow. And I look forward to the process, providing us with a much more communicative solution to the many problems we realize that we're about to face. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Segawa rose to speak for the measure stating:

"Mr. Speaker, speaking on a general basis on all the functional plans that we are faced with today, I think that the minority leader has sort of implied that some of the freshmen are not even aware of what are in these plans. I believe that this may be true, cause it would be quite impossible for the freshmen, or even some of us who have been here, to really know the full implications of the plans that we're working on today.

"But I believe, Mr. Speaker, that it is very important that the state would have such functional plans. Plans which we can look upon as guides as to how we want to do certain things in the future. I think it's more important that there's been a lot of time spent on these plans, maybe not only by members of this Legislature, but members of the last Legislature, as well as advisory councils. And there have been many, many hours put into these plans, and as we act upon it today, it is not to

say that there has not been enough time spent on it. And even if the freshmen spent a lot of time on it, there's a lot of conjecture in the future and I believe those of us who will be here in the future will have the control of funding these projects as we face them on a need-be basis or as we go along, if we need to look at the plans and take the kind of action that we feel can take according to priorities and the availability of funds.

"He said that the administration can do this on their own. But Mr. Speaker, this body here represents the policy making body of the State and I believe it is very important that we, the legislators, representing the people of all the districts, have a say in what we want to do for the future of our State. On that regard, I ask that all members vote unanimously aye on this motion."

Representative Kiyabu-Saballa rose and stated:

"I'd just like to address Representative Segawa and tell him that this freshman thanks him and appreciates his comments."

"For this reason, Mr. Speaker, the last study that was done in depth was in 1976, and in 1978, the plans were set forth and we have them readily accessible upstairs. The plans are used for the tourism plans, Mr. Speaker. If we are going to use those plans and then have to go back and reimplement again what we find from this study that we approved yesterday, I think that it's improper. It would be better not to pass this one functional plan, wait until the resolution has had a fair test as to what kind of an impact it's going to have on the state general plan on tourism, and at that time we can pass it. Until then, I don't think that we would be doing a justifiable job to pass this, do the study, and go back and redo everything again. For that reason, Mr. Speaker, I am going to vote no on this particular plan. Thank you."

#### FORTY-FIFTH DAY

Thursday, March 31, 1983

The House of Representatives of the Twelfth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1983, convened at 11:30 o'clock a.m., with the Speaker presiding.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by The Reverend O.W. Efurd of the Mililani Baptist Church, after which the Roll was called showing all members present.

The Clerk proceeded to read the Journals of the House of Representatives of the Forty-Second and Forty-Third Days.

On motion by Representative Segawa, seconded by Representative Marumoto and carried, reading of the Journals was dispensed with and the Journals of the Forty-Second and Forty-Third Days were approved.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Forty-Fourth Day was deferred.

At this time, the following introductions were made to the members of the House:

Representative Crozier introduced Mr. George Rodrigues, the National Administrator of the Bobby Sox of America, and "a very special person to Hawaii. He has lived on the mainland for quite a few years but he spends quite a bit of his time in Hawaii. Mr. George Rodrigues helped start the Bobby Sox Program, branching out into Maui and the Big Island. He has helped start the Bobby Sox Program and, right now, there's something like 3,000 kids across the island of Oahu that belong to the program and they are now branching out into Maui and the Big Island. I have come to know Mr. Rodrigues and I appreciate what he has done for our kids. And just to give a little background on Mr. Rodrigues -- some of the oldtimers that might remember him in the different leagues throughout the State -- he has always been involved in some kind of a youth program, primarily dealing with baseball. I remember that he used to be quite involved with the Puerto Rican League and he is quite a legend, and a lot of people loved him and just about as many hated him because

he was such a stern commissioner and leader."

Representative Hagino introduced 29 first grade students from Kuhio School. They were accompanied by their teacher, Miss Margaret Ojima; and parents, Mrs. Naleieha, Mrs. Tully and Mrs. Fine.

Representative Honda introduced 26 students representing Maui, Baldwin, Hana, Molokai and Lahainaluna High Schools. These students are members of the Maui Legislative Experience Program and they were accompanied by six teachers, Toshi Seki, Alvin Shima, Sue Ikeda, Joyce Iwane, Betty Lou Kala and Elizabeth Sakamoto.

Representative Tungpalan introduced Mr. Jimmy Kumagai, Chairman of the Democratic Party of Hawaii, who was seated in the gallery.

Representative Hayes, prior to introducing her visitors from New York, stated:

"Mr. Speaker, the visitors from New York are members of a singing group called 'Just Friends.' They were members of the gay men's chorus in New York. They used to catch the train together and, believe it or not, started harmonizing on the subway and formed a singing trio as a result. That was two years ago. Since then, they have performed primarily at benefits and organizational events, and their Hawaii performance is the first outside their state.

"They sing about the gay experience and their repertoire includes an upbeat campy review of songs from the 20's to the present. They came to Honolulu to perform at the tenth anniversary of the founding of the Sexual Identity Center. This is a non-profit agency providing low cost or free services to help individuals, couples and families deal with human sexuality. Among the goals are to dispel myths about sterotypes of human sexuality and to promote fair treatment. The group achieves these goals through counseling, consultation, advocacy, training and educational programs. The Center was instrumental in persuading Mayor Anderson to sign a directive on nondiscrimination.

"The founder and executive director of the Center is William Woods. He started it about ten years ago and is the primary source of energy behind it. It has a one hundred percent volunteer

support, and is funded through donations by members and through some service fees. Bill Woods has been, I think, helped in accomplishing this with the Masters Degree in Public Health Administration from the University."

Representative Hayes then asked Peter Clem, Paige Jackson, Aurelio Font and William Woods to stand and be recognized.

Representative Hee introduced a student from Molokai, Ryan Aikala, stating: "When I was a school teacher on Molokai, as part of the Hawaiian Studies Program, this young man exemplified what can be accomplished through learning a little bit about his culture and certainly about his language. This young man certainly is kamaaina to our olelo aloha and he is a testament to a fine young man who has kept traces of his culture alive, particularly through his family."

Representative Blair introduced a group of sixth graders from the Hongwanji Mission School. They were accompanied by their teacher, Ms. Elaine Nonaka.

Representative Kiyabu introduced a group of fifth graders from Jefferson School. They were accompanied by their teacher, Mrs. Moriyama.

"Mr. Speaker, this bill, on page 23, refers to 'interim receipts or temporary bonds'; I wasn't quite sure what this meant and I'm wondering whether the Finance Chairman could give me a short explanation."

At 11:58 o'clock a.m., at the request of Representative Kiyabu, the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

Representative Marumoto rose to speak in favor of the bill with reservations:

"Mr. Speaker, I'm not quite sure what this bill refers to when they speak of 'interim receipts or temporary bonds'. But it said, 'Prior to the preparation of definitive bonds, the development corporation may issue' these types of instruments. They can be exchanged for the 'definitive bonds when such bonds have been executed and are available for delivery'.

"I'm assuming that the definitive bonds refer to special revenue bonds and before these special revenue bonds can be floated, there is a certain type of interim financing, take-out financing, or some sort of temporary bonds which may be issued. I have no argument with the special revenue bonds because the faith and the credit of the state is not behind this type of bond. But before these are issued, and if the temporary bond is issued, I don't know who would be liable to repay these bonds. Whether it is the board that is formed by this bill, or the University, or the state. I think that this is a grey area, and that is the extent of my reservations.

"This caucuss is very much for high tech. I think it's kind of a motherhood issue now. We especially like this bill since once-upon-atime, it was introduced as a Republican measure. We would hope that this bill will pass and come into fruition, but we don't have to risk the credit of the state behind any type of temporary financing. Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Say rose and to speak in favor of the measure stating:

"Mr. Speaker, on page 23, section C, interim receipts are tax anticipating receipts or notes. And for temporary bonds, these are short term bonds which is primarily 4 to 5 years. Thank you."

"Mr. Speaker and members of this House, this bill refers to an act relating to dislocated workers, and I would like to point out what this bill would mean, particularly to a small island community like Moloka'i.

"This bill would call for matching federal funds, dollar for dollar, with the state and the impact of this bill, particularly with the small island that I represent, has far reaching ramifications then just what this particular bill calls for.

"On Moloka'i, for example, in the last decade, we lost Dole Pineapple Plantation and along with that, were a lot of dislocated people who had put their blood, sweat, their tears, their lives and their families on the line with an industry which. for all practical purposes, they had no voice in the matter whether the industry would close or not. This had happened again in 1982, and will continue with the recent closing of Del Monte - again the decision was made in the mainland and quite frankly, came as a shock, although not an anticipated one, completely unanticipated, but it was a shock in terms of the impact.

"With the foreclosure of Del Monte, the rippling effect will affect all industries on Moloka'i. And the impact that it will have on Moloka'i goes far beyond just a simple foreclosure of 200 jobs. Budgets will be cut back and social impact as well as the economic impact of the island will be severe.

"I believe that this Del Monte foreclosure is a signal of times to come with large plantations. We are beginning to see a new era of what is happening in what traditionally was a labor intensive type of movement. And these jobs which will be affected, deepen the human aspects of not only economic, but of their family life as well. I would urge that this bill would reflect more than one dollar, but I think that can be decided for things to come.

"I might point out that these kind of foreclosures only call to the resiliency of our island community, but that only goes so far and we're really are ... as far as the resiliency of our people, they are in fact that, however there is a limit and this bill will seek to not only train people to stay on Moloka'i, but for the state as well. There will be job training, which hopefully, they can seek on other islands as well. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

"Mr. Speaker and members of this body, I, first of all, would like to thank the members of the Finance Committee and the Chairman and Vice-Chairman for allowing this bill to remain alive. I would like to speak in favor of the bill.

"Mr. Speaker and members, please allow me to take these few minutes to aquaint some of you with Moloka'i General Hospital. It is the sole provider on our island, and it is the only island that does not have a county or state facility relating to health. By virtue of it being the only facility on our island, it is a quasipublic facility in the respect that the hospital does not turn anyone away, notwithstanding that it being private, not for profit organization.

"The economic conditions of our island is such that many times, it is a facility that is faced with treating the indigent population of Moloka'i. The other alternative to our hospital would be for its residents to ... particularly in crisis situations, to be burdened with the tasks of air ambulance facilities, which cost in excess of \$900 for ground transportation and air ambulance.

"This creates not only a burden to people who can afford it, but also for those people on fixed incomes, particularly the senior citizens. As I spoke earlier this morning, I mentioned that many of the people on Moloka'i will soon be unemployed with the closure of Del Monte. This not only will put a burden on those people, but also with the federal cutbacks, ineligibility requirements for medicare and medicaid, this will further exemplify the plight of the people on Moloka'i.

"We have, as you know, if not one of the highest, the highest unemployment percentages in the state.

"For the record, let me add there is a subsidy for Molokai General Hospital included in the executive budget. For the record, let me state that it is indicative, I think, of the Department of Health, as well as the state government, who has wished not to take over our facility, and on a positive note, I think they have as a result, included us in the executive budget subsidy.

"I must note, however, that this subsidy is based not on this particular loan for Molokai General Hospital. It is a subsidy based on the hospital not being in debt. This particular bill allows the hospital to get out of debt, which right now is running about \$280,000. The hospital currently runs on \$30,000 short-fall per month.

"The hospital is ham-strung by several things of which are the plight of the people, in many cases, not to be able to pay, and the plight of the state, unwilling to, at this point, ... let me say, favoring instead of subsidy in the executive budget, rather than take over by the state infrastructure.

"On a positive note, I also would like to mention that the hospital has made positive steps in streamlining their management situation with recent take over contract by Valley Sierra, which is a nation wide institute to help run the hospital more economically.

"Finally, Mr. Speaker, I would ask this body to vote in favor of this bill."

Representative Kiyabu, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 856) recommending that S.B. No. 904, SD1, HD1 pass Third Reading.

On motion by Representative Kiyabu, seconded by Representative Kawakami and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 904, SD1, HD1 entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO FAIR DEALERSHIP PRACTICES", passed Third Reading by a vote of 51 ayes.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that S.B. No. 904 had passed Third Reading at 2:34 o'clock p.m.

DEFERRED MATTERS FROM EARLIER ON THE CALENDAR

Stand. Com. Rep. No. 821 on S.B.

No. 903, SD1, HD2:

Representative Kiyabu moved that the report of the Committee be adopted and S.B. No. 903, SD1, HD2, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kawakami.

Representative Rohlfing rose to speak against House Draft 2 to Senate Bill No. 903 stating:

"While I strongly support efforts to expedite and optimize the exploitation of geothermal energy, I must oppose this draft which has amended the original bill in two disastrous particulars.

"First, the Board of Land and Natural Resources would be given the authority to designate geothermal resource subzones in any land use district, including urban districts. This, in itself, is a violation of county home rule.

"Second, the use of the land within such geothermal resource subzone, insofar as such use relates to the development, production and distribution of electrical energy, would be 'governed exclusively by rules adopted by the Board of Land and Natural Resources'. If this bill were enacted as written, the courts would have to interpret these words at their face value, and the key word in this provision is 'exclusively'. It would mean that the Board of Land and Natural Resources, a non-elected body, could pre-empt not only county general plans, development plans, and zoning ordinances, but also statutes passed by the Legislature, including the almighty State Plan and Functional Plans, about which we have heard so much. Although the proposed language in Section 3 of the bill would preserve the rights and duties under four enumerated chapters of Hawaii Revised Statutes, most of Title 12, including Chapter 171, 'Public Lands', would not be immune from the fiat of the Board of Land and Natural Resources. This is, in my judgement, an example of over-reaching for power by the state administration. It is contrary to the legislative intent of Section 46-4 and 205-5 of the Hawaii Revised Statutes. And, I think it is a violation of underlying principles of county home rule.

"I would support the original

version of this bill which limited the department's authority to areas in conservation, which is their particular 'kuliana'. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Levin rose to speak against the bill stating:

"Earlier this session, the developers of geothermal energy had a bill introduced which would have assured that geothermal energy could be a permitted use in a conservation district. That bill died, for good reason, in Committee. In the Senate, a bill would have allowed geothermal in conservation and agriculture districts. That concept also died, although the bill number is being used as a vehicle for the language presently before us.

"What we now have in front of us, is thought by some to be a compromise, and I believe that it is presented to us in good faith, as such. However, the essence of the bill, as I read it, actually goes beyond what the developers asked for in the first place. It not only allows geothermal development in conservation and agriculture districts, but it goes a step further and allows the Board of Land and Natural Resources to determine 'suitability' of areas for development without the existing guarantee that such decisions will be based on the Environmental Impact Statements.

The Environmental Impact Statement law has come to be thought of over the years as a standard, basic, reasonable protection of our environment. And under this bill, it is true that there still will be an EIS required for any specific geothermal project.

"However, the EIS will come after the suitability of the area has been predetermined, and I believe that, therefore, the issues left to be decided by the Environmental Impact Statement will be relatively minor ones. The biggest issue will already have been decided and will be binding on all state and county agencies by the terms of the bill.

"Some may disagree with that argument, but the testifiers in support of the bill clearly gave evidence that that is going to be the impact of the bill. The one environmental protection that was contained in the bill when it left the Water, Land Committee has been deleted; it would have

required a comparison of the various areas, the various sites with geothermal potential, and then it would have limited development to areas with the least environmental impact or effect. I hope that the restoration of the provision in conference will not cause people to feel that the bill is then okay. A bad bill will then have been made better, if it is in fact improved in conference. But I believe that it will still be a bad bill because it will still provide inadequate protection and inadequate balance.

"Alternate energy has already been oversold to our constituents. Alternate energy has been promoted as (1) a means of removing our dependence on foreign oil, (2) a boon to our economy, and (3) a way of lowering the cost of electricity to the consumer. The first concept is correct. It is probably better to be dependent on a source which does not have to be imported. But on the second concept, there's a question on whether it's a boon to our economy, or at least the benefits will not be as broad as is sometime imagined. The dollars paid to an investment group from the mainland leave Hawaii just as surely as if the dollars go to Saudi Arabia. Some jobs may be created, and the State will collect revenues and royalties, but if the equipment is imported and the workers are imported, then the number of dollars circulating in Hawaii will not increase as dramatically as projected. And there will be some tradeoff; for example, the people that presently work in the oil industry - they transport the oil, they unload it at the dock these people will be dislocated.

"And on the big selling point, with respect to savings for the consumer, that will absolutely not occur. We, ourselves, have assured that by guaranteeing through legislation passed last year and legislation proposed this year, that the PUC must set the cost of firm electricity not less than 100% of the avoided cost. So there will be no savings passed on to the consumer.

"It, therefore, seems to me that the benefits of geothermal are real but are also limited. And since the benefits are limited, they need to be weighed and balanced against the detriments. Therefore, environmental concerns are worthy

of better treatment than this bill provides. I am pro-geothermal development, but I do not feel that this bill adequately deals with the issue.

"And there is also an irony in this bill. The bill is being promoted by the geothermal developers, but it may actually slow down development. This is because it is unclear what will happen between now and the time that the subzones are established, and how long it will take to set up the subzones. The bill provides that there must be an island wide assessment before the geothermal zones are established.

"Mr. Kent Keith has said that it will take 6 months and \$315,000 to do a good job of performing that environmental assessment, an island wide assessment. Yet we have not given the \$315,000 to the Board to do that, and the Board has no obvious expertise in this area.

"The question then is, obviously, why the developers are in favor of this bill? I think that it is worth noting that one group pushing this bill particularly hard, and that is Campbell Estate and a group called True-Mid Pacific, are not affected by the problems that I have just raised, because Campbell owns only one piece of land relevant to geothermal and their only interest is in assuring that conservation zoned land can be used for geothermal and this bill takes care of that issue.

"The other developer who is primarily interested in ... has testified in support of this bill, thought that it would take only three weeks to set up the subzone. He apparently is not familiar with government operations. He testified that he is ready to proceed on a power plant on the Big Island now, if this bill does not pass. But if it does pass, he'll probably have to wait until the subzones are established. That means a delay of six months or more by the testimoney from DPED.

"Mr. Speaker, the idea of setting up, in advance, areas in which geothermal can be developed, is a very positive one. I want to comment the people who have worked long and hard on this issue and this bill, because it is an attempt to deal fairly with the problem, I know. I favor geothermal development, and if I felt that this bill adequately dealt with the issue, then I would

wholeheartedly support it. But it is simply my belief the bill is not well balanced, and does not include the protection that the authors intended.

"It is my hope that the bill will achieve better balance between the needs of the industry and the needs of the people and the environment who are affected by geothermal, and that they will do so in conference. But at the moment, we have only House Draft 2 of Senate Bill 903 to deal with, and therefore, I must vote 'no'. Thank you."

Representative Anderson rose to speak against the bill stating:

"First, I'd like to explain, I know that the Chairman has worked very hard. I'm not against the bill as it is titled to allow people or to allow development into conservation lands. What bothered me more than anything, Mr. Speaker, is exactly like the previous speaker said. Is the consumer going to receive any benefits? And the gentleman that came to testify before us did not give us that actual benefit for the consumer. He said it could possibly be, way down the line.

"When we asked him where was it going to be built first, and who will it benefit, he could not answer that, Mr. Speaker.

And I don't believe that if you're looking at a bottom line, that you're going into an area to develop, and you don't know who you're going to help, and who the beneficiaries are going to be, then I think that we might be a little ahead of time. And for that reason, and that reason only, I am going to vote against this bill. Thank you."

Representative Say rose to speak in favor of the bill stating:

"There's been a lot of discussion this afternoon in the area relating to geothermal and I believe that all of their critiques and comments are very well taken.

"The problem here this afternoon, for all of us as a body of the State House, is to address a policy issue. And the policy issue here this afternoon, is do you want to see alternate energy in the future - may it be wind farms, may it be OTEC, may it be geothermal, solar energy. I believe as far

as what the Committee on Water, Land had done is a very commendable job.

"The Senate Draft that you have before us here this afternoon, is a draft that was written with a lot of support and help from the members of the Committee, and primarily written by Representative Menor.

"In trying to address this geothermal issue, it became very, very difficult because of our land classification system that we have in the State of Hawaii. I believe that all of you here know this afternoon, that we have four classifications - conservation, rural, ag, and urban.

"Mr. Speaker, I truly wish that someday, within the future, that we probably come up with another classification of land, may it be the subsurface minerals attached to the surface of this particular land.

"What we are addressing here this afternoon, is a very complicated issue in regards to exploration and development of geothermal. I believe all of you here do not want to see geothermal development in your own back yard, such as the urban classification. Those of you living in the rural districts would not like to see it also. And for those of you who are the strongest proponants for saving prime agriculture lands, I support you also.

"Where in this state would this particular area of geothermal development take place where it would have the least effect and impact on our people of the State of Hawaii? That would be in the conservation districts, mind you.

"I've never looked, and I hope some of the previous speakers realize that, I've never looked at geothermal as a specific project by project approach. I'm looking at it as an over-all state approach. I've talked to some of my colleagues in regards to how the development of geothermal will lessen the burden upon the people of the State of Hawaii, primarily the County of the City of Honolulu.

"You think about it. I've talked to some of my colleagues in regards to ...you know, the water demands are much higher now in the county of Hawaii, okay. This would be a very, very positive approach to redirecting our population to the outer islands, primarily the Big Island and Maui.

"In a university study, there was noted 20 different areas of geothermal sub-zones. Most of it was found on the county of Hawaii, and there was one particular area on the county of Maui, and one particular area on the county of Oahu.

"All I am saying this afternoon, is that as legislators, we have to take a policy position or statement. I get a little disturbed at we want to get into more detailed in the Hawaii Revised Statutes. But is it, like I've always asked you, Speaker, our job to be administrators and not overall policy makers.

"If you, as a Speaker, want us to become administrators of different departments and divisions, for particular projects, I would wholeheartedly support it - if that is my role. But I really don't think that is my role to be very, very restrictive, very, very regulated as far as what the departments cannot do, and what the departments can do.

"I can understand all of the concerns that have been brought up this afternoon, but I truly believe that this is a positive approach in trying to address the very, very particular problem. Because in the Hawaiian Electric's statement made by Mr. Dudley Pratt, he stated to the county of Hawaii that by the year 1987, they would like to see another source of alternate energy. They do not want to go into the development and construction of a major petroleum refinery generating electricity on the county of Hawaii.

"If that is the members wishes, fine. But I do not want to see this particular state depend much more on the influence of the OPEC nations.

"And finally, let me say this, Mr. Speaker. For those of my colleagues who think this is a particularly bad bill, I really don't think of it as a bad bill. I really don't think of it as a controversial issue. This is a compromise for the developers who have already spent a half a million dollars in trying to do the EIS studies that is recommended, the CDUAs. All I'm asking here, and I think my colleages from the ... my vice chairman, who had his bill introduced and died in the committee, is that everyone knows as far as the general public, and the people of the United States and other foreign countries, think that Hawaii is anti-business. And I believe that if this measure does

not pass, the State of Hawaii will lose about \$17 million in new venture capital coming into this state in exploration and development of geothermal.

"And with this, Mr. Speaker, I hope all of my colleagues will support this measure as far as seeing it go into conference. Thank you very much."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 903, SD1, HD2 entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO GEOTHERMAL ENERGY", passed Third Reading by a vote of 46 ayes to 5 noes, with Representatives Anderson, Hee, Levin, Nakata and Rohlfing voting no.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that S.B. No. 903 had passed Third Reading at 2:51 o'clock p.m.

Stand. Com. Rep. No. 831 on S.B. No. 313, SD1, HD2:

Representative Kiyabu moved that the report of the Committee be adopted and S.B. No. 313, SD1, HD2, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Kawakami.

Representative Marumoto rose to speak against the bill stating:

"Mr. Speaker, the spending limits in this bill are probably unconstitutional, and it also favors incumbents in cases where the limit is too low and also meaningless where the limits are too high.

"The various committees of the House and the Senate most certainly wrestled with the problems of constitutionality and we shall see if this law will stand. I personally have no idea whether it will.

"As if this possible unconstitutionality were not enough, this bill is also an incumbent preservation proposal. Though noble in purpose in its attempts to set spending limits on our ridiculously escalating campaign costs, it should help the incumbent, because it generally takes more money to unseat an incumbent than it does to maintain one's seat. If there exists a low spending limit, a challenger is limited in conducting a competitive campaign.

"In lower races, such as for the House, we have relatively high spending limit and we will each have over \$20,000 to spend if this bill passes. I think that it is almost too high and makes the limit meaningless. How many of us can raise, or do spend that much? And in 10 years with a 10% annual increase that this bill provides, we will be able to spend almost \$50,000.

"Perhaps the most maddening portion of this bill is the puny penalties it imposes if one should spend more than one is supposed to. One must then simply return what is received from public financing, or in other words, a paltry \$100 for house candidates.

"The Campaign Spending Commission may publish the names of offenders. I say, 'big deal'. With money, career at stake, there are very few of us who will be afraid of these deterrants in order to win.

"As if this was not enough to offend me, Mr. Speaker, I can take issue with several other issues of this bill. The removal of the requirement to report occupations of donors. This is consistent with federal election requirement which requires the occupation and business address of all people who contribute even \$10. We would delete this, the occupation in cases of donors of over \$100. It is a mystery why we're deleting this. But for certain, it pulls the curtains over a little, on sunshine.

"Another feature which is inconconsistent with disclosure is the mandate to retain campaign spending reports for 2 years rather than 5. I think that it would be of interest to the public to keep these records available, much longer than 5 years. We should extend the holding period, not shorten it.

"And an old loophole remains, Mr. Speaker. Off election years, every other year for those of us who run for 2 year terms, 3 out of 4 years for persons with 4 year terms. An office holder could raise and expend money without regard to any limits.

"In addition to these years, the spending limit does not apply from the day after an election to the end of the election year when many of our campaign bills come rolling in.

"I would have liked to see at least the later loophole closed, Mr. Speaker.

"In voting 'no', Mr. Speaker, I hope that some of the conferees on this bill are listening. Thank you very much."

Representative Anderson rose to speak against the bill stating:

"And again, I would like to say that I know that the chairman has worked to try to take a lot of the bugs out of the campaign spending, but if I am going to receive \$100 of public funds, I, Mr. Speaker, will never abide by the campaign spending rules, as long as anybody else can come in and pay \$250 and spend as much as they want to.

"The public thinks that by us receiving public funds that they're taking care of all of our campaign spending. When I go to my fund raisers and talk to people, they say, 'why don't you abide by the campaign spending, we wouldn't be going through this'.

"If we really want to go ahead and keep our costs down, then I think that we should use public funds up to \$10,000, Mr. Speaker. For this reason, it's like voting against motherhood, when you say you're going against the campaign spending laws. But it's awfully difficult to sit out there and try to tell people that the public funds that you're receiving is \$100.

"And I think that the only time that we can bring this to this attention, is by voting against this bill. Every time I sit down in the committee hearings, and hear about how we have to go ahead and account for every dollar, I feel like a crook. And that's what bothers me, Mr. Speaker. In the committee hearing, when I ask Common Cause, if this is one of their big issues on how much money we receive, the man said, 'no'. I asked, 'have you ever helped anybody and was your particular reason for helping that person because they went by the campaign spending?', and he said, 'no, it wasn't'.

"And I don't believe that any of our constituents out there feels that way, Mr. Speaker. Maybe if we're running for Congress, or Mayor, or the governorship, the lieutenant governorship... yes, they're interested where the big bucks are coming. I personally received a \$1,000 donation and it's in the books, from my brother, and a \$500 donation from a calabash uncle four years ago. That's the highest. The rest of it comes from my district ... \$25, \$50, and that's about it, Mr.

Speaker.

"And I think it's about time that we look into the laws, make sure that we can go ahead and put it out there what we're spending, and who we are receiving it from, but make it a little more simple. I don't do my own books. I have a treasurer that does it, and he is encompassed with all of this red tape that we get and I feel sorry for him. But as long as I'm not doing it, and I don't spend any money, I'm not even on my own checking, I don't think I have to worry about it, but I think that the people out there should know that they're not paying out of public funds for any of our campaigns. And for that reason, and that reason alone, I am going against the

At this time, Representative Hagino stated:

"I would like the Journal to note that the very concerns that Representative Marumoto brought up are the very reasons why I intend to vote against this bill. I hope that it will die a very timely death in conference. I don't think that I will be able to persuade 25 other people today. Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 313, SD1, HD2 entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS AND EXPENDITURES", passed Third Reading by a vote of 44 ayes to 7 noes, with Representatives Anderson, Graulty, Hagino, Marumoto, Menor, Okamura and Rohlfing voting no.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that S.B. No. 313 had passed Third Reading at 3:00 o'clock p.m.

## S.B. No. 236, SD1, HD1:

Representative Baker moved that S.B. No. 236, SD1, HD1, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Stanley,

Representative Marumoto requested that her remarks in opposition to S.B. No. 236, SD1, HD1 be inserted in the Journal and the Chair noting that there were no objections, so ordered.

The remarks of Representative

Marumoto are as follows:

"Here we go again! Changing a law that is less than a year old. Here we again attempt to legislate relations between people. Big brother is on the horizon in 1984 and we are attracted by his omnipresent spectre.

"How many of us are physicians? How many different standards for giving health care information in regards to mastectomies will have to be created? Do we know of all the kinds of mastectomies there are or the techniques that are and will exist in the future? It seems to me that physicians should spend the bulk of their time involved in providing health care, rather than writing rules that will become obsolete in a few years, or perhaps even a few months.

"And what of liability for the state and board members should some court find the rules as insufficient in some form? This is not far-fetched. It is my opinion that a well informed diligent board could come up with standards, and in a particular case an expert from within Hawaii could find fault with them testify as such, and be more convincing than the state's and board's witnesses. Medicine is an art and a profession, but it is not a widget factory where parts are assembled and disassembled by robots.

"I question whether there is some legal implication in this law, that if a physician wishes to discuss a new, but unrecognized form of alternative, and if his patient chooses such, that there is some violation of the standards of information that are to be created under this law. When does a practice become recognized and when is it unrecognized? These are the kinds of words that only make lawyers rich.

"I could go on, Mr. Speaker, about the ability of everyone to get second, third, or fourth opinions; about the fear of suit that accompanies the practice of medicine; but, I will close by mentioning my fear of creating standards for so called special and controversial procedures like mastectomies and different, less stringent informational standards for so-called routine and non-controversial procedures. It may be that the routine and non-controversial are just the kind of cases where the risks are greatest for all involved, because too many things are taken for granted.

"I had confidence that something worthwhile could have been achieved under the present law. If this bill becomes law, I see only more controversy and confusion emerging."

The motion to pass S.B. No. 236, SD1, HD1 entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO IN-FORMED CONSENT", on Third Reading was put by the Chair and carried by a vote of 42 ayes to 9 noes, with Representatives Bunda, Chun, Kawakami, Marumoto, Matsuura, Morgado, Souki, Tom and Tungpalan voting no.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that S.B. No. 236 had passed Third Reading at 3:01 o'clock p.m.

### S.B. No. 805, SD1, HD1:

On motion by Representative Shito, seconded by Representative

Kim and carried, S.B. No. 805, SD1, HD1 entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENT REPARATIONS", passed Third Reading by a vote of 36 ayes to 15 noes, with Representatives Albano, Andrews, Bunda, Hee, Ige, Jones, Kihano, Kiyabu-Saballa, Marumoto, Menor, Morgado, Okamura, Rohlfing, Souki and Yoshimura voting

"Mr. Speaker, I don't know if any of you heard the news this morning on the radio, but it was reported that a newspaper girl was attacked early this morning by a child molester in Makiki. Several residents heard screams and came to her aid. They caught the molester and held him until the police arrived. Mr. Speaker, I feel that those residents who were not afraid to get involved and came to the victim's aid should be congratulated. We are fortunate, this morning, that one of the residents who apprehended this molester is in the gallery."

Representative Kim then asked James Stone, her staff researcher, to stand and be congratulated.

Stand. Com. Rep. No. 880 on H.R. No. 80:

Representative Okamura moved that the report of the Committee be adopted and H.R. No. 69, HD1 be adopted, seconded by Representative Baker.

Representative Rohlfing rose in opposition to H.R. No. 80 stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in opposition to H.R. No. 80. To do so is not a pleasant task, for any sane person is opposed to any kind of war, and nuclear war is obviously mind boggling.

"I'm old enough to have been a teenager in Hawaii when Pearl Harbor was bombed, to have served in the Navy during the Korean war, to have been on active duty in Viet Nam in the time of the Tet offensive as a reservist and earned a combat ribbon there. I say this only so

you know that I've at least some basis for speaking on this measure today.

"Let us dissect what this well meaning resolution actually says. It's hard to argue with 'Whereas' paragraph number one, yet one could say that prevention of nuclear war is also of 'paramount importance' to all living species on the planet, not just Americans.

"'Whereas', paragraph number two states that the risk of 'accidental war' will be reduced by a nuclear weapons freeze. Has everyone forgotten last year's Falklands Island war? That could qualify as an 'accidental war' which a freeze of nuclear weapons would not have prevented. Who can say that accidental war won't occur if an existing nuke missle is sent on its way by a 'spaced out Russian missileman, or an aircraft commander goes berserk even if there is a 'freeze'?

"'Whereas' paragraph number 3 says the 'freeze' is a panacea which can stop the nuclear arms race which threaten human existence. This language ignores the fact that the hundreds of Soviet, U.S., British and French missiles already in place, and they certainly threaten human existence just as much.

"'Whereas' paragraph number 4 implies that efforts to reach agreements to reduce arms, no matter how diligently pursued are 'self defeating'. Really? How about the next resolution, H.R. No. 186? Which this same committee recommends we adopt? It says such negotiations should be diligently pursued.

"'Whereas' paragraph number 5 is even more simplistic. What basis is there for saying a freeze of nuclear weapons prevents a first strike by the Soviet Union? What intelligence reports are we relying on? Where are they? Are we privy to those? I'd sure be interested!

"As for the 'resolved' clause, believe it or not, if one word were changed, I could buy it in its entirety. For the word 'freeze' in line 4, substitute the word 'agreement'. After all, how does a 'freeze' stop existing deployment of nuclear weapons?

"Mr. Speaker, I don't want the drafter of this resolution, the introducer, my friend from the Big Island, to feel that I am just a 'nit-picker'. What I really feel is that we in this body have neither the information nor

the expertise to make the expansive statements that this resolution makes.

"May I suggest an alternative solution? That we pass a resolution that the House of Representatives of this State is firmly opposed to war and is in favor of the earliest practicable mutual disarmament, including, but not limited to, nuclear weapons. Thank you."

Representative Hagino rose to speak in favor of the resolution stating:

"Speaker, just a few words in favor of these resolutions. I don't intend to get to the point of this resolution, but I do want to commend the leadership for its foresight and courage in allowing debate and discussions of these kinds of issues which of national and international importance.

"I also know that his courage and foresight will again be demonstrated when the leadership will allow my James Watt resolution to come to the floor. Thank you very much."

Representative Jones rose to speak in opposition to the resolution stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I waited quite a long time before deciding whether to speak or not. I really didn't want to speak out against this because I want to try and keep harmony in our House here in a lot of ways, but because of my conscience I feel I have to.

"I really appreciate what the author of this bill has tried to do; I appreciate the intent of it. Being a veteran of two wars, myself, having seen children and mothers burned and raped, I share a great aversion to war, as we all do. Whether I agree very much with Mr. Rohlfing's discussion of some of the wrongness of some of the wording of the resolution, it is not verifiable in terms of its veracity, I also think there is a very practical issue here.

"And the question we have to answer here in the House is, 'will a nuclear freeze cause reduction and the elimination of nuclear war in our world?" That is the critical question before us this morning, and the answer to that is, I think is 'no', and that's why I'm against this resolution.

"A freeze would in effect reward the Soviet Union for its arms buildup. The Soviet Union, historically will not change its position unless it has incentive to do so. It moved almost no-where under the Carter administration, now with President Reagan and his commitment of peace through strength, we see them moving. We should not delude ourselves by saying 'peace, peace', when there is no peace. A mutual freeze, negotiators tell us, will be even more difficult to negotiate than arms reductions.

"In the past 10 years, the Soviet Union has outspent the United States by \$400 billion in military expenditures. We are now arguing over a \$30 billion increase, less than one year of the past ten years of deficits.

"In the past 10 years, the Soviets have more than tripled their nuclear warheads. They have three warheads aimed at each of our missile silos. This gives them a 95% chance of knocking out all of our land based missiles in a first strike.

"How could a freeze reduce the risk of nuclear war if we could freeze at a level which can now destroy the world? We should work toward a mutually verifiable arms reduction. In nuclear weaponry, which President Reagan is seeking, and this is the only way to begin to reduce risk, not to freeze but to reduce. A freeze would be a step backwards.

"In the S.T.A.R.T. program, which stands for Strategic Arms Reduction Talks, both sides have accepted the concept of reductions. And the Soviets have moved away from rigid insistence on the maintenance of current SS-20 force levels, and this is very, very significant. Why should we throw away the opportunity to achieve real reductions in the talks which are now under way in exchange for the uncertain and the potentially dangerous alternative, a freeze?

"Therefore, I heartily encourage my colleagues to vote no against this resolution this morning. Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Apo rose to speak in favor of the resolution stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I think, given the nature of man, that I'm resigned to the fact that we shall never eliminate human conflict within the world. And I think, irrespective of the specific wording of the resolution, which I admit that I am not totally familiar with, that what we are attempting

to do here is to eliminate those options, in the field of human conflict to which human kind can turn. I think that in waging conventional war, as bad as that is, it is at least in the past, has not been a threat to blowing up the entire world.

"I see this resolution as establishing a posture on the part of the state in indicating to the federal government that we, as a people, are sensitive to the one option that does pose the possibility that we eliminate ourselves from the face of the earth. I cannot believe that a resolution from the House of Representatives will be payed much attention by the federal government or by the office of the President.

"And by establishing a nuclear freeze, I think that we can at least take another step forward in eliminating the billions of dollars that are now going into the development and deployment of additional nuclear weapons for which our state is suffering in the reduction of federal aid for social service, health, education, etc. programs. Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.R. No. 80 entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION URGING PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES TO PROPOSE TO THE SOVIET UNION A MUTUAL WEAPONS FREEZE WHICH WOULD HALT THE TESTING, PRODUCTION, AND DEPLOYMENT OF ALL NUCLEAR WEAPONS, MISSILES AND DELIVERY SYSTEMS IN A WAY THAT COULD BE CHECKED AND VERIFIED BY BOTH COUNTRIES", was adopted.

"It is, therefore, left to the state to help and assist the subcontractors with this particular problem, and though this bill is without any penalties, it serves as a clear statement of our desire to assist them. May I commend my chairman, Representative Albano and all the members of the Committee for appreciating and addressing the problem that this bill adressess. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

# INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

A concurrent resolution (H.C.R. No. 200) honoring the memory of United States Congressman Phillip Burton and extending condolences to his family was jointly offered by Representatives Hagino, Takamine, Okamura, Rohlfing, Tungpalan, Albano, Andrews, Apo, Baker, Blair, Chun, Graulty, Hashimoto, Hayes, Hee, Hirono, Honda, Ikeda, Lardizabal, Leong, Levin, Marumoto, Matsuura, Nakata, Say, Segawa, Souki, Stanley, Tam and Wong and was read by the Clerk.

Representative Rohlfing rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, just a brief word. Congressman Burton was a very strong and a very hardworking Democrat, and very partisan in his representation in Congress. However, I got to know him when I was serving with the government in American Samoa and I had a great deal of appreciation for what he has done for the people of the Pacific territories, in particular the people of American Samoa. And I got to know Eni Hunkin who was one of his 'boys', so to speak, in Congress and who is now Assistant Attorney General in American Samoa. And Congressman Burton trained people like him and other people to serve in these islands and so I feel that I personally want to join in expressing our condolences and our thanks to his family for the role they played in his role helping people of the Pacific.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

On motion by Representative Hagino, seconded by Representative Rohlfing and carried, H.C.R. No. 200 was adopted by a rising vote.

A resolution (H.R. No. 517) congratulating Hawaii's professional nurses on their National Recognition Day and recognizing Nurses Week in Hawaii was jointly offered by Representatives Chun, Baker, Albano, Anderson, Andrews, Apo, Blair, Bunda, Crozier, Dang, Graulty, Hagino, Hashimoto, Hayes, Hee, Hirono, Honda, Ige, Ikeda, Isbell, Jones, Kawakami, Kihano, Kim, Kiyabu, Kiyabu-Saballa, Lardizabal, Leong, Levin, Marumoto,

Matsuura, Medeiros, Menor, Morgado, Nakasato, Nakata, Okamura, Rohlfing, Say, Segawa, Shito, Souki, Stanley, Takamine, Tam, Taniguchi, Tom, Tungpalan, Wong, Yoshimura and Peters and was read by the Clerk.

On motion by Representative Chun, seconded by Representative Baker and carried, H.R. No. 517 was adopted.

Representative Chun then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, today is Nurses Lobby Day here in the Capitol. The nurses are here representing several organizations to let us know they are interested in what the Legislature is doing. We did a very good thing for the nurses this year, Mr. Speaker. We passed Senate Bill 605 which removed the classification restriction on school health nurses. That was quite a step forward.

Last week, I said to this body that 'a nurse is a nurse is a nurse.' That statement is so true, Mr. Speaker. To show the situation, this nurse was once confronted by a very intimidating situation. As Chairman of the Honolulu Police Commission, I was asked to defend our action of limiting information to the media. I faced a room of about 50 Rotarians, a sea of male faces. I stood up and told them, 'I don't know who you are out there -- judges, lawyers, doctors, bankers, big shots from all businesses -- and here I am, a lone woman in this room. But I am a nurse and I know that if any of you get sick and you come to a hospital, I will ask you to undress and, by gum, you all look the same!'

Representative Chun then introduced the following persons: Mrs. Rosie Chang, President of the Hawaii Nurses Association; Mrs. Marion Poirier, Executive Director of the Hawaii Nurses Association; Dr. Hazel Dubin, Acting Associate Dean, University of Hawaii School of Nursing; Mrs. Nancy Hamana, President, Unit 9, HGEA (Registered Professional Nurses); and Mrs. Sally Hamada, Nurse Coordinator, Department of Health representing the County/State Hospitals.

Floral leis were presented to the honorees by Representatives Baker, Morgado, Crozier, Yoshimura and Tam while Representatives Chun, Stanley, Hirono, Hashimoto and Tungpalan presented them with certified copies of the resolution.

Representative Chun then asked the following persons who were seated

in the gallery to stand and be recognized: Christie Brunton of the Kokua Nurses; Bernadine Skinner and Debbie Smith of the Upjohn Health Care; Melodee Deutsch, Education Coordinator, and Kay Stigliani, Secretary/Treasurer, Hawaii Section of the Nurses Association of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists; and Dr. Mary Jane Amundson and Mrs. Charlotte Trotter, Clinical Nurse Specialist of the Mental Health Program, University of Hawaii.

Representative Hee then rose and remarked:

"Mr. Speaker, for the record, one of the nice things about going to a hospital is that all nurses look different to me.

Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

At 11:59 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair, "for the purpose of extending our personal aloha and congratulations to our honorees this morning."

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:18 o'clock p.m.

On motion by Representative Segawa, seconded by Representative Marumoto and carried, the following resolution (H.R. No. 518) was adopted:
