We allowed for a mechanism to receive complaints from homosexuals and everyone who felt they were discriminated against and, to date, Mr. Speaker and my fellow colleagues, we have received not a single complaint from the gay group.

"I will speak more on this matter on Wednesday, but I would like for the Clerk to record my 'no' vote today.

"Thank you very much."

## INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

A resolution (H.R. No. 93) honor-

ing and welcoming Senator Franklin J. Arceo Quitugua of Guam was jointly offered by Representatives Kawakami, Alcon, Apo, Bellinger, Crozier, Hayes, Hemmings, Hiraki, Hirono, Honda, Ihara, Isbell, Levin, Marumoto, Metcalf, Okamura, O'Kieffe, Oshiro, Ribellia, Say, Shito, Souki, Tajiri, Tam, Tom and Tungpalan and was read by the Clerk.

On motion by Representative Okamura, seconded by Representative Apo and carried, H.R. No. 93 was adopted.

Representative Okamura then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, as State legislators we rarely have an opportunity to meet our mainland counterparts, much less our counterparts from other nations and territories. Today we have such an opportunity as visiting with us here in the chamber this morning from Guam, our very close Pacific sister territory, is Senator Franklin Quitugua.

"The resolution speaks for itself and sets forth the Senator's more noteworthy accomplishments. However, I think one point needs reiteration -- a 40 percent budget increase for education. Mr. Senator, I am sure Representative Rod Tam and others here would like to discuss your lobbying technique with you after session.

"Seriously, Mr. Speaker, it is fitting for us to honor this distinguished statesman and educator from Guam, and without further delay I introduce to you and this honorable body the Speaker of the unicameral Legislature in Guam, the Honorable Senator Franklin Quitugua."

Representative Okamura asked the honoree to rise to be recognized. Accompanying Senator Quitugua were Mrs. Dolly Ching, Senior Vice President of the Bank of Hawaii, and Mr. Bob Blume, Regional Vice President of the Pacific Island Division of the Bank of Hawaii.

An ilima lei was presented to Senator Quitugua by Representative Tungpalan while Representative Okamura presented him with a certified copy of the resolution.

The Chair then invited Senator Quitugua to the rostrum whereupon he addressed the members of the House and audience, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, members of this

august body, I am deeply touched. I never expected that I, from Guam, would be accorded this honor of addressing Hawaii's State Legislature. We always look upon Hawaii and the Hawaiians to be leaders in the Pacific and my coming to you this morning to receive this honor was certainly very much unexpected.

"I told the members of the Senate as we proceed forward in this decade of the Pacific, that I hope our peoples in business, in politics, in education, work closely. Let's make these islands, our homes, a better place in which to live, for the good of our children, a lot of them who are present here. We say the same thing in Guam, and your giving me this honor and mentioning about my past accomplishments in education, and facing my responsibility as Speaker of the House of the Guam Legislature by your people, I will see to it that this honor that you bestowed on me this morning is further carried forward. And I hope that when you visit Guam, visit the Western Pacific, you will look upon us as your brothers and sisters, and hopefully, this association will continue. It will lengthen for the benefit of all of us Hawaiians, Guamanians, Micronesians. This is our home and I am very delighted to be here.

"Thank you very much."

## THIRTY-THIRD DAY

Monday, March 9, 1987

The House of Representatives of the Fourteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1987, convened at 11:00 o'clock a.m., with the Vice Speaker presiding.

The Diving Blessing was invoked by Representative Ezra R. Kanoho, after which the Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representatives M. Ige and Leong, who were excused.

## SUSPENSION OF RULES

On motion by Representative Apo, seconded by Representative Anderson and carried, the rules were suspended for the purpose of eulogizing the late Richard A. Kawakami, Speaker of the House of Representatives.

Representative Okamura rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise with a very heavy heart filled with deep and personal sadness over the passing of a very dear friend and a leader among great leaders. Richard A. Kawakami will live in the hearts of our people as one of the finest public servants ever to serve Hawaii's people.

"Our Speaker began his political career in 1968 as a member of the Kauai Charter Commission, and as a Kauai delegate to the 1968 Constitutional Convention, and later as a House member representing his beloved Kauai. His continued, uninterrupted public service and active participation in many community organizations, too numerous to mention here, is a reflection of his deep personal commitment to the welfare of the people of this great State. Speaker Kawakami has, through his many years of public service, become indelibly imprinted in the history of Hawaii's first quarter of a century after statehood.

"Speaker Kawakami was a leader of all men. For our keikis, he pursued programs for the betterment of Hawaii's public education system and public university. His heart was with the working people of Hawaii, and he always sought programs that would preserve the dignity of employees while at the same time, meet the needs of employers. He nurtured

social programs, and on opening day he made special mention of two very significant populations in Hawaii -- the elderly and the handicapped.

"As a native son of a primarily agricultural community and as an avid amateur orchid grower, Speaker Kawakami appreciated the plight of the local farmers. Speaker Kawakami, the son of H.S. Kawakami, a former plantation store clerk who built a successful family business, has both shared in his father's success and established himself as a businessman in his own right.

"And last but not least, as a sportsman, the Speaker respected nature and will be remembered for his shoreline management legislation and other progressive environmental measures enacted during his unprecedented twelve-year tenure as the Chairman of the House Water, Lands Committee. Speaker Kawakami leaves a legacy to which all public servants can aspire.

"From a very personal observation, after a very intimate relationship with him as his Majority Leader, I can honestly say that Speaker Kawakami's style of leadership was cooperative and not confrontational. Moreover, I know that he respected the Legislature as an institution and that to the very end, he worked towards minimizing any conflict or tensions resulting from this past session's organizational activities. As legislators, we shared with the Speaker the common experience of the rigors of campaigning, the warmth of getting to know the people in the process, especially loyal staff members. He shared with us the heavy responsibilities and agonies, making those hard decisions on the issues, of weighing the arguments, of considering far-reaching effects of the decisions that we make, the difficulties of striking a proper balance between competing issues and the common concern of fashioning programs to fit the needs and aspirations of the majority of the people of Hawaii. We shared with him the long hours of work, and oftentimes the loneliness of public office, and most important, we shared with him the need to disagree and then to rejoin our forces to continue the work together again.

"Mr. Speaker, I spoke with Speaker Kawakami's dear wife, Bertha, this morning, and she asked me to convey



to the members of this honorable body that the Speaker truly wanted to do a good job and that he was very happy everyone worked very well together. He didn't mind putting in the long hours because everyone seemed so cooperative and he had a really good feeling about the session. She has also asked me to express her deep appreciation to all of you for your support and your kind expressions, and mainly for being a friend to our late Speaker, Richard Kawakami.

"In closing, Mr. Speaker, I would like to say to Speaker Kawakami that I will miss you, that we will all miss you, and that you will be remembered as the years go by, whether we hear your quiet chuckle, or that a lot of what you believed in will be made true in programs that we enact in coming years. We bid you aloha and a warm farewell.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Liu rose and stated:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

"How can we capture the essence of the loss we feel today caused by the death of Speaker Richard Kawakami? Certainly we will try collectively, and each of us in our own personal way, we shall extend our hearts to the Kawakami family, we shall recall our own private moments with Richard Kawakami. We will consider our own mortality and the role that we really play in this world.

"Richard, we Republicans and all Hawaii will miss you. You did well; we will not forget you. Aloha."

Representative Hayes rose and stated:

"We have lost a great leader in Richard Kawakami -- someone whose patience and resilience gave us a promise of many years of progress and cooperation in achieving goals which would benefit the State.

"We had such a short time to enjoy the open leadership. His concern for being fair and helpful to everyone; his unwillingness to close out anyone from a committee chairmanship or a leadership position was an eloquent sign that we were on a path we could all believe in.

"I can only echo Governor Waihee's words that he was taken from us too soon.

"Thank you."

Representative Shito rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, words cannot express the shock of the passing of Speaker Richard A. Kawakami. A man truly committed to Hawaii; a man of compassion, a statesman and most of all, a dear friend. He had so much to offer as he took the helm of leadership.

"In a speech on opening day of the 1987 Legislature, he stated: 'And then all that has divided us will merge; And then compassion will be wedded to power; And then all will care for the sick and the weak and the old; And then all will nourish the young; And then all will live in harmony with each other and the earth; And then everywhere will be called Eden once again.' May he dwell in the Garden of Eden.

"To his family, Bertha and the children, God comfort you in this hour of sorrow and mourning.

"Thank you."

Representative Tom rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, when I entered the State Capitol this morning, somehow I was hoping that this whole nightmare was just a dream and that I would awaken and hear in the hallways Richard's familiar and distinct laugh. Each one of us who knew Richard Kawakami had a very special, unique and personal relationship with him all our own. To all who knew him, Richard was a good listener. Richard was a very caring human being. He was a thoughtful individual, always asking me how I was doing, how was my wife, my children, because of the real memorable occasion we spent with Richard in Colorado on an insurance conference. We will never forget it. Yes, Richard has the ability to make people laugh with his kind of dry humor and he could become stern when the situation called for it.

"The Speaker possessed this unique ability to make each individual who knew him feel important and special. For me personally, as the former House Judiciary Chairman, whether I was facing the media, chairing a House committee hearing, or just sitting behind my desk pondering over difficult decisions that had to be made, Richard would always be there when I needed him to just comfort me, laugh with me, to give me advice and guidance, and at times to provide a shoulder for me to cry on. One of

Richard's favorite songs that he always requested and asked me to play was, 'To Dream the Impossible Dream.'

"Richard, I know that you can hear us and your spiritual presence will always be with us. I know that as one legislative body, we will make your dreams for Hawaii's future a reality.

"Thank you."

Representative Bellinger rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, fellow members, the specter of death has invaded the halls of our Capitol and like a thief in the night, has stolen Richard Kawakami, our Speaker and our friend.

"The suddenness of yesterday's events is like a nightmare that we hope will disappear when we awake. Unfortunately, this nightmare is all too real and our deepest sympathies are with the Kawakami family during this most difficult period.

"As a freshman legislator, I found Richard Kawakami to be a warm, compassionate man with a mild, yet firm style of leadership, a man with an agenda for tomorrow and the ability to meet that agenda. He was a man I was proud to call a friend, a man that I will miss deeply.

"As devastating as his untimely death is, it should not prevent us from continuing to pursue the course that he had charted. We can pay him no higher tribute than to continue in our efforts to make Hawaii's future a bright and prosperous one dedicated to the benefit of all of Hawaii's people.

"To that end, we should all pledge our complete support to our new Speaker.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Apo rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I had intended to say my remarks to close the session today but I think it is more appropriate for me to do it at this time.

"Mr. Speaker, with your permission and with the indulgence of the members of the House, I would like to read the last section of Kahlil Gibran's philosophical work titled, The Prophet. This section deals with a great leader about to leave his people and his last words to them. I

believe were Speaker Kawakami with us and able to address us today, he would have wanted to express these thoughts:

'Then he descended the steps of the Temple and all the people followed him. And he reached his ship and stood upon the deck. And facing the people again, he raised his voice and said:

'People of Orphalese, the wind bids me leave you. Less hasty am I than the wind, yet I must go. We wanderers, ever seeking the lonelier way, begin no day where we have ended another day; and no sunrise finds us where sunset left us. Even while the earth sleeps we travel.

'Brief were my days among you, and briefer still the words I have spoken. But should my voice face in your ears, and my love vanish in your memory, then I will come again, And with a richer heart and lips more yielding to the spirit will I speak. Yea, I shall return with the tide, And though death may hide me, and the greater silence enfold me, yet again will I seek your understanding. And not in vain will I seek. If aught I have said is truth, that truth shall reveal itself in a clearer voice, and in words more kin to your thoughts.

'I go with the wind, people of Orphalese, but not down into emptiness; And if this day is not a fulfillment of your needs and my love, then let it be a promise till another day. Man's needs change, but not his love, nor his desire that his love should satisfy his needs. Know therefore, that from the greater silence I shall return. The mist that drifts away at dawn, leaving but dew in the fields, shall rise and gather into a cloud and then fall down in rain.

'And not unlike the mist have I been. In the stillness of the night I have walked in your streets, and my spirit has entered your houses, And your heart-beats were in my heart, and your breath was upon my face, and I knew you all. Ay, I knew your joy and your pain, and in your sleep your dreams were my dreams. And oftentimes I was among you a lake among the mountains. I mirrored the summits in you and the bending slopes, and even the passing flocks of your thoughts and your desires. And to my silence came the laughter of

your children in streams, and the longing of your youths in rivers. And when they reached my depth the streams and the rivers ceased not yet to sing.

'You have been told that, even like a chin, you are as weak as your weakest link. This is but half the truth. You are also as strong as your strongest link. To measure you by your smallest deed is to reckon the power of ocean by the frailty of its foam. To judge you by your failures is to cast blame upon the seasons for their inconstancy.

'Ay, you are like an ocean, And though heavy-grounded ships await the tide upon your shores, yet, even like an ocean, you cannot hasten your tides. And like the seasons you are also, And though in your winter you deny your spring, Yet spring, reposing within you, smiles in her drowsiness and is not offended. Think not to say these things in order that you may say the one to the other, "He praised us well. He saw but the good in us." I only spoke to you in words that which you yourselves know in thought.

'There are no graves here. These mountains and plains are a cradle and a stepping-stone. Whenever you pass by the field where you have laid your ancestors look well thereupon, and you shall see yourselves and your children dancing hand in hand. Verily you often make merry without knowing.

'And some of you have called me aloof, and drunk with my own aloneness, And you have said, "He holds council with the trees of the forest, but not with men. He sits alone on hill-tops and looks down upon our city." True it is that I have climbed the hills and walked in remote places. How could I have seen you save from a great height or a great distance? How can one be indeed near unless he be far?

'And others among you called unto me, not in words, and they said, "Stranger, stranger, lover of unreachable heights, why dwell you among the summits where eagles build their nests? Why seek you the unattainable? What storms would you trap in your net, And what vaporous birds do you hunt in the sky? Come and be one of us. Descend and appease your hunger with our bread and quench your thirst with our wine. In the

solitude of their souls they said these things; But were their solitude deeper they would have known that I sought but the secret of your joy and your pain, And I hunted only your larger selves that walk the sky.

'But the hunter was also the hunted; For many of my arrows left my bow only to seek my own breast. And the flier was also the creeper; For when my wings were spread in the sun their shadow upon the earth was a turtle. And I the believer was also the doubter; For often have I put my finger in my own wound that I might have the greater belief in you and the greater knowledge of you.

'And it is with this belief and this knowledge that I say. You are not enclosed within your bodies, nor confined to houses or fields. That which is you dwells above the mountain and roves with the wind. It is not a thing that crawls into the sun for warmth or digs holes into darkness for safety, But a thing free, a spirit that envelops the earth and moves in the ether.

'If these be vague words, then seek not to clear them. Vague and nebulous is the beginning of all things, but not their end, And I fain would have you remember me as a beginning. Life, and all that lives, is conceived in the mist and not in the crystal. And who knows but a crystal is mist in decay?

'This would I have you remember in remembering me: That which seems most feeble and bewildered in you is the strongest and most determined. Is not your breath that has erected and hardened the structure of your bones? And is it not a dream which none of you remember having dreamt, that builded your city and fashioned all there is in it? Could you but see the tides of that breath you would cease to see all else, And if you could hear the whispering of the dream you would hear no other sound.

'But you do not see, nor do you hear, and it is well. The veil that clouds your eyes shall be lifted by the hands that wove it, And the clay that fills your ears shall be pierced by those fingers that kneaded it. And you shall see, And you shall hear. Yet you shall not deplore having known blindness, nor regret having been deaf.

For in that day you shall know the hidden purposes in all things, And you shall bless darkness as you would bless light.

'After saying these things he looked about him, and he saw the pilot of his ship standing by the helm and gazing now at the full sails and now at the distance. And he said: Patient, over patient, is the captain of my ship. The wind blows, and restless are the sails; Even the rudder begs direction; Yet quietly my captain awaits my silence. And these my mariners, who have heard the choir of the greater sea, they too have heard me patiently. Now they shall wait no longer. I am ready. The stream has reached the sea, and once more the great mother holds her son against her breast.

'Fare you well, people of Orphalese. This day has ended. It is closing upon us even as the water-lily upon its own tomorrow. What was given us here we shall keep, And if it suffices not, then again must we come together and together stretch our hands unto the giver. Forget not that I shall come back to you. A little while, and my longing shall gather dust and foam for another body. A little while, a moment of rest upon the wind, and another woman shall bear me.

'Farewell to you and the youth I have spent with you. It was but yesterday we met in a dream. You have sung to me in my aloneness, and I of your longings have built a tower in the sky. But now our sleep has fled and our dream is over, and it is no longer dawn. The noontide is upon us and our half waking has turned to fuller day, and we must part. If in the twilight of memory we should meet once more, we shall speak again together and you shall sing to me a deeper song. And if our hands should meet in another dream we shall build another tower in the sky.

'So saying he made a signal to the seamen, and straightway they weighted anchor and cast the ship loose from its moorings, and they moved eastward. And a cry came from the people as from a single heart, and it rose into the dusk and was carried out over the sea like a great trumpeting. Only Almitra was silent, gazing after the ship until it had vanished into the mist. And when all the people were

dispersed she still stood alone upon the sea-wall, remembering in her heart his saying, "A little while, a moment of rest upon the wind, and another woman shall bear me."

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Horita rose and stated:

"Speaker Kawakami was a leader who managed to bridge the gap between the novice and the veteran, the disenfranchised and the establishment. He exercised compassion and invited input from all quarters. He believed in the philosophy that the sharing of information and power led to a stronger house. He saw the place that Hawaii could assume in the Asian/Pacific region and realized that in order for Hawaii to do so, it needed to aggressively compete to seek those opportunities.

"He was a teacher that led by example, not by lecture. He nurtured the new and the young in hopes of Hawaii's future and the time when they would assume the role that he would leave.

"He was a friend whose door was open, no matter the hour of day or night, and made time no matter how busy he was to listen to ideas that sometimes were trivial.

"Wherever he is, he watches us to make certain that we stay on track to take those steps that will take Hawaii to the 21st century that he spoke about on opening day. There are those of us who will miss you, Richard, but know that working toward the fulfillment of the dreams that you so often talked about brings you back to us. I will miss borrowing coffee and bumming rides to functions. But I for one, Mr. Speaker, will not bid Speaker Kawakami farewell because I know that he is here with us."

Representative Takamine rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, we have indeed lost a true friend. Richard Kawakami was a man of many fine qualities and a man who had much ability, and perhaps most importantly, he was a true humanitarian, a man who cared very much. Mr. Speaker, what is equally, if not more important, is that his spirit -- the spirit of caring that moved him -- continues to exist in these halls. And hopefully, this spirit will assist each of us in doing the work of creating the best Hawaii

possible -- the Hawaii that he would have wanted to see.

"Thank you."

At 11:47 o'clock a.m., Representative Okamura asked for a recess and the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 11:50 o'clock a.m.

A resolution (H.R. No. 138) requesting a study to determine the feasibility of improving air freight facilities and expanding reefer facilities at General Lyman Field in Hilo, Hawaii was jointly offered by Representatives Honda, Andrews, Bellinger, Bunda, Fukunaga, Hiraki, D. Ige, Isbell, Kanoho, Lee, Levin, O'Kieffe, Pfeil, Say and Tajiri.

#### THIRD READING

The following bills, which were on the calendar for Third Reading, were read throughout, and the following actions taken:

##### H.B. No. 6, HD1:

On motion by Representative Metcalf, seconded by Representative Hagino and carried, H.B. No. 6, HD1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO RIGHTS OF VICTIMS AND WITNESSES IN CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS", passed Third Reading by a vote of 47 ayes, with Representatives M. Ige, Jones and Leong being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 6 had passed Third Reading at 11:41 o'clock a.m.

##### H.B. No. 4, HD2:

Representative Metcalf moved that H.B. No. 4, HD2, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Hagino.

Representative Hemmings then rose to speak in favor of the bill, with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I want the record to report that I am very much in support of the chairman of the Judiciary Committee's efforts on this bill, and I did sign it free and clear. But after further thinking the issue over, I think there are two apprehensions that I would like to bring to this floor today.

1. Will passage of this bill stifle future, free and open discussion on the qualification of a candidate to seek office? Will it stifle individuals, the public and the media's ability to point out specifics about a candidate's background that may have a profound effect on their ability to do their job for the public's benefit?

2. More specifically, are we creating yet another government agency to do a job that existing agencies and laws have failed to do?

"I think the major point is that in the Heftel smear, which I think is the reason why this bill is here today, the problem is not that the laws we have cannot adequately address penalizing the culprit. The real problem is, we cannot identify who the culprit is. There may be a good chance that we are creating an agency when there need not be one and that existing laws can adequately address libelous or criminal activity regarding privileged information.

"In voting 'yes' today, we may want to reconsider our vote on final reading--assuming the bill comes back from the Senate.

"Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Crozier then rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, my comments are quite simple: the argument that is going to be presented is that this will have a chilling effect on anybody who would like to take advantage of another candidate.

"Right now, we do have a mechanism to react to the abuse and, that is, through the civil system, sir, the civil courts.

"My main concern is that this is an encroachment on our freedom of speech, and anytime we start to encroach on that, sir, I will resist as adamantly as I can.

"Thank you very much."

Representative Cavasso rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, while I do agree with the intent of this bill, I do believe it to be an overreaction.

"The bill is filled with vague terms which may easily be misinterpreted in our community and may discourage open and free exchange of ideas in campaigning. It will stifle future, free and open discussion, and it will stifle the ability of our people, our press, and other candidates to question and ferret out the truth. We do have laws that address the subjects that are being questioned in this bill, and we have the ability to seek out the truths with our current laws and this bill is unnecessary.

"I vote 'no.'"

Representative Metcalf then rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, dirty campaign tactics have arrived in Hawaii as evidenced in the recent local elections and, most notably, in the governor's race. Such dirty campaign tactics are not conducive to good government because they focus the public's attention on individual personalities rather than the actual issues facing the community.

"The purpose of H.B. No. 4, HD2, is to ensure fairness in elections, to protect legitimate reputations of all political candidates and to punish those individuals who are responsible for smear campaigns without any intended chilling effect on the right of free speech under the First Amendment. This measure will address these problems with two basic approaches: by designating election smearing to be a crime; and by establishing a fair campaign practices commission. This commission will develop a code of fair campaign practices and will receive and review all campaign practices complaints. This commission is designed to issue unbiased findings quickly to the affected parties.

"Some people have expressed concern that this measure may infringe on the right of free speech. Your House Judiciary Committee was very careful to tailor this legislation around the framework of the landmark case of New York Times v. Sullivan, so not as to infringe on the First Amendment rights of free speech.

"Mr. Speaker, as the House Judiciary Committee chairman, I am of firm belief that this is a good bill, that this measure will result in more issue oriented campaigns resulting in better government, and I urge all my colleagues to support it.

"Thank you very much."

Representative Hayes then rose to speak in support of the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I do not agree with the people who fear that it will disrupt campaigning, and I think it will limit the lies that have been symptomatic of some recent campaigns and will confine it more to issues. I think this is a plus for Hawaii."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 4, HD2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO ELECTIONS", having



been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 44 ayes to 3 noes, with Representatives Cavasso, Crozier and Souki voting no, and with Representatives M. Ige, Jones and Leong being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 4 had passed Third Reading at 11:47 o'clock a.m.

and the Chair, "so ordered."

Representative Oshiro: "May I ask all the members of our Transportation Committee to please stop by my desk after session for committee reports."

Representative Lee: "The Committee on Education will hold a public hearing at 1:30 in Room 310 this afternoon. Decision making to follow."

Representative Hiraki: "The Committee on Consumer Protection and Commerce and the Committee on Judiciary will be having a joint, public hearing this evening at 6:30 in Conference Room 328. Decision making to follow if time permits."

The Chair then announced:

"We have our deadlines to meet; we would like all members of the Committees to be available for signatures on committee reports, and we would be very pleased if you would let your committee chairman know of your whereabouts so that those committee reports can be signed, and we can meet our schedules tomorrow."

Representative Okamura: "There will be a closed Majority caucus tomorrow at 10:00 o'clock a.m."

At 11:50 o'clock a.m., on motion by Representative Apo, seconded by Representative Anderson and carried, the House of Representative adjourned until 11:00 o'clock a.m., tomorrow, Wednesday, March 11, 1987.
