#### FIRST DAY

### Wednesday, January 18, 1989

In accordance with the provisions of Section 10 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, the House of Representatives of the Fifteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii convened in Regular Session on Wednesday, January 18, 1989. The Honorable Jerry L. Chang, being the Representative at the time present who was elected from the First Representative District of the State of Hawaii, called the House to order at 10:00 o'clock a.m.

The National Anthem and Hawaii Ponoi were sung by Ms. Marlene Sai, accompanied by the Honolulu Symphony.

Representative Chang appointed Representatives Andrews, Arakaki, Bybee, Bunda, Cachola, Cavasso, Hayes, Kotani, Tom and Yoshimura to escort Reverend Grant Lee to the rostrum.

Reverend Grant Lee then invoked the Divine Blessing.

#### INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

H.R. No. 1, declaring the Honorable Jerry L. Chang, Representative from the First District, as the duly elected Temporary Chairman of the House of Representatives of the Fifteenth Legislature was jointly offered by Representatives Honda and Hashimoto and was read by the Temporary Clerk.

On motion by Representative Honda, seconded by Representative Hashimoto and carried, H.R. No. 1 was adopted.

Representative Chang stated:

"Members of the House of Representatives of the Fifteenth State Legislature, I am honored to be your Temporary Chairman this morning. Thank you. Let us commence with the order of the day."

### INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

H.R. No. 2, declaring the Honorable Daniel J. Kihano, Representative from the Eleventh District, and Emilio S. Alcon, Representative from the Thirty-Eighth District, as Speaker and Vice Speaker, respectively, of the House of Representatives of the Fifteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii was jontly offered by Representatives Souki and Lee and was read by the Temporary Clerk.

On motion by Representative Souki, seconded by Representative Lee and carried, H.R. No. 2 was adopted.

The Temporary Chairman appointed Representatives Alcon, Apo, Hagino, Hirayama, Kanoho, Kawakami, Liu, Okamura, Souki and Takamine to escort the newly elected Speaker to the rostrum whereupon the Temporary Chairman presented the gavel to the newly elected Speaker.

The Speaker took the Chair and stated:

"Governor Waihee and Mrs. Waihee, Lieutenant Governor Cayetano, Congressman Akaka and Mrs. Akaka, former Governor Ariyoshi and Mrs. Ariyoshi, Associate Justice Nakamura, Mayor Akana, Mayor Yukimura, honorable colleagues, ladies and gentlemen -- 'Ano Ai Ke Aloha.

"Today marks the opening of the Fifteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, and as we embark on yet another exciting and challenging journey, let us not forget the doctrine of aloha that guides us in our deliberations and all that we do, a doctrine that was established by those who came before us, and which we are charged to protect and nurture for those who will follow. From our pluralistic society, we have managed to build a state where the spirit of aloha not only flourishes, but has

become an integral part of our lives. It is satisfying to know that Hawaii is the State where treating people decently is a major goal of our community ... where quality, service, caring, and harmony are key to our outlook on government, business and the well-being of our State ... where the spirit of aloha fosters a sense of caring and love that bonds our diverse ethnic community into a single, strong working force.

"And as we move forward in our efforts, let us reaffirm our sense of purpose and strengthen our commitment to welcome opportunities for further toil and risk that surely this legislative session will bring.

"An eastern philosopher once explained the basis for peace. There can be no peace in the world until there is peace amongst nations. There can be no peace amongst nations until there is peace amongst states. There can be no peace amongst states until there is peace amongst cities. There can be no peace amongst cities until there is peace amongst families, and there can be no peace amongst families until there is peace within thyself.

"I see two important messages in this philosophical thought. First, the basis for all that we do is the individual. Ours is the responsibility to the people, in hearing and understanding their needs and translating these needs into legislation that will continue to improve the quality of life in this home we call Hawaii.

"The second message is that we are all dependent on one another. Our world cannot be what we would want it to be without cooperation amongst countries; our country cannot be what we would want it to be without cooperation amongst states; our State cannot be what we would want it to be without cooperation amongst cities and counties.

"So as we reaffirm our sense of purpose here today, and as we welcome new challenges and exciting opportunities in the days to come, let us focus our efforts on serving our people without regard to political differences or jurisdictional disputes, without regard to egotistical insignificances; instead, let us concern ourselves with what is right, what is best for the people.

"Today, the challenge of political courage is faced by every member of this House. Everything we do is placed under a microscope and examined under the bright lights of the media. Our lives are so saturated with the enormous power of the television cameras that complex decision making becomes even more difficult. Sometimes an uninformed crowd can raise a storm of protest. Under such circumstances, it takes great courage and commitment to do what we know is right.

"While many have and will continue to debate our purpose, I believe it can be summed up in a simple Hawaiian phrase -- Kulia I Ka Nu'u (strive for the highest). When we as individuals adopt this concept, this constant questing toward excellence, then we become a state with a strong sense of destiny.

"Kulia I Ka Nu'u drives us toward seeking new ideas, and spurs us to action in many different areas. Thus, our agenda will be full.

"An immediate agenda item will be education. While we live in a fast-paced society, what has remained constant over the years has been our faith in education and our determination to provide the best possible learning experiences for our children.

"In times past, our plantation families scrimped and saved to educate their children. A Hawaiian princess willed her entire fortune for the education of her people.

And today, education remains a top priority for the people of this State.

"I am proud of our schools, and I am proud of our teachers. But the challenges which now confront our educational system are far greater, and perhaps more complex than ever before. With a common sense of purpose and responsibility, the business community has moved forward with a study of their own, for which we are grateful. We welcome their support, their suggestions, and their recommendations.

"No doubt changes in our public school system may be needed to produce multi-talented and skilled students, and we are prepared to make these. We will:

- \* Review our system of governance for our public schools, including the notion of an appointed school board to provide for more local control and greater accountability than provided by the present system.
- \* Examine school problems on a school-by-school basis with assurances that faculty, students and the community at large have input on their individual school concerns.
- \* Examine current legislative policies regarding our schools and eliminate those determined to be obsolete.
- \* Examine the establishment of a State subsidized universal preschool program.
- \* Examine and provide for major improvements to the State Library System.
- Continue support and expansion of parent network centers.
- \* Establish a systematic program of repair and maintenance for our schools.

In the area of higher education, we will:

- \* Determine the fate of West Oahu College which because it is located in the chosen growth area on Oahu, must therefore be developed into a vital, growing part of our higher education system.
- \* Support an Institute of Peace.
- \* Review the College of Education to assure that the needs of our schools are being met with respect to the quality of our graduates as well as the numbers required to meet both the short- and long-term needs of the Department of Education.

"There will be other educational initiatives, no doubt. And we will aggressively pursue those that will strengthen and expand our educational system so that our children will have an educational experience that is second to none in this country.

"My message should be clear -- education will enjoy a very high priority in this legislative session.

"In the area of international relations, we must strengthen our role as a leader amongst Pacific Basin countries. We will open our minds to ideas from the East as well as the West, ideas perhaps more in keeping with our cultural heritage and diversities, but ideas which make sense for us in this continuously shrinking world. In an international role, we will strive to serve as an exporter of ideas, values, activities, goods, and services. By cementing our efforts and working closely together, the various segments of our community can build this State

into the kind of international arena worthy of a central role in the world community.

"We will:

- \* Work to establish a central office to coordinate Pacific Basin concerns, thus eliminating our currently fragmented approach in dealing with our international friends and colleagues.
- \* Establish an Office of Protocol to assure a better understanding of cultures, and the proper ways of doing business.
- \* Support an international conference focusing on Pacific Basin issues and to include discussion groups from both within the State and throughout the Pacific.
- \* Continue with our plans for a convention center at the International Market Place.

"Clearly, Hawaii must expand its leadership role amongst Pacific and Asian countries, and we must be prepared to assist in making this happen.

"The need to feel secure in your own home or community is essential to your satisfaction with life. Yet, the majority of crimes committed in Hawaii involve property crimes, like car thefts and burglaries, that occur near homes. Currently, most police stations are centrally located in major population areas, many at great distances from small neighborhoods where easier, more direct access could greatly help residents. The presence of police officers in small neighborhoods would provide people with a greater sense of security, rapid response to calls, and a positive identification amongst residents.

- \* Look into the feasibility of the establishment of neighborhood police stations, perhaps as part of fire stations, in communities throughout the State.
- \* In the days to come, we will be working closely with our newly elected Prosecutor and will support his efforts in combating crime.

"With respect to our economy, we recognize that our future depends on an economy that is vigorous, diverse, and has strong growth potential. However, we must also recognize that governmental efforts toward achieving a strong economy are dependent on a dynamic private-public partnership, particularly the emerging of the energies, talents and skills of labor, business, and government. It is our intention to build a more vibrant and aggressive business climate by:

- \* Establishing a Hawaii stock exchange.
- \* Establishing a strategic fund to attract private investment to the State.
- \* Encouraging the development of a strong computer software industry.
- \* Developing the waterfront from Ala Moana to Keehi Lagoon into a hub of maritime, commercial, and recreational activities.
- \* Reviewing land use processing laws to encourage a balanced approach to building by both the public and private sectors.
- \* Making small business innovation grants available.

"Another important part of our agenda will be the concerns of our native Hawaiians, for it is from our pre-

Cook ancestors that we have learned aloha, Malama Aina, Lokomaika'i, and other Hawaiian values that are as important to us today as they were in ancient times.

"We will:

- \* Accelerate the infrastructure program at the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands and move toward placing more people onto available lands.
- \* Endorse creative approaches to the department's development program and work closely with staff to invigorate the entire process.
- \* Incorporate Hawaiian values into our fabric of living. For example, we will encourage all parties involved in controversial issues of land or culture to actively participate in sessions of Ho'oponopono or some form of alternative dispute resolution, prior to the filing of lawsuits.

"A fifth agenda item will be the transportation crises we are presently facing. Our highways are nearing gridlock at peak traffic hours. We spend millions on highways, but little for ridesharing and alternative transportation measures. The traffic problems cannot be solved by the State alone. It will require a public/private partnership along with the dedicated commitment of all levels of government in order to develop solutions.

"We will:

- \* Evaluate mass transit and decide whether or not it is a viable answer to our transportation crisis. We have deep concern for how such a massive infrastructure can be installed without forever scarring the face of this island with rails and intolerable debt. It's time to take a stand. Do we protect this special place that we call Hawaii, or do we simply turn it in to another one of a hundred mainland cities?
- \* Require unified transportation planning on both the State and county levels and including the private sector.
- \* Support private sector efforts to establish ridesharing programs for various communities.
- \* Examine both the public and private bus systems to determine how best to meet the needs of the commuters.
- \* Discourage students from driving to school, and instead encourage them to take advantage of alternative ridesharing measures.
- \* Support preferential parking policies for ridesharers and seek incentives for the private sector to make ridesharing more attractive.

"In terms of human services, we will reinforce the concept of aloha in the treatment of all of our brothers and sisters. We will establish policies that design service programs with compassion, charity, and love.

"We will:

\*Examine the concept of universal child care, to assure that youngsters growing up in families where both parents have to work are given the same opportunities for learning that other youngsters have.

 Encourage private employers to provide child care programs and benefits. \* Expand the day health care programs for the elderly.

"Finally, in the area of the environment, we will adopt the policy of Malama Aina -- caring for the land with a sense of protection and deep respect.

#### "We will:

- Support a stronger educational program in the areas of environmental protection.
- \* Work toward the continued preservation of our resources.
- Strengthen monitoring programs particularly for our coastal waters.

"While last session's accomplishments give us a feeling of satisfaction, we know that our work is not yet finished. It is time to climb once again, to feel the spirit of purpose, to sharpen our energies and strive toward our goals. The creation of a better Hawaii requires the pursuit of new ideas, new ideals that are perhaps greater than we can ever achieve, but lofty goals, nevertheless, that set us on the path -- Ku Lia I Ka Nu'u.

"Each one of you here today, every resident of Hawaii must accept the responsibility for achieving and maintaining our State purpose, for making Hawaii a worthy model for the world. Members of the House, we too must commit ourselves. We too must reaffirm the quest: Ku Lia I Ka Nu'u -- Strive for the highest.

"Mahalo."

The Chair appointed Representatives Arakaki, Cachola, Duldulao, Horita and Marumoto to escort the Honorable Emilio S. Alcon to the rostrum.

The Chair then said:

"Members of the House of Representatives, I present to you my Vice Speaker, Emilio Alcon."

The Chair recognized Representative Liu, Minority Leader, who rose and responded:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Good Day to you and to all who are listening, so naturally that means a special aloha to the Governor because he will be listening, of course, closest of all. The day and the coming year appear to be bright--no recession, unemployment figures are low, the U.H. football Rainbows anticipate a banner season, and it is not an election year.

But we cannot ignore that there is a restlessness and uncertainty throughout our State that is percolating just under and through our feet. The Big Island presents us with a new mayor with an 'R' after his name--Mayor Akana. In the face of a united Democratic front, Representative Saiki is re-elected hands down. Mayor Fasi confounds the Advertiser again. A new Honolulu Prosecutor springs forth--some would say like 'Momotaro' himself, and we wish him well. And a 'Joan of Arc' now presides over Kauai--Mayor Yukimura.

"These are indeed changes, Mr. Speaker, and signs that are indicative that the pioneer, explorer, adventurer, and independent streaks that is all the amalgam of American history is alive and well in Hawaii. Our people want an environment where they feel secure in the thought that if they are willing to risk their energies, ideas, and money in economic, social or academic markets here, they will have a fair chance of success. People want a level playing field with rules that are the same for all.

"But to nurture such an environment, Mr. Speaker, we will have to take risks. Let's risk upsetting the facade of harmony with the executive branch and come up with a budget that does not break the bank...'Governor Asks Record Spending.' (Advertiser, December 30). 'In State Spending, Hawaii is Number 2.' (Star-Bulletin, December 19). 'State Spending Increased Faster Than Inflation.' (January 2, Pacific Business News). 'Governor Adds \$257.8-million To Spending.' (January 13, Star-Bulletin).

"We should not let this \$8-billion budget which has been presented to us become an \$8-billion spending spree. Instead, let's risk doing what I called for in my 1988 Opening Day remarks, Mr. Speaker, on this very same floor 365 days ago, and return a significant portion of the projected \$600-million (read my lips--six hundred million dollars) surplus plus extra revenues to the people. Returning only half of that excess translates into \$400 for every resident taxpayer and dependent in this State, or \$1,600 for a family of four. Sixteen hundred dollars is certainly not loose change. Government should not be in the business of hoarding enormous sums of our money. Our Constitution calls for a rebate in these times. Mr. Speaker, let's risk following the law for a change and give help to people in this State where they can feel it in their pocketbooks.

"'The government closest to the people is the best. Let them make more of the decisions.' That's a quote, Mr. Speaker, that we should risk listening to. 'The government that is closest to the people is the best. Let them make more of the decisions.' A quote which was made in reference to giving counties greater financial ability to deal with the concerns of average people about road paving, sewer maintenance, beach and park cleaning, and police protection. A quote made by a Democrat--Governor Mario Cuomo--on December 28, 1988, and reported in the New York Times.

"Mr. Speaker, if we do not provide our counties with a greater share of tax revenues in this time of excess, they will have a right to tell home owners and renters that 'your property taxes and rents and other living costs have gone up because the Legislature and Governor forgot about these things--forgot about you.' We could easily return \$50-million back to the counties for roads, parks and police; and if we did, the need to raise vehicle, gas and property taxes on Kauai, or Oahu, Maui, Molokai, Lanai and Hawaii would quickly fade.

"And, Mr. Speaker, let's risk paying attention to the thousands of senior citizens who presented us with petitions last year to remove the four percent excise tax on medical services which is really a tax on being sick, and that is wrong.

"Should we not risk being creative in tax reform and do things like change our tax credit for child care costs which today averages only about \$120 per claim and, instead, we think about raising the credit to allow 75 percent of allowable expenses in this area.

"Finally, Mr. Speaker, let us together, together risk upsetting those who want to cling to old policies and old ways, and move to make fundamental reforms in our public education system. There are many fine people in the system, but I agree with the recently published analysis of Hawaii's public schools by Paul Berman in which it is written: '...the majority of Hawaii's students attend schools that have no better than average performance...tinkering with the present system...is not enough...a quantum improvement should be the objective.' Let us implement the many specifics provided in the report, and especially focus on giving decision-making power over the moneys and curriculum to the

communities that surround our schools. In fact, our Governor's own Congress on Hawaii's International Role, just last month, endorsed major changes in public education as necessary to expanding our opportunities in the world. Will the Democratic Party turn its back on its own fledgling attempts at perestroika?

"So there it is, Mr. Speaker, for you and your Majority, a Republican challenge. A challenge that obviously faces overwhelming odds in this arena, but a challenge that on the battlefield of ideas stand on equal footing with those of your Party.

"And we will not give up, Mr. Speaker, for we believe we speak for those who feel left out of these political halls of power; that we speak for those who want a government that will take us off the top ten list of 'states with the highest taxes.' We will not surrender because we believe we speak for those who are tired of being asked, 'Who do you know?'

"Mr. Speaker, Republicans stand ready to be your partner this session, and worthy adversary. We are ready to engage you in sharp debate, and ready, too, to find common ground. But, Mr. Speaker, and to all of you who have listened, understand that we do all these things, not for the sake of fighting, not for the sake of hearing our own voices, but because we, too, have the best interests of Hawaii in our hearts, for whether a Keiki o-ka-aina or an arrival with the morning sunrise: if we live here, Hawaii is the mother of us all.

"Aloha."

The Chair recognized Representative Okamura, Majority Leader, who rose and responded:

"Mr. Speaker, we, the Democratic Majority, stand united. We stand ready to support your efforts in the session which lies ahead of us. Just last week, we commemorated the life of a giant among men--Dr. Martin Luther King--a modern day hero who gave us an indelible vision of a society on earth--a vision which honors and cherishes all that is wondrous about mankind.

"Under the leadership of the Democratic Party, the State is thriving. We enjoy nearly full employment. Business is booming. Our financial institutions are sound. New industries are being established. But there is still much work to be done if we are to make that indelible vision a living reality.

"We all know, you and I, the many faces of our future leaders for they are in each and every one of our classrooms, and they will be our legacy.

"We all know, you and I, the everyday heroes who go quietly through life, sometimes against great odds. Let us not deny them the vision for they are our children, our elders. They are our brothers and our sisters for whom there is no home to offer shelter from the storm.

"There is still work to be done and our rapidly changing world--Asia and the Pacific--continue to grow in prominence. Indeed, the Pacific century is unfolding before our very eyes.

"And if there is work before us, then we are most certainly blessed. We are blessed because we are on common ground in our intent to build an educational system and an educational experience for our youth that is an example of excellence for all of America.

"We are blessed because we are on common ground in our intent to have excellence in education which means new good jobs, self-fulfillment, mastery, pride, and self-respect.

"For the business sector, excellence in education means better trained and more productive workers.

"For labor, excellence in education means a strong and growing economy.

"For our young and old alike, excellence in education ensures that Hawaii's people will be prepared to be citizens of the world and a future in which the global community will be more than a fine ideal.

"We are blessed because we have the extraordinary means by which to make things happen, to literally create our future, to breathe life into a vision of Hawaii that we can afford to have.

"This year, Mr. Speaker, we have a surplus in our State treasury--a surplus when other states and the country are facing tremendous deficits. How often we have implored--let us invest in our future. How often we have embarked in this direction without nearly as much in the way of resources. Some would say that the wisest course for us to take is to return the surplus in its entirety to all fellow citizens. But have we learned from our nation's experience what our Asian neighbors know so well that long-range investments are our best bet for long term economic strength?

"The Democratic Majority proposes to return a portion of this surplus directly to the people of Hawaii by increasing the full tax credit and by reducing personal income tax rates as well.

"The Democratic Majority also proposes to build a policy and programmatic foundation for the rapidly arriving 21st century. We are thus committed to empowering now the visions we have so long held for Hawaii.

"My friends, do we choose to wait when opportunity is within our reach? To those who would say, let the future take care of itself, let us answer, if we do not prepare for the future now, what future will we have?

"Carl Sagan once said and I quote: 'Visions are inspiring and challenging, serving as beacons and controls during turbulent changing times. Effective visions prepare for the future but honor the past. The visions we present to our children shape the future. They become self-fulfilling prophesies.'

"Mr. Speaker, the Democratic vision is clear. We have the means to translate our vision into action and reality. With your leadership and guidance, your Democratic Majority stands ready to meet the challenges of this session and those beyond it.

At 9:42 o'clock a.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair, to meet in Joint Session with the Senate, in accordance with House Concurrent Resolution No. 1, to receive the Governor's State-of-the-State address. (Gov. Msg. No. 26)

### JOINT SESSION

The Joint Session of the House of Representatives and the Senate was called to order at 10:03 o'clock a.m. by the Honorable Daniel J. Kihano, Speaker of the House of Representatives.

The Speaker then welcomed and introduced the following distinguished guests to the members of the Fifteenth Legislature:

The First Lady of the State of Hawaii, Mrs. Lynne Waihee. She was accompanied by her daughter, Jennifer. Pikake and ilima leis were presented to Mrs. Waihee by the President of the Senate, Richard Wong; and the Speaker of the House, Daniel Kihano.

The Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawaii, the Honorable Benjamin Cayetano.

Former governor Ted Schwinden and Mrs. Schwindin of Montana; former governor of the State of Hawaii, the Honorable George R. Ariyoshi; and another former governor of the State of Hawaii, the Honorable William F. Quinn.

First Lady of the House of Representatives, Mrs. Jo Ann Kihano.

Commander of the Fourteenth Coast Guard District, Rear Admiral William P. Kovalesky, representing the military in Hawaii. The Honorable Soon-Yong Hong, Consul General of Korea, and representing all of the members of the Consular Corps in Hawaii.

The Chair appointed Senators James Aki, Gerald Hagino and Mary George, and Representatives Emilio Alcon, Tom Okamura and Michael Liu to escort the Honorable John D. Waihee, Governor of the State of Hawaii, to the rostrum.

Representative Bertha Kawakami presented Governor Waihee with a maile/ilima lei on behalf of the House of Representatives; and Senators Mary George and Ann Kobayashi presented the Governor with a maile lei and an ilima lei on behalf of the Senate.

The Speaker then presented to the members of the Fifteenth Legislature, and guests, the Honorable John D. Waihee, stating:

"Members of the House and Senate, ladies and gentlemen, I present to you the Governor of the State of Hawaii, John David Waihee."

The Governor addressed the Joint Session, stating:

"President Wong, Speaker Kihano, members of the Fifteenth State Legislature, honored guests, ladies and gentlemen...Aloha.

"You know, it's a very interesting experience for me today to be addressing you in the presence of three former governors as they all sit there -- Quinn, Ariyoshi and Schwinden. They are sitting there very smugly, knowing that they are through going through all of this. But, you see, I have the last word and that is, if I was a gracious host, I would have invited them to the golf course instead of being here to listen to the State-of-the-State address.

"Today, as President Wong so aptly stated on Opening Day, we stand at the edge of the Pacific horizon looking outwards at new opportunities.

"For the past two sessions, I have had the privilege of appearing before you and calling upon you for action to meet the challenge of our new horizons. Each time, you rose to the occasion and surpassed all expectation, making believers out of cynics.

"As a result, we are on the move, a people hitting our stride in the home stretch of the 20th century.

"Hawaii's economy has never been better. Today we enjoy the sixth highest economic growth rate in America; our small businesses have the country's third largest earnings growth rate; and our unemployment rate is the fourth lowest in the country and the lowest it has been in 18 years.

"In 1985, Hawaii had a budget surplus of about \$120-million -- a relatively modest amount when compared to other states with considerably larger surpluses such as California, Wisconsin, Minnesota and Alabama. Today, we have the second largest surplus in the country and those states have little or none at all.

"In partnership with the hard working men and women of this State, we have begun to turn things around and lay a solid foundation for our future.

"Yet, because we live here and are part of this community, we know that there is still more to be done. Our people dream of an even better future, and they rise to that challenge every day.

"It's tough. There's a lot of sacrifice. Yet, Hawaii's people work hard for their dreams because those dreams are very real. They're for families and communities; they're for today and tomorrow; they're achievable; and, in this great place to be, they are worth it.

"Our task in the days ahead is clear: We are here to help fulfill our people's dreams and make their lives better.

"Ironically, because you have done so much in the past two sessions, their expectations are high. I believe that through timely and well-considered investment in our people, in our children, in our quality of life, in our future -- we can be the catalyst for economic and social change that nurtures the ideal of a Pacific community entering the 21st century.

"The heart of Hawaii's vitality is her people, bonded together by mutual interdependence and shared aspiration.

"Strengthen one and we strengthen all.

"We begin with the core of our society -- the family.

"Robust families are healthy ones, and we have for more than a decade assured the health care of most of our workers and their families. However, some 30,000 people are left out -- thousands of them children.

"I propose that Hawaii lead the nation and extend primary care for all of its citizens. This supplemental system of health insurance will operate through the existing private carriers and contain an emphasis on wellness and the prevention of disease.

"We also urgently need to direct attention to a segment of our population that has lost its way, the mentally ill whose affliction can have a dismaying effect on families.

"We are building a state-of-the-art acute care hospital for the mentally ill as part of our effort. We now ask you to support with additional resources for a revitalized community-based system. Our goal is to reintegrate the mentally ill into society as functioning, productive citizens.

"Our health is jeopardized by nursing shortages which will reach a deficit of over 1,300 nurses by 1991 without special attention. I propose a \$6.5-million action program to graduate approximately 300 additional registered nurses. And \$8-million in capital improvements to improve the facilities at the School of Nursing.

"Every family in Hawaii dreams of its own home. Some feared it was only a dream. But we said that dreams are what you build upon.

"You gave us a \$120-million housing superfund and funds to purchase lands in Kapolei. With your continued support, we will see affordable homes in a beautiful new community in West Oahu and new projects on the neighbor islands.

"In 1988, answering our specific call for affordable housing, developers committed themselves to 14,700 affordable units on Oahu and the Big Island.

"For those families in Hawaii who are not able to buy, we propose an increase in the State Rental Assistance Program and State funds for the construction of new low-income rental units.

"Our native Hawaiian families share the universal dream for housing. We know that when Hawaiian Home Lands have infrastructure, Hawaiians will build homes on them. This year, we are more than doubling our CIP requests to turn empty lots into homesteads.

"Our children are the future, and above all else, Hawaii's families believe in and desire the best for their children.

"In our changing society, working parents share a common concern for the care of their children during the hours when they are at work.

"To offset the concern of these parents for their children's supervision outside of school hours, I propose a demonstration project for after-school care in our parks and schools. Counties, let's work on this together.

"Furthermore, we all know that early education enhances a child's potential for success in school. I propose the goal of early childhood education for all of Hawaii's children by the year 2000. We will begin this coming September by implementing preschools for four-year olds from Maili to Makaha in cooperation with Kamehameha Schools.

"We will also support expansion of a program with proven success, the Hawaiian Language Immersion Program that provides a bridge between day care, earlychildhood education and kindergarten.

"In addition, I have asked Lieutenant Governor Cayetano to head a special childcare/early childhood education 'cabinet' to further work with the appropriate public agencies and members of the public on these important issues.

"In Hawaii, public education is seen as the great equalizer. Without it, the aspirations of our children for tomorrow will be less than our own for today. With it, all of our children have the opportunity to carve out their own destiny.

"Over the past year, our people have recommitted themselves to excellence in public education. For example, the Hawaii Business Roundtable, thanks to people like Dudley Pratt and David Heenan, has given us the Berman/Weiler Report as a catalyst for change.

"Such studies, the Board of Education and the Superintendent of Schools tell us in a professional fashion what we already know in our hearts, that the earlier we teach our kids, the better...that the more involved the parent, the more involved the child...that communities which give their best to their schools get back the best product...that schools empowered to act on their own outperform schools which are slaves to the system..that good teachers are always learning...and that schools that look sharp inspire involvement and learning.

"Our vision is to enter the 21st century with a public education system that is second to none.

"By 1999, we want public schools that (1) are managed by a system of accountability based on local control; (2) are renewed places of learning satisfying each student's potential, staffed by well trained and involved professionals; (3) that are housed in facilities that are conducive to learning and foster pride; and (4) are institutions that parents choose to have their children attend.

"If we are going to achieve our goal, we must change our mindset. We can no longer approach education in fits and starts, merely in the confines of two year budget cycles and certainly not with government doing it alone. We must firmly commit ourselves to our vision, set our course and steadfastly hold to it. Everyone --public and private -- starting now...with a decade of determination ahead. Ten years to the top.

"Nowhere is the need for a change of mindset so poignant then in the way we govern our schools.

"Hawaii has one of the most highly centralized school systems in the country. For many years the system fostered equity and served us well. However, in recent years, we have become increasingly aware of the inherent weaknesses of our system.

"With the renewed public interest in education, now is an opportune time to review the governance structure of our school system. Many proposals have been advanced, ranging from an appointed school board -- to modifying the present one -- to establishing a network of elected local school boards.

"I propose that you take this opportunity to review the various options and consider an appropriate constitutional amendment.

"In the meantime, we should not and cannot wait. Therefore, I propose that we immediately institute a school/community-based management program that puts our schools in charge of their own affairs.

"The school/community-based management system we envision would be one where local school communities --parents, teachers, administrators and other interested parties -- would have full charge of almost all budgeting, setting of educational programs and school priorities, and increased involvement in staffing.

"The public will and should expect these schools to be accountable. The deal is that the State and the Department of Education will set the standards, and the schools will have the freedom and authority to achieve them.

"We will start with 30 schools which are desirous and ready to move into school/community based management by next year. They will be models for others and each year additional schools will be incorporated so that by the year 2000 all schools in Hawaii will be locally managed.

"I recently visited Hilo Union Elementary School on the Big Island. This is a school, that if you judged solely by the demographics of its students, would tempt you to believe that it is a school at risk. Yet, what I saw instead was an example of what a school committed to learning looks like.

"The school has a special reading program which we visited. You can imagine the commotion that we caused when a group of us entered the teaching area. Yet, neither the tutors nor the students even looked up. Is it any wonder that reading scores at Hilo Union now exceed state and national averages.

"I am sure that most of you know of many other similar examples.

"What we are committed to is that by the turn of the century, all of our schools will be such renewed places of learning."

"Our renewed schools will be institutions where core learning is emphasized and where the essential skills for competitiveness in the 21st century, such as second language proficiency and applied technology skills, are required subjects.

"In many instances, our schools are burdened with too many course requirements to implement a complete renewal program. However, as they shift to school/community-based management, they will have the flexibility to institute after school education programs and/or A K to 10 core learning system to facilitate the transformation.

"The key to the renewal of our schools is the involvement and dedication of our educational staff. We need to support the continuous professional development of our educators as well as provide opportunities for them to plan programs and curriculum.

"Such training and planning will require additional work time from our educators at the beginning and ending of the school year.

"Also, if we are to meet the demand for teachers in our renewed schools, we must invest in the improvement and expansion of the University of Hawaii College of Education.

"Some of our schools will need more help than others if they are to achieve their full potential. Such schools are generally those where there are a large number of students at risk and chronically underachieving. For these schools, we propose a special program which directs a partnership of resources to help them renew themselves and attain school/community control.

"A school system that is second to none requires facilities that gleam with the pride of public education.

"The DOE estimates that it will cost over \$800-million for all of the facilities that we will need over the next ten years.

"Thus, I propose for the next seven years, the earmarking of \$90-million per year from general fund revenues for a total of \$630-million to be channeled into a facilities special fund. This sum and the interest it earns should provide the financing that we need.

"It would cost us about \$1.5-billion to provide the same amount of capital by selling bonds. Using cash financing, we can save close to \$1-billion and give growing communities like Mililani and West Hawaii the schools that they deserve.

"Monies alone, however, will not give us the kind of school facilities we desire. All of us -- parents, students, educators and the community-at-large -- need to take pride in the care and maintenance of their schools. Accordingly, I propose the establishment of a school inspection program.

"Now, to the issue of choice. First, we begin by saying that to some extent we already have it. We just call it district exception.

"Over 11,000 students use it. It is time to make it available on an open and equitable basis.

"I would ask that the Board of Education continue its review of this issue and develop further methods of expanding parental choice.

"Second, there are communities with good schools which, from time to time, face the possibility of closure because of declining enrollment. Allowing parents to choose the schools their children will attend would take advantage of these under-utilized facilities.

"Over the past two years, we began several exciting initiatives at the University of Hawaii in ocean and earth sciences, Pacific/Asian studies, astronomy, and other special areas. These initiatives are moving well and deserve your continued support.

"New initiatives alone, however, will not be sufficient to build the premier University of the Pacific that we desire. We need to insure that our foundation is firm. Thus, I propose that we make this the year of the undergraduate, with funding for undergraduate curriculum and services.

"Let's back the undergraduate track with substantial expansion of student services, including academic, career, financial aid and personal counseling as well as additional dorm facilities.

"We will also seek additional support for our community colleges, including full funding for the new Kapiolani Community College campus.

"The University of Hawaii at Hilo often seems to be forgotten when new initiatives are proposed. Yet, it is a fine institution with its own strengths, including the fact that about 17 percent of its student body has Hawaiian ancestry. Therefore, we propose that a Hawaiian Language Center be established at Hilo. Such a center would, among other things, develop course materials for the teaching of Hawaiian language in our public schools.

"We are determined that every student in the University system shall reap the rewards of a quality education from the very first day of campus life through graduate studies.

"We're working hard to create new economic opportunities for our graduating students.

"One key is the capital needed to spawn new industries. In 1987, you passed legislation to raise the ceiling on our Hawaii Capital Loan Program. Our first \$1-million recipient, Seafloor Surveys International, is truly a success story. Their sonar system which maps the ocean floors is near completion. The company fills a special Hawaiian high tech niche. And best of all, Seafloors tells us the loan made it possible for them to stay here and do business rather than move to the mainland. We are producing home grown high tech and ask for your continued help to carry on.

"We must also provide economic infrastructure. Agricultural parks are essential to the diversification of our oldest industry. This session, I request the appropriation of some \$7-million to establish a livestock agricultural park on an initial 600 acres.

"To create jobs, we must also create new industries. I'm happy to tell you that our countdown to a commercial space industry is on schedule. We are well on our way to creating a needed industry, and I ask you for \$1.7-million for our office of space industry to continue the countdown.

"Our economic future depends on sound infrastructure.

"Now is the time, not merely to get even, but to get ahead. In the good times, we prepare for the possibility of bad times. We invest in the future.

"Transportation is our economic lifeline, and we are embarked on the most ambitious construction program in the history of our State.

"Many of our airport facilities were built before jets were the common mode of travel. Support funding as you have in the last years and we will have modern-day

terminals at all major State airports and extended runways on all neighbor islands within the next four years.

"Traffic congestion is people's number one everyday problem, and we're attacking it.

- \* With H-3.
- \* With newly constructed high occupancy vehicle lanes.
- \* With the planned construction of the Kalanianaole Highway widening project.
- \* And for the first time in the history of the neighbor islands, county/state long-range transportation plans.

"Across the State, we're on our way with the road widening and bypass construction necessary to ease traffic.

"The ocean is our industrial highway. And in the last two years, we've strengthened and extended piers in Honolulu, Kahului and Nawiliwili. We propose funds for construction of new pier and storage areas at Barbers Point, a second pier at Nawiliwili, and the acquisiiton of the Kapalama Military Reservation, for which I ask your immediate attention.

"In addition, I request the appropriation of some \$37-million for Honolulu waterfront projects which can proceed immediately and which will lend a new grace and excitement to the expanse of our waterfront.

"All of us have given our best to the community we call Hawaii, because our land and our people make our lives full

"It is in this spirit that I propose these actions:

"First, let us remember that whoever and wherever you are in Hawaii, you have the biggest and most wonderful front yard in the world. It is called the Pacific Ocean.

"I propose that we appropriate \$100-million to be merged with other federal monies and establish an environmental special fund to keep that front yard clean.

"Our people have spoken. They demand a better level of wastewater treatment. We certainly heard them in Kailua and what's good for Kailua is good for Kalihi...and Waianae, Hilo and the entire State.

"It will take a county-state partnership to do the job right. We will use the fund to provide direct grants and low interest loans to the counties to help them build wastewater and sewage treatment facilities.

"Using this interest-earning special fund strategically, for matching and leveraging purposes, we will be able to clean up our waters.

"Second, we've all known the natural joy of walking on soft moss and gazing up at the green canopy of a Hawaiian rain forest.

"But will our children and theirs likewise be able to experience our living link to the ancient past?

"Scientists fear that within 20 years, at least half the native Hawaiian plant and animal communities that we now know today may be lost forever. I share that fear.

"Today, I propose a new and permanent commitment of \$4-million a year from our hotel room tax revenues to preserve and manage our natural area reserves and sustain our unique native flora and fauna.

"In my meetings with Hawaii's major landowners, I stress not only the need to improve our economy but also to enhance our environment. Today, I'm very pleased to announce that Castle & Cooke has, at my request, agreed to grant a conservation easement to the nature conservancy to establish a new 462-acre dryland forest preserve in the Kanepu'u area on Lanai.

"This dryland forest preserve will protect at least 48 species of native Hawaiian plants, including the endangered Lanai sandalwood and gardenia. Imagine, eight of the world's 19 wild species of this gardenia are found in Kanepu'u.

"Lastly, we need to preserve our unique and irreplaceable natural areas and beaches for future generations to enjoy. To help us do this, we will be submitting for your consideration new land banking legislation and a request for a \$40-million appropriation over the course of the biennium.

"Hawaii has prospered since I first appeared before you.

"During such times as these, our Constitution requires that we pay a rebate to our taxpayers and they are certainly entitled to one.

"The exact amount of the rebate is left to your discretion. Let me caution, however, against the temptation to establish an exact amount until you have had the opportunity to weigh all the competing demands of our people.

"We also need to heed the wise advice of our Senate Minority Leader to use 'common sense,' remembering that there may be a harder tomorrow.

"Furthermore, if our tax system is generating more than we need to do the public's work, we should fix the system.

"It is upon that principle that I propose the second tax reduction in three years.

"I urge your consideration of a tax reduction package including:

- \* A new credit for excise taxes paid on medical services, up to \$200 per return and double that for senior citizens. By this action, we can reduce taxes and ultimately the cost of medical care.
- \* Higher standard deductions and lower income taxes for all taxpayers.
- \* Additional increases in the dependent care creditadult or child care. By this action, we reduce taxes and increase the independence of the family unit.
- \* Raising the eligibility level for the renter's credit, which will give relief to people moving up the income ladder.

"A family of four earning an adjusted gross income of \$26,000 a year, renting a home and itemizing deductions, would have paid \$1,102 in State taxes before your tax reduction of 1987, \$772 after your action of '87, and only \$480 if you pass this proposal.

"A beginning-to-end reduction of 56 percent in three years.

"That's how I spell relief.

"For some time now, our county governments have come before you requesting an increase in their grants-in-aid appropriation citing as justification the increasing cost of paying for infrastructure such as roads in their jurisdictions. They note, quite correctly, that they are limited only to taxing real property and that the grants-in-aid amounts have not changed in many years.

"Without debating the merits of the various arguments, suffice it to say that I believe the unit of government that is going to spend the citizens' money ought to raise it.

"However, I also believe that these discussions have gone on long enough and that the matter should be resolved. Therefore, I propose that we eliminate the county grants-in-aid and instead transfer to the counties the State's liquor and tobacco taxes along with the complete authority to regulate the use and sale of these items.

"Since the revenues from these taxes are approximately \$60-million a year, our counties would net about \$40-million of an increase in the exchange which would be used to fund infrastructure or perhaps even lower property taxes.

"One last word about taxes. There will be no. . .read my lips. . .no tax proposal submitted for your consideration to raise taxes for State highways. Instead, we will submit innovative legislation to handle that problem in other ways in the days ahead.

"We have proposed to you a number of investments for our people. We believe them to be wise investments in our future. These were investments that were often put aside during our lean years with the promise that someday we would do them. Well, now is the time.

"As Speaker Kihano pointed out on Wednesday, 'We are all dependent on one another.' This morning, I've proposed action to make the lives of our citizens better. Now, as we begin the Fifteenth Legislature, I'd like to speak to the people of this State on behalf of the elected officials who serve you.

"We ask:

"What does make your life worthwhile? What is it, specifically for you, that makes your day fulfilling? We can tell you one thing. What makes your life worthwhile is you.

"We ask you to take what's important to you -- your family, your work, your church or club or school and by all means your government -- and give it that something extra. Make a personal investment for what you believe in

"Whether it's helping coach your daughter's soccer team or something as simple as taking your shopping cart back; supporting the Symphony or learning to strum the ukulele; let us reach into ourselves for the something special which brings quality to our lives.

"Because when you make your life better, you make our community better and our State greater.

"Strengthen one and we strengthen all. For community, you see, is a cooperative enterprise.

"These are the things that make us whole, make us one. One magnificent land and one unconquerable people.

"Mahalo."

Senate President Richard Wong then rose to remark:

"Governor, before proceeding, I was asked by Mrs. Kihano to make a slight correction to the Speaker's announcement. She is not the speaker of the house; she is the governor of the house.

"Thank you very much, Governor Waihee. We certainly appreciate hearing from you on your assessments of the issues facing Hawaii and your ideas on addressing these issues.

"As the legislative session progresses, we look forward to receiving specific proposals from your administration on the points that you have raised today. I am confident that the Legislature will give them full and serious consideration.

"Speaking for myself, Governor, I am pleased that you have emphasized health care for all of our people, improvements to our educational system, both lower and higher, and a redirection of our Pacific region focus. These issues are certainly of concern to me and I am gratified that you share these concerns.

"I am also intrigued by your idea for tax reform as well as suggestion about giving the counties the liquor and tobacco taxes as a source of revenue, discontinuing the grants-in-aid. This certainly has a great deal to be said for it and I look forward in the course of the session to discuss its ramifications further.

#### INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS

No. 45, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION HONORING KODO ON THE COMMENCEMENT OF ITS 'ONE EARTH TOUR 1989' FOR ITS EFFORTS IN BRINGING WORLDWIDE RECOGNITION TO TRADITIONAL TAIKO DRUM PLAYING AND IN PROMOTING PEACE AND UNDERSTANDING IN THE WORLD," was jointly offered by Representatives Fukunaga, Horita, Taniguchi, Kotani, Alcon, Anderson, Andrews, Apo, Arakaki, Baker, Bunda, Bybee, Cachola, Cavasso, Chang, Duldulao, Hashimoto, Hayes, Hemmings, Hiraki, Hirayama, Hirono, Honda, D. Ige, Ihara, Isbell, Kanoho, Kawakami, Kihano, Lee, Marumoto, Metcalf, Okamura, O'Kieffe, Oshiro, Say, Shon, Stegmaier, Takamine, Tam, Tom and Yoshimura.

On motion by Representative Fukunaga, seconded by Representative Horita and carried, H.R. No. 45 was adopted.

Representative Kotani rose and offered a few remarks on behalf of the co-introducers of the resolution, stating:

"During an earlier visit, these artists were billed as 'The Demon Drummers of Sado.' Indeed, they are demonic in their intensity and their commitment to their craft. The drummers get up every morning at 6:00 a.m. and run six miles as part of their training regimen. From 1975 to 1980, they ran in the Boston Marathon and performed when they reached the finish line.

"Centered on the massive Japanese drum, the taiko, KODO performances combine the music of traditional and contemporary instruments, mime, and dance.

"Taiko drum playing is familiar to our islands because the taiko came to our islands with the Japanese immigrants in the late 1800s and is familiar to all those who have attended bon dances during the summer. Many of us can remember the celebration at the Buddhist temple in the early evening -- the shave ice and barbecue sticks, the antics of old men in yukatas kicking up their heels, the poised dancers in colorful kimonos circling the tower called the yagura -- and the beat of the taiko throbbing through our bodies and linking together the circle of dancers with the bystanders.

"Thus, I believe that we can appreciate the theme of KODO's current 'One Earth Tour.' The taiko links us to the traditions of the past and binds us together in the celebrations of the present. The beating of the taiko expressed the vibrant harmony of the rural village and KODO's proclaimed mission is to bring the sounds of the taiko to all the people of our planet, so that 'we might all be reminded of our membership in that much larger and more important village of the world.'

"This reminder is even more significant for us, seemingly isolated here in the middle of the Pacific, that now, more than ever, we are indeed part of the global village.

"There hasn't been an empty seat at the Oahu performances by KODO, and nobody has been disappointed. I'm sure that the members of the Hawaii Matsuri Taiko and other local taiko drummers and the school children for whom KODO performed appreciated their willingness to share their talents. Perhaps someday, the revival of interest in the taiko in Hawaii will reach the point where our performers, too, will be able to perform abroad.

"I join my colleagues in commending all the members of KODO, and their director, Mr. Yoshiaki Oi, for their creative contribution to peace and understanding, and their vision of one earth.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Fukunaga then rose to introduce the honorees, as follows: Mr. Yoshiaki Oi, Director; Mr. Takashi Akamine, Manager; Mr. Motofumi Yamaguchi and Mr. Yoshikazu Fujimoto, senior performers; and Provost Peter Dobson of Leeward Community College, "whom we would like to thank for sponsoring this group for so many years."

Representative Fukunaga then asked the following persons, who were seated in the gallery, to stand to be recognized: Mr. Bob Ward, Assistant Manager; Mrs. Faye Komagata "who heads the Wahiawa Hawaii Matsuri Taiko Group"; Mr. Richard Aadland, Coodinator of Theater Programs at Leeward Community College; and Mrs. Kathleen Cabral, Theater Manager at Leeward Community College.

Floral leis were presented to the honorees by Representatives Horita, Hashimoto, Kawakami, Marumoto and Fukunaga.

#### INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

H.R. No. 47, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE HAWAII CRIMINAL JUSTICE COMMISSION," was jointly offered by Representatives Hirono, Metcalf, Anderson, Bellinger, Bybee, Cachola, Cavasso, Chang, Fukunaga, Hagino, Hashimoto, Hemmings, Hiraki, Honda, Horita, D. Ige, Ihara, Isbell, Kanoho, Kawakami, Kihano, Kotani, Leong, Okamura, Oshiro, Say, Souki, Stegmaier, Tajiri, Takamine, Taniguchi, Tom and Yoshimura and was read by the Clerk.

On motion by Representative Hirono, seconded by Representative Metcalf and carried, H.R. No. 47 was adopted.

Representative Hirono then rose and stated:

"My colleagues know that I very rarely do floor presentations; in fact, in the nine years that I have been here, I believe I have a total of perhaps three floor presentations. So, this is really quite a first, you know, to do this so early in the session.

"Before I introduce our honored guests, I would like to make a few additional remarks.

"It's not everyday that a Hawaii program gains national recognition for the work that they have done, and the Hawaii Criminal Justice Commission and the work that they have been doing richly deserves this recognition. As the resolution which was read indicates, their work has been innovative, extensive and varied. Some of the activities for 1989 include the second annual safety action seminars which is a series of workshops dealing with topical issues in the area of crime prevention. They are also going to do a crime prevention conference in June in collaboration with the Police Department and the military and, of course, they are going to sponsor the third annual McGruff Fun Run.

"Representative Hiraki and I have run in the first two Fun Runs and we intend to do this coming Fun Run in October and I hope to see many of you join us in this physical effort because, thank goodness, we need to get into some sort of physical activity rather than just what we are doing here.

"In addition to these activities, they are also planning a program which is similar to the McGruff Truck Program and this is a program that is going to be called the McGruff House and will involve establishments like the Post Office and 7-Eleven stores. And these kinds of places will be deemed safe havens for childen and adults who may need emergency assistance. I don't know if you are familiar with the Truck Program but that is a program that is conducted by the Criminal Justice Commission in conjunction with Hawaiian Electric, Hawaiian Telephone, Oceanic and the Gas Company and they provide their trucks as safe havens for children.

"All of these programs have been very innovative, very well supported by corporations and members of the public, and I would like to thank the corporations for all of the time, effort, and support they have given to the Hawaii Criminal Justice Program.

"At this time, I would like to introduce our honored guests sitting with us on the floor.

"First, Roy Chang who is the chairman of the Commission. He has been the chairman of the Commission since 1985 and this will be his fourth year, and Mr. Chang is one of the most creative individuals that I know of. I've known Mr. Chang for many years and we used to go jogging together and as we were jogging, he's telling me about all of the plans for the Commission and asking, what you think of this and what do you think of that. The man is constantly thinking of new things. That is very much reflected in the work of the Commission since he took over as chairman -- Mr. Chang.

"Our second honored guest is widely recognized. I don't think I need to even introduce him but Mr. McGruff, would you stand and be recognized -- our crime prevention dog.

I would also like to have Mr. Alan Shimabukuro stand to be recognized. He is the Executive Director of the Hawaii Criminal Justice Commission and has been since 1987

"In addition to the guests on the floor, we do have some of our commissioners as well as staff people who are in the gallery. I would like to ask them to stand; in particular, I would like to recognize Jay Sasan from Hawaii, Lee Ohigashi from Maui, and Dane Oda from Kauai, who flew over from those islands to be with us this morning."

Representative Hirono then presented Mr. Chang with a certified copy of the resolution, while floral leis were presented to the honorees by Representatives Amaral, Hayes, Horita and Metcalf.

"It was President Theodore Roosevelt who once said, and I quote: 'If you are going to do anything for humanity, the chances of success lie not in working with the man but with the child for the child of today is the citizen of tomorrow.'

"Indeed the fate of our future lies in our families and how well they nurture our collective investments in that future. Unfortunately, our families have changed and the laws, attitudes, government policies and agency practices that help families have not kept up with the changes. That means our fumbling, stumbling and failing because we still think of families being like 'Leave it to Beaver' with white collar Ward, and prim housewife June, wonderful Wally the teenager, and the cute Beaver. We might even think of families being like the Waltons and their little farmhouse in the country. Such are the wonders of TV, but it is time for a reality check.

"We have families on welfare, families with both parents working, families that can afford child care, single parent families, and many economic and legal barriers that affect non-traditional families. And it doesn't get any better because children of disfunctional families become problems that they must sooner or later pay for.

"While the Human Services Committee strives to provide services and programs to help families and kids in trouble, we also recognize the tremendous value and economy of preventive programs. When that prevention program also involves a partnership of the media, the corporate sector, and community leaders working together towards a common goal, it is like finding gold, and we all benefit.

"Believe it or not, members, there are programs that work without government assistance.

"Mr. Speaker and members, families are not special interest groups. In fact, it is one of the few interests that we all share in common and represent. The social economics and the ethnic makeup may defer in our respective districts, but our families remain the lifeblood in each of our communities.

"For that reason, I ask all of you to salute a program that helps to strengthen our families and, in turn, enrich the lives of our children."

"May I introduce some of the people who helped to make KHON's 'For Kids' Sake' program possible."

That dream of perfection and to say, 'I possess a talent that most people do not have -- an ear for melody, for harmony, and beautiful sound.'

"You know, the New York Philharmonic, the Philadelphia Orchestra, the Seattle Symphony, and orchestras in West Germany, in South Africa, are just some of the musical highs experienced by Hawaii's youth who had their beginnings in the Hawaii Youth Symphony.

"Mr. Speaker, what an honor for us as State Representatives today to be entertained and to be enriched by such a worthwhile youth organization as Hawaii's Youth Symphony.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."
