## JOURNAL OF THE HOUSE

#### FIRST DAY

#### Wednesday, January 16, 1990

In accordance with the provisions of Section 10 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, the House of Representatives of the Sixteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii convened in Regular Session on Wednesday, January 16, 1991. The Honorable Jerry L. Chang, being the Representative at the time present who was elected from the First Representative District of the State of Hawaii, called the House to order at 10:13 o'clock a.m.

The members of the House, guests, and audience rose to sing the National Anthem and "Hawaii Ponoi" led by Ms. Yvonne Perry.

Representative Chang appointed Representatives Arakaki, Bainum, Bunda, Morihara, Okamura, Tatibouet, Tom and Young to escort Reverend William Kaina to the rostrum.

Reverend William Kaina then invoked the Divine Blessing.

## INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

H.R. No. 1, declaring the Honorable Jerry L. Chang, Representative from the First District, as the duly elected Temporary Chairman of the House of Representatives of the Sixteenth Legislature was jointly offered by Representatives Honda and Hashimoto and was read by the Temporary Clerk.

On motion by Representative Honda, seconded by Representative Hashimoto and carried, H.R. No. 1 was adopted.

Representative Chang stated:

"Members of the House of Representatives of the Sixteenth State Legislature, I am honored to be your Temporary Chairman this morning. Thank you. Let us commence with the order of the day."

The Temporary Chairman appointed Gerald Miyoshi as Temporary Clerk of the House of Representatives.

# INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

H.R. No. 2, declaring the Honorable Daniel J. Kihano, Representative from the Eleventh District, and Peter K. Apo, Representative from the Forty-Ninth District, as Speaker and Vice Speaker, respectively, of the House of Representatives of the Sixteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii was jointly offered by Representatives Souki and Takamine and was read by the Temporary Clerk.

On motion by Representative Souki, seconded by Representative Takamine and carried, H.R. No. 2 was adopted.

The Temporary Chairman appointed Representatives Alcon, Anderson, Apo, Arakaki, Cachola, Honda, Kawakami, O'Kieffe, Peters, Say, Tajiri, Taniguchi and Yoshimura to escort the newly elected Speaker to the rostrum whereupon the Temporary Chairman presented the gavel to the newly elected Speaker.

The Speaker took the Chair and stated:

"Governor Waihee, Mrs. Waihee, Lieutenant Governor Cayetano, Mrs. Cayetano, Chief Justice Lum, Congresswoman Patsy Mink, Congressman Neil Abercrombie, Admiral and Mrs. Hardesty, Admiral Charles Larson, Mayor JoAnn Yukimura, Mayor Linda Lingle, Mayor Lorraine Inouye, former Governor and Mrs. George Ariyoshi, neighbors, family and friends. . E Komo Mai. . . Aloha and welcome to the chambers of the State House of Representatives.

"Over half a century ago, the 32nd President of this great nation asserted his conviction that 'the only thing to fear is fear itself.' Time has proven Franklin Delano Roosevelt correct in this belief.

"In that decade and in the decade of the 90's, these wise words have meaning. Back then it calmed a frightened and confused nation. Today, beset by problems of a nation on the 'brink of war' or at a minimum, poised for a violent confrontation of international proportions, I believe people may again feel confused, frustrated, and afraid. Then and now, people will look to leaders they can trust -- those who create a feeling of confidence and who provide hope.

"As leaders of this great state, our responsibility to our people is very clear. We must honestly assess the

problems and conditions facing our state and our nation. More important, we must tell people the truth -- which always isn't easy to determine, and which may oftentimes be painful or unpopular.

"It is time to take the proverbial 'bull by the horns' and talk sense to the people of Hawaii. During this time of uncertainty we must be mindful of the fact that we need to respond to public concern, not public prejudice.

"As a predecessor of mine at this podium said in the 1980's, 'Let's be honest about our roles and responsibilities in this process. . .' We are a deliberative body -- we listen to people, consider facts, and try to make the best decisions possible.

"But before we begin to face the issues and speak honestly about social and economic problems, let us take a few moments and refelct upon the Middle East crisis.

"As history will teach us and as the Kuwaiti crisis will remind us, peace and progress are dependent on the willingness of countries and people to work with one another. No one should deny this dependency.

"However, for some the path of aggression and violence are an easier means to an objective. It took only 12 hours for Saddam Hussein to deny Kuwait its right to self-determination, to try and gain regional dominance in the Arab sector, to rock the world stock and currency markets, and to propel the rest of the world to join forces and bear arms in defense.

"On the domestic front, our energy prices soared adding further injury to our worries of dealing with an overwhelming federal deficit, the savings and loan crisis, and a nationwide recession. But these worries are overshadowed and lessened with the hopes and prayers that America's sons and daughters will fare well as they join with other nations to end the injustice, tyranny and exploitation imposed by the Iraqi government.

"Although Hawaii has not yet outwardly suffered the economic prophecy that has befallen many of our sisterstates, she too has sent her share of native sons and daughters to the Saudi Arabia border. As we wait fearfully and yet patiently for all nations to resolve this crisis, let us reflect for a moment. Let us reflect where Hawaii has travelled and where Hawaii is currently.

"Take pride, Hawaii. As we look about us today and gaze at the mixed racial features and the innocent yet contented expressions of our children, we will realize that Hawaii is firmly built upon the continuous blending of culture and race. Although some of us are not Hawaiians by blood, we are Hawaiians by adopted thought and culture. By the grace and compassion of the true Native Hawaiians, many of us came and established roots, and raised our children as Hawaiians in an island paradise comparable to no other. This is our home.

"Take pride, Hawaii. As we look about us today and gaze mauka at the narrow, sloping ridges of the Koolaus -- then gaze makai across a vast, urban sprawl to lengthy stretches of white beaches and warm blue waters -- we will realize that Hawaii is firmly built upon the hard work of many hands and dedicted hearts. For those of earlier generations, remember the blistering sun and dusty cane fields of plantation work? The 'mom and pop' corner grocery stores? For those of my generation, remember Statehood, the construction of Ala Moana Center on reclaimed swamp land, and Henry J. Kaiser's development of Hawaii Kai? For those of later generations, remember the old Biltmore Hotel and King's Alley, the Termite Palace and the Aloha Stadium, the Alexander Young Building and Tamarind Park? We have

come a long way, but we must continue to preserve and nurture Hawaii in harmony with the island ways and lifestyles. This is our heritage.

"Be proud, Hawaii. As we look about today and gaze beyond the shores of these gentle islnds, let us remember the colorful and unified diversity of thought and culure we have brought, and will continue to bring, to the mainland and the rest of the world. With the voyage of the Polynesian, the coming of the missionaries, the immigration of the Asian and the many others that followed, we have long recognized the need and the necessity to work with each other as a condition of peace and progress within these islands. This is our history -- our sense of place in time.

"Today, as we convene the Sixteenth Legislature, our moods may be tempered by the effects of the Iraqi conflict, but we are still buoyant with the hope and light of each new day.

"Given our island heritage, we have survived every struggle known to affect the world as well as every personal struggle known to affect each and every one of us. It is clear that Hawaii will never lose its vision and purpose. We are an ohana that can, and will, brave every societal conflict and every economic prophecy of worsened times. We are an ohana that will remember and treasure our traditions and ideals, and at the same time embrace new and innovative ideas and methods. We are an ohana that acknowledges the workings of fate, but recognizes the capabilities of man to choose the paths most agreeable and befitting to all of us. We do not claim to have all the answers, but we can claim to have the courage, faith, and perseverance to work together and move forward. We are not afraid. In the hands of God, we rely on our collective strengths to meet our destinies honestly with responsibility.

"In this context, I am reminded of an old biblical saying -- 'for those to whom much is given, much is required.' Local economists predict that Hawaii will not suffer a recession in 1991. While this is good news, we must not become complacent. We must be prudent and mindful of our good fortune. Moreover, we must make the most efficient use of our tax dollars and continue to strengthen State programs and services for the people. For in the final analysis, it is our collective, daily efforts that will preserve the Hawaii which we love.

"And so my fellow citizens, I am honored to be with you today. On behalf of the members of the House of Representatives for the State of Hawaii, we thank you for your support.

"Mahalo and Godspeed!"

The Chair appointed Representatives Baker, Bellinger, Duldulao, Horita, Isbell, Kanoho, Lee and Marumoto to escort the Honorable Peter K. Apo to the rostrum.

The Chair then said:

"Members of the House, friends, and people of the State of Hawaii, I present the Honorable Peter K. Apo, Vice Speaker of the House of Representatives."

The Chair recognized Representative Anderson, Minority Leader, who rose and responded:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to explain something before I say a couple of words. I didn't want anyone to think that I was lost when I knew I got off the mauka side of the stage and right away went to the makai side. So that's where I went rather than northwest.

"Mr. Speaker, whatever our philosophical differences are in this chamber, we are ultimately one people and in the spirit of loving our people and our islands, and the love of our country, I would request that your words be entered into the Journal as my own.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The Chair "so ordered." (By reference only).

The Chair then recognized Representative Taniguchi, Majority Leader, who rose and responded:

"Mr. Speaker, on behalf of the Majority members of the House of Representatives, Aloha to you, and welcome to our honored guests, our friends, and our families.

"Today as we convene the Sixteenth Legislature, we do so somberly. However, I'm here to assure you, Mr. Speaker, that your Majority Caucus is ready to proceed with a new sense of unity, with sincere determination, and still committed to one goal to best serve the interests of all the people of Hawaii.

"Thank you."

#### INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

H.C.R. No. 2, entitled: "HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION DECLARING HAWAII'S UNWAVERING SUPPORT FOR THE MEN AND WOMEN OF THE UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES AND THEIR FAMILIES DURING THE CONFLICT IN THE PERSIAN GULF," was jointly offered by Representatives Kihano, Apo, Arakaki, Cachola, Taniguchi, Yoshimura, Alcon, Amaral, Anderson, Bainum, Baker, Bellinger, Chang, Chun, Duldulao, Fukunaga, Hashimoto, Hirono, Honda, Horita, D. Ige, Ihara, Isbell, Kanoho, Kawakami, Lee, Marumoto, Morihara, Okamura, O'Kieffe, Oshiro, Peters, Santiago, Say, Souki, Stegmaier, Tajiri, Takamine, Tam, Tatibouet, Thielen, Tom, Ward, Yonamine and Young and was read by the Clerk.

Representative Taniguchi moved that H.C.R. No. 2 be adopted, seconded by Representative Anderson.

Representative O'Kieffe then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak in favor of ths significant resolution.

"Twenty-seven years ago last November, as I was returning to work from lunch, rising in a Chicago elevator, I learned that a shooting had taken place in Dallas.

"Two days ago, as I was returning to work from lunch, rising in our own elevator here in this Legislature, I again learned that a shooting had taken place -- this time in a country called Iraq.

"The course of history was dramatically changed that day in November just as history is being changed even as we speak today.

"I was profoundly affected by the songs we sang on Opening Day as if I had a prior sense of foreboding.

"I am saddened beyond belief because we are now at war where no one wins.

"We all cherish peace. . .freedom. . . liberty.

"To my adopted State of Hawaii and to the state and country of my birth, my thoughts are with all of you who are involved.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Lee then rose to speak in favor of the resolution, stating:

"This resolution expresses our sentiments but I would like to express what I think is important in this resolution and what is happening in the Middle East.

"In time of an emergency, a crisis or war, we have to make difficult decisions, stand up, and be counted.

"The President and the Congress have made difficult decisions. It is time for us to support our men and women who are carrying out their decisions.

"The President and the Secretary of State have built a unique and bold coalition of all nations in the United Nations. They stand together, the five big powers and the smaller states.

"This collective security action, unprecedented in history and the dream of President Woodrow Wilson and President Franklin Roosevelt, has come to fruition. This is the historic importance of the allied coalition.

"Only the United States could have provided the moral inspiration and the practical leadership in the long fight for international law and order.

"I support that moral inspiration and leadership.

"Yet the situation in the Middle East demands further moral and political leadership. The settlement that followed the end of the Ottoman Empire and World War I is unravelling.

"The United States must pick up what President Jimmy Carter started. President Carter worked for peace in the Middle East. He succeeded at Camp David, and Egypt and Israel have been at peace as neighbors for a long decade.

"President Carter was unable to proceed with the international conference which the French and the Europeans are now calling for. This is the goal before us after the hostilities. President Bush says he wants to be a healer. Let us pray that he can do so.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Horita then rose to speak in favor of the resolution, stating:

"As we begin the 16th legislative session, our President, our soldiers, and our country face the most perilous period of time my generation can remember. It is quite sobering for us to stand here today as our fellow Americans again put their lives on the line in a far off part of the world. Our hearts and prayers go out to them there and their families that are here and throughout the world.

"It is also a somber time when we consider that here in America, half of our country has entered a period of economic recession. . .where financial institutions have begun to fail in numbers not seen since the Great Depression.

"It is a time when all members of this House must remind ourselves of the seriousness of the tasks facing us as elected public officials. We each have an important mission with which we have been charged to serve the people of this State.

"Let us not forget our responsibility is not to our individual selves. . .that our duty lies in achieving the public good.

"Let us not let our personal disagreements or disputes, our past differences and arguments, detract us from reaching that goal of service to the public. The problems we must contend with are too great for such petty distractions.

"We have all been through a very difficult organizational challenge. But with that effort completed, let us put aside the differences that have divided us. Instead, let us look for the many things in common which will unite us to achieve the common good for the people of this State.

"I have come to know all of you, and I know that we can accomplish this because of our dedication to public service. But more so, I know that we will achieve this

because these troubled times that face our nation and our State demand it of us.

"To take a phrase from a popular song today and another from a song during another troubling time in American history, 'It's the "hope of hopes" that will help us to "keep on, keeping on."

"With these thoughts in our hearts and minds, let us proceed with the order of the day.

"Thank you."

Representative Ward then rose to speak in favor of the resolution, stating:

"I appreciate this opportunity and hopefully it's an opportunity that I will never have again even though it was in 1965 that there was a similar motion in this body even though it was about Vietnam. Hopefully this body will never have to speak as we are today again.

"I speak in support of the resolution, particularly in support of the total disarmament of Iraq, for the total support of our troops in the field for the protection of Saudi Arabia, and for the protection of Israel and all the surrounding nations.

"As a Vietnam veteran, it is particularly touching to speak on the House floor of this, particularly as I will not submit an amendment but I would suggest that further in the future, this body deal with sending each of the troops that were deployed in Hawaii a letter of commendation. When they come back, we send them a letter of welcome. Some of us who came back from Vietnam -- we were unknown and we were undesirables.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Stegmaier then rose to speak in favor of the resolution, stating:

"Out of this United Nations endorsed military action, I believe that the possibility develops of a strong and lasting peace which will have implications for peace world-wide. It may well be that through the united efforts of the world community of nations in stopping Iraqi aggression through the courageous leadership of the United States as well as the goodwill and restraint of America's Middle Eastern allies, we may be positioned to begin the process of working out a solution to the plight of a homeless Palestinian people. Should this be the result, we shall be forever indebted to the courageous actions of this multinational force and to the soldiers, sailors, marines, airmen and women who are putting their lives on the line for peace in the Middle East.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Young then rose to speak in favor of the resolution, stating:

"Today, I saw in the newspapers a picture of Martin Luther King next to a column headlined, 'WAR.' I was both saddened and stirred by this very historic juxtaposition. As I watched on television the incredible accuracy of and subsequent destruction by the sophisticated high-tech weapons, I was stirred by the challenge for our future. I saw what I hoped may be the end of an era. May this be our last war. May this conflict single the need for global coalitions for peace.

"Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.C.R. No. 2 was unanimously adopted by a rising vote.

At this time, Representative Young was granted permission to make a late introduction and she introduced her son, Dr. Harry V. Daniels, III, "a former student at Kamehameha Schools, a former Peace Corps worker who spent four years in Africa, and now an aquaculturalist residing in Guayaquil, Ecuador."

At 9:41 o'clock a.m., on motion by Representative Arakaki, seconded by Representative O'Kieffe and carried, the House of Representatives stood in recess subject to the call of the Chair to meet in Joint Session with the Senate, in accordance with House Concurrent Resolution No. 1, to receive the Governor's State-of-the-State address.

#### JOINT SESSION

The Joint Session of the House of Representatives and the Senate was called to order at 10:00 o'clock a.m. by the Honorable Daniel Kihano, Speaker of the House of Representatives.

The Divine Blessing was invoked by Munawwar Ali Khan (Moslem).

At this time, the Speaker welcomed and introduced the following distinguished guests to the members of the Sixteenth Legislature:

The Chair then appointed Representatives Apo, Taniguchi and Anderson, and Senators Hagino, Aki and George to escort the Honorable John David Waihee, Governor of the State of Hawaii, to the rostrum.

Senator Ann Kobayashi and Representative Baker presented Governor Waihee with a maile\ilima lei on behalf of the Senate and the House of Representatives.

The Speaker then presented to the members of the Sixteenth Legislature and guests, the Honorable John D. Waihee, stating:

"Members of the House and Senate, ladies and gentlemen, the Governor of this great state of Hawaii, Governor John David Waihee."

The Governor addressed the Joint Session as follows:

"Thank you.

"President Wong, Speaker Kihano, members of the Sixteenth Legislature, honored guests, ladies and gentlemen:

"Today, as we gather, our hearts are heavy, our country at war. Over 8,300 Hawaii-based military men and women are serving with thousands of our fellow Americans in the Middle East. It is right that we honor their sacrifice with a moment of silence. Let us bow our heads and each in our own way, give a silent prayer for their return.

"Four years ago, I stood before you for the first time and declared our intention to be an activist state government, creating an economic and social environment right for our Pacific community entering the 21st century.

"Thereafter, we opened the doors and the minds of government to new partnerships and new approaches. As a result, the people of Hawaii have many new gains: Universal access to health care insurance; the A+Afterschool Program; a school superfund and the beginnings of school reform; a university system rated in the country's top ten in educational quality for the dollar; a comprehensive State housing program; tax reform recently referred to in the Wall Street Journal as 'dropping far faster than any state's'; land-banking and the best state endangered species propagation facility in America.

"We've worked hard at getting ahead.

"And today, I want to talk to you about staying ahead.

"We face many odds: Federal deficits, a national recession, war, the threat of terrorism, energy instability, and the military use of commercial aircraft. Any one of these conditions, while alarming, we would have managed as a tough task. Together, they may be the greatest threat to our economy in our State's history.

"The Federal government faces a staggering 3.2 trillion dollar national debt. To place that in context, on a per capita basis, Hawaii residents pay more for interest -- just interest -- on the national debt than they do in Hawaii State personal income tax.

"To avoid deeper debt, the federal government is increasing taxes, cutting services and mandating the states to do more with less federal help. The reality is that with problems as deep and as wide as homelessness and pollution, Washington has no coherent domestic policy. In effect, they are passing us the buck, without giving us a buck to do it.

"We also face a national recession, the first in eight years. It has ravaged certain sections of this country. Some states, and we are one, have avoided its harsh grasp, but none will avoid its impacts.

"We are a world at war and with war comes increased stress on already burdened economic conditions. Despite the best of intentions, the national deficit will obviously increase. The instability of oil prices and supply has exacerbated the national recession, increased the cost of living and the price of travel. The military deployment of civilian aircraft affects all domestic carriers. The growing anxiety over international terrorism is affecting all destinations, as consumers become increasingly concerned about their security.

"As a result, Hawaii's tourism industry is suffering. Hotel occupancies are down, advance bookings have fallen off, and for the first time, group tours are cancelling. Fortunately, the eastbound travel market, especially visitors from Japan, continues to be strong. Nonetheless, if present trends continue, we face even more severe consequences, including the possibility of employee layoffs.

"Furthermore, since tourism is our primary industry, the economic impact of the slowdown is already being felt in other sectors of our economy.

"The question we now face is how we respond to this set of challenges.

"Do we sit back and take what comes? Do we passively lower our goals as a society? Or do we take stock, take action and stay ahead?

"I propose we stay ahead. We do it with security to protect our people, economic action to offset downturns and promote recovery; and fiscal fitness so that we meet our people's needs with the resources that we have.

"To begin with, we must remember that we are all in this together. Nothing comes before the welfare and safety of our people. Nothing.

"Security measures are in place to protect the public. I will not apologize for inconveniences at airports or elsewhere. That's all a part of tightening up.

"We are monitoring the flow of consumer goods to Hawaii. There is no shortage or anticipated shortage of any essential. Indeed, I would like to report an oversupply, not an undersupply, of rice by our major supplier, California. You see, one of their biggest customers, Iraq, hasn't placed any orders for a while. Folks, there is simply no reason to hoard anything.

"The flow of fuel to Hawaii remains steady and we are assured a solid 90 day supply. We wisely activated our emergency energy plan months ago, and although I hope never to implement its higher level actions, we are ready. I have instructed the State energy office to hold a news conference in the near future to update the public on the emergency energy plan.

"On the subject of military deployment of civilian aircraft, we will continue to monitor effects.

"Whatever transpires, prior actions we have taken to increase and diversify our air service readies us for this situation. In the last four years we have increased the number of international carriers to Hawaii from 19 to 25. We are participating in air rights negotiations involving 13 different countries which have already given us 448,000 new seats from international cities in 1990 and 851,000 in 1991. No one will cut off our highways in the sky.

"Incidentally, while we are discussing the topic of our people's security, I believe that it is time to stop the proliferation of military-style assault weapons in our society. Before a tragedy occurs, I urge you to support the crimefighters' coalition on this matter.

"We must pursue measures that offset the downward turn of our economy and work toward Hawaii's economic recovery. The success of our State's economy is fundamental to the success of everything we want to achieve as a society. We must build from our strengths:

- \* From an economy that over the last four years grew at an average rate which was 89 percent faster than the nation's.
- \* From the power of small businesses, where Hawaii ranked third in growth in the nation in 1989.
- \* From a very healthy job growth rate, 66 percent higher than the nation's from 1986 to 1989.
- \* From a 1990 unemployment rate that was the second lowest in the country.

"Yesterday's challenge was to improve our business climate. Today's challenge is to sustain a balanced economy. I call it staying ahead.

"The most basic need of our recovery strategy is to move quickly to revitalize our travel industry.

"Thus, I have already approved a 1.4 million dollar four-week radio, direct mail and print media promotion campaign targeted toward our base market on the West Coast where we believe the quickest response is possible. The campaign will be equally funded by the State and the private sector and implemented as soon as prudently possible given our nation's wartime sensitivities.

"In addition, I will ask you for a special appropriation to fund major promotions in our big markets immediately when the war ends.

"While these countermeasures are absolutely vital to our present economic well-being, they are supplemental to our existing strategy of developing new markets. We must continue these efforts to ensure the long term vitality of our travel industry. "Important to our tourism plant is the development of a Waikiki Convention Center. There is no better time than now to review this project. If the present site is inappropriate for the center as legislated, we should consider expanding the site, making the center smaller or moving it. If the Aloha Motors site will meet our industry's needs, then so be it. In any event, it is time we make this project work or forget about it.

"Staying ahead means helping business stimulate business. It does not mean sending dollars out of our economy to be held in a trust fund in Washington, which is exactly what we are doing with the unemployment insurance tax. The Department of Labor tells me that our unemployment insurance fund is so strong right now it can sustain a 12 percent unemployment rate for two solid years.

"This session, I will again submit to you a proposal to reduce unemployment insurance costs and provide a job training fund. Let's keep our monies at home to stimulate our economy and benefit our businesses, especially small businesses, and workers.

"As we enter the final decade of this century, Hawaii must fully realize its potential as a center of Pacific trade, finance and commerce. Many sectors of our economy are ready to enter the exciting and challenging export market. To help Hawaii business work in the global marketplace, we are developing an International Business Center, with data base services on trade which will be available to Hawaii businesses in the next few months.

"Our Office of International Relations will provide the leadership to ensure that 'thinking globally and acting locally' is more than a slogan. The time has come to define international activities on our own terms.

"One bright spot in our present economic outlook is the construction industry. Staying ahead means priming its economic pump. By doing this we achieve the dual objectives of keeping people working and catching up on our much needed public infrastructure.

"For example, I have asked the Department of Education and the Department of Accounting and General Services to implement a year-round program for the construction and repair and maintenance of schools.

"Our housing program will continue at full speed, not only to meet the shelter needs of our people but also to stimulate construction.

"The improvement of our transportation facilities also must continue. Unfortunately, the Highway Revenue Task Force reports that in the last several years, costs have outpaced revenues, creating a need for more income for the highway fund.

"I will submit the recommendation of the task force to you for your consideration. I ask you to review this situation and consider whether an increase in the fuel tax is indeed warranted.

"Energy is a concern for all of us. Today, it is no less basic to our survival than water.

"Recognizing this, we have initiated the approaches of integrated resource planning and demand-side management. We must consider all costs, including environmental and social, of each energy option. Through demand-side management, energy efficiency will be considered an energy option. It is well past time to reward conservation.

"In addition, we must continue our support of research and development of alternative energy resources. Geothermal energy remains an important option.

"On the policy level, we need to debate and decide whether alternate energy prices should be fixed to the price of oil. Is the preservation of the environment and the reduction of reliance on oil worth the possible higher costs? For example, are we willing to guarantee our sugar growers a fixed price for energy production, regardless of the price of oil?

"Action is necessary at all levels.

"Staying ahead means staying fiscally fit as a state. During the last few years, with huge budget surpluses, maintaining fiscal fitness was an enviable task. Today, given our current economic condition, we are clearly in for diet and exercise.

"Last October, when the world seemed a lot simpler, the Hawaii State Council on Revenues estimated that State tax revenues would increase by 8.5 percent this fiscal year, 11 percent next fiscal year, and 6.8 percent the following year. These revenue estimates, while healthy when compared to the rest of the country, were modest compared to the revenue increases we received in the recent past.

"Accordingly, we submitted a budget to you on December 27th that scaled down spending and proposed moderate increases for priority programs. What it cut most of all were spending expectations.

"Well, two weeks ago, prior to the outbreak of the war, the Council revised downward the October revenue estimates. Based largely on the greater than anticipated impact the national recession was having on our travel industry, the Council indicated that tax revenues would be approximately 150 million dollars less for the biennium than predicted.

"Will even that conservative projection hold? Given our current state of economic flux, your leadership and I have our doubts, and thus, have taken the extraordinary action of asking the Council to reconvene tomorrow and review their current estimates.

"Upon the receipt of the revenue estimates, we will do the following:

- Develop a new financial plan for the upcoming biennium. We have agreed with your legislative leadership to jointly develop this financial plan so we may have common parameters in the preparation of the State budget;
- Institute additional administrative spending guidelines for this fiscal year. We already have in place spending restrictions to promote efficiency and savings. These will be enhanced to create additional savings for this fiscal year; and
- 3. We will submit for your consideration revisions to the State budget proposal that is presently before

"Our objective remains the development of a State budget that is disciplined yet focused on the priority needs of our State. To do this, we must be willing to reallocate existing resources from lower priority programs to higher priority ones. We must choose our goals and shape government to achieve them, not create government and then wedge our goals in.

"Indeed, what better time than now to take a totally fresh look at how government can do better with the tasks it has at hand. We need to ask the question: Can we fundamentally shift the ways in which we approach and handle the jobs of state government in order to minimize the resources required. Thus, I have instructed the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs Director, Robbie Alm, to develop a 'mini Hoover Commission' to oversee this important reassessment.

"In the days ahead you and I will have to make some tough choices as we pursue our people's agenda. Yet the choices we make today will make the difference tomorrow. These are some of the priorities I see:

"Education. You and I have made historic appropriations to public education -- a 54 percent increase in the last four years. We reached agreement on a competitive four-year teachers' contract, created the nation's first school facility superfund and made real progress in school repair.

"More than money, two years ago we called for a revolution in public education. Today we are in the middle of that revolution, and the rallying cry is ownership and results. The struggle will end when the schools are controlled by the people who use them, and our students are reaching the high standards we set for them.

"But have our actions and allocation of resources really supported the cry for ownership and results? I propose this course for public education.

"For ownership, we must begin by increasing flexibility. I propose taking the approximately 70 million dollars a year now budgeted for a collection of some 40 programs which have been placed on the school system top-down over the years, and turning it over in lump sum to the Board of Education. No mandates, no strings, no sacred cows. Just allocate it towards reform and educational progress. New schools mean new schools of thought.

"In addition, we must make school/community-based management a success. We should increase incentive funding for SCBM schools. We need working, successful models in the community. When we have the quality, the quantity will follow. As was originally intended, special needs schools should be incorporated into SCBM and provided the widest array of services possible.

"We must test delivery systems for early childhood education, with the priority being for special needs school communities. Possible approaches include enhancing head start and expanding the open doors program.

"For results, I call for the creation of a Commission For Performance Goals. The commission would finally and firmly set the performance standards of achievement expected of all students. Curriculum can't be planned or resources prioritized without clear goals in place.

"Finally, as I said earlier with government as a whole, we must rethink the issue of governance in education. What we have structured for today was established for yesterday. As a result, public education does more hoopjumping than any other unit of state government. As any significant change requires a constitutional amendment to be ratified by the voters, I ask you to initiate hearings this session on all governance options. Let's air all the issues, finalize a proposal by next session, and put it before the voters in 1992.

"All of us took pride this fall when MONEY magazine found the University of Hawaii to be one of the top ten

values nationally in public higher education. Its developing biotechnology program was cited by <u>U.S. News and World Report</u> as one of the four best in the nation, and its foreign language program was the first of three nationally to be designated as a national resource center for foreign language training.

"These achievements highlight the standing of our University system. We must continue to suport and strengthen our statewide campuses and enhance our University's leadership role.

"We need your continued support of our comprehensive housing plan for both affordable ownership and rental housing. To leverage the contribution of the private sector, our package for home ownership includes a 400 million dollar Hula Mae bond authorization.

"To stimulate rental housing, I am proposing 23 million dollars for elderly, special needs and low income projects; 8.5 million dollars for a new affordable project in Kakaako; 100 million dollars for rental housing bonds and 11 million dollars in rental assistance funds.

"Urban core rental housing is at the top of the State's priority list. We currently have over 900 such units under development. But it will take state, county and private sector partnerships to really do the job. We will submit to you this session a report identifying vacant or underutilized State lands which could be used for rental projects by government or by the private sector, working together with government. The State and the City (I am very pleased to have the Mayor here) have already joined together in planning for a project at the Pawaa Police Station site where at least 1,000 units could be built. That is the wave of the future.

"We must also view and act upon leasehold condominium conversion as an affordable housing issue. In an incredibly tight housing market, we want people who live in condominiums to enjoy the security of shelter. This may require unique solutions, and the guiding principle will be fairness to all involved. This will not be an easy task, but we cannot let that deter us. Lt. Governor Ben Cayetano has been working for many months on this isssue, and we will be presenting our proposal to you in the days ahead.

"Homelessness is a national disgrace. In Hawaii there are perhaps 3,000 homeless families. Today, thanks to the State, counties and homeless concerns advisory committees, we house 250 families in ten facilities and have outreach services for another 500.

"Working with these groups, we have come up with a 12 million dollar proposal for the homeless, as a catalyst for a public-private emergency housing program to shelter 500 more families this year in temporary villages on Oahu.

"These actions alone are not enough, when speculation has driven the cost of housing beyond so many of our peoples' reach. So again, I will propose an antispeculation tax for your consideration. In addition, I propose that we work jointly with the counties and the private sector to seek ways to put investor-held condominiums, many of which are now vacant, back into the rental market.

"Ten thousand people have gotten health care coverage since Hawaii became the first State to offer universal health care insurance. One of them is Mrs. Edith Gifford of Waianae, who wrote and told us that her husband passed away and she had no medical benefits. With her new coverage she said, (and I quote), 'I will be able to

sleep better knowing that I have a doctor or hospital to go to?

"Mrs. Gifford, we will all sleep better knowing that.

"Despite our efforts, we see a health care crisis looming in the nation. To help avoid it here, we have created a Blue Ribbon Committee, bringing together all sectors to improve the quality of our services in a more cost effective manner.

"I call for your special attention in the area of our State community hospitals. Our goal has always been to assure quality medical services statewide, especially in the otherwise underserved rural areas of our State; and for the most part, our State community hospitals have accomplished that result.

"Also, our community hospital system at one time achieved a good degree of economic self-sufficiency. However, in the recent past and for the foreseeable future, with the rising cost of medical care, our community hospitals will require additional subsidies. Furthermore, it is questionable whether our current system of managing hospitals is appropriate for these high-tech times. Therefore, I propose that this session we go beyond the concept of autonomy and explore new management models using the private sector as a resource to run our community hospitals. Likewise, we should continue to support the development of public/private joint ventures like the North Kohala Community Hospital.

"The key word in health care is prevention. We need to fight teen pregnancy, drug abuse, infant mortality and AIDS. These are not merely goals of State government; they are goals of our society.

"Among the forgotten people of this country are the mentally ill. In difficult economic times, their voice may be lost. As we rebuild this State's mental health system, I call for your support of budgetary action which significantly strengthens treatment at the Hawaii State Hospital and community mental health centers statewide. I ask you to join me in July, as we open the doors of not merely a new building but a new day for mental health in Hawaii.

"As human services at the State level expand, so has the use of non-profit agencies to deliver these services. Like you, I've seen much of the good work first-hand. However, with rapid growth has come a concern for duplication and overlap. I call for a very careful review of the purchase or service process this legislative session, to ensure the system avoids duplication, cuts costs and enhances delivery of services.

"Last year, with your support, we settled the long-standing disagreement over revenues due the Office of Hawaiian Affairs from the ceded land trust. This year I have submitted to you an action plan pursuant to Act 395, to further address controversies under the Hawaiian Home Lands trust and the public land trust.

"It calls for action to remedy historic controversies, basic to the fulfillment of the current and future obligations under both trusts. It sets in motion a process involving the people most affected by the trusts, as well as the leaders of this State. It notes clearly our collective responsibility to pursue action in federal arenas as well.

"The primary asset of the Hawaiian Homes Program is its land trust. Accordingly, I have directed the Attorney General, the Department of Land and Natural Resources, the Office of State Planning, and Hawaiian Home Lands to immediately convene a task force to accelerate the process of clearing title and compensating the trust for

illegal or improper withdrawals, transfers, takings or uses. This is not a task force to study the issue. There are over 13,000 acres of land claims. The assignment is to resolve these claims in creative ways to make the trust both whole and stronger.

"For past controversies involving individual beneficiaries, I propose a Board of Individual Claims Resolution. The Board will provide a means for beneficiaries to bring past claims before a neutral body, without the costs and the delays associated with the judicial process.

"Even as we take these steps, there is much more to consider. The time has come to confront the issues of self-determination and governance as they affect the Hawaiian Home Land and public land trusts. Should there be an elected Hawaiian Home Lands Commission? Should the two trusts be combined? Should there be a starting over, with a new sovereign entity created to represent the Hawaiian people, and administer both trusts.

"I ask you to consider these issues. Our vision of making things right means making things whole. The 21st century must have a place for Hawaiians and non-Hawaiians alike.

"Environment. This year we will take further strides to apply the old adage 'Waste not, want not' to our lives. At a time when county landfills are overflowing, we propose statewide technical assistance for county recycling programs. Furthermore, we will propose a bill to transform State government itself from a huge waste generator to a recycling leader.

"For those times when systems break down and because the Coast Guard will no longer handle land-based spills, we propose beefing up our State oil and hazardous waste emergency response team. I am also pleased to announce that this year we will break ground on the construction of our own public health and environmental lab. Now when parents fear that their children have contracted Lepto Spirosis from a swim in a stream, we will be able to test right here, not in Atlanta, Georgia. It could be a matter of life or death.

"In my 1990 State-of-the-State address, I articulated the community's call to save the Heeia Wetlands. Today, I happily join with Senator McCartney and Representative Tom and others in announcing that an agreement has been reached which will allow the Heeia Wetlands to remain undeveloped forever. We have saved Heeia.

"I also announce action to designate Mount Olomana as a significant geological feature and unique site, to qualify it for protected subzone status within our conservation district, standing there as a pristine symbol of the Windward side.

"I report to you that we have saved the ancient Hawaiian burial ground at Honokahua on Maui and are in the process of acquiring 5.5 additional acres at Makena Beach to add to the State park.

"On Kauai, we have acquired Brenneke's Beach and given it to the county as a permanent public park.

"On the Big Island, we are creating a seven-mile coastal wilderness park through a series of actions including the condemnation and acquisition of Mahaiula and other purchases and exchanges.

"At my last Capitol For a Day, the North Kohala community asked me to work with them to keep their coastline in open space. In December, my family and I

visited this unique area. Today, I ask you to join the North Kohala community, Senator Malama Solomon and me in saving as much of the North Kohala coastline as is possible.

"And at long last and proudly, the sun is rising on the return of Kahoolawe to the people of Hawaii.

"These are important actions. But more than going parcel by parcel, we must look at our conservation lands as irreplaceable resources. So, I have instructed the Office of State Planning to identify valuable lands statewide to add to our conservation district, and the Department of Land and Natural Resources, with support from you, to strengthen the protection and management of these lands.

"The re-creation of our future is more important today than it was a scant year ago. Former Secretary of State George Schulz said: 'Start with the recognition that something profound has happened. This is a new epoch. That doesn't mean that everything is different -- but it means that all the important things are different.' The world, futurists have asserted, is entering an age of paradox.

"And that was before the war.

"More than anything else, the war has brought into sharp focus the questions we have about our future. Our future as an island state and as a people in a world that is profoundly different. We are caught up in the emotion of the day, and forget how well prepared we are for these tumultuous times.

"We are used to paradox. We call it diversity. Neither East nor West, part of America -- yet still an island people looking inward and outward at the same time. Pacific people carving out an international identity, and stubbornly guarding our values, traditions and quality of life

"The world is swirling around us; events touching each of our lives. Nevertheless, we have a choice, the means and the will, to step boldly to re-create our future in the ways that we want it to be when this war ends. And this war will end.

"In these troubled times, when civilization shakes, it is the best time to put our beliefs to work. Our success depends on how swiftly we act, how boldly and creatively we venture, how far we reach out to each other.

"Let there be no mistake. This is our calling. There is great work to be done.

"Thank you."

Senate President Wong then rose and stated:

"Thank you, Governor Waihee, for your very frank and sobering remarks.

"You have pointed out the dilemma facing all of us state policy-makers very clearly and very sharply. We appreciate your candor.

"The worldwide economic recession which has been spreading across the mainland has finally reached Hawaii's shores. That, compounded by the devastating economic impact of the Middle East war, has severely affected our economic well-being.

"Recent world events remind us again of the interdependence of all humanity, and of how events on

the opposite side of the world can have a profound impact on us here in Hawaii.

"With projected state revenues going down, we in the Legislature are going to be confronted with some very difficult choices. We will have to cut back on some very worthy programs because of the shortfall of funds. We hope to be able to work together closely with you and your administration in making the critical decisions, which will hopefully be wise, efficacious and compassionate.

"I must confess that it is not always easy to focus on our local fiscal problems at a time when men and women are confronted with the perils of war. Our thoughts go out especially to those military personnel from Hawaii who are deployed in the Middle East, and to their families here at home who are anxiously awaiting their return. Our prayers are with them.

"In the meanwhile, we must carry on. For those of us in the Legislature, we certainly have our work cut out for us. In addition to addressing our budgetary concerns, you have pointed out a number of areas where we need to pay special attention -- education, the environment, economic recovery and growth, housing, health and human services. We stand prepared to work with you on dealing with these issues. On a personal note, I applaud your strong words against assault weapons. Let us do our best. Let us rise to the challenges before us.

"If there are no further business, I hereby declare this Joint Session of the Hawaii State Legislature adjourned."

At 10:55 o'clock a.m., the President declared the Joint Session adjourned.

## INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

H.R. No. 18, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING HARUO KANESHIRO," was jointly offered by Representatives Say, Arakaki, Amaral, Bainum, Baker, Chang, D. Ige, Isbell, Morihara, Santiago, Tajiri, Taniguchi and Yonamine and was read by the Clerk.

"Mr. Speaker and members of this honorable body, it is indeed a pleasure this morning to introduce a very good friend of mine, a family friend of the 25th District, and he is Haruo 'Papa' Kaneshiro.

"Papa Kaneshiro is known in Hawaii as Hawaii's living bonsai legend, and as the resolution stated, fifty years ago he started his endeavor on the Hamakua Coast of the sugar town of Paauilo. The adjectives people use about Papa in describing him is that he is very open-hearted, he has a willingness to share his education, he is very thoughtful in teaching the bonsai art, and also he is a very, very caring husband. Papa Kaneshiro has received numerous awards and recognitions on the national level and international level. And last but not least, he has developed his own style of bonsai plant -- the Kaneshiro Kengai.

"What is the Kaneshiro Kengai style?

"It suggests a tree growing on a cliff, if you can picture maybe the Pali with the trunk or the main branch sticking out, sweeping down on all sides of that particular cliff.

"At this time, I would like to introduce to this honorable body, Papa Kaneshiro."

The honoree, Haruo 'Papa' Kaneshiro, then rose to be recognized.

Accompanying 'Papa' Kaneshiro were his wife, Mrs. Kaneshiro; their daughter, Ms. Jane Nakama; and their nephew, Mr. Ken Kaneshiro.

Representative Arakaki then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to share just a little anecdote about 'Papa' Kaneshiro. It's sort of a reflection of days gone past and a part of our history which has disappeared.

"Papa and his friend, originally from the Big Island, Paauilo, and his friend, Mr. Soboku Nishihira were roommates when 'Papa' came to Honolulu and Mr. Nishihira got into the hog raising business. And for those who don't know, hog raising was one of the prime industries for the Okinawan people. people. In fact, my They called them 'buta grandfather was a pig farmer. kais' and I still remember going with my grandfather to pick up what they called 'slops' or 'buta kaukau.' And what's interesting is that Papa's friend, Mr. Nishihira, when the war broke out, he used to go and pick up the 'buta kaukau' and because at that time, when the war broke out, people didn't want to be associated with things Japanese, they were all getting rid of their bonsai plants, and so Papa's friend, Mr. Nishihira, picked up all these plants and they kept them in this special place and these two guys, you know, really thought they were very special so they had a special collection. Because of these two Uchinanchus or Okinawan people, they were crazy about bonsai and they weren't afraid of the FBI. They actually preserved this very special and ancient art, so I think it is a tribute to Papa-san and his friend, Mr. Nishihira. I think we need to thank him for not only preserving the art but to make it a very special part of Hawaii's culture and history.

"Thank you, Papa-san, and thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Kawakami presented the honoree with a white carnation lei while Representative Arakaki presented him with a certified copy of the resolution.

"First, in many ways he is like all of us in this House. He is an elected member of the Lithuanian Parliament; he has 12,000 constituents, something I think that all of us have. He was elected in February of 1990 and he is one of 140 members of Parliament. He has, unlike us, a five-year term, not a two-year term, but I think that's where some of the similarities may end in that his legislative body is now in the process of implementing a mandate, given just a few days ago, for his nation's independence or facsimile thereof from the Soviet Union. He is also a member of the Foreign Relations Committee of which some of us are in this body, but his job, or his mission, is to get recognition of his country's independence. So far, only Iceland has recognized the nation of Lithuania. On deck I understand is Denmark, Poland and Norway.

"Mr. Kasauskas is obviously on an uphill and a dangerous battle in the fight for self-determination and nationhood, and like our Governor who has met with Mr. Gorbachev, Mr. Kasauskas has met with Mr. Gorbachev and calls him a very clever, however cunning, individual.

"His past is that of an author. Out of his intelligence, he has written ten books, a few of them were banned regarding some of the things that happened in Siberia that didn't get published until recently with Glasnost, and I

think this has prepared him for the battle to expose the truth and the inequities in the Soviet system.

"He is now on a mission to gain world recognition for his country and it's certainly, Mr. Speaker, an honor for us today to acknowledge his presence in Hawaii and wish him and his nation Godspeed."

"We wish aloha from our people to the people of Lithuania in their battle for freedom and independence.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Floral leis were then presented to Mr. Kasauskas by Representative Chun and to his translator and interpreter by Representative Shon. Representative Ward presented the honoree with a certified copy of the resolution.

#### DEPARTMENTAL COMMUNICATION

Dept. Com. No. 4 from Irwin Tanaka, Administrative Director of the Courts, The Judiciary, transmitting copies of a report pertaining to furthering the use of mediation, arbitration, and other forms of alternative dispute resolution in Hawaii's courts convened and moderated by the Judiciary's Center for Alternative Dispute Resolution in a series of roundtable discussions, pursuant to House Resolution 176 of the Fifteenth Legislature was read by the Clerk and placed on file.

At this time, the following introductions were made to the members of the House:

Representative Tam introduced a group of fifth grade students from Maemae Elementary School. They were accompanied by their teachers, Mrs. Chun and Mrs. Toyama.

Representative Tom, prior to introducing his guests on behalf of Representatives Yoshimura, Alcon, Cachola, Arakaki and himself, stated:

"Mr. Speaker and members of this honorable body, this past Saturday, the House Committees on Education and

Human Services had a joint public hearing relating to the establishment of a Special Needs Program in designated schools in the Honolulu and Maui school districts, more specifically the Farrington complex and in Molokai and Lanai comprising of nineteen schools. At the hearing, Mr. Speaker, if I may before the introduction, I would just like to point out that we received numerous testimonies from many community leaders. There were parents, students, teachers, living and working in the Kalihi area with children attending the Farrington complex, in strong support of a Special Needs Program in the Kalihi area. I was personally moved, Mr. Speaker, by their testimonies because it made me realize that much of the negative publicity in Kalihi were far outweighed by the positive and joint efforts of the people in Kalihi to come together and support such a worthwhile program.

"The Special Needs Program allows schools such as in the Farrington and in the Maui complexes to implement innovative means to address their low achievement problems and to improve student performance in its nineteen schools that experience chronic achievement problems and demonstrate certain characteristics such as high absenteeism and high disciplinary referral rates.

"The Legislature in 1989 funded the Special Needs Program in the Leeward District which is very successful, Mr. Speaker, and now it is time for the Honolulu and the Maui school districts to get a piece of that pie.

"Today, the Kalihi community came to the State Capitol with a delicious brunch that I know was held here and experienced by many legislators and staff members, and the brunch was prepared by students at Farrington High School. They had to, unfortunately, leave to go back to school. But we have people here and if I may, I would just like to briefly introduce them."

Representative Tom then asked the following individuals to stand to be recognized: Mina Tatupu, President of the newly formed Parent/Teachers Student Organization; Ernesta Masagatani, Honolulu District Deputy Superintendent; Bob Eagleston, Vice Principal at Kalihi Kai and a former staff member of Education Chair, Rod Tam. "He was very active in putting this together"; Laurie Wong, Honolulu District Office Educational Specialist; Patty Tom, wife of Representative Tom; and a group of principals, teachers, and parents that made this possible.

Representative Kawakami, on behalf of Representatives Apo and Kanoho, introduced two Kauaians who are with the Agricultural Leadership Foundation of Hawaii which provides participants life experiences to develop and support leaders of the agricultural industry of Hawaii, as follows: Laurie Ho, district conservationist with the USDA Soil Conservation Service, and Valerie Kaneshiro who works as herb manager for Kaneshiro Farms, a family business. They were accompanied by Reggie Doi and Kippen Chu of her office.

Representative Chang introduced Jeff McCall, Tim O'Connell and Henry Terada, members of the Agricultural Leadership Foundation from the Big Island.

Representative Isbell then asked all the members with the Agricultural Leadership Foundation Program "and who are shadowing us today," to stand to be recognized.

Representative Morihara introduced Sumner Erdman, rancher and owner of the Ulupalakua Ranch on Maui, and a participant in the Agricultural Leadership Foundation of Hawaii Program.

Representative M. Ige introduced 80 students from Puohala Elementary School. They were accompanied by their teachers, Mrs. Takayama, Miss Kuraoka, Mrs. Reinhardt, Mrs. Hirata and Mrs. Sablan.

"The internment brings to a close two decades of hard labor for the JACL, and now the local and national chapters are looking ahead to other long-standing issues and renewing their efforts to combat the further erosion of the rights of all citizens and residents of the United States.

"We have a young group of sansei -- these are the third generations who serve as officers of the organization. They bring vigorous commitment and renewed directions for the chapter's activities in the years ahead, and I congratulate them for their part in leading the JACL into this new decade.

"We also have with us today two very important people who were primarily responsible for the creation of the Hawaii chapter. These niseis, all successful in their own right, live their lives helping others and have involved themselves to better serve and help their society through many organizations and charities, and I want to congratulate and recognize each one of you for your part in making Hawaii a better place."

Representative Horita then rose and proceeded to introduce the honoree, stating:

"In preparing for today's floor presentation, I came across some comments made by the late Harry Bridges, President emeritus of the ILWU, recalling the historic 1934 dock strike of San Francisco. Since the comments appeared to reflect the philosophies of our honoree today, I would like to share these words of wisdom with you and my colleagues.

"Fifty years later, what was it really all about?

"First of all, it was about power. We showed the world that when working people get together and stick together, there's very little they cannot do.

"Second, it was about democracy. We said that the rank and file have the right to decide. If you gave them the facts, they would make the right decisions.

"Finally, it was about how people treat each other. It was about human dignity. We made employers to treat us as equals, to sit down and to talk to us about the work we do, how we do it, and what we get paid for it.

"Mr. Speaker, I believe that these words reflect the continuing philosophy of the union and its members and exemplify the sentiments of our honoree, Mr. Eddie Lapa, who began as an ILWU business agent in 1950 and who has served as President of Local 142 since 1981. Throughout our years as legislators, I think we have all had the privilege of sitting down with Mr. Lapa to discuss current labor issues and the plight of the working men and women. Honest, sincere, concerned, straight-forward are all words we have used to describe him. In addition to an illustrious career with the ILWU, Eddie's resume runs the gamut of community work and public service.

"Mr. Lapa did not know that we were having a floor presentation today, but I think that he must have suspected something. He showed up at my office this morning, completely bewildered and said, 'You know, I don't even know what I am doing here.'

"Eddie, I am really proud to have this presentation for you. Without further delay, I would like to introduce our honoree, Mr. Eddie Lapa.

Mr. Lapa rose to be recognized and was presented a House certificate of recognition by Representative Takamine and an ilima lei by Representative Horita.

Accompanying the honoree on the House floor was his wife, Emily, who was presented an ilima lei by Representative Yonamine.

Representative Horita then asked his daughter and granddaughter who were seated in the gallery to stand to be recognized.

Representative Takamine then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I think the resolution and the comments of Representative Horita speak well of our honoree and do a good job in reflecting the kind of person that he is. I think, looking back, it is unquestionable the kind of strong leadership and the contributions that Mr. Lapa has given to the labor movement in Hawaii.

"Eddie, to you and your family, I want to extend my personal wishes of congratulations and appreciation.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

"Mr. Speaker, PEACESAT, all of you have heard of, some of you have probably used, stands for the Pan Pacific Education and Communication Experiments. It's been a bridge for the educational and the scientific connection between Hawaii and the Pacific Islands. It was an experiment that I had in the late '70s as a student at the East-West Center to sit around the table with three or four microphones and speak to people in Guam, almost the way Representative Shon and his Health Committee spoke to Kauai except they could see each other. And in the '70s, to be able to speak to a Pacific Island and have

instant communication was an exception. Plus, it was

"Dr. Bystrom, in his ingenious way, took an old weather satellite and converted this into a solar-powered communication between Hawaii and the Pacific. Dr. Bystrom was a communication professor at the University of Hawaii and for all of his work, he was nominated for a Nobel Prize. I think the words that best summarize him were made by a colleague that said, 'He empowered and ennobled others by embodying the concepts of PEACESAT, that is mutual respect, sharing of information, and cordiality.'

"His spirit indeed is very much alive in PEACESAT, and PEACESAT is still carrying on today and is very much in use.

"May I ask Mrs. Bystrom and her son, Eric, who will receive the award in place of Dr. Bystrom, to rise and be acknowledged by this body."

Mrs. Bystrom and Eric rose to be recognized and a House certificate of recognition was presented to Mrs. Bystrom by Representative Ward and carnation leis were presented by Representatives Hagino and Young.

The Chair then stated:

"This morning, the Honorable Speaker of the House, Daniel J. Kihano, asked me to offer you his congratulations and his regrets that he could not join us."
