INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION (FLOOR PRESENTATION)

H.R. No. 44, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION COMMENDING BODE UALE," was offered by Representative Ward and was read by the Clerk.

On motion by Representative Ward, seconded by Representative Stegmaier and carried, H.R. No. 44 was adopted.

Representative Ward rose and proceeded to introduce the honoree, stating:

"I was anxious to praise the floor presentation recipient with the following words that go back to his youth and as a student at Laie Elementary, and perhaps a message for the younger people who will see him now in a different light.

While Judge Uale was a carefree youth at Laie Elementary School, his class had a 'career day' forum. They brought in a policeman, a fireman, a businessman, and yes, believe it or not, a lawyer, and most of his classmates were inspired by tales of the policeman's and the firefighter's life-saving heroics. However, the glamorous jet-settings of the businessman didn't impress him, but who he was impressed by was the lawyer. And among his classmates, and especially the Samoan community, he chose a road less traveled and decided that his future would involve constitutions, courtrooms, and court cases.

"Certainly, on that fateful day in elementary school, and even in his subsequent years at the William S. Richardson Law School, along with our colleague, Representative Stegmaier, he could not have anticipated that someday he would be standing before the State House of Representatives for this commendation for his accomplishments, and his invaluable services to the legal community, the Samoan community, and the youth-support community. Yet here he is today. And while it is impressive that he has earned his judgeship after only eight years in the legal profession, we realize that since he's been a lawyer at heart for the past thirty years, his rapid and his growing success is nothing less than fully deserved.

"As his representative from the Hawaii Kai area, and on behalf of the House of Representatives, we certainly wish to extend our congratulations and best wishes for his continuing success. 'Ole susuga ale uluwai'i faamasino Samoa e Hawaii.'

"Mr. Speaker and colleagues, I present to you the first judge of Samoan ancestry in Hawaii -- the Honorable Judge Bode Uale."

The Honorable Judge Bode Uale rose to be recognized.

Representative Stegmaier then rose and stated:

"I am very pleased to be able to stand and honor Judge Uale today. As a classmate of his at Law School, we

were classmates, we were soul mates from time to time, and we felt like cell mates from time to time as well.

"There's been mention made about the significance of Judge Uale being of Samoan ancestry, and yet those of us who have known him over time know that he is and will be a judge who will serve with distinction, and he would be honored no matter what his ethnic background might be. I should let you know, those of you who might not be familiar, that Judge Uale is the nephew of Famika Anae, someone with whom several of us served in the Constitutional Convention, who we remember for his gentleness and dignity, and these characteristics have been inherited by his nephew as well.

"I would like to end by sharing an insight that I had through Judge Uale's character. At the end of his time as a law student, he had to make a choice between serving as a prosecutor or as a public defender, and I remember talking to him about the process that he went through in arriving at his decision. He consulted those whom he respected and, based on his background in the Church of Latter Day Saints and his conservative upbringing, I think it would have been a natural inclination for him to perhaps become a prosecutor. And yet, for him, the issue was a lot broader than that. The question was: How might he grow and become a better attorney and develop in his career, wherever that might take him.

"And I was very impressed that he chose, as Representative Ward indicated, the road less traveled ... to be able to become more sensitive to those individuals in society who were having difficulty playing a constructive role in society. And that's indicated now by the kind of judge that Judge Uale has become -- a person who is sensitive and understanding, and yet can provide counsel and direction in a way that those who did not avail themselves of such opportunities would not be able to do. We look forward to a great career, and again, I am honored by this opportunity.

"Thank you."

Representative Beirne then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, as the representative for the 46th District, I am very honored to have the Samoan judge that has hailed from my area be recognized by this Seventeenth legislative session. I would like to wish the Judge well, and much love from all the people from our district.

"Thank you."

Representative Tom then rose and stated:

"I've had the unique experience of appearing before Judge Uale recently, and I think my client lost but it's okay, no harm done. I just want you to know, Mr. Speaker and members, that this man ... I was so impressed with. He was tough, and yet he was compassionate. He was extremely humanistic, he was candid, he really exercised the kind of foresight of a judge. He didn't just issue orders ... he took the time to explain the orders to the client. Sort of like you, Mr. Speaker. ... very much like you.

"But, I want to just say that I commend and hope for the best, and next time I appear in front of you, you can maybe give me a win, Judge?"

"Thank you very much."

At this time, Representative Ward introduced and asked Lei Dunaway, administrative clerk, who accompanied Judge Uale, to stand to be recognized.

Lei Dunaway then presented Judge Bode Uale a floral lei on behalf of all the clerks of the Family Court.

Floral leis were presented to Judge Uale and Lei Dunaway by Representatives Thielen, Beirne and Stegmaier, while Representative Ward presented Judge Uale with a Certificate of Recognition.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION
(FLOOR PRESENTATION)

H.R. No. 62, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION HONORING GLENN T. MINAMI THE 1993 STATE TEACHER OF THE YEAR," was jointly offered by Representatives Stegmaier and Ward and was read by the Clerk.

On motion by Representative Stegmaier, seconded by Representative Ward and carried, H.R. No. 62 was adopted.

At this time, Representative Stegmaier proceeded to introduce the honoree, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, when Glenn Minami was selected 'Teacher of the Year,' at least one commentator on a local talk show ridiculed the idea that a vocational education teacher could become selected as the 'Teacher of the Year' in the State of Hawaii.

"Glenn Minami had to deal with that kind of stereotyping throughout his career as an educator. And he's also had to deal with the stereotyping of students who have been assigned to his classes, as he put it ... dumped in his class. What he has done with students who came to him as unmotivated learners is to turn them into motivated individuals who had a great appreciation for learning.

"When I was up at Kaiser High School not too long ago for the facilities inspection tour, I ran across a student in that particular part of the campus -- the vocational education part -- and he commented that he loved the program but there was a lot of reading that took place, and he said it with a little bit of a smirk.

"Glenn Minami, through his method of teaching, has instilled in his students an awareness of the significance and relevance of reading in their lives. Along the way, in his twenty years at Kaiser, Glenn also became an instructor for the Communications Technology Learning Center. In that capacity, he dealt with students who were very motivated to learn, who had an idea of career advancement, and being able to apply learning at the high school level to future learning. Whether he was teaching motivated or unmotivated students, Glenn Minami has been guided by one principle and that is, it is not what you do in life, where you are on the social pecking order, but rather, how you do what you chose to do with your life. And out of that, many, many students who have come into contact with him have developed a sense of appreciation for themselves and others, that they will be indebted to him for for a lifetime.

"Out of the 11,000 teachers throughout the State, I'd like now to introduce you to the individual who has been selected as 'Teacher of the Year' for the State of Hawaii -- Glenn Minami."

The honoree, Glenn Minami, then rose to be recognized.

Accompanying Glenn Minami on the House floor were Mrs. Kathleen Minami, his wife; Kay Zukeron, a teacher at Kaiser for many years in the English Department and his coordinator of the Communications Technology Learning Center; Kim Park and Andy Wang, students at Kaiser, and participants in the Learning Center who came to Glenn as motivated students.

Representative Stegmaier continued:

"I did want to alert all of you that they are going to be joining the Press Corps for the day. They have their cameras here and will be asking members to comment on the issue that they are preparing to discuss in a news story on KGMB News 101 Program. The issue is whether you're in favor or opposed to having the student representative of the Board of Education with a full vote on that Board. So be aware that they might be buttonholing you."

At this time, Representative Young presented a red carnation lei to Mr. Glenn Minami and Representative Stegmaier presented the honoree with a certificate of recognition. Floral leis were presented to the others by Representatives Chun, Duldulao, D. Ige and Nekoba.

At 12:21 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

This is an anti-small business bill which, in the future of Hawaii when big ag is gone and the Big Five are gone, all we got is small businesses. This is giving the counties the power, in effect, to take their property tax bill, put whatever fines are outstanding on that bill, or withhold the driver's license, or have the registration of their license impounded until they pay all their bills.

"So, we've got a bill here that's going to hold the small business community hostage. It's called 'county civil fines' ... it's really a fox in sheep's clothing.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Lee then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to point out very clearly that the counties will not be able to attach the civil fines unless they are completely adjudicated in some fashion, according to due process. In other words, it's not anti-business -- it's anti-scofflaws. And that means anyone who doesn't pay his fines ought to be given the opportunity to do so in the most painless way which is through the property tax.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS
(FLOOR PRESENTATIONS)

On motion by Representative Arakaki, seconded by Representative Duldulao and carried, H.R. No. 71 was adopted.

Representative Arakaki then proceeded to introduce the honorees, stating:

"The month of February has been declared 'Drug Free Hawaii Month,' and I am wearing my ribbon ... I hope

everyone else got their ribbon, and I am proud to say that I am drug and alcohol free. I can't emphasize enough the importance of getting that message across, especially to our young people -- and you see a lot of young people in our audience today -- and why it is so important is because the cost of substance and alcohol abuse is much too costly. You can ask our Judiciary Chair, Representative Tom, about the cost for the large number of abusers who burden our law enforcement and court system. You can ask our Corrections Chair, Representative Menor, about the large numbers of abusers who are in our prisons or on parole. You can ask our Health Chair, Representative Duldulao, about the cost of substance and alcohol abuse treatment programs. You can ask our Human Services Chair, Representative Chun, about the cost of drug-exposed infants and the involvement of substance and alcohol abuse in many cases of domestic violence and child abuse. You can ask our Education Chair, Representative D. Ige, about the cost of over six thousand public school students who are heavy drinkers and more than 3,200 public school students who are heavy drug users and how they not only present problems for teachers and counselors, but they are disruptive to their peers as well.

"The cost is much too great. It is pervasive and it is insidious like a cancer. And like a cancer, sometimes it is difficult to detect, but it is there eating away at many young lives, and that is why it is so important to send the message to our young people in Hawaii. If there's anything that we've learned about prevention strategies, especially for our young people, we've learned from the people that we've brought on the floor today.

"A couple of important things -- the most important and effective way to communicate to students in a meaningful way is to have their peers provide that message. Also, it is not enough just to say no -- we must present alternatives and we must provide role models. And based on those two principles, Mr. Speaker, we ask the students in grades four to twelve from Oahu public schools to deliver their drug and alcohol-free messages through posters and murals and emphasize the benefits of a healthy lifestyle.

"The poster and mural contest was a collaborative effort of the Coalition for a Drug Free Hawaii; the Department of Health, Alcohol and Drug Abuse Division; the Department of Education; and the Youth Services Network. And this collaboration indeed is not just among agencies -- it truly has to involve a partnership with the community and parents as well. So we recognize everyone's efforts in providing that message to our children.

"Today, we honor four people who do represent that effort."

Representative Arakaki then asked the following honorees, who were seated on the House floor, to stand to be recognized: Sandy Lacar, Executive Director of the Coalition for a Drug Free Hawaii; Elaine Wilson from the Department of Health, Alcohol and Drug Abuse Division; Laurie Wong, Deputy Superintendent for the Honolulu District, representing the Department of Education; and Cheryl Kamioka, Program Director for the Coalition for a Drug Free Hawaii.

"This raising the tax -- hotel room tax -- at a time when we are in a hard financial strait in the first place, is not something that that sits well with me. . .

Representative Cachola then rose on a point of order and asked for a recess.

At 12:43 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

Upon reconvening at 12:44 o'clock p.m., Representative O'Kieffe stated:

"I would like to thank Chairman Cachola for his enlightening remarks and I would like the Clerk, if he will, to strike my remarks prior to this.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Shon then rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"Basically because I do not believe we should be funding capital improvements with cash. What this bill provides for, particularly if you look on page 2 of the Committee report members, that any increase in the transient accommodations tax shall be precluded from use

in the general fund by any other department. It shall go into this special convention center account for financing the convention center.

"I believe with a \$40-million deficit in education, deficits in Medicaid, that we should be looking at all sources of revenue, across the board, to fund these areas. I do not believe that we should be funding capital improvements with cash. Last year, to our detriment, we passed the budget which had \$111-million in cash for CIP programs and we are back this year trying to convert them back to bonds. With the kind of deficits that we have and the kind of impositions we're making on our people here, we should not be funding the convention center with cash. That's what this bill does.

"In a related action today, Mr. Speaker, we passed out a bill which allows for the redistribution of TAT money away from the counties, allows for increase in the TAT possibly.

"This bill, if it passes as is, means that any increase in revenue that we may gain in the transient accommodations tax shall not be available for education, shall not be available for human services, for long-term care, for anything, except this particular convention center.

"I think if we fund this, it should be through bonds and not through cash. That's why I'm voting no.

"Thank you."

Representative Alcon then rose on a point of information and inquired:

"May I also know what the enlightening information was that was given to Representative O'Kieffe?"

At 12:46 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:47 o'clock p.m.

Representative Lee then rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

"I am speaking in favor of House Bill 1202 although I do not like the increase in the transient accommodations tax. The point I would like to make is that the increase and the tax will pay for the bonds ... we will be building the convention center with revenue bonds. . .

At this point, Representative Cachola interrupted on a point of order and asked for a recess.

At 12:48 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:49 o'clock p.m.

Representative Cachola then rose to speak in support of the bill, stating:

"This bill creates a funding mechanism for the construction of a convention center. We have two funds: One, a revolving fund. The other one is what we call the capital fund.

"The capital fund includes the following revenues: The TAT fund over and above 1991 and 1992 distribution or collection. We also have the five percent TAT coming or

given to the State; and we also have the GET tax over and above the 1991-1992 level.

"Based on testimonies given to us by the Council on Revenues, there will be enough money to cover for the repayment of the bond, and we might even have a lot more to accelerate it.

"Also, Mr. Speaker, this capital fund, once it is paid up, will lapse, or there is a drop dead clause on this capital fund. The mechanism is such that the State has to contribute in the construction of the convention center and that is to be paid by general obligation bonds which is reimbursable.

"The other features of this bill, Mr. Speaker, is in the revolving fund. What we put in that fund are the following: The rentals that we derive from the convention center; number two, the rentals from parking; and thirdly, the rentals from the concessions; and fourth, whatever funding the State might provide.

"This bill initially, when you start the construction of the center, there is not enough money that the convention center will generate. And the reason why we still have to pay the bond is because once we float the bonds, we have the obligation to repay the interest -- not the principal. If you base, for example, three hundred million dollars needed to construct the convention center, based on projections, we need about eighteen million dollars for interest only to pay that. However, during the first two years we are not required to pay the entire three hundred million dollars. The plan is to stagger the bonding requirement ... like one hundred million dollars the first year, one hundred million dollars the second year, and one hundred million dollars the third year. By doing that from the first year, the five percent that we get from the State's portion of the TAT is about four million dollars. The following year, another four million dollars. If you float the bond in 1994 -- one hundred million dollars -- which is one-third of the three hundred million dollars, the interest payment is about six million dollars. So just the five percent portion of the State is enough to cover for that.

"We floated two bills initially. One bill calls for taking 40 percent from the counties' share of the transient accommodations tax. The other bill calls for an increase of the transient accommodations tax from five to seven percent. We got opposition from all sides -- from the counties as well as the visitor industry, and we got the message loud and clear.

"This mechanism that is being proposed doesn't take any money from the counties' share of the TAT as well as raising the TAT from five to seven percent. This, to my mind, is a good compromise. It is innovative in the sense that we are really sensitive to the counties as well as the visitor industry. To raise the transient accommodations tax at this point in time will not be good for the industry.

"So, my colleagues, this compromise bill or mechanism really is good. We are sensitive to the industry, we are sensitive to the counties, and I think we will be able to pass it.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Lee then rose and stated:

"First, I would like to apologize to the chairman of the Tourism Committee for trying to preempt his explanation. I would like to congratulate him on his very innovative idea on how to fund the convention center. It is very important to understand that we are not taking money from anyone else. Mr. Cachola, with the help of Lowell

Kalapa, have instituted a special fund by taking the growth of the room tax as a means of repaying the interest on the bonds which we issue to finance the center.

"What is very interesting about this measure is that it follows a number of things which the Legislature has done over the past several years, and it is important to remember that the management of money, the management of debt, is very, very important for the fiscal health of the State and indeed of the entire country. We know what has gone wrong when we do not manage our money as wisely on the federal level. The federal government has now a debt of four trillion dollars and President Clinton is trying to correct the problem. In Hawaii, because of the management and the use of special funds in very innovative ways such as the one that Mr. Cachola has instituted, it's a mark of maturity in managing money.

"Let me illustrate to you what that means.

"In 1979, the State of Hawaii was greatly in debt. We were number seven among all states in debt per capita. Ten years later, by the wise use of cash, we brought down our debt position to number twenty-two among all the states. In other words, we paid off our debts, used cash when we had the cash, so that today we are able to say, 'alright.' We will not blink when we borrow three hundred million dollars because we can afford to do so. Our equity position, our cash position, has been very, very well-managed throughout the last few years so that we can do so with a minimum of disruptions. Not only that, what is most important in the convention center is the acceleration of public construction to take up the slack in private construction in the classic Keynesian method of stimulating economic activity. Now, we are able to do that because we have people like Representative Cachola, and even Mr. Lowell Kalapa -- he supported this special fund. He helped Mr. Cachola in formulating the measure that is before us today. When we have such cooperation, we are able to do a lot of good things for the State in a well-reasoned, well-planned, and very, very rational way of attacking our financial problems.

I would like to congratulate, more than ever, Mr. Cachola for taking into consideration my opposition to raising the TAT and by using a very innovative way of taking, or tapping, the excess growth. That, ladies and gentlemen, is what had come out of the Tourism Committee.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Shon then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, a couple of final comments.

"The explanation given by the Chair of the Tourism Committee is the kind of explanation you get after extensive negotiations with the private sector as to ... well, how much is their contribution, how much is our contribution, what are the financing going to be. I have not seen a concrete proposal before us as to exactly what our obligations are going to be in the construction or stimulation of a new convention center.

"This bill seems to indicate that there have been some rather substantive negotiations and it has been decided that the State is going to pay for all of it. I think it is premature.

"Secondly, as I listened very carefully to the Chair's explanation, indeed it does imply that cash will be used to finance the construction of the convention center. Cash from the TAT, if there is an increase, if we should decide

that, will go into, not the operating fund, but the convention center capital special fund.

"I again object to that approach and I think that we should look very carefully at this. I am sure the bill will go to Finance, but I want to signal very strongly that we have not made a determination collectively on how much our obligation is going to be in the construction of the convention center, or where it's going to be. The siting of the convention center, incidentally, has always been very much a part of the debate as to whether or not we wanted to put our resources on the table. The siting has not been determined. And whether or not we will need additional KP money for education or anything else is yet to be determined.

"On those two objections, I will continue to vote no.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Hagino then rose and stated:

"I did read the bill and I am well aware that the tax increase portion was taken out; however, I still do intend to vote no, and I would like to have the Clerk record my no vote, and this is even after listening to the explanation. I still intend to vote no.

"Thank you."

Representative Marumoto then rose to speak in favor of the motion, stating:

"I think the House position on this convention center -- the financing package -- is a win/win situation. I think the Senate may be coming in with a tax increase proposal, and this will provide us a convention center without a tax increase. I think it will help the economic development of our State and the stability of the tourist industry. I think eventually we will derive more revenues into our general fund to help pay for our schools and human services. So, I am very happy with this package. It does cap the TAT revenue to the counties; however, there are several ways to help the counties implement the increase that would normally go to them, and extensive discussions in the Tourism Committee brought up ideas such as giving the traffic fines back to the counties, giving back the GET portion that they pay to the State, and perhaps institute new taxes such as the sin taxes to give to the counties so they wouldn't be without an increase in their share of funds.

"If Representative Shon had stayed in the Tourism Committee longer this morning, he would have heard that the State does intend to negotiate several more points with one or more of these private entities that would like to develop the convention center. We're looking to lower the land cost, maintenance cost, the common elements, parking, derive greater portion of the concessions, have the private sector pay for the studies, and any other capital improvements such as bridges that may result. Nothing is final, and everything is still up in the air. It certainly is a good package to start to negotiate and then turn over the authority to the Waikiki Convention Authority to go ahead.

"I am very excited about this prospect. I think it is an excellent bill. We should now move it to Finance for further scrutiny, and I am upset that there seems to be some misconceptions about this bill but I urge all of you to vote aye.

"Thank you."

Representative Taniguchi then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I stand to speak in opposition based on the comments of Representative Marumoto.

"I guess my concern is that if this was in fact in the discussions, and we are talking about any increases in the TAT, that the IIA Committee was never a party to those discussions in terms of other kinds of resources that the counties will get. Based on that, I think we have to kinda send a message.

"Thank you."

Representative Bainum then rose on a point of information and asked:

"A former speaker spoke of the Waikiki Convention Center Authority. Is that the current name of the Authority?"

Representative Cachola answered:

"Mr. Speaker, originally that was the name of the Convention Center Authority but last year, we amended that and changed it from Waikiki Convention Center Authority to just Convention Center Authority."

Representative Bainum thanked the Chair for the clarification and further stated:

"I hope to point out that we have not yet decided what the location is, and I have plenty more to say on that bill.

"Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1202, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO A CONVENTION CENTER," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Hagino, Shon and Taniguchi voting no.

Representatives Duldulao and Chun, for the Committees on Health and Human Services, presented a joint report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 79) recommending that H.B. No. 432, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

On motion by Representative Duldulao, seconded by Representative Chun and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 432, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO SMOKING," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representative O'Kieffe voting no.

Representatives Hiraki and Takamine, for the Committees on Ocean Recreation and Marine Resources and Water and Land Use Planning, presented a joint report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 80) recommending that H.B. No. 59, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be placed on the calendar for Third Reading.

Representative Cachola moved that the report of the Committee be adopted and H.B. No. 1705, HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance, seconded by Representative Chang.

Representative Stegmaier rose to speak in support of the motion, stating:

"The Aloha State Games have benefitted over eight thousand amateur athletes in the State of Hawaii. It provides an opportunity for us to develop the technical expertise to eventually put on the Hawaii-Pacific Games which could be the greatest games of the Pacific Rim.

"I commend this bill to the Finance Committee for appropriate appropriations.

"Thank you very much."

Representative O'Kieffe then rose to respond to the previous speaker, stating:

"When I have kids all over the State that don't have textbooks, don't have gym equipment, don't have exercise rooms, don't have teachers, have to take their classes in their own bathrooms ... when all those problems are fixed, then I'll go to the Aloha State Games. But right now, I'm saying aloha to this bill."

Representative Marumoto rose to speak against the measure, stating:

"I think the Aloha State Games is a wonderful event heretofore. They had a hard time organizing but people who participated really enjoyed it, and I had two sons who have taken part in it.

"However, this year the Department doesn't seem to have their act together, as far as organizing. Although they intend to have these games held in June, my understanding is that they don't have anybody to run

them yet. And when I asked them who they were talking to in trying to organize these games, they mentioned, 'Well, perhaps the Hula Bowl people or the Aloha Bowl people,' and I felt like these were not appropriate entities to run the Games, so I voted no on the Committee report ... I thought I had to explain it.

"Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1705, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE CONTINUATION OF THE ALOHA STATE GAMES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Marumoto, O'Kieffe, Shon and Thielen voting no.

Representative Cachola, for the Committee on Tourism, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 119) recommending that H.B. No. 1530, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representative Cachola moved that the report of the Committee be adopted and H.B. No. 1530, HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representative Hagino rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, first of all I would like to ask the Clerk to note my presence here. I was not able to vote on some of the bills on page 2, however, I would like the Clerk to note my no vote on House Bill 1530, HD 1, relating to golf promotion. I do have a few remarks and these remarks will be applied to House Bill 1934 as well as the one I voted no on regarding the Seniors' Golf Tournament at Kaanapali in the previous session.

"I don't mind giving money to sports promotion such as the Hula Bowl, the Aloha Bowl, and games that we have traditionally supported over the years that have become really almost a part of the regular budget, but a lot of these are new events. We are in a tremendous economic crisis, as pointed out by the Minority Leader.

"I guess what troubles me. . . you know, I don't golf and I do commend people who do golf -- it's a fine and good recreation for them -- but I see a kind of mentality here that bothers me. Several hundred years ago, when Marie Antoinette was told that the people of France were starving and didn't have bread, she said, 'Well, let them eat cake.' I feel somehow today, when I look at these bills and people are in financial straits, we seem to replace Marie Antoinette and say, you know, let them eat golf putters. It's this kind of sensibility that I think we should try to curb, curtail, and support these promotions at a later time when the economy has improved.

"Also, if we do have extra money for tourism dollars, I would really strongly recommend that it be used for promotion of tourism for Kauai which I think badly needs it and for some of these other specified sports activities.

"Because of that, I am voting no on this and will continue to do so."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1530, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR GOLF PROMOTION," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Amaral, Hagino, Hirono, O'Kieffe, Shon and Thielen voting no.

"It's surprising that the Department of Taxation, one of our branches that has come in to us to say, don't have special funds and really to oppose any measure whatsoever that would impact upon tax revenues ... they are saying now that they want to be exempt, have the money go into a special fund, be able to spend it for overtime, for emergency hires, temporary hires, and to fill vacant civil service positions, and then anything left over won't go back into reimbursing the State general fund. So the Department of Taxation is sending this message. It should be treated differently from all other branches of government, including the Department of Education. And I just cannot support that kind of a measure.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Lee then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I would just like to mention that I checked with Mr. Lowell Kalapa last week and he was the one who helped set up the special fund for the convention center. I asked him why did he do that. He said, 'Whenever it is appropriate.' I guess whenever it is appropriate is alright with Mr. Lowell Kalapa and if it's appropriate for him, it should also be appropriate for others too.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Ward then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, the previous speaker cited a very . . . I would say, probably one of the best brains in this State; however, in the context I think he is besmudging his name because this bill -- H.B. 1460 -- is really an excuse for underfunding of our State Department of Taxation. It takes money to make money and because we didn't give an appropriation, we are giving them a special fund. We have been told by the Legislative Auditor -- avoid special funds at all costs. Thirty percent of the budget of this House is already special funds. If we go in the direction of our colleague on the mainland -- Louisiana -- which has seventy-eight percent special funds, we don't even have to show up every January. We can just stay home. All the budget will be just revolving on its own. So what we've got is another precedent going in the direction of special funding, taking away the constitutional authority of which this body is supposed to do. We have the power of the purse strings and now we're going to give it over to the departments. You want the Executive to run this state, or do you want the House?"

"Again, I know he's going to collect money by delinquent taxes -- it's a good reason -- but it's a poor management on our part not to give them the money to make the money.

"So, Mr. Speaker, this bill is heading us in the wrong direction.

"Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1460, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO A TAX ADMINISTRATION FUND," passed Second Reading and was placed on the calendar for Third Reading, with Representatives Thielen and Ward voting no.

Yes, surfers with boards have been bitten but how many really have been the problem?"

"For the most important reason, the shark is so many of our Hawaiian friends and neighbors' 'aumakua' and for this very reason, I am voting no on this bill."

Representative Amaral then rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"I would note that I voted in Committee 'no' on this measure but actually for the opposite reasons of the last speaker. The difficulty with this bill is that the word 'control' has been deleted. This is not a shark control bill, and because of that I voted against this. This is a shark tagging bill.

"Thank you."

"I know this matter has been discussed many times -- Hawaiian sovereignty -- and certainly, when I had the committee, there were some budgetary items regarding Hawaiian sovereignty. It's come a long way due to the centennial celebration, and I'm looking over the bill and I am wondering if you could ask the chairperson that made the recommendation if you could just provide, at least in your own mind, a very succinct definition of sovereignty and to give some idea where we're going in this very complex, perhaps even a volatile area. I would like to know where we're heading. We're providing funds but we've never had a definition. It started two years ago, now we're in the third year, and I suspect a lot of impetus has been created since the centennial celebration. I think we need to know. . . the public needs to know a little more clearly as to where we're going in this area. I wonder if you could provide it."

At 9:10 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 9:12 o'clock p.m.

Representative Thielen then rose and stated:

"Possibly it would help the rest of us if we could hear the same response."

The Chair responded:

"It was determined by the Chair. . . by the Speaker that there's going to be another opportunity at Third Reading. There's going to be a Majority caucus, and at that time the definition of sovereignty can be explained and debated extensively."

Representative Hagino then rose and withdrew his inquiry.

The Chair thanked Representative Hagino.

Representative Ward then rose on a point of inquiry and asked:

"The question, Mr. Speaker, is: What is the expressed purpose of Second Reading, specifically, if not for dialogue?"

The Chair answered:

"It is for dialogue. That's why we are giving you the opportunity, Representative Ward."

Representative Ward continued:

"The opportunity of which. . ."

The Chair interrupted:

"I have answered your question, Representative Ward. This is for further dialogue. You may debate the issue at hand. You have a discussion on Page 5? If you wish to speak on a specific item, will you please name the bill so we can get on with the business."

Representative Ward responded:

"Am I instructed to save it for Third Reading now, Mr. Speaker, is my question."

The Chair answered:

"If you wish to debate any items, you may proceed. Is there any item that you wish to proceed on?"

Representative Ward replied:

"That clarifies it. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Apo then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, perhaps I can sort of rise to the occasion and provide a few remarks on the Hawaiian sovereignty bill.

"In answer to the question, we don't know what sovereignty means and what the bill provides is to allow for the process of discussion to continue in hopefully the Senate and the House.

"The first question that the bill tries to address is to put it to the Hawaiian people through some form of plebiscite or referendum whether or not the Hawaiian people -- native Hawaiians and Hawaiians -- would like to convene a constitutional convention. That's the first question.

"If the answer to that is yes, then the bill continues to provide at least opportunities for discussion as to how this constitutional convention will take place, how you apportion the State, et cetera, et cetera. So, it is by no means any kind of final document and I believe the Committee and the Chair and all of us agree that we still have a long way to go, but we have begun the process.

"There are many specific questions that could be posed on the floor tonight that probably are unanswerable. One of them is . . . what do we mean by sovereignty? We just don't know -- it's up to the Hawaiian people to decide.

"Thank you."

Representative Amaral then rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"My understanding, Mr. Speaker, however, is that the intent of H.B. 2098 is to generate or to allow revenues for the purpose of public education on the issue of sovereignty, not on constitutional conventions or plebiscites. And so, in that sense and with that specificity, I then support this measure before us.

"Thank you."

Representative Beirne then rose to speak in support of the motion, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I feel that there are many models and definitions that are on the table right now in the discussion of sovereignty but this particular bill would basically educate our Hawaiian public and the non-Hawaiian public on the term itself, thereby leading up, you know, to a constitutional convention at some later date, upon trying to understand this issue.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Hagino rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"I have opposed this concept for eight years now, I think, or nine years, and I will continue to do so. I believe that we are a small state with basically a small public university system. If you look at the mainland -- the University of California system, the University of Wisconsin system, University of Michigan system -- these are outstanding universities. They have been able to maintain, in some cases, a number of campuses far more than the number of campuses that the University of Hawaii has, and these institutions have allowed the campuses to carve out their own identities and to offer a very broad mix of educational opportunities to the citizens of their states, as well as to the citizens of the rest of America.

"We are not such a big institution that we need to carve out a separate state university system for various other campuses. This will -- mark my word -- this will

hurt the University of Hawaii as a system. It will have a tremendous effect on the University of Hawaii-Manoa, the only research university that we have in the State of Hawaii.

"I think this bill is ill-founded. It is a direct attack on the concept of autonomy. The administration came out against this, the Regents came out against this. Of course, I would have preferred if the Regents showed up and testified in person, and I wonder where they were on an important measure as this but, basically, the University is against this, the University of Hawaii-Hilo is against this, the faculty is against this. I think that this is truly political interference within the governance of the University of Hawaii. . .the governance of higher education.

"I will be voting against this bill on Second Reading and, hopefully, that I won't have to vote against it on Third Reading.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Lee then rose to speak in favor of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I wish to congratulate the previous speaker for his numerous contributions to the dialogue that we have in this chamber, and he certainly has very valued points to make.

"I just wish to emphasize that the definition, the parameters, direction and pace of what we have under discussion on this bill are still to be determined. So his input on this legislation is solicited, but I would like to assure all of you that, so far, we have received, not only the contrary opinions expressed and conveyed tonight by the previous speaker, but also a great deal of positive feelings for the new concept, and I hope that all of you would help us in defining or even whether the concept itself should come to fruition or not.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. PROCESSING OF UNCOLLECTIBLE ACCOUNTS FOR THE COMMUNITY HOSPITALS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representative Duldulao, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 295) recommending that H.B. No. 1649 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

On motion by Representative Ihara, seconded by Representative Thielen and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1649, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO SERVICES FOR PERSONS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES OR MENTAL RETARDATION," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Representative Duldulao, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 296) recommending that H.B. No. 1445, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Ihara, seconded by Representative Thielen and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. On motion by Representative Ihara, seconded by Representative Thielen and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 871, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE STATE HEALTH PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT AGENCY," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representative Duldulao, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 298) recommending that H.B. No. 286, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Ihara, seconded by Representative Thielen and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 286, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION TO INCREASE AMBULANCE SERVICE IN THE HAWAII KAI AREA," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representative Duldulao, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 299) recommending that H.B. No. 1388, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Ihara, seconded by Representative Thielen and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1388, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representatives Cachola and Taniguchi, for the Committees on Tourism and Intergovernmental Relations and International Affairs, presented a joint report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 300) recommending that H.B. No. 124

pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representative Ihara moved that the joint report of the Committees be adopted and H.B. No. 124 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance, seconded by Representative Thielen.

Representative Shon rose to speak against the measure, stating:

"I do think that all those who disagree with the concept that the administration proposed of transferring a major portion of the TAT away from the counties; therefore, forcing all of our constituents probably to have a raise in property taxes. This is still alive in this bill. I think that it would have been much wiser to remove it at the Committee level.

"I have no problem with the blank part of Section 1 which deals with whether or not we might want to raise the TAT. But the redistribution issue is purely a vehicle for that proposal to significantly redistribute up to thirty percent of the TAT away from the counties. I think all of those who are concerned about county revenues and trading TAT for property taxes should take a very serious look at this and hope that it does not emerge as part of our financial package.

"Thank you."

Representative Hirono then rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"I would like the Clerk to note my 'no' vote. I am opposed to any measure that opens the door to a decrease in the TAT portion to the counties."

Representative Lee then rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to tell my colleagues that I did vote against this bill because I'm opposed to any raise in the TAT, and the concerns which the previous speakers have spoken about the distribution is also one that I share.

"I understand the reason for the bill but to be consistent, I voted no in the Committee, and I would like to have the Clerk record a 'no' vote.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative O'Kieffe then rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, since this bill leaves the rate open, I have to be concerned about a possible increase in taxes, and for that reason would you ask the Clerk to cast a 'no' vote for me.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Beirne then rose to cast her 'no' vote, stating:

"My employment record for 22 years in the Outrigger chain helps me to make this decision. I think taxing the tourists is sufficient at this time.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 124, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE TRANSIENT ACCOMMODATIONS TAX," passed

Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Alcon, Arakaki, Beirne, Hagino, Hirono, Lee, O'Kieffe, Shon, Tam, Thielen and Ward voting no.

Representatives Cachola and Taniguchi, for the Committees on Tourism and Intergovernmental Relations and International Affairs, presented a joint report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 301) recommending that H.B. No. 1827, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Ihara, seconded by Representative Thielen and carried, the joint report of the Committees was adopted and H.B. No. 1827, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO TOURISM," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representative Cachola, for the Committee on Tourism, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 302) recommending that H.B. No. 1828, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representative Ihara moved that the report of the Committee be adopted and H.B. No. 1828, HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance, seconded by Representative Thielen.

Representative Bainum rose to cast his 'no' vote, stating:

"I am not voting no against the concept of the convention center but I am voting no to letting loose a godzilla at the Ala Wai Gateway area, a monster that will devour hundreds of affordable rentals in Waikiki.

"Thank you very much."

Representative Lee then rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"This is a very, very ingenuous bill because it names three sites and it enables whoever is in charge to negotiate from a better position of strength. So I wish to commend the Chairman of the Committee on Tourism for his foresight.

"Thank you."

Representative Cachola then rose and requested that his remarks, in favor of the bill, be inserted into the Journal and the Chair, noting that there were no objections, "so ordered."

Representative Cachola's remarks are as follows:

"From the convention center information presented to the Tourism Committee in public hearing and decision-making on House Bill No. 1828, the costs to the State can be summed up as follows:

"Although the committee voted to pass the site selection bill naming three sites, the committee still requested additional information on various matters and greater elaboration on some of the information presented earlier, primarily about the big disparity between the two projects on the costs for FFE, contingency funds, common elements, parking (per unit) and land, but also on other matters. Different requests were made to different groups, depending on which of their previous answers required further details.

"The information that the Tourism Committee has requested from the **Myers Corporation** includes:

1. A breakdown of FFE (furniture, fixtures, equipment);
2. The State's pro-rated share of the construction costs for the parking stalls if 800 parking stalls of the total 1426 were assigned to the state convention center;
3. A breakdown of common elements, including a description and the percentage of the total that the State will bear;
4. Whether maintenance costs will be allocated between the private portion and the state convention center in proportion to the ratio of floor areas;
5.
 - a. Whether land interest can be a 55 year or a lifetime lease rather than fee simple;
 - b. Whether the costs can be allocated between the private portion and the state convention center in proportion to the ratio of floor areas or some other basis;
 - c. The respective costs, according to the new proportion, if any, for fee interest, lifetime lease, or 55 year lease.

"The information the Tourism Committee has requested from **First Development/Sukamto Holding** includes:

1. A breakdown of FFE;
2. Whether maintenance costs will be allocated between the private portion and the state convention center in proportion to the ratio of floor areas;
3. Whether the term of the lease can be lengthened to lifetime.

"The information the Tourism Committee has requested from the **Convention Center Authority** includes:

1. The reliability of the underground construction methods for both proposals;
2. The rationale for requiring 800 parking stalls;
3. The adequacy of the contingency funds for both proposals;
4. The suggested amount that the developer would have to deposit to guarantee construction beginning June 30, 1995;
5. The adequacy of the traffic impact mitigation measures for both proposals, including comments by the City and County of Honolulu Department of Transportation Services;
6. Regular updates on the status of the financing of the private portion of the development;
7. An independent study on the feasibility of both proposals.

"In order to give the Legislature more time to consider the project information from both groups, the Tourism Committee decided to designate in House Bill No. 1828, House Draft 1, all three sites, including the two leading contenders and one backup. It would be neither prudent nor advisable to narrow down the range of options by selecting a single site at this early stage. Through close scrutiny of the relevant information and careful weighing of the different factors, e.g. cost, benefits, proximity to rooms, and traffic and social impacts, the Legislature can act to preserve the health of the economy and ensure the best project for the State.

"I urge my colleagues to vote in favor of this bill."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1828, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO A CONVENTION CENTER," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Arakaki, Bainum and Hagino voting no.

Representative Cachola, for the Committee on Tourism, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 303) recommending that H.B. No. 654 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Ihara, seconded by Representative Thielen and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 654, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO TOURISM," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representative Arakaki voting no.

At 10:05 o'clock p.m., Representative Takamine asked for a recess and the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 10:07 o'clock p.m.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Beirne then rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"I, too, have very much concerns on this title, 'Native Hawaiian-Owned Industrial Enterprises,' especially when they have a partnership with a private business like Mitsubishi. I think the title is misleading, and I think that they do not represent the native Hawaiians as a whole but just a private entity.

"Thank you."

"The problem with putting it into the law is that once you do that, then in the next budget period, guess what's going to come back and guess which branch of government will come back and ask for an additional appropriation to hold what they've already been doing within their own budget. I think this is unnecessary and it opens the door to their asking for taxpayers to pay more money for this.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

"I wish to speak with serious reservations ... I am not speaking against the bill or asking the Clerk to cast a 'no' vote because there are some good measures in it, but I do have serious reservations about one portion of House Bill 150, HD 1, Stand. Com. Report 348.

"What this does on the very final two pages of the bill, and I hope that those changes will be eliminated as the bill moves forward or if it moves forward, what it does is ... it says that we now will give a tax exemption, for a one thousand dollar donation, to the contributor; that's of course, provided that the candidate will abide by the campaign spending limit. But that's a pretty hefty duty tax deduction to be able to take.

"Also, on page 28, regardless of whether or not a candidate abides by the campaign spending limit, this bill will allow any contributor to deduct two hundred dollars from her or his taxes, and I think that is really a bad message to send. I could see tying it if the candidate is going to abide by campaign spending limit restrictions, but I can't see giving a blanket two hundred dollar tax deduction. I really frankly don't know where Director Rick Kahle was on this one when he's been speaking out vigorously against a lot of other measures that take away from the tax revenues of the State. I would have expected him to champion the fight against this provision.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Marumoto then rose to speak in favor of the bill, with reservations, stating:

"In regards to the election law, there is a provision that requires that a precinct official 'shall be of the same party as the Governor and shall be the first named precinct official on the list prepared by the Chief Election Officer.' I don't think it's necessary to have a party affiliation to be a precinct official, and I would hope that when this bill goes on to a subsequent committee, that they will consider amending it to make it non-partisan. If you think that someday we might have a Governor of a different party, then I am sure you would all agree with me.

"Thank you very much."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 150, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO ELECTIONS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance.

At 10:20 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 10:44 o'clock p.m.

Representative Thielen rose and asked whether or not the Chairman of the Transportation Committee would yield to a question to which Representative Oshiro answered:

"I'd rather not."

Representative Thielen continued:

"Mr. Speaker, it's not an adversarial one. If I state my question in advance ... I just wanted to know if this division is set up for environmental protection in the Department of Transportation. Will it be paid for out of the general fund or out of the highway special fund?"

Representative Oshiro answered:

"The intent of H.B. No. 1789 is for the money to be paid for from the highway special fund. . .from existing special funds -- airport, highway and harbor collectively."

Representative Thielen thanked Representative Oshiro and continued:

"Then I can support that because I think that they do need more environmental sensitivity."

Representative Ward then rose to speak against H.B. No. 173, HD 2, stating:

"This is a bill that would protect Hawaiian and Aloha Airlines, and it is parading as a local airlines stabilization bill. I speak against this for six quick reasons:

"First, it is illegal -- clearly and patently against U.S. Code, Chapter 49, of the Federal Aviation Act;

"Secondly, it will drive up the cost of airfares by regulating those airfares;

"Thirdly, it will decrease the number of flights. They are having no profits now because they've got too many flights going too often with too few seats. President Clinton himself has said that they have expanded too quickly in the nation and that's why they are not profitable.

"Fourthly, it will make Hawaiian and Aloha Airlines permanently protected from the onslaught of any possible third carrier.

"Mr. Speaker, if we do to these airlines and then expect the national airlines not to do to us, that is cutting back air flights to Hawaii, we would be seriously damaged in tourism.

"The question is ... why would we do (1) something illegal; and (2) something that's going to cost us more money?"

"And lastly, Mr. Speaker, if this bill is at all palatable and we do want to protect local airlines, let's protect them -- give them five years -- let's do a drop dead and then let them go out and fly again. If not, this is a bad bill and bad policy.

"Thank you."

Representative Lee then rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"I think the previous speaker has explained, very succinctly, the problems that are causing the tribulations which the air carriers on the mainland are now going through, and the shakedown will only come about with the demise of one or two carriers, and the end result would be necessarily the higher price.

"What the Transportation Committee has done is basically to go back to when the problem was not there, and the problem should not have been fixed. In other words, the return to the regime under the old federal Civil Aeronautics Board under which a public utility such as airlines are regulated for their benefit as well as for our benefit.

"So I would like to cast a resounding 'yes' vote for this bill.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

I don't know if we want to be a destination for people whose primary focus is to limit their liability. I think there could be some dangers for Hawaii in this type of a measure.

"Thank you."

I don't think that's really in the best public interest."

"If we take a look at the Hamakua area -- and I believe that there is a bill alive in the Senate that I am hoping will come over to us -- to treat it as a redevelopment district where we walk in, take a look at it, and we put in a comprehensive land use plan similar to what the people in the district developed, I guess, through many long meetings and working out a regional plan, it would provide for a mixture of agricultural density, some urban

expansion, residential, commercial, golf course, while preserving the Waipio rim area.

"I think to throw fifty-one million dollars at the region to get a small portion of land and then hope that we can keep people employed for twelve to eighteen months is short-sighted. I think that we should be visionary and implement a plan whereby we can really put in some diversified land use that will add to the job base, that will provide permanent jobs for the people and their children, rather than a short-term fix where twelve to eighteen months down the road they are then told ... sorry, we'll retrain you but you're going to have to go on to welfare because there aren't any jobs there.

"With that, I would urge members to look at what is to be coming over, I understand, from the Senate and see if that isn't a better way to go for the betterment of that whole area."

On motion by Representative Say, seconded by Representative Kawakami and carried, H.B. No. 1697, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE USE TAX," passed Third Reading by a vote of 45 ayes, with Representatives Amaral, Apo, Chang, Ishii-Morikami, Menor and Shon being excused.

H.B. No. 1694, HD 1:

On motion by Representative Say, seconded by Representative Kawakami and carried, H.B. No. 1694, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO INCOME TAX REFUNDS," passed Third Reading by a vote of 45 ayes, with Representatives Amaral, Apo, Chang, Ishii-Morikami, Menor and Shon being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. Nos. 568, 892, 920, 1697 and 1694 had passed Third Reading at 12:23 o'clock p.m.

H.B. No. 1372:

On motion by Representative Yonamine, seconded by Representative Suzuki and carried, H.B. No. 1372, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO POLICE DEPARTMENTS," passed Third Reading by a vote of 45 ayes, with Representatives Amaral, Apo, Chang, Ishii-Morikami, Menor and Shon being excused.

H.B. No. 1459, HD 1:

On motion by Representative Yonamine, seconded by Representative Suzuki and carried, H.B. No. 1459, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE EMPLOYEES' RETIREMENT SYSTEM," passed Third Reading by a vote of 45 ayes, with Representatives Amaral, Apo, Chang, Ishii-Morikami, Menor and Shon being excused.

H.B. No. 1666:

On motion by Representative Yonamine, seconded by Representative Suzuki and carried, H.B. No. 1666, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY," passed Third Reading by a vote of 45 ayes, with Representatives Amaral, Apo, Chang, Ishii-Morikami, Menor and Shon being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. Nos. 1372, 1459 and 1666 had passed Third Reading at 12:24 o'clock p.m.

H.B. No. 1356, HD 1:

Representative Taniguchi moved that H.B. No. 1356, HD 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Takumi.

Representative Thielen rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"What this bill does is allows the Office of International Relations to provide Hawaii officials with in-depth briefings prior to those officials taking international trips. My question is ... what's the price tag on this bill, Mr. Speaker, and isn't it more important for those Hawaii State officials to stay at home and tend to the problems that we have right here in our State? I don't think we need to expand the role or the responsibility of the Office of International Relations when our money and our focus should go toward our problems, toward education, and other problems that we need to solve in Hawaii.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Ward rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, we live in a global village and we are a major player in the world economy. We have a special responsibility being in Hawaii. Look at the group out there ... what ethnic groups and what nationalities do we represent? We have a special responsibility to international relations, and this bill costs nothing.

"This bill is the opportunity for the Office of International Relations to become a part of the United Nations system in the Pacific. If you read the section where it allows the OIR to tap into United Nations' funds for the development that is going on in the Pacific ... I had the honor to escort Boutros Boutros-Ghali of the United Nations to Dr. Oksenberg's office at the East-West Center and Mrs. Foster's office in OIR. For Dr. Neck to say that the UN system is changing -- it is decentralizing.

"Does Hawaii want a piece of the action in the Pacific?"

"There are millions of dollars available. Part of this bill allows the OIR to be a money maker, contrary to what my myopic colleague has just indicated. This is a money-making bill. It puts Hawaii in the middle of the Pacific where it is, where it belongs, and where it should be.

"It's a good bill, Mr. Speaker.

"Thank you very much."

Representative Thielen, in response, stated:

"I'll put my glasses on so I won't be myopic.

"The problem is that the bill carries a price tag. It says we're going to send government officials overseas. I don't believe that we have the money or the luxury to do that today, and I also think that we may live in a global world, or a global village, as my colleague stated, but we have problems here at home and we need to solve those first. So I say, hold the line on what ultimately will be more money spent sending government officials overseas. I think the people have had enough of first-class travel and flights out of State.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 1356, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO INTERNATIONAL RELATIONS," having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 43 ayes to 2 noes, with Representatives O'Kieffe and Thielen voting no, and Representatives Amaral, Apo, Chang, Ishii-Morikami, Menor and Shon being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 1356 had passed Third Reading at 12:28 o'clock p.m.

H.B. No. 1602:

On motion by Representative Stegmaier, seconded by Representative Morihara and carried, H.B. No. 1602, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO ECONOMIC REDEVELOPMENT PROGRAM FOR DEPRESSED AREAS," passed Third Reading by a vote of 45 ayes, with Representatives Amaral, Apo, Chang, Ishii-Morikami, Menor and Shon being excused.

H.B. No. 1999:

On motion by Representative Bainum, seconded by Representative Herkes and carried, H.B. No. 1999, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO BUILDING CODES," passed Third Reading by a vote of 45 ayes, with Representatives Amaral, Apo, Chang, Ishii-Morikami, Menor and Shon being excused.

H.B. No. 2040, HD 1:

On motion by Representative Bainum, seconded by Representative Herkes and carried, H.B. No. 2040, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HAZARDOUS WASTE," passed Third Reading by a vote of 45 ayes, with Representatives Amaral, Apo, Chang, Ishii-Morikami, Menor and Shon being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. Nos. 1602, 1999 and 2040 had passed Third Reading at 12:29 o'clock p.m.

H.B. No. 1566:

Representative Yonamine moved that H.B. No. 1566, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Suzuki.

Representative Hagino rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise to speak against this bill. I'll be voting no. I voted against it on Second Reading and I'll continue to vote against it on Third Reading.

"Let's forget about the parties involved in the pros and cons of this bill. Let me bring up another matter which I think should be important to us, and this is the manner in which this bill is passing today.

"I am a little familiar with this story because I chaired the Human Services Committee a number of years ago. Normally in the past, and this has happened to this same bill the previous Legislature, a bill like this would go to the Human Services Committee. This is not what has happened this year.

"I think what is troublesome about this bill is that normally the Legislature takes, I think, a hands-off approach whenever there is any kind of a litigation and there is litigation in this area, and in some sense this litigation continues to this day. What this bill does is to short-circuit the litigation in this area, or any attempts to come to some amicable solution, as was suggested in the morning **Advertiser** a couple of days ago.

"This bill, this year, has been referred to other committees, and in particular another committee, instead of the traditional committees a bill of this sort will be referred to. Also, there has been a waiver and this bill has gone straight to the floor instead of a second hearing by another committee. I think a matter that is so controversial as this bill would deserve a second hearing in this body before passing so swiftly during this legislative session.

"I think because of the manner in which this bill is passing should give pause to all of us to consider ... why are we rushing through this bill? And I ask all of you to consider the fact that this has been a twenty-three year old controversy now being rushed through to some solution that is not going to make a lot of people happy.

"For this reason alone, aside from all the parties that are involved in this bill, aside from that, I think it is not good legislative judgment to rush through this bill and pass this bill in the manner that we have chosen to pass this bill this session, which is contrary to the traditional avenue that was afforded a bill of this matter in previous legislative sessions. I ask all of you to consider voting no on this bill.

"Thank you."

Representative Thielen rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"I would ask the Clerk to please note my agreement with the prior speaker's statements.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative M. Ige then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I, too, rise to speak against this measure. I also rise as an individual who was involved in this measure as former chairman of this committee. It was a very emotional issue back then as it is today. But, Mr. Speaker, we believed, at that time, that the Randolph-Sheppard Act -- the protection of blind and visually handicapped individuals -- required some type of legislation that would help them try to get up on their feet and do productive jobs, to be a tax-paying individual for this State, and we supported this measure. To see it

before us, in midstream, basically changing the rules, basically looking at other individuals that are not just visually handicapped as well, I have a problem with that. I feel that if we work together, if we collaborate, we don't need legislation like this to interfere with what is happening out there in the community. I think, as it is, it is fine, we just need to get together and collaborate more together.

"Thank you."

Representative Yonamine then rose to speak in favor of the bill, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, first, the way the bill is written, it will not jeopardize any federal funds, especially the Randolph-Sheppard Act. In fact, DHS's decision was based on the fact that to terminate another organization based on the fact that it will jeopardize federal funds. Such is not the case.

"I think what this bill does is it compels the DHS to promulgate new rules and regulations relating to awarding contracts which they have not done for the last twenty-three years. And I think this ought to be made clear that this bill, in its amended form, does not guarantee any non-group organization to get a contract, nor does it guarantee other vendors from applying for it. But what it does compel, and this is most important, that DHS's Vocational Rehabilitation Division has to come up with new rules and regulations in order to be equitable and fair in awarding contracts.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Hirono then rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"In addition to echoing the concerns already raised by others who have risen to speak against this measure, I see this in a rather simple way, and that is that the blind vendors who have spent almost nine years or more vindicating their legal rights in this area ... now that they've finally vindicated their legal rights, we are telling them that we are going to just pull the rug from under them, and we're going to change the rules of the game.

"And contrary to what the Chair of the Committee has said, I do not believe that DHS terminated Makaala because they were concerned about loss of federal funds. It was because they were doing something they should not have been doing under the law in the first place.

"Thank you."

Representative Chun then rose to speak against the bill, stating:

"I support both the blind vendors and Makaala. I think Makaala has done an excellent job at the Honolulu International Airport.

"However, as Representative Hirono has indicated, the blind vendors have been in litigation for nine years and it seems, at this point, I would hope that the Legislature and the administration, you know, put their foot down and basically bring both parties together to the table. Unless that happens, neither one of them can get their vending back.

"So, for this reason, I don't know if this particular legislation will help, but I hope that if it does pass that the other committees review this legislation or somehow put within the bill itself some kind of requirement that would make it equitable for both parties. I really feel they should be sharing in the vending operation.

"Thank you."

At 12:37 o'clock p.m., Representative Arakaki asked for a recess and the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:38 o'clock p.m.

Representative Yonamine rose and responded:

"This is exactly what the bill will provide -- an opportunity for all parties involved, if they so wish, to discuss ways in which they can either negotiate or talk to each other. But what is most important is that it is no use meeting unless DHS has those rules and regulations. I think we shouldn't lose sight of what it is. It doesn't open the door to anybody else now from getting a contract with the way we have amended the act. I think that should be made clear.

"Thank you."

Representative Ward then rose to speak in support of the bill, with reservations, stating:

"This is a bill that shouldn't even be on this floor, or even before us. It pits the blind against the blind against the disabled, and it is here today because the Department of Human Services hasn't done its homework. This bill does not decide who gets the airport contract. This is not about five million dollars and who's going to get it. It's because they didn't crack the heads together of those who didn't come to the table that we are now here today with a political solution that should have been an administrative solution.

"Mr. Speaker, as Chairman Yonamine has said, this bill will mandate DHS do its homework, bring out the best in the most reasoned solution, where everyone can win because, right now, it's a lose/lose situation and the blind are pitted against the blind and the disabled.

"Thank you."

Representative Hagino then rose and stated:

"I believe that on several of the airport sites that there have been some movements of compromise. I think what this bill does is it effectively cuts out compromising.

"I would caution everyone of us to read the bill. You know, I think all of us are. . . you know, we know the government system, we know how the bidding system works . . . read the bill! If you think that there's going to be a compromise, or the parties are going to get together after this bill passes and it is signed into law, you're fooling yourselves. Read the bill! There's going to be one victor and it's not going to be the blind vendors. Read the bill -- put your knowledge as to how the process works and you're going to find out it is not true. If there is any compromise, it is going forward now. What this bill does is it's going to cut off compromise.

"Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1566, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO USE OF PUBLIC BUILDINGS BY BLIND OR VISUALLY HANDICAPPED PERSONS AND QUALIFIED NONPROFIT CORPORATIONS," having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 36 ayes to 9 noes, with Representatives Arakaki, Chun, Hagino, Hirono, M. Ige, O'Kieffe, Santiago, Tam and Thielen

voting no, and Representatives Amaral, Apo, Chang, Ishii-Morikami, Menor and Shon being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 1566 had passed Third Reading at 12:41 o'clock p.m.

H.B. No. 1149, HD 1:

Representative Yonamine moved that H.B. No. 1149, HD 1, having been read throughout, pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Suzuki.

Representative Morihara rose and requested a conflict ruling, and the Chair ruled "no conflict."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 1149, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO WORKERS' COMPENSATION," having been read throughout, passed Third Reading by a vote of 44 ayes to 1 no, with Representative Takamine voting no, and Representatives Amaral, Apo, Chang, Ishii-Morikami, Menor and Shon being excused.

The Chair directed the Clerk to note that H.B. No. 1149 had passed Third Reading at 12:42 o'clock p.m.

Representative Duldulao then rose and stated:

"On Stand. Com. Rep. 494/H.B. 120 and Stand. Com. Rep. No. 495/H.B. No. 122, I have reservations."

Representative Lee then rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to support the recommittal of Stand. Com. Rep. 495 and H.B. No. 120.

"I would just like to remind the members that last year, the University of Hawaii took a very big hit because of this.

"Thank you."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 120, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO GOVERNMENT ASSISTANCE," was recommitted to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Amaral, Arakaki, Hagino, Hirono, O'Kieffe, Santiago and Thielen voting no.

Representative Say, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 495) recommending that H.B. No. 122, as amended in HD 1, be recommitted to the Committee on Finance.

Representative Say moved that the report of the Committee be adopted and H.B. No. 122, HD 1, be recommitted to the Committee on Finance, seconded by Representative Kawakami.

Representative Shon rose to speak against the motion, stating:

"Firstly, Mr. Speaker, I think that over the years we have struggled with the notion of how do we make health care less expensive to our people, and we have often debated whether or not to eliminate the excise tax on health care altogether. I think it is an erroneous premise that this year we should seriously consider raising the cost of health care even though the scheme of things is to try to get leverage with the federal government.

"Secondly, as constructed, even if this tax were to pass, my understanding is that it really is not necessary to include long-term care institutions in this because the acute-care institutions, by themselves, would generate an adequate amount of income that the administration has incorporated into its financial plan. Therefore, this bill by and of itself, I believe, is flawed because it creates a tremendous burden on long-term care institutions. . .

At this point, Representative Say rose on a point of order and stated:

"The motion before this House this afternoon, Mr. Speaker, is a motion of recommittal. It is not a motion on the passage of a particular measure of the contents."

The Chair then asked Representative Shon to confine his remarks to the motion for recommitment.

Representative Shon continued:

"On the recommitment process, I realize that in the past there has been instances where bills which were referred to committees died in committees, re-emerged, because in the wisdom of the Legislature, they needed to be resuscitated. Nevertheless, I think in the new spirit of openness and respect for committees, this is a bill which was referred to a committee and my understanding is it died in committee. It had a hearing and the majority voted no. We were opposed to this idea. Now the bill has been reattached to another vehicle and will be further considered.

"In my view, if this was an essential part of the package that the House wanted to consider all the way to the end, the referral system should have adjusted for that. It seems to me that when a bill is referred to a committee, that committee has a hearing, takes testimony, and votes against that idea, that there should be a certain respect for that. And that perhaps we should say that our financial package, at least at this point in the session, should not include this idea because our committee which is an expert on this has said 'no, we're opposed to this, the impacts we do not agree on.'

"For that reason, I think it would be wisest for us not to recommit this bill and not to include it in our financial package. I am sure, later on in the session, there's going to be other opportunities to discuss a whole range of financial elements to our package. But in respect for the committee system, and just one vote here that I think that if it was intended that this bill would have gone to Finance, no matter what, then it should have been referred to Finance. If the intent was ... we think we want the input of our subject matter committee to decide up or down, then I think that implies something. It implies respect for the judgment of that committee.

"So, with all due respect to those who are trying to put together the financial package, and respect for the notion that this idea perhaps should be further discussed, I do think that in the initial referrals and discussion as to how it should have been handled, it should have been handled slightly differently in order to respect the spirit of committees which bring out the public, we have the hearing, people believe they are testifying on a bill, and they believe that that committee is going to make a decision based on the rest of the House, and now suddenly it's not.

"I think, in the future, we should think a little bit more clearly about this if we want all these elements to be part of the financial package all the way. Then these should also be included in bills which go directly to Finance. But to give it to a committee and say ... what do you think? Then say, oh, you made a mistake, maybe you didn't understand what was going on. To me, that sends a mixed signal to all those who did come out and testified on it in good faith, and for that reason, I will vote against this particular measure.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Arakaki rose and stated:

"Mr. Speaker, I wish to make an appeal to the Chair, in terms of the recommitment. I believe that these two bills are clearly within the purview of the Human Services Committee, especially for Standing Committee Report 494, House Bill 120, because it is different from the bill that we did consider in committee. I wish to appeal to

you that these two bills be recommitment to the Committee on Human Services for consideration."

The Chair denied the appeal.

Representative Arakaki continued:

"Mr. Speaker, that being the case, please register a no vote."

Representative Hagino then rose to cast his 'no' votes, saying:

"I would like to echo the remarks of Representative Shon who was maybe too gentle, in my opinion, but this is the first time in my experience that I've seen this happen and it goes against the whole concept of legislative responsibility and due process."

Representative Thielen then rose to cast her 'no' vote, saying:

"It's the process to which I object, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 122, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO STATE FINANCES," was recommitment to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Amaral, Arakaki, Hagino, Hirono, Shon and Thielen voting no.

Representative Tom, for the Committee on Judiciary, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 496) recommending that H.B. No. 1088, as amended in HD 1, be recommitment to the Committee on Judiciary.

On motion by Representative Tom, seconded by Representative Menor and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1088, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO TORT LIABILITY," was recommitment to the Committee on Judiciary.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

Representative Baker: "I have two announcements: One has to do with the proofs that we all received as a result of taking our pictures for the composite. The Clerk notes that there's about 27 of us who have not returned the proofs to the Clerk's Office and Adele would be very appreciative if we would return them today. Also, for members of the Majority, we will have a number of Third Reading bills on March 4th, which is our next session day, and so we will have a Majority caucus prior to session that day."

Representative O'Kieffe: "I think this body knows about Project Olelo. Olelo is our version what C-Span is to the Congress. This has been very carefully put together and coordinated by Representative Ihara and practice sessions will be starting during the interim on this. For those of you who are interested, immediately following session, in Room 1111, Olelo is set up for your inspection and observation and there will be about a fifteen minute presentation on what Olelo really does."

Representative D. Ige then rose and thanked all the members for their participation in "Back to School Hawaii Day." "Participation has been tremendous and the excitement that I've been receiving from the schools is really overwhelming."

ADJOURNMENT

At 12:15 o'clock p.m., on motion by Representative Ihara, seconded by Representative Thielen and carried, the House of Representatives adjourned until 11:30 o'clock a.m. on Thursday, March 4, 1993.
