In accordance with the provisions of Section 10 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, the House of Representatives of the Eighteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 1995, convened at 10:00 o'clock a.m.

The Honorable Dwight Y. Takamine, being the Representative at the time present who was elected from the First Representative District of the State of Hawaii, called the House to order at 10:00 o'clock a.m.

The members of the House, guests, and audience rose to sing the National Anthem and Hawaii Ponoi led by Zoulou.

The Temporary Chair appointed Representatives Eric Hamakawa, Michael Kahikina, Nathan Suzuki and Noboru Yonamine to escort Kupuna Momi Mookini Lum to the rostrum.

Kupuna Momi Mookini Lum then delivered the invocation.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

The Temporary Chair then appointed Representatives Ken Ito, Merwyn Jones, David Morihara, Billy Swain and Eve Anderson to escort the Honorable Ronald T.Y. Moon from the rostrum.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION

H.R. No. 2, declaring the Honorable Joseph M. Souki, Representative from the Eighth District, and Paul T. Oshiro, Representative from the Forty-First District, as Speaker and Vice Speaker, respectively, of the House of Representatives of the Eighteenth Legislature of the State of Hawaii was jointly offered by Representatives Okamura and Thielen and was read by the Temporary Clerk.

On motion by Representative Okamura, seconded by Representative Thielen and carried, H.R. No. 2 was adopted.

The Temporary Chair appointed Representatives Annelle Amaral, Dennis Arakaki, Tom Okamura, Calvin Say and Cynthia Thielen to escort the newly elected Speaker to the rostrum.

The Temporary Chair stated:

"Members of the House of Representatives, I present the Honorable Joseph M. Souki, the Speaker of the House of Representatives of the Eighteenth Legislature," and presented the Speaker with the gavel.

The Speaker took the Chair and delivered his address, stating:

"Distinguished guests, colleagues of the State House, and members of my own house -- my wife, Frances; my daughter, Desiree, my new son-in-law, Dutch; my sister, Virgie; my niece, Linda Harrison, her husband, Warren Harrison; and my very good, long-time friend and campaign chairman for many, many years, Richard Kibe -- ALOHA!

"A special welcome is due to the eighteen new members of the House. I remember my first day as a freshman legislator. Back then, I didn't even dream that one day I would be Speaker. Indeed, there are those who say my being here today proves that anyone can make it in America.

"I have no doubt that one of you freshmen will one day be in my shoes, hopefully not at the same time as I am. I mention this, in the hope that over the session you will show some empathy for this grey-haired man who speaks his own brand of Maui Portuguese-English and has nothing to defend himself but a little gavel.

"I know many are already feeling the pressure of the job we have ahead of us in the next four months. It's hard not to when you read the predictions about the economic situation in our state and the impact this will have on our revenue base.

"The pressures on the state budget in 1995 are real.

"State revenues are down. There are still people in need. There are good programs without funding. More federal cutbacks are around the corner. Everyone is cutting back, especially Hawaii's families who face the highest cost of living in the country.

"And money problems aren't the only serious challenge we face. Public distrust of government is widespread. The people of Hawaii are disheartened by unchecked campaign spending and ongoing reports of unethical behavior by public officials.

"It's no wonder we hear so much about people who have lost hope.

"But we don't have the luxury of picking our battles. We were elected to make the hard choices now before us. Today this alarm clock is ringing, and we must rise to the challenge. And as tough as the challenge may be, I believe this body will meet the test.

"We must start by defining the real problem. To my way of thinking, a failure of confidence in government is the true crisis. While all we seem to read and hear about is money, money, money, I believe our biggest task is to restore a belief among the people of Hawaii that we in the government are there for them and not for ourselves.

"Our efforts to do that will rejuvenate public willingness; not only to get more involved in their government, but to solve problems which government cannot. Government responsibility and personal responsibility go hand-in-hand.

"Yes, we will all experience some pain this session. The private sector has made cuts and we will too. But we can do things in the next four months to make sure our economy is back on its feet sooner and with more strength.

"It begins with our commitment to work with Governor Cayetano and his administration in cutting spending, finding new efficiencies, and establishing clear public spending priorities.

"One rule going in. Despite the fiscal challenges we face and no matter how desperately we feel the need for more revenue, now is **NOT** the time for more taxes. With the cost of living squeezing everyone, we don't want to saddle taxpayers with one more burden.

"Notwithstanding the lack of funds, there is much we can achieve in 1995. Not every bit of progress depends on money.

"To strengthen government, we must shore up the foundation it is built on. Our House priorities include proposals which will:

* Strengthen the democratic process by making meaningful campaign reform. That means reducing the raw power of money in elections and curbing the influence of special interest. Closely related to this is the need for election reform. Even the perception of inappropriate influence in the elections process seriously jeopardizes public confidence. We will look at the options available to remove all elements that could appear to introduce any form of bias into our elections process.

- * Also, reform our State Ethics law. We will propose an expansion of the powers of the Ethics Commission, and improvements in public access to commission proceedings and hearings. It is not enough to say ethical standards are needed; we must welcome scrutiny of our actions by the public.
- * Also, review the implement, as appropriate, the State Auditor's recommendations regarding the State Civil Service system.
- * Beyond government, we will focus on our insurance laws, resolving the problems of workers' compensation and automobile insurance which are having a debilitating effect on our businesses and citizens. Insurance should protect our society, not destroy it.
- * In addition, we will introduce legislation to limit county government liability in beach-related injury claims.
- * I know we are fortunate that the level of serious crime in Hawaii is less than in other communities on the mainland, but most families are concerned about basic safety. We will conduct hearings and thoroughly review the findings of the Penal Code Review Committee and review the policies of the Hawaii Paroling Authority.
- * We will not let other quality of life goals be held hostage to this year's revenue shortfall. For environmental protection, we intend to make strides in the areas of environmental management, conservation, recycling, and improved stewardship of Hawaii's ocean resources.
- * While we have enacted omnibus education packages the past two sessions, I don't believe that any of us feel that the job is done. I would like to see us consolidate the gains we have made in school reform. We will review the progress made and continue to push for full implementation of the Education Reform Act of 1994. We will determine how school construction and maintenance programs can be accelerated and improved. And we will propose the creation of a Teaching Standards Board to develop criteria for ensuring quality teachers.

"In closing, a good agenda, with plenty of room for anyone with a good idea.

"We will rise to the challenge by making the hard choices. We will be a government which uses its funds wisely. When people see more accountability, true administrative reform, and greater willingness to put aside pet projects for the greater good, we will begin to reduce the level of cynicism which exists now.

"We will rise to the challenge by not letting the important goals of our community be held hostage to a revenue shortfall.

"We will rise to the challenge by dealing with unavoidable conflict -- attacking the issues but not the personalities.

"And, finally, we will rise to the challenge by coming through these hard times better people than when we come into them. Teaching... Learning... Growing.

"For that is the test of good government and good leadership, and the measure of a strong society.

"We will rise to the challenge.

"Thank you very much, members, and Aloha.

"Before I go on, I want to introduce the Governor, Ben Cayetano; Lt. Governor Mazie Hirono; and Reverend Monsignor Terrence Watanabe.

"I know, in my introduction, I failed to mention the Mayors of the respective counties, the Council Chairs, and the Council members who attended ... thank you for taking the time to come, and Aloha."

The Chair appointed Representatives Kenneth Hiraki, Bob Nakasone, Devon Nekoba, Marcus Oshiro and Barbara Marumoto to escort the Honorable Paul T. Oshiro to the rostrum.

The Chair presented the Vice Speaker, stating:

"Members of the House of Representatives, I present the Honorable Paul T. Oshiro, Vice Speaker of the House of Representatives for the Eighteenth Legislature."

The Chair then recognized Representative Thielen, Minority Floor Leader, "to present the Minority's response."

Representative Thielen rose and responded:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

"Governor Cayetano, Lt. Governor Hirono, Chief Justice Moon, Reverend Monsignor Watanabe, Mr. Speaker, County Mayors, County Council members, fellow representatives, spouses and guests:

"Minority Leader Gene Ward and his wife send greetings from Mainland China, the home of their adopted daughter, Johanna Mei Ward. Unfortunately, they were unable to complete the adoption process in time to be with you today but are in the air as I speak. In his absence, I will deliver Representative Ward's report of the loyal opposition.

"Last year, Representative Ward began his address to the Legislature by saying, 'We must rekindle the vision of our destiny as a people, and as an island community in the middle of the Pacific.' Now, more than ever, we must know who we are, where we are going in the 21st Century -- just five years away. Today, your loyal opposition renews its commitment to Hawaii's future by outlining seven elements of its Republican Agenda for Hawaii.

"These seven items will be at the top of the list of all that we Republicans say, do, think, and act upon in this legislative session.

"First, Hawaii's House Republicans think that Hawaii needs to become an active partner in the powerful new global economy of Asia and the Pacific.

"We must begin to re-orient our sights on opportunities in Asia as a combination of idealism and practicality, not only because it is our geographic destiny, but because it would best serve our interests by creating more and better jobs for our people.

"We have been given an unparalleled place in the world and a historical and geographical opportunity granted to few other people where we can fashion bridges between West and East.

"In all practicality, however, and one which we want to emphasize today, our objective should be simple: jobs, jobs, and jobs.

"Thus, we want to sound an urgent call to action, over the economy of our state. As everyone in this chamber should know, unemployment is up. So are bankruptcies of small businesses. Tourism is in the doldrums. Military spending is declining, and agriculture is dying a slow and painful undiversified death.

"In the midst of all this, Asia is booming, and Republicans understand that there are some things we can and must be doing to be a part of this new prosperity.

"Opportunities in the communication field, education, training, medical, and visitor fields are plentiful, and need to be harnessed before Hawaii is overlooked or considered irrelevant except for its sun, sand and surf.

"One way we can harness the opportunities of the future is by putting new focus and emphasis on the ethnic entrepreneurial heritages and unleashing the entrepreneurial energies of our people in the State of Hawaii.

"Entrepreneurs in Hawaii are opportunities for growth and jobs. Entrepreneurs are not obstacles to government.

"We are encouraged by the appointment of Dr. Seiji Naya as the new head of the Department of Business, Economic Development, and Tourism, who will be attempting to capture some of the six hundred billion dollars that fly over Hawaii annually. But he can't do it alone or without a more friendly small-business environment. Hawaii has largely forgotten its Mom 'N Pop business community. Republicans want to see small business survive and thrive in this state, and not be ignored by benign neglect any longer.

"How?

"We need to solve our workers' compensation problems this session; Republicans will do all we can to see that that will happen. And we must rid small businesses of the barriers to entering and succeeding in business. Lower the cost of doing business, and you lower the cost of living in Hawaii. A case in point is all the new 'user fees' we passed last year, Mr. Speaker. Did we read your lips correctly? I think not, and I hope this will not be the case again this year. A user fee is a tax by just another name.

"Third item on the Republican Agenda for Hawaii, is to have an educational system that does not lack a single classroom. Republicans intend to push for new private/public partnerships to build needed classrooms for our children by wrestling construction away from the bureaucracy.

"Hawaii's educational system cannot slip backwards any further without seriously injuring our children and our future.

"The private sector builds schools faster than any bureaucracy, and a new public/private partnership is immediately needed since government just hasn't delivered on the needed classroom space.

"Classroom construction, Mr. Speaker, is a nonnegotiable and non-delayable item in the minds of your Republican Caucus. And we challenge you and the Administration to work with us, Mr. Speaker, to deliver for Hawaii's students.

"Moving into the area of ethics in government, it's clear that the people of Hawaii want more ethical government.

"House Republicans now call upon the Governor to implement this wish of the people by backing legislation to elect the Attorney General rather than having her or him serve as the Governor's attorney or as the protector of the Governor's appointments over the peoples' interests.

"Too many past incidents of favoritism, non-bid contracts, and bid-parcelling have gone unpunished in the last eight years ... the people do not want business as usual. The people of Hawaii have not forgotten these breaches of ethics. Electing the Attorney General will remove this taint, and the distrust that the people frankly harbor about the Office of the Attorney General.

"Along with an elected Attorney General, a fifth and distinct pillar in the Republican Agenda for Hawaii is term limits for elected officials ... for all of us sitting in this room.

"We're backing terms limits, not because the Congress is doing it or because the Hawaii County Council has done it, but because it is right. She or he who serves the shorter time can serve the best.

"Incidentally, Mr. Speaker, we also believe that your term as Speaker, as well as those of your Committee Chairs, should be limited, to allow all of these fresh new people in the room the opportunity to move upward and filter to the top of this legislative body. That won't happen without self-imposed term limitations voluntarily agreed to by this body.

"Just as we need an ethical government environment in this state, so too do we need to protect the physical environment of this state.

"House Republicans feel it is time we put all of our environmental programs under one roof, and consolidate our efforts at keeping Hawaii's environment clean, safe and beautiful. We propose consolidating the environmental divisions within the Department of Health into the already existing Office of Environmental Quality Control. That office exists and also is within the Department of Health. This will consolidate using an underutilized director of OEQC and will maximize resources and save money. Consolidating our resources and manpower will ensure that Hawaii's sensitive ecosystems are protected comprehensively and not by piecemeal efforts.

"Last but not least, it is indeed a privilege to serve the people of Hawaii in these hallowed chambers. However, there are those who feel they deserve the privileges of service

"Republicans believe that no one in these chambers should be exempted from the laws that we pass and subject upon the people of Hawaii.

"In a critical move to reform the manner in which the Legislature works, Republicans will vote to require House members to adhere to all laws they pass. The period of privileged pensions has passed. We will also introduce legislation to require a three-fifths majority to pass a tax increase or a user fee increase.

"In sum, Mr. Speaker, Hawaii must position itself to take part in the blossoming prosperity of Asia, and if we stress small business survival, education of our youth, protection of our environment, ethics in our governing bodies, we shall have succeeded in launching Hawaii into the 21st Century.

"The Republican agenda is in place to do this, and your Minority is ready and willing to serve the people of Hawaii. We look forward to working with you and the Majority, and especially all the freshmen, to make Hawaii a better place for our children, including Johanna Mei Ward

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The Chair then recognized Representative Okamura, Majority Leader, who rose and responded:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

"Mr. Speaker, Governor Cayetano, Chief Justice Moon, Lt. Governor Hirono, distinguished guests, family, and friends ... on behalf of the Majority members of the Hawaii State House of Representatives, I bid you Aloha and Welcome.

"Mr. Speaker, I rise as a signal, to you, and all of Hawaii, that your Majority members have heard the clarion call of the electorate, and we stand before you today united, armed, and ready to proceed with the task and the challenge which is before us.

These included public and recorded committee decision-making; quorum requirements for committee action; and televised committee hearings. These reforms are now standard House procedures.

"This year, again under your able leadership, we have organized the House on the principle of full, inclusive participation, and have established a committee structure based on the individual expertise and interest of the members themselves. The net product, Mr. Speaker, will be a highly motivated and productive Majority.

"We have heard many people talk of the difficult uphill road this Legislature will face. Yet, Mr. Speaker, we are not daunted, rather we are challenged!

"During the next four months, we will work together, in partnership with our Republican members, with our colleagues in the Senate, with the new Administration, with business and with labor, with the counties, with community organizations, and with our district constituencies. This we will do in a concerted effort to meet our mutual needs and advance our collective wellbeing.

"Mr. Speaker, under your guidance and leadership, we open our House and extend our hand to all who wish to participate. Let us put personal agendas, political considerations, and narrow interests aside. Let us look deeply into our hearts and find the means to achieve our collective vision -- one that brings peace, harmony, aloha and hope to these wonderful islands we call home.

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTION (FLOOR PRESENTATION)

H.R. No. 7, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION CONGRATULATING COURTNEY GLAZA FOR HER FINE ACHIEVEMENT AND DISTINCTION AS MISS HAWAII 1994," was jointly offered by Representatives Tom and Ito and was read by the Clerk.

On motion by Representative Tom, seconded by Representative Ito and carried, H.R. No. 7 was adopted.

Representative Tom then rose and proceeded to introduce the honoree, stating:

JOINT SESSION

The Joint Session of the House of Representatives and the Senate was called to order at 10:00 o'clock a.m. by the Honorable Joseph Souki, Speaker of the House of Representatives.

Representative Amaral and Senator Solomon presented Governor Cayetano with a maile lei and an ilima lei on behalf of the House of Representatives and Senate, respectively.

The Speaker then presented to the members of the Eighteenth Legislature and guests, the Honorable Benjamin J. Cayetano, stating:

"Members of the Eighteenth Legislature, ladies and gentlemen, please join me in extending our warmest aloha and welcome to the Governor of the State of Hawaii, the Honorable Benjamin J. Cayetano."

The Governor addressed the Joint Session, as follows:

"Thank you very much. I want to extend my congratulations to Representative Ward who gave me this cigar. I guess it's a girl -- right, Gene? Give him a hand.

"Mr. President, Mr. Speaker, members of the Eighteenth Legislature, honored guests, my fellow citizens:

"I am truly honored this morning that the great privilege of presenting our State Administration's appraisal of the state of our State has been given to me.

"As a former legislator, I am not a stranger to this process. And I want you to know I am proud to have once served amongst you, and I am most appreciative for the invitation you have given me to present the goals my cabinet and I intend to pursue.

"At the outset, there are two things I want to bring to your attention. The first is that whatever I say here today is said with hope and confidence. I believe our ability to solve our state's problems is limited only by our imagination and our resolve. Second, I will not cover all

of the issues which face us. Instead, I will focus on those issues which are of the highest priority.

"Thomas Jefferson said that 'democracy begins in conversation.' My friends, let our conversation this morning begin in earnest.

"No government can sustain itself if the people do not believe in it.

"In the twenty years that I have served the public, I have never seen public confidence in government as low as it is today. Too many people find their government irrelevant to their lives. Too many people have lost faith in their government's ability to solve their problems, meet their needs and make life better. And there are far too many people who believe that public officials are self-serving, arrogant and corrupt.

"We must restore faith in state government. We must restore faith in public service. And we will begin by reaffirming our belief that government must serve and not be served. As your Governor, I will lead by example, as I have over my twenty years in public service. And my cabinet will follow my lead, making it clear to all who serve in my administration that cronyism and corruption will not be tolerated. There is no room in my administration for those who violate this standard.

"To this end, I have appointed an Attorney General who understands fully that the Attorney General is the people's lawyer -- and that her supreme loyalty in enforcing the law is not to me as Governor nor to you as members of the Legislature, but to the public, to the people.

"This fundamental principle is the cornerstone of public service. Like the Attorney General, our loyalty to the public supersedes our loyalty to each other. This principle will be the creed of my administration.

"To allay the public's concern about cronyism and corruption in government, we will establish in the Attorney General's office a Public Integrity/White Collar Crime Unit to fairly and vigorously enforce the law.

"Openness will be the hallmark of my administration. I have instructed my cabinet to be liberal, to be free, in providing you and the media with information. In time of trouble, you will never find me or my cabinet hunkering down defensively. That has never been my style, and as Governor, my cards will be face up on the table, as they have always been. If you want information, ask for it. If the law permits us to give it and we have it, we will provide it.

"The past few difficult years have taught us something we should never forget. It is the economy which allows us our lifestyle. Without a strong economy, we all suffer.

"Hawaii's economy is at a crossroads. Tourism, I am confident, will bounce back, but large corporate agribusiness such as sugar, and defense spending are in a decline. We must diversify our economy, strike a better balance among economic, environmental and social objectives, and lay the foundation for a better educated and higher skilled work force and population.

"Economic opportunities literally surround us. Hawaii is at the center of the world's most vibrant and dynamic economic region. My director of DBEDT, Dr. Seiji Naya, estimates there are about \$600-billion in trade flying over or bypassing us every year. If we could only capture one-tenth of one percent of that amount, it would be \$600-million in additional revenues which we can use to help our people and create new jobs.

"Opportunities in education, healthcare and the knowledge industry hold great potential for Hawaii. A few years ago, for example, Boston University was interested in buying Hawaii Loa College to service the demand for American higher education among Pacific Rim nations. Hawaii Pacific University, with a 56 percent out-of-state enrollment servicing many students from the Pacific Rim, has successfully found its niche in this market.

"Like American education, American healthcare is the best in the world and American healthcare is in high demand in the Pacific Rim. A few weeks ago, I had the privilege of being invited to golf with the King of Malaysia. It's one of the nice things about this job -- you get to do this. And the King had just returned from Stanford Medical Center where he received medical Having gone to Stanford for medical treatment, he decided he would stop to rest and play golf in Hawaii before returning to Malaysia. The appeal of American healthcare is not limited to kings. Every year, thousands of foreigners flock to the United States to patronize American hospitals, doctors, medical schools and healthcare businesses. We have some great ideas on how to seize these opportunities, but we will not be able to fully take advantage of them unless we take some basic steps which are essential -- essential -- to the meaningful diversification of our economy.

"First, we must build a quality public school system which will produce a high quality work force. Creating economic opportunities means little to me if our children are not prepared to seize them. This is why improving the public schools continues to be my highest priority.

"Second, meaningful economic diversification and growth will not occur unless we nurture a favorable business climate. This means accelerating our efforts to cut red tape, and we will give you examples of that, and bring down workers' compensation costs by reforming the system. Effective workers' compensation reform will not be achieved unless all of the affected parties stop blaming each other, and unless business, labor, medical providers and government work together toward a common solution. I place workers' compensation reform very high on my list of priorities, and I believe it is so important that I have asked the Lt. Governor to lead the administration's team on this matter. We have already developed a plan which she will soon present to you.

"Third, Hawaii needs a first rate, state-of-the-art telecommunications system. We have made great strides in building a good telecommunications network. But it is not a question of our capacity, rather it is a question of 'access.' In other words, what we have achieved in Hawaii is to build a telecommunications freeway -- a super freeway -- but there are very few on-ramps and few people can use this freeway.

"To provide greater accessibility to business, to scholars, to our schools, to our telecommunications system, I will propose that we go to the PUC and ask for the deregulation of telecommunications. We will ask the PUC to deregulate telecommunications, to create a climate of free and open competition to allow all telecommunications companies -- telephone, cable, microwave, cellular and satellite -- to operate here.

"Tourism, of course, will continue to be Hawaii's largest industry. And we will continue to strongly support tourism without micromanaging it. In this connection, we will continue our strong support of the Hawaii Visitors Bureau but we will require that the private sector begin to assume a greater share of the HVB's funding. On this

issue, I find myself in strong support of Senate President Mizuguchi's position on HVB.

"Let me now turn to education.

"Nothing we do will be more important than improving the education we give our children. A quality education goes far beyond preparing our children to earn a living. It is essential to improving our quality of life.

"The passage of the Omnibus Education Bill last year was a major step toward education reform. We will continue to support the implementation of the various reforms proposed by the Act, and we will work with you to bring about meaningful education reform.

"But given the fiscal crisis we find ourselves in, it is inappropriate for me to propose new education incentives such as early childhood education which is very dear to my heart but requires new revenue. Instead, let me discuss some reforms which can help improve our schools and can be made even in this time of fiscal constraint.

"You know, it takes approximately five years to build one of our schools. Maybe it's taking less now but it's close to five years. By contrast, it will take First Hawaiian Bank about two years to build its thirty-story skyscraper on the corner of King and Bishop Streets. First Hawaiian Bank has an advantage, however. It's here Walter Dods does not have to go through 41 steps to have First Hawaiian Bank's construction approved. We have to. We are going to change that.

"We propose to streamline the process. We will establish a 'one-stop' clearinghouse to facilitate all new school construction. This will require an integrated team approach by all of the appropriate state agencies to plan and implement school construction, working together. We believe this team approach will save time and improve communications between the different departments and agencies which are involved in the process.

"Repair and maintenance of the schools. We have a tremendous backlog in repair and maintenance. The problem is that the Board of Education, for a very good reason, has limited repair and maintenance of the schools to summer months. As a result, everything is crammed in a space or time of about three months. We are hundreds of millions of dollars behind in repair and maintenance. It is not anyone's fault — it is the system, it is the process. And if we continue to do things in the same way, we will never be able to break that logjam, and we will never be able to catch up.

"We propose simple things. I got this idea from someone who worked in DAGS which tells me a lot about the fertility of ideas among State workers, and I have adopted this idea. We will attempt to change the system by establishing a 'mobile' school consisting of airconditioned trailers that were used on Kauai after Hurricane Iniki hit Kauai, to move this 'mobile' school from school to school, year-round, to provide a regular and continuous repair and maintenance service. We believe that this simple idea will help us break the repair and maintenance logiam and will make the school place better for our children.

"You know, there are so many important issues I would have liked to discuss with you: long-term care -- very dear to my heart, and I propose that before my four years is over as Governor, we will do something about long-term care; affordable housing; auto insurance -- so important, again, that we have asked the Lt. Governor to take the lead on this; the University of Hawaii, the campus at Hilo, the campus at Kapolei -- very important issues; agriculture, transportation. I would have to

express those views to you at another time and you will learn about them through the budget process and the hearing process as you take a look at the bills.

"I want to devote the remainder of my time here this morning to what I consider is the State's biggest problem -- its fiscal condition.

"Of all of the issues, there is nothing more urgent, more demanding of our immediate attention, more central to all of our deliberations, than the State's financial crisis

"Make no mistake about it: no Governor, no Legislature since statehood has faced a financial crisis of the magnitude and severity that we face today.

"Until Saturday afternoon, I had a totally different speech. Then on Saturday afternoon, I met with my director of Budget of Finance who seems to make it a habit of bringing me these kinds of news. Until Saturday, we believed that the State faced a deficit of \$150 million over the next fiscal biennium. However, further analysis of our financial condition during the past weekend led us to the conclusion that the situation is even worse: that we now face a deficit in excess of \$250 million.

"Believe me, we are just as frustrated as you, and each day I hope and pray that it doesn't increase. But the fact of the matter is that we have checked the numbers again and again and again, we have brought other people in to look at the numbers, and we are convinced that we are correct, conservatively so.

"Let me take the time to decipher for you what seems to have happened. I think it's important that you understand. The executive budget submitted to you by the previous administration indicated that there would be a general fund balance of about \$80 million at the end of the 1995-1997 fiscal biennium. The first signal that this projected dollars was not likely to hold up occurred when the Council on Revenues submitted its last general fund revenue estimates indicating that the State would take in \$120 million less than previously projected.

"We then learned that certain programs, largely social services entitlements, required deficiency appropriations of about \$30.5 million this year. This also meant additional expenditures for the next biennium of some \$51 million, making for a potential shortfall of some \$200 million at the end of the biennium.

"Our latest analysis indicates that some of the calculations and assumptions were incorrect. For example, the savings, which everybody had high hopes for, from the early retirement program enacted just last session in the waning hours of the last session, were overstated by \$33-million, we found. Why? Because it was mistakenly assumed that all retirees were employees paid by the general fund whereas, as you and I know, a significant number were paid by other funds, including special funds.

"In addition, there was a miscalculation of nontax revenues in the financial plan requiring a downward adjustment of \$10.4 million.

"At this point, let me say that I don't expect you to remember all of these adjustments, certainly not in their details. But I feel I'm obliged to mention them because we all need to understand that there is a sound basis for concluding that our situation is much worse than we previously thought.

"Could it get worse? Unfortunately, the answer is yes. We do not yet know how changes in federal policies will

affect state expenditures, but the outlook is not very bright. Moreover, the financial plan does not include collective bargaining, does not include the specific appropriations that you make every year, averaging about \$30 million. It does not include contingent expenses that we may pay because of lawsuits, because of decisions made by the federal government such as the purchase of the Kapolei land, the reimbursement of the airport fund or the Felix case which many of you know about. Estimated cost -- \$45-, perhaps \$90 million. It could get worse.

"Could it get better? Yes, it could get better. We can hope that general fund revenues will pick up soon, but I would suggest that it would not be wise to base our financial policy on wishful thinking.

"What then can we do? What course of action should we follow?

"These are the basic alternatives as I see it. First, we could raise taxes to make up for the shortfalls, but the Speaker, the Senate President and I agree we do not believe that this is the course that we should take. The public would not accept any new taxes without us first exhausting our efforts to control State spending.

"Second, we could impose across-the-board reductions in State expenditures, but such an arbitrary action would mean that the most needed and worthwhile programs would suffer.

"Third, we could restructure government to realize efficiencies and economies and reduce or curtail programs which are less needed or outlived their usefulness.

"I propose that the third alternative is the most reasonable, the most responsible, and the best course of action to follow if we are to resolve the crisis we are in and also provide the basis for a more efficient and economical state government over the longer term.

"One of the first steps that we can take in redesigning the structure of government is to review the need for all boards and commissions and those agencies which are attached to the core departments and the offices of state government.

"I mentioned earlier in my speech that I would lead by example, and I will.

"We will start with the Office of the Governor. I have already begun the curtailment of the Governor's Agricultural Coordinating Committee and propose its eventual elimination because its functions should be assumed by the Department of Agriculture.

"Similarly, we do not need a separate Office of International Relations, not because our relationships in a global economy are not important, but because its mission can be pursued by the Department of Business, Economic Development and Tourism.

"I also propose that we review the Office of Children and Youth, the Executive Office on Aging, and the Office of Youth Services to determine whether these important functions can continue to stay in the Governor's Office or whether they should be absorbed by existing departments.

"A thorough review should also be made of the many agencies assigned to the principal departments with a view towards elimination or consolidation. As an example, SHPDA, the State Health Planning and Development Agency, has not shown, in my view, over the years that it has been accomplishing its principal objective of controlling the costs of healthcare facilities.

Perhaps it should be terminated. Likewise, the program of the Office of Space Industries is no longer viable, and perhaps it, too, should be reviewed and shut down.

"With respect to housing, there are now four agencies involved: the Hawaii Housing Authority, Housing Finance and Development Corporation, the Hawaii Community Development Authority, and the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands. I propose that the first three agencies be consolidated into a Department of Housing, much along the lines suggested by Representative Isbell.

"As to the housing development function of the new department and that of the Department of Hawaiian Homes, better results could be achieved by contracting all of the housing development and construction with the private sector. That has been proven time and time again -- it's time we got to it.

"We will examine all boards and commissions and recommend the termination of those which are no longer needed.

"This review should especially apply to professional and occupational licensing boards, some of which should probably be sunsetted to remove the onerous burden of unnecessary regulation.

"We should extend our review even to advisory boards. You know, with all of the emphasis on public education now centered on the individual school, with the rise and the importance of the commitment of the Legislature, or the executive, or the Board of Education to the process of SCBM, it may be time to re-examine the need for the district school advisory councils and determine whether that body is still needed.

"The agenda for restructuring government is a long one, and our approach should be systematic. I am establishing a task force on government restructuring to review the roles and responsibilities of the principal departments and to determine the appropriate placement and reassignment of functions.

"This task force, which I will personally chair, will be comprised of the directors of several key departments and will also involve the participation of leaders from our three public employee unions and leaders from the business community.

"Just as organizations need to be restructured for economy and efficiency, so should programs be redesigned if better results and savings can be achieved. For example, we have recognized that our health care programs have been extremely and increasingly costly. QUEST was developed to address that problem. The underlying principle of QUEST, we all know, is managed care.

"We estimate that QUEST will save \$60-million over five years. We can realize savings faster if we broaden QUEST now to cover the aged, blind, and disabled which is still under the old fee for service system and which recently caused us to ask you for an \$11.1-million deficiency appropriation.

"We believe that further savings can be obtained by extending QUEST to public employees and to retirees. And we can also enlarge the scope of QUEST to enable the private sector, small business, and every person in the private sector company who wishes to join, to join.

"The major concern of enlarging QUEST is whether members will be able to choose their doctors and get the quality of care they are accustomed to.

"I believe they will. QUEST today have five managed care plans now available. With a huge infusion of new participants -- we estimate about 140,000 in addition to the 120,000 now enrolled -- experience shows that most doctors will join one of the managed care programs.

"With nearly a quarter of the people in the population of this State in a single massive purchasing pool for health care, we believe QUEST will have enormous bargaining power with providers to purchase quality health care at affordable prices.

"We ask that you support our plan to expand QUEST over the next two years. It will not be easy -- there are some very, very serious questions to consider, but we believe we need to make these kinds of changes to bring health care costs under control in the State.

"Even as the major thrust in the restructuring of government and the redesign of programs is to achieve greater efficiency and cost savings, there will be some instances where a higher level of expenditures will be required.

"We must continue to fund increased staffing at the State Hospital not just because the courts require it, but because it is the right thing to do.

"And there will be instances where we must provide funding where none was previously appropriated. In this regard, we must honor our commitment to the settlement of \$600 million over the next 20 years to the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands simply because justice for native Hawaiians requires it. We simply will have to make do with less funds elsewhere, and in this case, if permitted by the settlement, we hope to ask you to earmark \$30 million annually from general obligation bond funds normally used for the State's capital improvement program to the payment of that settlement.

"We should consider this matter not merely as a settlement to benefit native Hawaiians but also as a matter which will also help the housing needs of our communities in general.

"Let's remember that every family moving into a home on Hawaiian Home lands frees a home in the community to help with our affordable housing problem. All of our citizens, not just native Hawaiians, stand to gain.

"There are some immediate, though limited, measures that we can take to improve general fund revenues. I will not touch on some of the proposals made by the House and the Senate with respect to gambling, but let me tell you what we're doing. We should review the many special and revolving funds. Where the need for the funds is questionable or the balances are excessive, we should consider transferring the funds to the general fund.

"We believe there is the potential of gaining \$31 million for the general fund through such transfers.

"We will also be proposing that you look into eliminating or reducing certain tax credits and exemptions. Keep in mind that we currently give away \$140 million a year in tax credits annually.

"Under current financial conditions, some of these exemptions may no longer be justifiable.

"For example, if the current exemption for cruise ships from the general excise tax were to be eliminated and if the tax credits for food purchases, medical services, and care of dependent children were to be limited to those with adjusted gross incomes of less than \$100,000, an additional \$11.6 million would accrue to the general fund.

"The fiscal crisis which I have described to you represents a formidable challenge to you and to my administration. There is no single solution, no magic bullet, which will solve the crisis. I have suggested to you some of the things that can be done, some of the actions that I believe should be taken. But even if we do all of the things that I have proposed today, the bottom line is this: we will still have to make budget cuts of \$40 million in the current fiscal year, \$80 million in each of the next two years of the fiscal biennium, for a total of \$200 million in cuts between now and June 30, 1997.

"In the days ahead, we will identify to the extent possible, the specific cuts that we are proposing. If these cuts are still insufficient, I will hold the line during the budget execution process by applying spending restrictions. In all of these difficult tasks, I ask for your support, your ideas, your understanding, and your full participation.

"The immediate crisis must be resolved before we can move forward to do the things that we really want to do to improve the quality of life for Hawaii's people. Like many of you, I support early childhood education and affordable long-term care as programs which are sorely needed by our people. These programs are very dear to my heart. I am determined that these needs will be met, and they will be when we put our financial house in order over the next two years.

"Recently, a friend told me that this is a terrible time to be Governor, that there was no money to do anything and that he felt sorry for me.

"I disagree with him. Rather, I feel honored to have been chosen Governor by the people to lead in this time of crisis. And you should feel honored too. During the election, the people of Hawaii knew our State was headed for hard times. And yet, they chose you and me to lead, to give them hope, to make things better by doing the right thing.

"Think about it -- what a great challenge! There are only 78 of us -- 51 representatives, 25 senators, a lieutenant governor and governor -- chosen out of a population of nearly 1.2 million people. We have been given an awesome responsibility and a great privilege by the people of this great State, and we owe them our full efforts.

"A wise person once said, "A pessimist sees calamity in every opportunity; an optimist sees opportunity in every calamity."

"So I ask you, let us be optimists and seize the opportunity to make things right. Join me in accepting this challenge. We have this opportunity to make things right. When we do that, we will serve the people of Hawaii with pride and honor.

"Thank you."

Senate President Mizuguchi then rose and stated:

"Thank you, Governor, for your serious and thought-provoking State-of-the-State address.

"We personally share your commitment to public progress in behalf of the people we represent.

"The co-equality of the executive and legislative branches of government is a principle which must be respected and honored if our system is to endure. "Today, you have laid out your blueprint for action. We look forward to working with you towards its enactment, together with complimentary legislative proposals.

"If there is no further business, I declare the Joint Session of the Eighteenth Legislature adjourned." $\label{eq:continuous}$

At 10:45 o'clock a.m., the President declared the Joint Session adjourned.

At 12:00 o'clock midnight, the House of Representatives adjourned until 12:00 o'clock noon on Wednesday, January 25, 1995.
