Tuesday, February 20, 2007

Representative Yamashita, for the Committee on Economic Development & Business Concerns presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 757) recommending that H.B. "I stand in strong support of this rock-solid measure. Mr. Speaker, we passed a Senate bill last year. Unfortunately, it didn't make it

through. I hope this year it does. It received support from even the Governor and the Lieutenant Governor last year, Mr. Speaker, so I hope this makes it all the way through."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 389, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO ELECTIONS," passed Third Reading by a vote of 42 ayes, with Representatives Bertram, Cabanilla, Caldwell, Carroll, Karamatsu, McKelvey, Sagum, Takamine and Thielen being excused.

At 12:17 o'clock p.m., the Chair noted that H.B. No. 389, HD 1, passed Third Reading.
