Representative Awana's written remarks are as follows:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I am in support with reservations. First, allow me to preface my comments by saying that I am a proponent of renewable energy.

"The Enterprise Zone is a joint effort at the State and county levels. The purpose of an Enterprise Zone is to stimulate job creation and economic diversification in areas where there is a high need. This program offers State and county tax reductions and other benefits such as an exemption from the general excise tax for up to seven years.

"This bill places more job creation right in the heart of where there are already many jobs and one of the main sources of economic growth in our State. In addition, there appears that there is only one on company in our State providing sea water air conditioning. This one company is also in a position to take advantage of additional tax credits and special purpose revenue bonds. Policy that singles out businesses for preferential treatment is questionable under these circumstances. Thank you, Mr. Speaker." Representative Marumoto rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."
