Representatives Morita and Yamashita, for the Committee on Energy & Environmental Protection and the Committee on Economic Development & Business Concerns presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. On Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1281, Relating to Seawater Air Conditioning District Cooling Systems, creating an Enterprise Zone for this kind of business. I have some problems with that and I'll be voting aye with reservations."

Representative Awana rose in support of the measure with reservations, and asked that her written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Awana's written remarks are as follows:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I am in support with reservations. First, allow me to preface my comments by saying that I am a proponent of renewable energy.

"The Enterprise Zone is a joint effort at the State and county levels. The purpose of an Enterprise Zone is to stimulate job creation and economic diversification in areas where there is a high need. This program offers State and county tax reductions and other benefits such as an exemption from the general excise tax for up to seven years.

"This bill places more job creation right in the heart of where there are already many jobs and one of the main sources of economic growth in our State. In addition, there appears that there is only one on company in our State providing sea water air conditioning. This one company is also in a position to take advantage of additional tax credits and special purpose revenue bonds. Policy that singles out businesses for preferential treatment is questionable under these circumstances. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Marumoto rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committees was adopted and S.B.
