Representative Ward: "Just for the record, and for all the various countries in the world and what they're doing. Today is Sri Lanka's National Day. And I know we have a number of citizens in Hawaii from that place, and they are celebrating as such. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative M. Oshiro: "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. On Monday, January 26th, former Chief Justice, Herman T. F. Lum passed away. While Chief Justice Lum was best known as a lifelong jurist, first in the Circuit Court and subsequently as the head of Hawaii's Judicial branch of government, Chief Justice Lum served also as the Clerk of this House from 1957 through 1961, a seat now occupied by one of his former law clerks, our own Pat Mau-Shimizu.

"Like so many other local boys of that generation, Chief Justice Lum served in the Army. After completing his term, he came home, purchased a one-way ticket to the mainland and earned his college and law degree through the G.I. Bill of Rights. And after purchasing another one-way ticket home, he returned to Hawaii and joined other progressives, such as Governor John Burns, Senator Dan Inouye, Sakae Takahashi, Governor Ariyoshi, and others to form Hawaii's modern day Democratic Party.

"That was a difficult decision for Chief Justice Lum, as the local Chinese community was predominantly Republican, due to the popularity of the late Senator Hiram Fong.

"Chief Justice Lum was interned yesterday in a simple, private military service at Punchbowl. Mr. Speaker, at the appropriate time, I request that this body observe a moment of silence for our former House Clerk and Chief Justice, the late Herman T. F. Lum. Thank you."

At this time, the House of Representatives stood for a moment of silence in memory of the late Chief Justice Herman T.F. Lum.

At 12:18 o'clock p.m., Representative B. Oshiro requested a recess, and the Chair declared a recess, subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:19 o'clock p.m.
