"Mr. Speaker, the community bordering the unimproved segment of Kaimakani Street (Aiea) has been waiting for over five years for the City and County of Honolulu and the State Department of Land and Natural Resources (DLNR)to agree on who owns, and, thus, maintains the street in question.

"In 1993 the Honolulu City Council passed Resolution Number 93-287, which essentially conferred this roadway, and other disputed sections of highway, to the City and County of Honolulu.

"Mr. Speaker, since being elected, the maintenance of Kaimakani Street has been a reoccurring problem for those residents living alongside it. Resident concerns center on health and safety issues resulting from the condition of the street, which normally has deep ruts resulting from erosion and illegally dumped bulky trash items. Again, with nobody taking responsibility for this street, the monitoring ends up resting on the backs of residents who then have to negotiate between State and City departments – neither of which want to take responsibility for the street.

"In the absence of any plan to deal with Kaimakani Street, the State DLNR has stepped in, when possible, to assist the City with minimal maintenance of the area. However, this is not a sustainable relationship - we must have agreement on the ownership of Kaimakani.

"Mr. Speaker, this measure, I hope, will help to resolve the jurisdictional conflict that currently exists and allay the legitimate concerns of residents living along Kaimakani Street."

The motion was out to vote by the Chair and carried, and the reports of the Committee were adopted and H.R. "But we have more of a content control. Not a censorship, *per se*, but we're just a little bit uptight about this. And I hope that as we move to next year and the year after, that we'll get a little bit closer to the vision of C-Span, a little bit closer to transparency. If people wanted to look at their government, they don't have to turn on *'Olelo* all the time, but they can turn on this Body, these hearings. Sometimes we're very boring, and they may fall asleep, but at least they'll have it. And that's what democracy's all about. Openness and transparency. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."
