Thursday, April 23, 2009

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Fifth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2009, convened at 12:06 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Magaoay presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Pastor Joseph Hunkin of the Lighthouse Outreach Center, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representatives Bertram, Takai and Takumi, who were excused.

On motion by Representative Evans, seconded by Representative Pine and carried, reading of the Journal was dispensed with and the Journals of the Forty-Second, Forty-Third and Forty-Fourth days were approved. (Representatives Bertram, Takai and Takumi were excused.)
