Representative Finnegan rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I'm going to rise in opposition to Standing Com. Report No. 1891. Thank you. Just quick comments. Mr. Speaker, I haven't had the time to actually take a look at the different recommendations, and I think for the most part what ARRA does, and the focus was to have a central point of accountability. And so, there may be some differences between what the working group has, with Hawaii's Congressional Delegation's working group, and the Governor. So I wanted for us to not take such a staunch stance on all the recommendations from the group, and allow for some flexibility for the Governor. So I'm standing in opposition."

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise with reservations. I rise in reservations in that the Obama Administration made it very specific that there would be some accountability. The buck would stop at the Governor's office, for all of the State of Hawaii.

"So, I think it's a collaborative thing, but to forego that the Governor should also succumb to the authority to the Commission. I think it should be understood that that would be taken under consideration. So, there's accountability with these funds. Basically, the Governor is where the buck stops, and she has to sign off, with a specific set of criteria that the Obama Administration has set forth. So, hopefully this will supplement it, and not compete with it. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Ching rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. "Thank you, Mr. Speaker. On Standing Committee Report 1892, SCR 170, SD 2, with reservations. My concern is that this is just a way to keep us from dealing with the problem this year."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R.
