"Under the present statutory scheme as found in HRS, Chapter 92, as Relating to Freedom of Information, individuals applying for licenses have certain privacy rights that are protected from disclosure. These rights are protected when they outweigh the public's right to know. As the law presently stands, the individual applying for a contractor's license or any other license, is protected from having the following information about him or her disclosed:

- The record showing that the requisite experience for licensure is met or exceeded;
- The record showing that relevant trade examinations have been passed; and
- 3. The record showing possession of adequate bonding.

"I believe the public's right to know clearly outweighs any privacy rights the applicant may have as pertaining to these 3 examples as set forth above. By passing this bill, all applicants for contractors' licenses would be required to disclose 1., 2., and, 3. above. HB 143 makes clear that licensed professionals' credentials and qualifications have no privacy interest, and is thus subject to disclosure.

"It is my hope that this bill puts an end to the unnecessary conflicts in the building between the different entities. This bill would at least create a platform for continued discussions for all interested parties."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 143, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO FREEDOM OF INFORMATION," passed Third Reading by a vote of 51 ayes.

Representative Takayama rose and asked the Clerk to record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative McKelvey rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Same request. But I do realize that this bill has a long way to go, so I look forward to working with the Senate on trying to address some of the concerns. Thank you."

Representative Fale rose and asked that the Clerk record and aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Hanohano rose and asked the Clerk to record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Hashem rose and asked the Clerk to record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Awana rose in support of the measure and asked that her written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Awana's written remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise with strong support. Our beautiful island state is known for the beautiful sandy beaches, sunshine almost all year and an eclectic array of residents and visitors from throughout the world. Our number one industry is dependent upon this image. However, Mr. Speaker, there is another side that some may know about, and others turn their heads away. For a vast majority, they do not know realize it exists. What I am speaking about Mr. Speaker is human trafficking.

"What HB 1068 HD 1 attempts to address is to inform and distribute information via the posting of signage in areas to inform those who witness trafficking or are engaged in being trafficked with a contact telephone number to report this activity. This measure will save lives. According to James Dold of the nationally renowned Polaris Project, Texas, Virginia, Maryland, Louisiana, California, Pennsylvania and Alabama have already enacted a hotline posting law in their respective states. Nevada, Arkansas, Florida, South Carolina and Georgia introduced legislation this year along with Hawaii.

"Testimony provided by Kathryn Xian of The Pacific Alliance to Stop Slavery stated that, 'Shared Hope International rated Hawaii second worst in the nation in protecting child victims of sex trafficking by law.' '...there is no sex trafficking statute in Hawaii...'

"Mr. Speaker, the City and County of Honolulu Emergency Medical Services also provided testimony in strong support stating, 'City and County of Honolulu EMS personnel received comprehensive awareness training regarding the enormous and despicable amount of trafficking victims in our backyard. Unbeknownst to them, EMS paramedics have cared for these victims over the years without any understanding as to the real story behind the victims' lives.'

"Chief of EMS, Patty Dukes, goes on to say, 'On behalf of the EMS professionals, I strongly support the requirement to post information regarding resources available to enslaved trafficked person, as well as the general public.'

"Mr. Speaker, I would like to commend Chief Dukes for her leadership role in ensuring that her staff was trained. Before this training, first responders such as our EMS were not aware of the signs to look for when they had attended trafficked victims. Hawaii's strategic location in the pacific makes us ideal for trafficking activity from throughout the world.

"The Judiciary committee amended this bill to require every employer to post a signage, however my hope is that we can address this to focus it especially on to those establishments where this activity is known or suspected to take place as this measure moves forward. HB 1068 HD 1 is a move to aid those who are vulnerable to abuse and will provide assistance to get those trafficked out of this bleak situation.

"For the aforementioned reasons Mr. Speaker, I rise in support. Thank you."

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, with reservations and a brief comment. Mr. Speaker, it's rarely we have a time to save money when we pass a bill. This one is going to save lives. But there's a better way that this bill could be saving money, and that is targeting it specifically like it was last year to those that are mostly highly probable to have these kinds of sex trafficking or otherwise human trafficking.

"I think that bill died, but as the fishermen have taught us, you fish where the fish are. This one goes too broad in places where it's going to a waste of postage and printing and I think even though it's small, it's symbolic that we can pass a bill to save money by making this bill better. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Cullen rose and asked that the Clerk record and aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.B.
