Tuesday, January 28, 2014

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Seventh Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2014, convened at 12:07 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Mizuno presiding.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Cabanilla and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 614, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO GAMBLING," passed Second Reading and was placed on the calendar for Third Reading, with Representatives Belatti, Brower, McKelvey, Souki and Takai being excused.

Representative Rhoads, for the Committee on Judiciary, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 9-14) recommending that H.B. No. 525, as amended in HD 1, pass Third Reading.

By unanimous consent, consideration of Stand. Com. Rep. No. 9-14 on H.B. No. 525, HD 1, was deferred and in accordance with Article III, Section 15 of the Constitution of the State of Hawaii, printed copies of H.B. No. 525, HD 1, were made available to the Members of the House.
