"However, the state is going to incur the loss of this. So why am I voting with reservations? Because when the state loses money, it usually looks for other money. And other money means other taxes or other fees. At the same time, we have the mayors who are saying, 'look, give us a GET tax of 1% authority or authorization.' That is not a good sign.

"Also, there are rumors by one mayor that there should be a permanent half-percent tax for the train, which is supposed to expire in 2022. So, Mr. Speaker, this is playing around with the mix of the cutting of the pie. And sometimes when somebody pulls the sheets on their side of the bed and your toes go bare, which in this case is the state, some other reaction may be expected. With that, I would like to see how this plays out. For those reasons, I have reservations. Thank you."

Representative Say rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:
