"So for example, during the roll when a name is called, to answer $e\bar{o}$ basically just means to say, yes, I am here, and it's used specifically when someone is calling you by name.

"If you use it in a sentence, it goes like this. Ua $e\bar{o}$ akua e ku'u makua. I call to my parent. So that's today's Hawaiian Word for the Day, $e\bar{o}$. Mahalo."
