## Tuesday, February 17, 2015

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2015, convened at 12:06 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Mizuno presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Mr. Logan Araki, Senior at Punahou School and grandson of former Representative George Okuda, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representative Oshiro, who was excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Fifteenth Day was deferred.

Representative Tupola rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd like to register a no vote with comments, please. I don't know what happened that day, I can't remember if I walked in late, but I know that the Chair of Higher Education is so efficient, I think he holds UH's feet to the fire all the time, and I think that's what this bill is meant to do, is to make sure that the workload compensation for the professors is adequate for what they're doing.

"My concern is about the auditor doing it, so an audit of the workload for the faculty members as opposed to somebody who has the insight to know each of the fields. UH submitted testimony that they were also concerned that whoever does it needs to have expertise, and UHPA was in opposition to it. Personally I think because I had went through it, one of the things that the auditor did in the previous one was determine that anybody who does a lab as opposed to a lecture needs to be paid two-thirds a credit instead of one. That's something that can be taken care of I think at the collective bargaining level of the negotiation.

"So I guess my recommendation is, since UH is already saying that they're going to start doing it, talking about the workloads, revising the way that they're evaluated, maybe having them just do a report of how their progress is going as opposed to mandating the audit might be helpful, so that we can get somebody with expertise in there to make sure that the workloads are fairly compensated for the professors at UH. Thank you."

No. 900, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO MEDICAL ASSISTANCE FRAUD," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representative Oshiro being excused.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 837, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise with some reservations and a couple of comments. Mr. Speaker, ivory is a very precious jewelry piece, very precious commodity, but elephants are even more precious than that. Not because of any party symbols, but because of what they stand for, of one of the best animals that have been created in God's kingdom.

"What's going on is wholesale slaughter in places like Kenya and other African places. And fortunately, the United States has banned the import of ivory, it's illegal to have ivory. The problem is that it's slipped through the cracks and it's coming into Hawaii and to other places, and we need to do something about it.

"My problem with this bill is it needs to be written better. It's still got a tincture of anti-small business, some of the presumption that if you have even ivory regardless of where it came from or how you got it, whether it's legitimate, family heirloom, *et cetera*, there's a guilt factor and a shadow that I think we can do better. So as the first iteration, I say, yeah let's go for it, let's do this, but let's do it better. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 722, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.
