

## FORTY-THIRD DAY

Wednesday, April 8, 2015

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2015, convened at 12:05 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Mizuno presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Reverend Samuel L. Domingo of Kilohana United Methodist Church Niu Valley, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representatives Oshiro, Say and Ward, who were excused.
