

EIGHTH DAY

Tuesday, February 2, 2016

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2016, convened at 12:07 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Mizuno presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Ms. Bai He, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Seventh Day was deferred.

Representative Belatti, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 8-16) recommending that H.B. No. 1013, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 1013, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, strong support. Mr. Speaker, this is a life saver and a bill of hope. It's says, if you are on your death bed and you want to try an experimental drug, you have the opportunity to do that. Why am I speaking on second reading? Well, this bill came up a number of years ago and it didn't go anywhere, and I want to thank my Peace Corps buddy, Dr. Creagan, for introducing it, and I want to encourage everybody. There are some people who have died in the process of having introduced this a number of years ago, and we hopefully this time will have it run completely through the whole system. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Creagan rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I am in support. I want to thank my Peace Corps buddy for those kind words and I'd like to have those adopted as my own," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Creagan continued, stating:

"But I'd also like to say that this does give hope to people who are otherwise excluded from these medications when it might save their lives, and they need to be given to these people expeditiously or they might die or they might suffer irreparable harm. So I think it's time that we pass this bill. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1013, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO EXPERIMENTAL TREATMENTS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

Representative Rhoads, for the Committee on Judiciary, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 9-16) recommending that S.B. No. 1067, SD 2, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1067, SD 2, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO CHARITABLE SOLICITATION," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance.
