Monday, February 8, 2016

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Eighth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2016, convened at 12:07 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Mizuno presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Senior Pastor Klayton Ko of First Assembly of God, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representatives Creagan, San Buenaventura and Say, who were excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Eleventh Day was deferred.

KA HUA 'ŌLELO O KA LĀ
HAWAIIAN WORD FOR THE DAY

Representative Ward presented *Ka Hua 'Ōlelo o Ka Lā*, the Hawaiian Word for the Day, as follows:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. The word for today is *manuahi*. *Manuahi* means free, gratis, or without any cost whatsoever. The story that is told as the origin of the word from the *kupuna* as well as my former business partner Dr. George Kanahale said, at a certain place in Chinatown there was a retail store run by a Mr. Manuahi. And whenever you had a need for something but you didn't have the money, Mr. Manuahi was the man to see, because he would give it to you free. He was a generous, big-hearted Hawaiian man whose name is now in history because it means free, without cost, and a gift. So *manuahi* is the word for today and *manuahi* is what you paid for the word for the day. Thank you."

"I would like to express my reservations on HB 1927, HD 1, which allows a tax credit for individual and corporate taxpayers that provide either solar-powered air conditioning units or solar energy systems specifically designed to provide electricity for air conditioning units for schools. While the intent of this bill is laudable, I am concerned that these tax credits have a significant impact on the budget that are not factored in when enacted. The Renewable Energy Technologies Tax Credit is especially concerning since nearly 35% of the credit is claimed by individuals with an income of \$100,000 to \$199,000, and nearly 24% of the credit is claimed by individuals with an income of \$200,000 or more. Essentially, this tax credit benefits the wealthy and should not be used as a vehicle to provide electricity for air conditioning units for schools."
