Representative Nakashima's written remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise in support of this resolution that helps to preserve and ensure a very special resource that we have at Waipio Valley in my district on the Big Island. This resolution requests that the Waipio Valley Alliance assume the responsibility for inviting taro farmers, residents, property owners, Kamehameha Schools, Bishop Museum, and other stakeholders to discuss the future stewardship, as well as environmental and cultural uniqueness, of Waipio Valley for future generations.

"For three decades, the State has recognized this important cultural resource and attempted to take steps to ensure its preservation with marginal success. The recent announcement by Bishop Museum expressing the need to divest itself of their Big Island landholdings, including much of Waipio Valley, has renewed this discussion and urgency for action, sooner, rather than later.

"With this resolution, the Legislature has placed the future of Waipio into the hands of those closest to the situation – the residents and families of the valley who have invested generations of nurturing and care to make Waipio Valley the very special place that it is today. With this resolution, we are asking that the stakeholders in Waipio Valley provide the Legislature with a plan for implementation that would ensure the future stewardship of this very special resource while balancing this desire with the dynamic community that shares the valley and its resources today.

"It is my hope that this plan will once and for all settle the future preservation of the cultural and environmental significance of this natural resource while ensuring that the management will be able to change and adapt to address the needs and interests of the valley's stakeholders.

"Aloha."
