"In support, with a comment. I think that right now sex trafficking and addressing it, we started last year and now we're getting into it more of how we can help out. And I think that I was compelled in the hearing to hear organizations like IMUAlliance, Hoola Na Pua, who help a lot of these victims. And their concern was, because it's often a very traumatic issue that people want to discuss in private, by having them go to a center may make them more uncomfortable and less willing to discuss the help they need.

"So I support giving them more money, more help, more resources, and I would just encourage the next committee to take into consideration some of these organizations that are on the ground, helping victims. Take into consideration helping the money go to them as opposed to possibly making it a little more uncomfortable for the victims that really, really desperately need help. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

"Mr. Speaker, some of us remember when we used to go bowling there. Well, what it does is kick-start, for the first time in the history of the Department of Hawaiian Home Lands, a potential high-rise that could take hundreds of people off the waitlist. Obviously, you know that the waitlist is 27,000 people. This is the first high-rise to give at least step number one in getting Hawaiians housed, of which 97 years ago we promised.

"So this is a historical bill, even though it's empty. I hope it's just the beginning of a momentum that we can build houses for the Hawaiians, and

it can be done on a high-rise level. And this does that, and I want to thank Speaker Say for his introduction of this, and encourage everybody to follow the momentum that's being started today."

Representatives Nakashima and Johanson, for the Committee on Economic Development & Business and the Committee on Labor & Public Employment, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 84) recommending that H.B. No. 1157, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Higher Education.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committees was adopted and H.B. No. 1157, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER AT THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Higher Education, with Representative Oshiro being excused.

Representative Belatti, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 85) recommending that H.B. No. 313, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 313, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representative Oshiro being excused.

Representative Belatti, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 86) recommending that H.B. No. 1110, as amended

in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Public Safety.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1110, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO TIER II FILING FEES FOR REPORTING OF HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Public Safety, with Representative Oshiro being excused.

Representative Belatti, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 87) recommending that H.B. No. 672, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Education

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 672, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH SERVICES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Education, with Representative Oshiro being excused.

Representative Belatti, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 88) recommending that H.B. No. 913, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Labor & Public Employment.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 913, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Labor & Public Employment, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Matsumoto rose to disclose a potential conflict of interest, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, ruling on a potential conflict. My husband is a firefighter," and the Chair ruled, "no conflict."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 913, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO MEDICAL COVERAGE FOR FIREFIGHTERS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Labor & Public Employment, with Representative Oshiro being excused.

Representative Belatti, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 89) recommending that H.B. No. 468, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Labor & Public Employment.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 468, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Labor & Public Employment, seconded by Representative Fyans

Representative Har rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Please note my reservations on this measure, just a very brief comment. We had extensive discussion in the Health Committee and I want to thank the Chair for moving this measure along. That said, there was a lot of conversation between HHSC, HGEA and UPW. And the concern was raised whether this bill was necessary, moreover, whether it would affect current bargaining, collective bargaining rights. So in an abundance of caution, I'll be voting with reservations, please. Thank you."

Representative Morikawa rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Reservations, with some comments. Our state hospital system must be sustainable, and personnel costs are a huge portion of their budget. But creating a separate unit is not the solution. HHSC must do better negotiating separate memorandum of agreements, since their

employees have many different working conditions. Creating more bargaining units will be costly to both the employer and the unions, but this is a very important discussion that needs to continue. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Tupola rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. With reservations. I want to thank my colleagues on the Health Committee. It was a very robust discussion, and I would like to thank my colleague from Kauai and ask permission to enter her comments as if they were my own. Thank you," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Onishi rose in support of the measure with reservations and asked that the remarks of Representative Morikawa be entered into the Journal as his own, and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 468, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO COLLECTIVE BARGAINING IN PUBLIC EMPLOYMENT," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Labor & Public Employment, with Representatives Har, Morikawa, Onishi and Tupola voting aye with reservations, and with Representative Oshiro being excused.

Representative Creagan, for the Committee on Agriculture, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 90) recommending that H.B. No. 3 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 3, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO ANIMALS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representative Oshiro being excused.

Representative Creagan, for the Committee on Agriculture, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 91) recommending that H.B. No. 390, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 390, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO ANIMAL CRUELTY," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representative Oshiro being excused.

Representative Creagan, for the Committee on Agriculture, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 92) recommending that H.B. No. 655 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 655, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE ROSE-RINGED PARAKEET," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representative Oshiro being excused.

Representative Creagan, for the Committee on Agriculture, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 93) recommending that H.B. No. 1301, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1301, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO INVASIVE SPECIES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representative Oshiro being excused.

Representative Creagan, for the Committee on Agriculture, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 94) recommending that H.B. No. 155 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 155, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO ANIMALS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representative Oshiro being excused.

Representative Ito, for the Committee on Veterans, Military, & International Affairs, & Culture and the Arts, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 95) recommending that H.B. No. 422, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 422, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Onishi rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I'd like to register a no vote on this measure. A few comments. Mr. Speaker, the current Selective Service process only involves males. What this bill does is it's going to adversely affect young men who, for whatever reasons, may not have registered with Selective Service, to not be able to enroll in a state-supported secondary education institution, or receive loans, grants, scholarships, or other financial assistance.

"There's all kinds of reasons why young men may have either forgotten or decide not to enroll or register for Selective Service, but again, to me, this only affects males, and doesn't affect any female. And until such time as Selective Service registration requires all young people to register, I feel that this just targets males. Thank you."

Representative Thielen rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I appreciate the former speaker's comments. I'd like to cast a no vote."

Representative Ito rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, in support. Mr. Speaker and members, this bill came from the Selective Service Commission. All it is, is letting the University of Hawaii comply with the Military Selective Service Act. That's all it is. Now, as far as the women, that has to be addressed by the federal Congress.

"But right now, and the university gave an explanation why they couldn't put the males into the system, it's because of the computer. Now, if I remember right, we gave the university a lot of money to upgrade the computer system. And this is one indication that, I don't know, but they cannot even input something like this. So this is just a bill that, letting the University of Hawaii, let them know that they have to comply with the Military Selective Service Act. Thank you."

Representative Evans rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, I rise in support. I just want to emphasize again that this will make individuals eligible for federal student financial assistance and employment within the executive branch of the Federal Government. So this is actually to become in compliance, so that people here can comply to get that federal assistance.

"We may disagree with some of the underlying things, like it doesn't ask for women, this is only for males, and that's a whole other issue that we should probably write maybe a resolution to the congressional delegation to address that. But clearly we want our men here in Hawaii to be able to be eligible for assistance, so I'm in strong support. Thank you."

Representative San Buenaventura rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, in support, brief comment, sir. Basically, this is to assure that America has a fighting force in the event that the voluntary draft, or the

voluntary military has to rely upon the draft, as some of us in this room, including you and myself who were drafted. It's like what the Jones Act is for the fighting of a war on the seas, being able to take the merchant ships and put them into action. It's to be able to pull the people of this place and throughout the nation to be available.

"Mr. Speaker, it's invaluable and important, and I would think that even though the male issue is targeted, it's all about the fighting forces and the readiness of America to be at a drop of a hat as it's ready.

"The other thing it is, and it hasn't been mentioned, this keeps the young people out of jail. There's a huge prison sentence if you don't sign up. This is an incentive, not only to get an education, but to not go to jail, and that is something that they enforce seriously, even though they have done it very infrequently. There's a jail term if you don't sign up, and this is an incentive to keep them out of jail. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Takumi rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. I normally don't stand up on second reading bills, frankly because the bill has a long way to go. And I've heard the comments on the floor. Historically, this bill has come up in the past, and while I can agree with my colleague from Hawaii Kai we need a strong military fighting force and all the rest of that, there are other ways to get it there. We currently have an all-volunteer military. It seems to me if the branches of the military are not as successful in getting young men, I suppose, because this is what the target is, then maybe they ought to question themselves about their recruiting efforts.

"In my opinion, there is no nexus between having to sign up for the Selective Service and whether or not you can go to an institute of higher learning. If that were true, that we need to capture as many young men, and potentially young women, we should just say, you can't get employed. That would capture a lot of people. Only a minority of people go to institutes of higher learning. Why don't we say, after high school, in order for you to get a job, in order for you to open a bank account, you have to register with the Selective Service. You can see how ludicrous that can be. Thank you very much, Mr. Speaker. In opposition."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 422, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO SELECTIVE SERVICE," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, with Representative San Buenaventura voting aye with reservations, with Representatives Onishi, Takumi and Thielen voting no, and with Representative Oshiro being excused.

Representative Ito, for the Committee on Veterans, Military, & International Affairs, & Culture and the Arts, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 96) recommending that H.B. No. 420, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Transportation.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 420, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO VETERANS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Transportation, with Representative Oshiro being excused.

Representative Ito, for the Committee on Veterans, Military, & International Affairs, & Culture and the Arts, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 97) recommending that H.B. No. 418 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 418 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative San Buenaventura rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, with strong reservations. Spouses of disabled veterans should be entitled to as much rights as any other spouses, and as such, with strong reservations."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 418, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO MILITARY BENEFITS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representative San Buenaventura voting aye with reservations, and with Representative Oshiro being excused.

Representative Ing, for the Committee on Ocean, Marine Resources, & Hawaiian Affairs, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 98) recommending that H.B. No. 117, as amended in HD 1, be recommitted to the Committee on Ocean, Marine Resources, & Hawaiian Affairs.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B.
