Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, strong yes vote. Brief comments, Mr. Speaker. Mr. Speaker, everybody in this body, everybody in this state knows we have a huge homeless problem, huge problem. We need to have a multi-variant approach to this problem. This is one that allows property owners, their driveway or their backyard, to rent out space or lease space to those who may have an RV or, my daughter calls them hippie vans, the old Volkswagens that you could sleep in, or other type accommodations.

"The difficulty is that we are treating homelessness as one-size-fits-all. What is not clear in this bill I want to make very clear now on the floor. This is for the working homeless, those who if they're gone most of the day won't even be noticed by their neighbors. And it's not going to fit every household, just like you can't have an ADU in every household, in every lot. But there is an ADU, and this is kind of like a homeless ADU by allowing those who work for a living who cannot afford the rent yet, but they can go out and they can have actually a place to sleep, and they'll have access to a kitchen, they'll have access to facilities for hygiene.

"Mr. Speaker, the problem is we promised the people of Hawaii that we were going to, quote, 'solve homelessness.' We're nowhere near that, Mr. Speaker. This is for something to have a management, it's one of those side effects like the campgrounds in the other bills that are circulating to, quote, 'help manage homelessness.'

"It's a huge problem of which we're not going to be able to have enough money for housing first. It's too expensive. Some have called it the fake hope of housing first. We'll never have the money to be able to give people a house, or an apartment. So this is one of the many ways that people are thinking of, let's give not the solving of it but the solution to doing dwellings first, rather than wait for homes.

"It's not the best way to do it, but it's one of the ways, if we don't do it, all we've done in this place is kick the can down the road. And the homeless population, if you recall the count of a few weeks ago, is going up and up and up. We've got to manage it. This is one of the options to do that. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Quinlan rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Fukumoto rose in opposition to the measure and asked that her written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Fukumoto's written remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise in opposition to HB 968.

"While I agree that a comprehensive response to the homelessness issue is needed, especially because of the shortage in housing units, the bill lacks needed details and is of questionable utility.

"One of the immediately obvious shortcomings with the bill is that there aren't any restrictions against using this type of lease to sell space as a vacation rental. Additionally, the restriction against structures that violate health or safety regulations makes it difficult to distinguish from the city's Accessory Dwelling Unit program, which has already been implemented. And since the leases could not violate private agreements or covenants, a lot of homeowners in the introducer's own district wouldn't be allowed to sell these leases because of all the homeowners' associations.

"If this idea can be found to be substantially different from the city's Accessory Dwelling Unit program, it may be prudent to first conduct a pilot program in the introducer's district. I suspect however that the introducer's district, which is largely governed by homeowners' association, would not be impacted by this measure unless the Legislature expressly authorizes this pilot project to override current association rules. This will provide the introducer and other stakeholders with enough hands-on experience with this plan before potentially subjecting the rest of the State to an extraordinary zoning exemption that would allow individuals to live in tents, trailers and other potential dangerous dwellings in people's driveways and backyards. In districts with high winds, like my own, this bill could prove a serious hazard to the health and safety of those living in these dwellings and those living near them. As such, I would strongly oppose this bill or a pilot project of this bill to take effect in my district.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Choy rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative McKelvey rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative San Buenaventura rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative LoPresti rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Holt rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 968, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO AFFORDABLE TEMPORARY HOUSING," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Water & Land, with Representatives Holt, LoPresti and San Buenaventura voting aye with reservations, with Representatives Choy, Fukumoto, McKelvey, Nakamura, Quinlan and Thielen voting no, and with Representative Ito being excused.

"And may it stand for the remainder of the session?" and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative LoPresti rose to disclose a potential conflict of interest, stating:

"Ruling on a potential conflict. I'm the president of my association," and the Chair ruled, "no conflict."

Representative LoPresti continued, stating:

"Can that stand for the rest of the session?" and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative San Buenaventura rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"In strong support."

Representative Quinlan rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1308, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HOMEOWNERS ASSOCIATIONS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, with Representative Quinlan voting no, and with Representative Ito being excused.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committees was adopted and H.B. No. 1108, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PARKING FOR DISABLED PERSONS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Transportation, with Representative Ito being excused.

Representatives Belatti and Morikawa, for the Committee on Health and the Committee on Human Services, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 155) recommending that H.B. No. 1109, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committees was adopted and H.B. My two reservations are in regards to the portion talking about the TAT, and the other portion of the bill that references community health centers. So I'm still tracking it as it goes through the committees, and those are my concerns. Thank you."

Interestingly, whether it's the Department of Health or the proponents of the medical marijuana dispensaries, there was a lot of opposition to this, and the main reason was because of the fact that the Department of Health has taken so long in trying to get this program up and running, and I think many of the proponents of the dispensaries were upset, because they felt that you're changing the rules of the game now, when the Department of Health has still already been slow to get this program up and running. And so they felt that you were only going to further protract the process, and that's why, for those reasons, I'll be voting no. Thank you."

Representative Tupola rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. A no vote. My concern was about requiring the Department of Health to do an alternative tracking system. I think in addition to the comments made by the Representative from Kapolei, that additional things that we're putting on to this, that's making it harder for dispensaries to get off the ground. The Department of Health, their stance was that they didn't suggest that we continue to complicate it until it's actually, the program's off the ground. And so for those reasons, a no. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1488, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representatives Har, McDermott and Tupola voting no, and with Representative Ito being excused.

Representative Belatti, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 162) recommending that H.B. No. 836, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Transportation.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 836, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO MARIJUANA," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Transportation, with Representative Matsumoto voting aye with reservations, with Representatives Har, McDermott, Tokioka and Tupola voting no, and with Representative Ito being excused.

Representative Takayama, for the Committee on Public Safety, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 163) recommending that H.B. No. 1246, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Representative Thielen rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

"A no vote, brief comment. I know this is again the same bill from last year. My concern is eroding of the judicial system. I see that we have overcrowding, but giving the Department of Public Safety and specifically the director the ability to do this and include possibly releasing certain felons, I can't support that. Thank you."

Representative Ward rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. This bill has come up a number of times, and I've voted no, and I've called it the get out of jail free card, if you're friends with certain people in certain places that have the ability to literally have people exit on their own. So, a no vote again. Thank you."

Representative Har rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"With reservations, please. And Mr. Speaker, just brief comments. My only concern with this bill is that it does not actually require electronic monitoring, it just simply includes that it may include electronic monitoring. For those reasons, I'm with reservations. Thank you."
