"In opposition. Mr. Speaker, this bill opens up a race to the bottom of the quality of health plans that will be offered in our state. We can end up with much higher deductibles with less care, less quality, and it'll cost the consumers more. And I foresee that insurance companies will make a very quick race to the bottom, and it would really hinder health care in our state, and we should not do this. Thank you."

Representative Belatti rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. In support with slight reservations. Mr. Speaker, in these uncertain and turbulent times where health care is about to be disrupted with the repeal and replacement of the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act, we must be open to proposals.

"But we must also be clear-sighted and demand answers to questions, so that Hawaii's nation-leading healthcare system, which has as its foundation, its bedrock, Hawaii's Prepaid Health Care Act, we have to ensure that it is not disrupted to the detriment of Hawaii's people.

"The advocates of this bill, as it moves forward, must answer the question to our satisfaction as to how the introduction of high-deductible health plans into our pre-paid, employer-based health insurance system, and in particular Hawaii's prevalent plan, is not eroded, where the quality benefits and affordable health insurance is ensured for the people of the State of Hawaii. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Morikawa rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you. Stronger reservations, but I'd like to adopt the words of the Chair of Health, please. Thank you," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative San Buenaventura rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative DeCoite rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Nakamura rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Quinlan rose in opposition to the measure and asked that the remarks of Representative LoPresti be entered into the Journal as his own, and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

"I just want to note my reservations. Also, I'm against the bill, but maybe it can improve, it had a good intent in the beginning, and maybe in the Senate it can be better. Thank you."

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, in support. I think the reservations are well taken, if you don't understand what the major intent is. And this is something that has been around for a long time. Health savings accounts have been around for a long time.

"Being that not all of us are as youthful as some others, this is really a way that people who are young, if they stay healthy, and we've always talked about we don't have enough preventive medicine, well, this is a preventive issue in that, if you stay healthy, you save money and you can use that to buy a house, you can buy a condo, a tiny room or whatever.

"So there's benefits of staying healthy, and that's what's structured inside of this. And I know there's other quarrels that may be started by a health plan such as this, but for those who use it, it could be very streamlined, and it's not saying it's mandatory, it's an optional thing. So there are some good things in this and it should pass. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Kobayashi rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, with reservations. The prior speaker spoke about young people and high deductibles. It is true that young people might benefit and use this bill with high deductibles. But then, having these young people drop out of the insurance pool also means higher rates for the other people, the not-so-young people. Thank you."

Representative Keohokalole rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Onishi rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."
