The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2017, convened at 12:04 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Mizuno presiding.

Representatives Brower and Aquino, for the Committee on Housing and the Committee on Transportation, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1095) recommending that S.B. No. 1148, SD 2, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Water & Land.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committees was adopted and S.B. No. 1148, SD 2, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Water & Land, with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Morikawa, Nakamura and Tokioka being excused.

Representative Brower, for the Committee on Housing, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1096) recommending that S.B. No. 1146, SD 2, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Education.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.B. No. 1146, SD 2, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Education, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative LoPresti rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"With reservations. My concern with this is, the optics is always a good one where it looks like we're actually going to reduce the cost for affordable housing, but the facts are otherwise.

"My understanding of how this works, when you're developing 80% AMI housing, you're usually doing it with some sort of government assistance at

the federal level, and there are standards that you actually have to keep it a certain price for the market, hence 80% AML.

"So, taking away school impact fees won't do a thing to reduce the cost of the housing to the consumer. All it does is increase the profits of the developer, who's already doing it for profit. So it doesn't make any sense, and it takes away from the kids. So, reservations for now. Thank you."

Representative San Buenaventura rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Tupola rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1146, SD 2, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO SCHOOL IMPACT FEES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Education, with Representatives LoPresti, San Buenaventura and Tupola voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Morikawa, Nakamura and Tokioka being excused.

Representative Belatti, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1097) recommending that S.B. No. 976 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Public Safety.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 976, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO TIER II FILING FEES FOR REPORTING OF HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Public Safety, with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Morikawa, Nakamura and Tokioka being excused.

Representative Belatti, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1098) recommending that S.B. No. 510, SD 2, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Education.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 510, SD 2, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO SCHOOL-BASED HEALTH SERVICES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Education, with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Morikawa, Nakamura and Tokioka being excused.

Representative Belatti, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1099) recommending that S.B. No. 720, SD 1, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Education.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 720, SD 1, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE CONCUSSION PROGRAM," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Education, with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Morikawa, Nakamura and Tokioka being excused.

Representative Belatti, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1100) recommending that S.B. No. 287, SD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 287, SD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Morikawa, Nakamura and Tokioka being excused.

Representative Belatti, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1101) recommending that S.B. No. 514, SD 1 pass

Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.B. No. 514, SD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Tupola rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Har rose in opposition to the measure and asked that her written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Har's written remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise in opposition to SB 514, SD 1. This bill authorizes pharmacists to administer human papillomavirus (HPV), Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis), meningococcal, or influenza vaccines to persons between 11 and 17 years of age and in a pharmacy setting. While this bill increases access to vaccinations for younger children, it is for this very reason that I am in opposition.

"All of the research shows that there are health related risks when administering vaccines. The HPV vaccine is no different. Currently, under the HRS, the HPV vaccine can be administered to those 14 and older. However, no tests have been completed for younger children. Therefore, it is perplexing that the Legislature seeks to pass a measure that would allow this vaccine to be administered to children of the ages of 11 through 17. We do not have the scientific evidence to support such a measure.

"Furthermore, under current law, the HPV vaccine is administered in a doctor's office or hospital in the event the patient has an adverse reaction, which is known to happen with this vaccine. This bill would allow the HPV vaccine to be administered in a pharmacy setting where there are no first responders. Therefore, if a child between the ages of 11 and 17 does in fact have an adverse reaction to the vaccine which is administered at a pharmacy, that patient will not have access to the immediate medical attention he or she may need.

"For these reasons, Mr. Speaker, I stand in opposition to SB 514, SD 1."

Representative Ward rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative McDermott rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative DeCoite rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 514, SD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, with Representatives DeCoite, Tupola and Ward voting aye with reservations, with Representatives Har and McDermott voting no, and with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Morikawa, Nakamura and Tokioka being excused.

Representative Belatti, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1102) recommending that S.B. No. 223, SD 2, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.B. No. 223, SD 2, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative LoPresti rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Quinlan rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Tupola rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Ing rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative DeCoite rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 223, SD 2, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representatives Cachola, DeCoite, Gates, Har, Ing, LoPresti and Tupola voting aye with reservations, with Representative Quinlan voting no, and with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Morikawa, Nakamura and Tokioka being excused.
