Friday, March 17, 2017

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2017, convened at 12:06 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Mizuno presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Bishop Shugo Yamanaka of Tenrikyo Hawaii Dendocho, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representatives Cachola, Ichiyama, Kobayashi, Lowen, Luke, McDermott, McKelvey, Oshiro and Souki, who were excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Thirty-First Day was deferred.

ORDER OF THE DAY

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS
(FLOOR PRESENTATIONS)

The following resolution (H.R. No. 141) was announced by the Clerk and the following action taken:

Representative Evans moved that H.R. No. 141 be adopted, seconded by Representative Ing.

Representative Evans, as Co-chair of the Outdoor Heritage Caucus, recognized the importance of outdoor recreation, lifestyles and cultural practices, and how lifeguards and ocean safety officers play an important role in ensuring our safety.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 141 was adopted, with Representatives Cachola, Choy, Ichiyama, Ito, Kobayashi, Lowen, Luke, McKelvey, Oshiro, Saiki and Souki being excused.

The following resolution (H.R. No. 142) was announced by the Clerk and the following action taken:

H.R. No. 142, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING AI-JEN POO FOR HER EXTRAORDINARY EFFORTS TO TRANSFORM WORKING CONDITIONS AND SET LABOR STANDARDS FOR MILLIONS OF DOMESTIC WORKERS IN THE UNITED STATES, INCLUDING HAWAII," was offered by Representative Takumi.

Representative Takumi moved that H.R. No. 142 be adopted, seconded by Representative Belatti.

Representative Takumi recognized the importance of domestic workers and their role caring for things families value the most, shared the history of domestic workers and their journey towards obtaining benefits and rights, and recognized Ms. Poo and her role in helping to pass domestic workers' bill of rights in Hawaii and other states.

Representative Belatti recognized the many achievements of Ms. Poo, and shared her philosophy about organizing: "I believe that love is the most powerful force for change in the world. I often compare great campaigns to great love affairs because they're an incredible container for transformation. You can change policy, but you also change relationships and people in the process."

Representative Belatti then introduced the honoree who was seated on the Floor of the House:

Ms. Ai-Jen Poo, Director, National Domestic Workers Alliance.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 142 was adopted, with Representatives Cachola, Choy, Ichiyama, Ito, McKelvey, Oshiro, Saiki and Souki being excused.

At 12:27 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:36 o'clock p.m.

Representative Ing, for the Committee on Ocean, Marine Resources, & Hawaiian Affairs, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1106) recommending that S.B. No. 1294, SD 1, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Higher Education.

Representative LoPresti rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I'd like to register reservations for 1106, 1107 and 1108. Some brief comments on 1106 and 1108. My biggest concern is that faculty should be setting curriculum, we shouldn't be legislating it. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. Representative Tupola rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Please register a no vote for me, and permission to insert comments from the previous bill. Thank you," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Ward rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, no vote with a brief comment, please. Mr. Speaker, this is a bill that is very worthwhile. It's to fund 911 services. But the source of it, I am told, and I understand to be the least of us who have this lowest socio-economic standing.

"Therefore as we did the floor presentation for those who are helping domestic workers and those who don't really have a chance to make it, this is a hit against the poor. It's good for the 911, but if we want to give a break to the poor, like we're looking for credit and other ways of helping them out, let's just let this go by, let them do their pre-paid. All of us here probably got unlimited time and text and data, but this is going to hit the people who can least afford it. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 887, SD 2, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO ENHANCED 911 SERVICES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, with Representatives Tupola and Ward voting no, and with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Oshiro and Souki being excused.

Representative Ohno, for the Committee on Intrastate Commerce, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1116) recommending that S.B. No. 946, SD 1, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

Representative Creagan, for the Committee on Agriculture, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1118) recommending that S.B. No. 640, SD 2, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Water & Land.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 640, SD 2, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HAWAIIAN TRADITIONAL AND CUSTOMARY PRACTICES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Water & Land, with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Oshiro and Souki being excused.

Representative Onishi, for the Committee on Tourism, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1119) recommending that S.B. No. 1084, SD 2, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1084, SD 2, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Oshiro and Souki being excused.

Representative Ito, for the Committee on Veterans, Military, & International Affairs, & Culture and the Arts, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1120) recommending that S.B. No. 419, SD 2, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Higher Education.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.B. No. 419, SD 2, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Higher Education, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative LoPresti rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. With reservations. My reservations stem in large part from the fact that this bill doesn't seem to leave room for conscientious objectors, first and foremost.

"Secondly, it seems, and I've discussed this with a colleague, it seems that this language would say that you can't even run for office, and I believe that would be unconstitutional if that were to pass. Thank you."

Representative Thielen rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. With reservations. I have those same concerns and I would hope that the next committee would look at this from that aspect.

"The other thing is, it applies to the male population. So what it could do is be a further hindrance to young men going to college, and already young men, I think, are in the 40th percentile of college applicants at this point, so right away they're a minority, and this can be a further stumbling block. I'm not sure, I've read the language in the bill, and as a retired attorney I could read it to say that no male in this building would be allowed to run for office unless they had complied with this federal law. So I hope everyone looks at it quite carefully. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 419, SD 2, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO SELECTIVE SERVICE," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Higher Education, with

Representatives LoPresti and Thielen voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Oshiro and Souki being excused.

Representative Belatti, for the Committee on Health, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1121) recommending that S.B. No. 387, SD 1, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 387, SD 1, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH INSURANCE," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Oshiro and Souki being excused.

Representative Brower, for the Committee on Housing, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1122) recommending that S.B. No. 1105, SD 2, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Labor & Public Employment.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.B. No. 1105, SD 2, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Labor & Public Employment, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative LoPresti rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Reservations. This is a companion bill to a House bill that we moved out that I had similar reservations about.

"Basically, my understanding that it allows for, if not requires, pay cuts for workers, workers who already can't afford the buildings that they're building, with no guarantee that there would be equal reductions in pay or profit from the developers or the contractors, which is unconscionable that we would make the workers take less pay with some assumption that there might be a reduction on the cost of housing.

"I think we need more guarantees that those pay cuts and profit cuts would be shared by all. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1105, SD 2, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HOUSING," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Labor & Public Employment, with Representative LoPresti voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Oshiro and Souki being excused.

Representatives Brower and Aquino, for the Committee on Housing and the Committee on Transportation, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1123) recommending that S.B. No. 1147, SD 2, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Water & Land.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committees be adopted, and that S.B. No. 1147, SD 2, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Water & Land, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, with reservations. Until we start selling development rights of these private TOD properties, I think we're lowballing that whole concept. As I've spoken many times on this floor, Hong Kong and Japan sell development rights along the corridor, not just for low-cost housing, which this one is for, but for the sake of building the stations and building the rail. Until that comes, I'm going to have a lot of skepticism about this. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committees was adopted and S.B. No. 1147, SD 2, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HOUSING," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Water & Land, with Representative

Ward voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Oshiro and Souki being excused.

Representative Takayama, for the Committee on Public Safety, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1124) recommending that S.B. No. 1039, SD 2, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1039, SD 2, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO PUBLIC SAFETY," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Oshiro and Souki being excused.

Representative Takayama, for the Committee on Public Safety, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1125) recommending that S.B. No. 996, SD 2, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 996, SD 2, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT PRACTICES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representatives Ichiyama, McKelvey, Oshiro and Souki being excused.

Representatives Woodson and McKelvey, for the Committee on Education and the Committee on Higher Education, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1126) recommending that S.B. No. 298, SD 1, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Economic Development & Business.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committees was adopted and S.B.
