

FORTY-SECOND DAY**Monday, April 3, 2017**

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2017, convened at 12:05 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Mizuno presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Speaker Joseph M. Souki, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representative McKelvey, who was excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Forty-First Day was deferred.

SENATE COMMUNICATIONS

The following communications from the Senate (Sen. Com. Nos. 396 through 400) were received and announced by the Clerk:

Sen. Com. No. 396, transmitting S.C.R. No. 7, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE HISTORIC SUCCESS OF COMMUNITY STEWARDSHIP UNDER THE TRADITIONAL KONOHIKI FISHING RIGHTS SYSTEM IN SUSTAINING AN ABUNDANT NEARSHORE ENVIRONMENT AND A THRIVING POPULATION AND CULTURE, AND URGING THE STATE TO SUPPORT THE DEVELOPMENT, ADOPTION, AND IMPLEMENTATION OF CULTURALLY-GROUNDED, COMMUNITY-DRIVEN FISHERIES MANAGEMENT PROPOSALS TO STEWARD, RESTORE, AND PERPETUATE OUR NEARSHORE RESOURCES AND MAINTAIN AND PROTECT ASSOCIATED CULTURAL TRADITIONS AND VALUES," which was adopted by the Senate on March 31, 2017.

Representative Nakashima moved that H.R. No. 157 be adopted, seconded by Representative Keohokalole.

Representative Ing honored Garrett Marrero and Melanie Oxley, and congratulated the honorees.

Representative San Buenaventura recognized Ed Olson for his contributions to the community.

Representative DeCoite, as a business owner, congratulated the honorees and recognized them for their contributions to the economy.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 157 was adopted, with Representatives Choy, Har, McKelvey and Saiki being excused.

The following resolution (H.R. No. 158) was announced by the Clerk and the following action taken:

H.R. No. 158, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING, COMMENDING, AND EXPRESSING A HEARTFELT MAHALO TO BRIAN MCCAFFERTY FOR HIS SERVICE AND DEDICATION TO THE PEOPLE OF MAUI COUNTY AND THE STATE OF HAWAII," was jointly offered by Representatives DeCoite, Souki and Yamashita.

Representative DeCoite moved that H.R. No. 158 be adopted, seconded by Representative Yamashita.

Representative DeCoite recognized the entrepreneurial spirit of Mr. Brian McCafferty, commended him on his many business ventures, lauded his work advocating for the preservation of traditional shoreline access trails and his work with the youth in the community, thanked him for his service and dedication to the State of Hawaii, and introduced honorees who were seated on the Floor of the House:

Mr. Brian McCafferty, Founder and Executive Director, Teens on Call; and
Mr. Abezon Acosta, Program Assistant, Teens on Call.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 158 was adopted, with Representatives Choy, Har, McKelvey and Saiki being excused.

At 12:37 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 1:00 o'clock p.m.

SUSPENSION OF RULES

On motion by Representative Evans, seconded by Representative Ward and carried, the rules were suspended for the purpose of considering certain Senate Bills for Third Reading by consent calendar. (Representatives Choy, Har, McKelvey and Oshiro were excused.)

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

Representative Takumi, for the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1554) recommending that S.B. No. 1264, SD 1, HD 1, as amended in HD 2, pass Third Reading.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.B. No. 1264, SD 1, HD 2 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative San Buenaventura rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"With strong reservations, because of the amendment. Just really short comments. Security guards are generally a very low-paying job. And I understand why we would want them to jump through hoops to ensure that they are qualified in their positions."

"However, there are huge delays right now in approving security guards for their positions, especially when there are special events. We not only compromise the safety of the special events because there won't be enough security guards, but we also prevent people who need these jobs from going to work. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1264, SD 1, HD 2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO SECURITY GUARDS," passed Third Reading by a vote of 47 ayes, with Representative San Buenaventura voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Choy, Har, McKelvey and Oshiro being excused.

Representative Takumi, for the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1555) recommending that S.B. No. 611, SD 1, HD 1, as amended in HD 2, pass Third Reading.

On motion by Representative Saiki, seconded by Representative Evans and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 611, SD 1, HD 2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO FIRE SPRINKLERS," passed Third Reading by a vote of 46 ayes to 1 no, with Representative Ward voting no, and with Representatives Choy, Har, McKelvey and Oshiro being excused.

Representative Takumi, for the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1556) recommending that S.B. No. 514, SD 1, as amended in HD 1, pass Third Reading.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.B. No. 514, SD 1, HD 1 pass Third Reading, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Cachola rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I'll be voting no on this, Senate Bill 514, SD 1, HD 1. And the reason for that is, we are playing with people's lives. The rationale that big drug companies like CVS, Longs Drugs, whatever, but there are a lot of small drug stores all over the place in the State of Hawaii, and if we are going to allow this to happen, and they cannot more or less treat patients which will more or less react to the drugs, then what happens? And that's why I have a lot of concerns about this, and hopefully they can fix it to address those concerns. Thank you."

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, with reservations. Mr. Speaker, my concern is that are these clinics, the three-minute clinics or the CVS pharmacy, morphing into basically treatment centers?

"You can get treatment, and now if you can get treatment in the CVS/Longs three-minute clinics, you've got to be able to get the drugs. So I'm wondering if one is leading the other, it's back and forth, but it looks as though it's moving in that direction."

"And my concern is, we're not sure where that goes, and one of the members of the Health Committee said they don't know any of the downsides on some of the things that they have in this bill that have been prescribed. Are there any bad influence or effects if it's administered incorrectly? And those are the reasons for my reservation. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 514, SD 1, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH," passed Third Reading by a vote of 43 ayes to 4 noes, with Representative Ward voting aye with reservations, with Representatives Cachola, Kong, McDermott and Tupola voting no, and with Representatives Choy, Har, McKelvey and Oshiro being excused.
