Representative Tupola rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, please record a no vote for me. I think that it's a good thing, on Stand. Com. 156, the one right before this, that we start reviewing what's been going on in the federal level.

"One of the things that happened when we were in the Health hearing is finding out that the Vaccine Adverse Event Reporting System, which documents all the events that have happened, adverse reactions towards vaccines, hasn't been studied by our Department of Health to determine what incidents have happened here in Hawaii. And I think an appropriate first step would be to get that under control.

"As we talk to the Department of Health, they said it's something they want to do, they want to look into, to make sure that as we update the vaccines, that we're sure that some of these adverse events that have happened in Hawaii have been addressed or that we've looked into it. And I think that that would be an appropriate first step, before we talk about updating it, creating awareness for things that we're not totally sure we're ready for here in Hawaii. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 157, SD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO COLLABORATE WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, HAWAII ASSOCIATION OF INDEPENDENT SCHOOLS, AND THE UNIVERSITY OF HAWAII TO PROMOTE VACCINES RECOMMENDED AWARENESS OF ADOLESCENTS, INCLUDING MENINGOCOCCAL DISEASE," was referred jointly to the Committee on Education and the Committee on Higher Education, with Representative Tupola voting no, and with Representatives Har, Kobayashi, Lee, McKelvey, Oshiro and Souki being excused.

Representatives Ing and Ito, for the Committee on Ocean, Marine Resources, & Hawaiian Affairs and the Committee on Veterans, Military, & International Affairs, & Culture and the Arts, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1791) recommending that S.C.R. No. 153, SD 1, as amended in HD 1, be referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representative Saiki moved that the report of the Committees be adopted, and that S.C.R. No. 153, SD 1, HD 1 be referred to the Committee on Finance, seconded by Representative Evans.

Representative Tupola rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"In support. I do want to thank the introducers for introducing a bill to have the Year of the Hawaiian. I would hope that every single year would be the Year of the Hawaiian, and whatever year it is going to be the Year of the Hawaiian, that we just get everybody off the waiting list to get homes, or do something amazing for Hawaiians that we haven't done before.

"I think it's commendable that we do this, but I also think we should make some really serious steps forward if we're going to start talking about that we're going to support Hawaiian issues. Thank you."

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"In support, Mr. Speaker. This is a good resolution, but it could be better. I think it's good that it's saying, hey, since 1988 we haven't had the Year of the Hawaiian, we haven't acknowledged what otherwise it suggests we've done in terms of progress educationally, business, *et cetera*.

"Conspicuous in its absence, however, in accomplishments, is because of a lack of accomplishment, is housing, Mr. Speaker. The largest homeless population, indigenous population, are Hawaiians. And as my colleague just mentioned, the housing situation for the last 96 years for the Hawaiian Homes Commission has been 9,600 lessees for the 203,000 acres with 27,000 still on the waiting list.

"So if it's the Year of the Hawaiian, I think we have to be able to acknowledge it should be the year of housing for the Hawaiians, and there's a better way of doing it than just acknowledging some of this stuff that some people would doubt is really putting the priorities other than through a resolution but through substance, finance and political will. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Ing rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"In support. Substance, finance and political will. All driven by public pressure, public sentiment, and there's nothing more powerful to catalyze that than a large event like we've seen in 1988. So I was born in the year 1988, ho'olōkahi. That was the original Year of the Hawaiian, where over 40,000 Native Hawaiians gathered in one place, in Aloha Stadium, to celebrate dance, music, to really push forward the Hawaiian Renaissance. I didn't even know about it until some bruddah that lives in Bumpy's Nation of Hawaii up in Waimanalo put an old video on Facebook with Leslie Wilcox around my age, celebrating this grand event. Labor unions were involved, they fed 40,000 people all at once. Remarkable.

"So, 30 years have passed. I was born then, now I'm coming of age, the folks that were my age are now big time decision makers, folks that were in their 50s and 60s are now *kupuna*, and this is another time to jump start that sort of movement. And it's also the anniversary, 30 years later, it's also the anniversary of the overthrow, 125 years.

"So what better year, in the Year of the Hawaiian, to engage more Hawaiians of every generation to participate in the political process, hopefully pressure folks like OHA and the State to really move. Move to reduce the waitlist of DHHL. Move to get Hawaiians to come out and vote.

"So that was the genesis of this resolution. Brought it over to folks in the Senate and got some other folks on board, hopefully the Office of Hawaiian Affairs. There's also a lot of division right now among the Hawaiian community, so we wanted to keep it as vague as possible, that it's not in support of any particular agenda, of nation building, but just a celebration of everything we've done in the last 30 years and in recognition that there's

still so much more work to do, and we've got to lay a path forward, for the next 30. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committees was adopted and S.C.R. Representative Tupola rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. So for that reason, this resolution wasn't referred to the Committee on VMI. So for those reasons, Mr. Speaker, with reservations."

Representative LoPresti rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Strong support. I just wanted to make a few comments so that everybody knows what this is about. The impetus for this came out last week in the Committee on Public Safety, whose area is, quote, 'relating to civilian emergency and disaster response,' end quote, from our House rules.

"I was simply looking at ways to prepare emergency responses for natural disasters, and that included something I've spoken on the Floor about before, relating to Aloha Tower and having that area serve as a container shipping yard, because the State right now has very little plans, if any, for that kind of disaster preparedness for a hurricane or a tsunami or some kind of terrorist attack or something in the harbor. And we decided to simply add on to that, oh, yeah, by the way, our fallout shelters are nonexistent anymore, and we should probably restock them. So that's all it's about.

"And last but not least, there's been I think a lot of confusion about, God forbid we ever need plans like this, but if a strong nuclear power were to target our area, we would have very little, if any, chance of survival. But, if it was something like a 15 to 20 kiloton that were to strike, the size of Hiroshima or Nagasaki, the blast radius of such a weapon is one to three miles, which is immense and enormous and hard to even imagine, but that means hundreds of thousands of people left to survive and it's our responsibility in public safety to try to make sure that we have some kind of disaster preparedness plan, that's all. Thank you."

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"I rise in support, and may the words of the previous speaker be entered into the Journal as my own," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Ward continued, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I think it's so timely for this resolution to be put before this body, and I know it's going to go to Finance. But it's something that as the Carl Vinson, the aircraft carrier, has either arrived or is steaming near the South Korean, North Korean nations, that we be alert to what's going, if anything is to happen, we'd be prepared.

"Riki Ellison of the Missile Defense Advocacy Alliance briefed both the House and the Senate last year. They made a very clear point about the very clear and present danger, that Hawaii is 12 minutes away from any missile that comes from North Korea.

"All the media has been saying, well, we are so far from getting the technology to reach the mainland. Well, we ain't the mainland. We are Hawaii and 12 minutes away. Mr. Speaker, you can't get in your car and get to the McDonald's down the street in 12 minutes.

"Mr. Speaker, this is a very timely thing. It's not that we want to be overreactive and make fear out of it, but preparedness, Mr. Speaker, that's the intent of this, and I commend the authors of it, and I hope that we pass it through into the Finance Committee, and that we are prepared for what otherwise looks like there's a lot of shaking going on in the Pacific area because of this. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 169, SD 1, HD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE STATE TO MODERNIZE ITS DISASTER PREPAREDNESS PLANS," was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representative Tokioka voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Har, Kobayashi, Lee, McKelvey, Oshiro and Souki being excused.
