

TENTH DAY

Thursday, February 1, 2018

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2018, convened at 12:08 o'clock p.m., with Speaker Saiki presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Ms. Kaila Kaawaloa, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representatives Lee, Say, Souki and Ward, who were excused.

On motion by Representative Morikawa, seconded by Representative Thielen and carried, reading of the Journal was dispensed with and the Journals of the First, Second, Third and Fourth Days were approved. (Representatives Kong, Lee, Nishimoto, Say, Souki and Ward were excused.)

INTRODUCTIONS

The following introductions were made to the Members of the House:

Representative Keohokalole introduced his staff, Kaila Kaawaloa, Julia Peleiholani and Peter Moala, and Representative Evans's staff, Teriitavae Perez.

At 12:14 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:24 o'clock p.m.

ORDER OF THE DAY

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

Representative Mizuno, for the Committee on Health & Human Services, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 23-18) recommending that H.B. No. 1950, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Intrastate Commerce.

Representative Belatti moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 1950, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Intrastate Commerce, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Tupola rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, with reservations. We've had this bill in the past, and my three comments, one is that usually for pharmacists, it's about a 20-minute period that they're able to fill prescriptions or even administer this, which doesn't also account for if there's a chance that there is adverse effects.

"Secondly is that, the APHA training is an online 20 hours training to help them prepare to administer immunizations, but it doesn't talk about how to handle adverse effects, especially if it happens in a commercial setting.

"The last thing is that, because pharmacists are not required to know the patients' history, we wouldn't know if they're getting it for the second time or if they have allergies or other things that they should be aware of before administering it, and one of our lead healthcare providers did actually suggest in the hearing to defer the bill. So I think we should just proceed with those cautions in mind for the safety of the public. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1950, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR

AN ACT RELATING TO THE PRACTICE OF PHARMACY," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Intrastate Commerce, with Representative Tupola voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Kong, Lee, McDermott, Say, Souki and Ward being excused.

Representative Mizuno, for the Committee on Health & Human Services, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 24-18) recommending that H.B. No. 1711, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1711, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, with Representatives Kong, Lee, McDermott, Say, Souki and Ward being excused.

Representative Mizuno, for the Committee on Health & Human Services, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 25-18) recommending that H.B. No. 1616, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1616, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Kong, Lee, McDermott, Say, Souki and Ward being excused.

Representative Mizuno, for the Committee on Health & Human Services, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 26-18) recommending that H.B. No. 1949, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Intrastate Commerce.

Representative Belatti moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 1949, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Intrastate Commerce, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative McKelvey rose to speak in support of the measure with reservations, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I know this is a procedural vote, however, I'd like to register with reservations. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1949, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Intrastate Commerce, with Representative McKelvey voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Kong, Lee, McDermott, Say, Souki and Ward being excused.

Representative Mizuno, for the Committee on Health & Human Services, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 27-18) recommending that H.B. No. 1816, as amended in HD 1, be recommitted to the Committee on Health & Human Services.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1816, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HUMAN SERVICES," was recommitted to the Committee on Health & Human Services, with Representatives Kong, Lee, McDermott, Say, Souki and Ward being excused.
