

ELEVENTH DAY

Friday, February 2, 2018

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2018, convened at 12:05 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Nakashima presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Pastor Mike Palompo of New Hope Central Oahu, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representatives Cachola, Lee and Ward, who were excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Ninth and Tenth Days was deferred.

ORDER OF THE DAY

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

Representative Evans, for the Committee on Economic Development & Business, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 28-18) recommending that H.B. No. 1328, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1328, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO FILM AND DIGITAL MEDIA INDUSTRY DEVELOPMENT," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Lee and Ward being excused.

Representative Mizuno, for the Committee on Health & Human Services, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 29-18) recommending that H.B. No. 1885, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1885, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO FAMILY COURT," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representatives Lee and Ward being excused.

Representative Mizuno, for the Committee on Health & Human Services, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 30-18) recommending that H.B. No. 1907, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

Representative Belatti moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 1907, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative McDermott rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Tupola rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Quinlan rose in opposition to the measure and asked that his written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Quinlan's written remarks are as follows:

"I believe that this bill will mostly hurt those who are attempting to use electronic smoking devices as a substitute for cigarettes. For me personally, I find that electronic smoking devices and liquid nicotine are a welcome alternative to inhaling burning plant matter containing over 4,000 chemicals. HB 1907 will dramatically increase the cost of these products to consumers, while reducing the amount of competition in the market. I urge the next committee hearing this bill to remove the language that relates to electronic smoking devices."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1907, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, with Representative Tupola voting aye with reservations, with Representatives McDermott and Quinlan voting no, and with Representatives Lee and Ward being excused.

Representative Mizuno, for the Committee on Health & Human Services, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 31-18) recommending that H.B. No. 1705, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1705, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH COVERAGE FOR PORT-WINE STAINS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, with Representatives Lee and Ward being excused.
