"I'm going to cast a no on this, 91-18. Although I agree with the protection idea, I think that probably we're missing the point, and the point is the material that's actually in front of the student is, the issue is protecting the person who's delivering the material. But if the material is egregious, that's the issue, not the person delivering it. So while I agree with protecting the person, I think the issue is the material itself. So I'm going to cast a no vote, sir. Thank you."

Representative Thielen rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, if I'm correct about this, I see the state Department of Education has made comments on this, but it seems to me that they're in, really in opposition to it, and they're saying, adding in--"

The Chair addressed Representative Thielen, stating:

"Representative Thielen, are you standing in support or in opposition of this measure?"

Representative Thielen continued to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"I'm going to be a no vote, Mr. Speaker, at this point, until I can sort of clarify this and see what's going on. Because DOE is saying, adding *in loco parentis* to subsection two of HRS 712-1215 appears to preclude the department from taking action against school employees identified as *in loco parentis* who commit the offense of promoting pornography for minors in various situations on school property. If the bill is actually doing that, I think that's a very serious situation, so I'm a no vote at this point. Thank you."

Representative Woodson rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members, we need this bill to potentially help protect kids, so I urge my colleagues to support this measure. Thank you. In support."

Representative Tupola rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Ward rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. Representative Quinlan's written remarks are as follows:

"I fear that allowing more residential dwellings on agricultural land is a slippery slope that we may end up regretting, especially on the island of Oahu where our housing pressure is so great."

Representative Gates rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Tokioka rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 2451, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HOUSING THAT SUPPORTS AGRICULTURAL PRODUCTION," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Water & Land, with Representatives DeCoite, Gates, Matsumoto, Nakamura, Thielen, Tokioka and Tupola voting aye with reservations, with Representative Quinlan voting no, and with Representatives Har, Kong and Souki being excused.

Representative Takumi, for the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 110-18) recommending that H.B. No. 898, as amended in HD 1, be recommitted to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.
