

## TWENTY-NINTH DAY

**Tuesday, March 13, 2018**

The House of Representatives of the Twenty-Ninth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2018, convened at 12:04 o'clock p.m., with Vice Speaker Nakashima presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Representative Gene Ward, after which the Roll was called showing all Members present with the exception of Representatives Gates, McDermott and Quinlan, who were excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Twenty-Eighth Day was deferred.

**ORDER OF THE DAY**

**REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES**

Representative Takayama, for the Committee on Public Safety, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1137-18) recommending that H.R. No. 14 be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.R. No. 14, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY, TO WORK WITH THE FAMILY REUNIFICATION WORKING GROUP AND OTHER COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS TO DEVELOP A PLAN TO ESTABLISH VISITATION CENTERS AT ALL STATE CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES AND JAILS," was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Gates, McDermott, Quinlan and Thielen being excused.

Representative Takayama, for the Committee on Public Safety, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1138-18) recommending that H.C.R. No. 17 be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and H.C.R. No. 17, entitled: "HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY, TO WORK WITH THE FAMILY REUNIFICATION WORKING GROUP AND OTHER COMMUNITY STAKEHOLDERS TO DEVELOP A PLAN TO ESTABLISH VISITATION CENTERS AT ALL STATE CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES AND JAILS," was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Gates, McDermott, Quinlan and Thielen being excused.

Representative Takayama, for the Committee on Public Safety, presented two reports:

(Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1139) recommending that H.R. No. 29 be referred to the Committee on Judiciary; and

(Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1140) recommending that H.C.R. No. 37 be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Representative Belatti moved that the reports of the Committee be adopted, and that H.R. No. 29; and H.C.R. No. 37 be referred to the Committee on Judiciary, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Ward rose to speak in opposition to both measures, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, this is the concealed carry resolution, correct? Mr. Speaker, no vote with a brief comment. Prior to the concealed carry information, I was really a very staunch gun control advocate, contrary to some impressions that people may have. Having been in the army and fired a number of weapons, I thought, well we don't need these things, but then I saw the data on concealed carry, Mr. Speaker. This is to explain why there's

a no vote that's relevant here, because those states that have implemented concealed carry have less murder rates than those who don't.

"That was, to me, an empirical statistical fact that was rather amazing. Which means, when you have a crook who sees somebody, if they're going to harm them, may actually get harmed themselves. I think it's a precautionary measure. Look, nobody likes guns, nobody wants to revel in what's been going on in the nation and the number of school shootings that we've had. But concealed to carry has a protective measure against those criminal elements that do run and do wild things in our nation. For those reasons, Mr. Speaker, a no vote, please. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the reports of the Committee were adopted and H.R. No. 29, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION OF HAWAII AND THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO OPPOSE "CONCEALED CARRY RECIPROCITY" LEGISLATION," was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representative Ward voting no, and with Representatives Gates, McDermott, Quinlan and Thielen being excused; and

H.C.R. No. 37, entitled: "HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION OF HAWAII AND THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO OPPOSE "CONCEALED CARRY RECIPROCITY" LEGISLATION," was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representative Ward voting no, and with Representatives Gates, McDermott, Quinlan and Thielen being excused.

Representative Evans, for the Committee on Economic Development & Business, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1141-18) recommending that S.B. No. 1156, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1156, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO MOVIE THEATERS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Gates, McDermott, Quinlan and Thielen being excused.
