The House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2019, convened at 12:02 o'clock p.m., with Speaker Saiki presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Reverend Robert "Moki" Hino of St. Andrew's Cathedral, after which the Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representatives Cabanilla Arakawa, Lee, Nakamura, Quinlan, Thielen and Todd, who were excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Thirteenth and Fourteenth Days was deferred.

ORDER OF THE DAY

INTRODUCTION OF RESOLUTIONS
(FLOOR PRESENTATIONS)

The following resolution (H.R. No. 21) was announced by the Clerk and the following action taken:

H.R. No. 21, entitled: "HOUSE RESOLUTION HONORING AND CELEBRATING HAWAIIAN CIVIC CLUB OF HONOLULU'S CENTENNIAL ANNIVERSARY AND THE HAWAIIAN CIVIC CLUB MOVEMENT," was jointly offered by Representatives Holt, Cullen, DeCoite, Gates, Har, Hashimoto, B. Kobayashi, Kong, Lowen, Matayoshi, McKelvey, Nakamura, Quinlan, San Buenaventura, Tarnas, Todd, Ward and Creagan.

Representative Holt moved that H.R. No. 21 be adopted, seconded by Representative Ward.

Representative Ward recognized Prince Jonah Kūhiō Kalaniana'ole for creating the Hawaiian Civic Club to provide scholarships for education of Hawaiian students, preserve Hawaiian heritage, language and culture to perpetuate the values of the Hawaiian community.

Representative Holt, as a member of the Kalihi-Palama Hawaiian Civic Club, honored and congratulated the Hawaiian Civic Club of Honolulu on their centennial anniversary and recognized the Hawaiian Civic Club as being the oldest Hawaiian community-based grassroots *'ahahui* with 60 clubs located in Hawaii and across the nation, and recognized and introduced honorees who were seated on the Floor of the House:

Charles Manu'aikohana "Manu" Boyd, *Pelekikena* (President), Hawaiian Civic Club of Honolulu; and
Kailama Farden, *Hope Pelekikena Mua* (1st Vice President), Association of Hawaiian Civic Clubs.

Representative Eli, as a member of the Nanaikapono Hawaiian Civic Club, recognized and celebrated the Hawaiian Civic Club movement and the fulfillment of Prince Jonah Kūhiō Kalaniana'ole's vision to establish and preserve the Hawaiian heritage and culture.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 21 was adopted, with Representatives Cabanilla Arakawa, Nakamura, Quinlan, Thielen and Todd being excused.

At 12:21 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:28 o'clock p.m.

REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

Representative Johanson, for the Committee on Labor & Public Employment, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 156) recommending that H.B. No. 1462, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce.

Representative Belatti moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 1462, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Cachola rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise in strong support of this bill. All the members of this House voted, a year or two ago, unanimously without reservation. And it will guarantee us to save over half a billion dollars every year. Strong support with additional written comments, Mr. Speaker. Thank you."

Representative Cachola's written remarks are as follows:

"I am in strong support of House Bill 1462, HD1, Relating to Unfunded Liabilities. Our state faces over \$12 billion in health unfunded liabilities. Act 268 (2013) requires the State and counties to pre-fund Other Post-Employment Benefits (OPEB) annual required contributions to cover the Employer Union Health Benefits Trust Fund (EUTF) unfunded liability. The pre-funding amount is about \$500 million per year for the next 30 years or more.

"As of 2018, the total pre-funded amount is \$2.37 billion. However, paying down the billions of dollars in unfunded liability may require drastic measures such as raising general excise tax (GET) and property taxes; laying-off state and county employees; cutting back benefits for state and county employees; increasing employee contributions; or using a combination of the aforementioned solutions.

"HB 1462, HD1, when enacted into law, could potentially save over \$500 million each year for the next 30 years. These savings may be used to fund much-needed state and county projects and provide a welcomed relief for taxpayers.

"Part I of HB 1462, HD1 also requires a feasibility study to determine the advantages of providing health benefits to state and county employees under a self-insured model. Over 300 businesses and organizations in Hawaii have successfully converted to self-insured from fully-insured. In addition, research has shown that 29 states that converted from a fully-insured health program to self-insured were able to control costs, save money and customize benefits.

"For the above reasons, I respectfully ask that your committee pass House Bill 1462, HD1, Relating to Unfunded Liabilities, to help the State meet its unfunded health care obligations for current public workers, retirees, future retirees and their dependents."

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, I stand with mild support, but it's a controversy that I hope will be put to rest after the study is done, because we have to commend the representative who just spoke that he has been a dogged believer in this, and hopefully the study will either confirm or deny what otherwise has been an ongoing discussion for decades. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 1462, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO UNFUNDED LIABILITIES," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce, with Representatives Cabanilla Arakawa, Nakamura and Thielen being excused.
