

THIRTY-THIRD DAY

Monday, March 18, 2019

The House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2019, convened at 12:01 o'clock p.m., with Speaker Saiki presiding.

The invocation was delivered by former State Representative and House Majority Leader Blake Oshiro, after which the Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representatives Belatti, Gates, Hashem, Lowen, McKelvey, Tokioka and Yamane, who were excused.

By unanimous consent, reading and approval of the Journal of the House of Representatives of the Thirty-Second Day was deferred.

Representative Yamane, for the Committee on Water, Land, & Hawaiian Affairs, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1388) recommending that S.B. No. 914, SD 2, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representatives Woodson and Yamane, for the Committee on Lower & Higher Education and the Committee on Water, Land, & Hawaiian Affairs, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1391) recommending that S.B. No. 976, SD 2, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Finance.

Representative Luke, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1393) recommending that S.B. No. 1361, SD 1 pass Second Reading and be placed on the calendar for Third Reading.

Representative Luke recognized Noah Taniguchi, Iolani team member who was unable to attend, son of Senate Chief Clerk Carol Taniguchi, and congratulated the Iolani team.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 210 was adopted, with Representatives Belatti, Gates, Har, Hashem, Lowen, McKelvey, Tokioka and Yamane being excused.

Representative Woodson honored hard-working students who bring great pride to their families, schools, community and our state, and recognized the Prudential Spirit of Community program as the largest nationwide program that honors middle and high school students for their volunteer community service.

Representative Tarnas recognized the Prudential Spirit of Community honorees and distinguished finalists who inspire others with their acts of public service, thanked them for their selfless contributions to their communities and the well-being of our state, and introduced honorees who were seated on the Floor of the House:

Chelsea Masaki, Mililani Middle School, state honoree who created a website that sheds light on environmental issues and features local cleanup opportunities;

Ryan Park, Punahoa School, state honoree who established a non-profit and school club, Helping Oncology Patients Everywhere (HOPE);

Stefani Sakamoto, Punahoa School, distinguished finalist who founded a nutrition education program called A Life of Healthy Actions (ALOHA) to encourage community members to make healthy food and lifestyle choices;

Catherine Chow, Keau High School, distinguished finalist who established a community garden at Hale Iki Village after the Kilauea eruptions displaced many families, who was unable to attend; and

Gerrie Marks, Vice President of Government Affairs, Prudential Financial, who was seated in the gallery.

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.R. No. 211 was adopted, with Representatives Belatti, Gates, Har, Hashem, Lowen, McKelvey, Tokioka and Yamane being excused.
