Tuesday, March 19, 2019

The House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2019, convened at 12:00 o'clock p.m., with Speaker Saiki presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Ms. Kaui Lucas of the Office of Representative Gregg Takayama, after which the Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representatives Belatti, Quinlan and Yamane, who were excused.

"There are multiple times in our American history where we made decisions that we are not very fond of. Some of these instances, the decisions we have made cannot be changed, but as Americans now, we should always try to do what is right.

"During World War II, the American government offered the Filipino people promises of a new life in America, compensation for their services in the military, and burial benefits. What was promised was not fully granted, and this bill will help in giving these valiant people what they have been desiring for.

"Senate Bill 1417, SD2 establishes a stable and dedicated funding source for repatriation and burial costs for Filipino-American World War II veterans by appropriating funds to the state Office of Veterans Services for the provision of burial grants for Filipino-American World War II veterans. Furthermore, any funds appropriated and unencumbered shall not lapse to the credit of the general fund but shall remain available.

"As the years go by, we need to be conscious about what have been promised from those before us and those whom these promises were for. These Filipino veterans are now in their early- to mid-90s and we must not

delay this action to do what is right. As Americans, we must have integrity in our word, even if it was not precisely our words. These valiant veterans should be given the opportunity to be taken back to their homeland to have their remains from where they came, as they wish. I humbly and respectfully ask my colleagues to open their hearts and keep in mind these Filipino veterans who had put their lives on the line with American soldiers to protect the American people.

"I stand in strong support of this bill."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1417, SD 2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO FILIPINO VETERANS BURIAL ASSISTANCE," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Finance, with Representatives Belatti, Quinlan and Yamane being excused.

Representative Takayama, for the Committee on Public Safety, Veterans, & Military Affairs, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1429) recommending that S.B. No. 1422, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Representative Morikawa moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.B. No. 1422, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary, seconded by Representative Johanson.

Representative Okimoto rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 1422, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO LAW ENFORCEMENT," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representative Okimoto voting aye with reservations, and with Representatives Belatti, Quinlan and Yamane being excused.

Representative Takayama, for the Committee on Public Safety, Veterans, & Military Affairs, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 1430) recommending that S.B. No. 600, as amended in HD 1, pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Representative Morikawa moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.B. No. 600, HD 1 pass Second Reading and be referred to the Committee on Judiciary, seconded by Representative Johanson.

Representative McDermott rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Okimoto rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative DeCoite rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Ward rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Har rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Matsumoto rose in support of the measure with reservations and asked that her written remarks be inserted in the Journal, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Matsumoto's written remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise in support with reservations.

"My district is comprised of military personnel in Wheeler and Schofield, and my concerns with this measure primarily relates to no provisions to accommodate our servicemembers, who may move from another state and bring their personal firearms to Hawaii.

"Mr. Speaker, have there been any comprehensive studies that demonstrate the differences in the competency to own a firearm at the age of 18 versus the age of 21?"

"We trust those who are 18-years-old to vote, to select our elected officials. We trust our 17-year-olds to enlist into the military—to risk their lives for our great nation.

"Mr. Speaker, while I respect the intent of this measure, I ask that we consider our servicemembers who own personal firearms and move to and from Hawaii before approving this measure.

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

Representative Tokioka rose and asked that the Clerk record an aye vote with reservations for him, and the Chair "so ordered."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.B. No. 600, HD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO FIREARMS," passed Second Reading and was referred to the Committee on Judiciary, with Representatives DeCoite, Har, Matsumoto, Okimoto and Tokioka voting aye with reservations, with Representatives McDermott and Ward voting no, and with Representatives Belatti, Quinlan and Yamane being excused.

Representative Har rose, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, sorry, I apologize. Mr. Speaker, on Standing Committee Report No. 1427, please have the Clerk note my reservations."

The Chair addressed Representative Har, stating:

"We've started to take the vote. We took the vote, so we can't interrupt the vote."

At 12:12 o'clock p.m., the Chair declared a recess subject to the call of the Chair.

The House of Representatives reconvened at 12:21 o'clock p.m.
