Consequently, our nation is in an AI arms race with China. With China gaining ground, in February President Trump has expressed the urgency of the U.S. maintaining its preeminence in AI for the U.S. Economy and national security, declaring that all agencies step up their involvement in this area. We need to clarify of what we mean by artificial intelligence. Is it to be augmented intelligence, emphasizing AI's assistive role, or an expert system, which is a computer system and attending software which captures and applies the knowledge and skills of a human expert to bear on a problem. Can we democratize familiarity and learning about AI involving legislators, their staff and support departments with more usage of mobile apps? We also propose a pilot project based on AI, for example, a legislative bills analysis expert system."

"So, until we have some leadership at that level, led by the fifth floor, which also has not done anything about this, I am going to continue to vote no on these measures. It's a 65-year lease, and by that time we will be well into the impacts from the rising seas around our islands."

Representative Perruso rose and asked that the Clerk record a no vote for her, and the Chair "so ordered."

Representative Wildberger rose in opposition to the measure and asked that the remarks of Representative Thielen be entered into the Journal as her own, and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

And those are the kinds of policy decisions that need to be made by DLNR, so that there's clear-cut guidelines as to what might be allowed and what not. Thank you."
