ORDER OF THE DAY**SUSPENSION OF RULES**

On motion by Representative Morikawa, seconded by Representative Matsumoto and carried, the rules were suspended for the purpose of considering certain House Bills for Final Reading by consent calendar.

FINAL READING**H.B. No. 465, HD 1, SD 2:**

Representative Belatti moved that H.B. No. 465, HD 1, SD 2 pass Final Reading, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Takayama rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, in strong support. Mr. Speaker, the measure we're considering today along with the next measure combined, go a long way towards enabling our *kūpuna* to age in place gracefully in their homes, where they prefer. With the help of limited state services such as Meals on Wheels or transportation or some light housekeeping, they are able to age in their own home as opposed to nursing homes. The beneficiaries from all this are not only our seniors but also their families, who often serve as

caregivers, and we as taxpayers ourselves, because when people impoverish themselves to go on Medicaid to enter nursing homes at a cost of more than \$126,000 per year, who ends up footing the bill? It's us as taxpayers.

"So, as we all know, we in Hawaii live longer than any other place in the world, and certainly the United States. These measures go a long way towards ensuring that those who are enjoying their golden years do so in comfort and happiness and joy. So, for those reasons I ask members for their support for these measures. Thank you."

Representative Belatti rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. In strong support. Mr. Speaker, one of the things that I believe we tried to do over the course of this session is to really focus on addressing the high cost of living, and this measure certainly does that. I'd like to also point out that this measure takes it a step further and ensures that the money that's appropriated in this bill for Kupuna Care will be folded into the base budget, the executive budget, as well as the appropriations for two years. In the past, advocates have asked us to do this, but we have refrained from doing it on a year to year basis.

"This bill really demonstrates our commitment to ensuring that the high cost living, particularly for our elderly who face increasing costs at a time when they don't have increasing income, to be able to live and thrive in our communities. So, for those reasons, Mr. Speaker, in strong support of this measure."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 465, HD 1, SD 2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO AGING," passed Final Reading by a vote of 51 ayes.

H.B. No. 468, HD 1, SD 2:

Representative Belatti moved that H.B. No. 468, HD 1, SD 2 pass Final Reading, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Takayama rose in support of the measure. [Note: See H.B. No. 465, HD 1, SD 2, for remarks.]

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 468, HD 1, SD 2, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HEALTHY AGING PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM," passed Final Reading by a vote of 51 ayes.
