On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the House reconsidered its action previously taken pursuant to the recommendation contained in Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2254, recommending referral to the Committee on Consumer Protection & Commerce. (Representative Mizuno was excused.)

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, S.C.R. No. 112, SD 1, HD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO CONDUCT A COMPREHENSIVE PERFORMANCE AND MANAGEMENT AUDIT OF THE CITY AND COUNTY OF HONOLULU DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES," was adopted, with Representative Mizuno being excused.

## SUSPENSION OF RULES

On motion by Representative Morikawa, seconded by Representative Matsumoto and carried, the rules were suspended for the purpose of considering certain House Bills for Final Reading by consent calendar. (Representative Mizuno was excused.)

## UNFINISHED BUSINESS

### Conf. Com. Rep. No. 2 and H.B. No. 330, HD 1, SD 1, CD 1:

Representative Belatti moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that H.B. No. 330, HD 1, SD 1, CD 1 pass Final Reading, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Ward rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Mr. Speaker, strong support, request for written comments in the Journal. Thank you."

Representative Ward's written remarks are as follows:

"Mr. Speaker, I rise in support but would also like to recommend that a part of the monies be designated for support of the suicide prevention hotline, especially as for any immediate need to do a home visit consolation, or at any other location. I would also suggest that the Department of Health conduct more frequent suicide education and counseling for students at intermediate and high schools, and how to get private and urgent counseling assistance. We live in a day and age where suicide deaths are becoming more prevalent, and we need to ensure that our residents, especially our children, have the appropriate resources if and when they might need them."

Representative Nakamura rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. In strong support. Two weeks ago, I introduced to you 38 students from the Kapaa Middle School's AVID program. These students have a desire to attend college and, if successful, will be the first in their family to attend college. The Kauai delegation hosted lunch and, over Zip Pacs, talked about their concerns. The bad traffic through Kapaa-Wailua, homelessness on our island, and the large number of teen suicides on our island.

"Mr. Speaker, you've heard many of the overall suicide statistics, one suicide in every two days in our state. For every death by suicide, 90 attempts are made. What is less known is that in Hawaii, suicide is leading cause of injury-related deaths for 15 to 29-year-olds. For this same age group, there are about 45 deaths every year, or close to two youth suicides every single month. And for every youth suicide, there are 180 emergency room visits and close to 60 hospitalizations that we don't hear about.

"Mr. Speaker, there are a lot of statistics, but I'm sure everyone in this body has been personally touched directly or indirectly by youth suicide deaths and suicide attempts. My family, my children, while in middle and high school, have been personally touched, and we all must be aware that suicide is preventable. We all have to be gate keepers and be aware of warning signs and bring the needed resources without a moment to spare to our youth in need.

"In 2016, the Legislature created the Prevent Suicide Hawaii Taskforce, a statewide collaboration that includes county-based task forces. Last year, the taskforce submitted a community-based thoughtfully written strategic plan outlining their proposed work in early intervention, education, and prevention. And they are implementing the plan.

"Mr. Speaker, the \$150,000 in HB 330 will go to the Department of Health and the Prevent Suicide Hawaii Taskforce. It's my hope that these funds can help leverage private sector and foundation funds to help implement the taskforce's strategic plan as it relates to our most vulnerable youth between the ages of 10 to 24.

"By the way, Mr. Speaker, the Kapaa Middle School students told me that bullying and especially cyber-bullying contributes to sadness and worthlessness. And they told me that this is happening at the elementary school level. The lack of activities for youth after school and on weekends and the lack of mental health treatment in rural areas also contribute to the high neighbor island suicide rates.

"I would like to acknowledge the Representatives from Puna and Kona for working with me on this bill, for the Representatives from Kalihi Valley and Nuuanu for hearing and funding this bill, and the Majority Leader for her leadership throughout this process. *Mahalo piha*."

Representative Morikawa rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Strong support. Too many suicides have happened in my district, so this is really critical for us. And I'd also like the words of the previous speaker to be inserted as if they were my own. Thank you," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Lowen rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. In support. I'd like to adopt the words of the speaker from Kauai, from Kapaa, as if they were my own and also add that on Hawaii island, our rate of suicide is the highest in the state, and that's really frightening. These are children who are going through such difficult times that they feel that this is the only choice they have. And so, this is a step in the right direction to take a step toward preventing it. And I'm just thankful that we are passing this bill today," and the Chair "so ordered." (By reference only.)

Representative Gates rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I stand in strong support. As a House conferee for HB 330, I was honored to help move this bill out of committee. Suicide is something that affects our entire state but is not often discussed. Youth suicide is an issue that is a major concern for my community. Two of the most at-risk groups of youth are located on the Waianae coast. Those youths being of Native Hawaiian descent or being from a rural background. Youth suicide rates have consistently risen, and we needed to do something to address this issue.

"In HB 330, it appropriates funds to the Department of Health to support statewide youth suicide early intervention and education initiatives focusing on youth between the ages of 10 through 24. This bill is a crucial step in battling the factors that contribute to suicide. And I believe we must all do our part in bringing awareness by having robust discussions within our communities. And we must also be there to offer our *keiki* guidance, so they can navigate through perilous times without feeling alone. And I would like to *mahalo* the advocates and the legislators who worked hard on this measure, and I'm looking forward to having the Governor sign it into law. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and H.B. No. 330, HD 1, SD 1, CD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO SUICIDE PREVENTION," passed Final Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Mizuno being excused.

At 12:06 o'clock p.m., the Chair noted that the following bill passed Final Reading:

#### REPORTS OF STANDING COMMITTEES

Representative Luke, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2284) recommending that S.C.R. No. 3, SD 1, HD 1 be adopted.

Representative Belatti moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.C.R. No. 3, SD 1, HD 1 be adopted, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Thielen rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I wish to cast a no vote on SCR 3, Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2284, and explain why. Mr. Speaker, this would convene a task force to look into installing sprinklers in single-family residences, and we know the cost of that, Mr. Speaker, we know what it would do to the cost of construction, we know what it would do to the cost of homes for sale.

"And I find that this sprinkler system is almost becoming archaic with the technology that we now have available to us. That technology can spotlight immediately any kind of a fire. You can sit with your cell phone and take a look at what's going on in your house if you're wired in that way, to be able to do that. We have many more current kinds of things to do that are less costly than installing expensive sprinkler systems in our homes and making those homes even more unaffordable for our people. Thank you."

Representative Lee rose to speak in support of the measure, stating:

"Thank you, just in support, Mr. Speaker. I'd just like to note that sprinklers do play a pivotal role in preventing fires. Had the Cathedral of Notre-Dame had a sprinkler system, it would not have burned. But more importantly here in Hawaii, for individual residences, having a discussion about what might be appropriate, if it leads to even saving one life, is something, I think, that is worthy of consideration. Thank you."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 3, SD 1, HD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION CONVENING A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE ISSUE OF RESIDENTIAL SPRINKLER COSTS IN NEW ONE- AND TWO-FAMILY DWELLINGS," was adopted, with Representative Thielen voting no, and with Representative Mizuno being excused.

Representative Luke, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2285) recommending that S.C.R. No. 147 be adopted.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 147, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION ENCOURAGING THE HAWAII HOUSING FINANCE AND DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION TO REEVALUATE THE RENTAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM," was adopted, with Representative Mizuno being excused.

Representative Luke, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2286) recommending that S.C.R. No. 86 be adopted.

Representative Luke, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2287) recommending that S.C.R. No. 119, SD 1 be adopted.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 119, SD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE STATE ENERGY OFFICE, IN COLLABORATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE, TO CREATE AND IMPLEMENT A STRATEGIC PLAN TO INCREASE RENEWABLE ENERGY AND LOCAL FOOD PRODUCTION AND CREATE AN ECONOMIC IMPACT REPORT BASED ON IMPLEMENTATION OF THE STRATEGIC PLAN," was adopted, with Representative Mizuno being excused.

Representative Luke, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2289) recommending that S.C.R. No. 171, SD 1 be adopted.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 171, SD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE AUDITOR TO ASSESS THE SOCIAL AND FINANCIAL EFFECTS OF REQUIRING HEALTH INSURERS TO PROVIDE COVERAGE FOR CLINICAL VICTIM SUPPORT SERVICES FOR VICTIMS OF SEXUAL VIOLENCE AND ABUSE," was adopted, with Representative Mizuno being excused.

Representative Luke, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2290) recommending that S.C.R. No. 211, SD 1 be adopted.

On motion by Representative Belatti, seconded by Representative Morikawa and carried, the report of the Committee was adopted and S.C.R. No. 211, SD 1, entitled: "SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION REQUESTING THE FINALIZATION OF MEMORANDUMS OF UNDERSTANDING AND OTHER ACTIONS FOR PURPOSES OF DIVERSIFYING SOURCES OF IRRIGATION IN CENTRAL OAHU," was adopted, with Representative Mizuno being excused.

Representative Luke, for the Committee on Finance, presented a report (Stand. Com. Rep. No. 2291) recommending that S.C.R. No. 15 be adopted.

Representative Belatti moved that the report of the Committee be adopted, and that S.C.R. No. 15 be adopted, seconded by Representative Morikawa.

Representative Thielen rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I want to cast a no vote please on 2291, 2292 and 2293 and explain why. Mr. Speaker, today is Earth Day. And we take a look around us, particularly in our island chain, and we recognize that sea

level rise is coming, no matter what we want to do. We know that it is inevitable. And the best thing that we can do is try to cut our carbon footprint and also try, at the most, to prepare ourselves for those rising seas.

"These three resolutions do exactly the opposite. What they do is they allow, well they were illegal, but they allow the seawalls, the revetments, the piers, the structures that are in the path of the rising sea, they allow them to stay for a term of 65 years. Well, by that time, they're going to be well underwater, so is a lot of the rest of our island chain. But to do this on Earth Day and to do it without having a plan developed by the Governor and his administration is just simply wrong.

"We don't have the leadership from the fifth floor to be able to put things in place, to say, we have to be prepared. And while these people maybe need to make some repairs to their seawalls, revetments and piers, maybe let them do that for a period of three years, as the Department of Land and Natural Resources assesses what's going on in that particular area. Should those structures be allowed to go? Are they preventing other natural movement of the rising seas? And are they maybe going to make other areas be in worse shape?

"So, while these three areas get to continue hardening the shoreline, other areas aren't going to be able to, and shouldn't be able to, and it's a foolish policy I think, Mr. Speaker. And I fault the fifth floor for lacking a plan. And I think that we need to step forward and start with a plan. Any measure like this should have no longer life span than three years at the most. Put the pressure back upstairs and have them get to work on a plan where we don't harden our shoreline, but we let the natural course take it's time and be able to move things inland. Thank you."

Representative McKelvey rose to speak in opposition to the measure, stating:

"Thank you, Mr. Speaker. On the same measures, 2291, 2292 and 2293, no vote, and would like the words of the previous speaker, from the words from 'the fifth floor' on to be entered as if they were my own. Thank you."

We were a little bit too efficient and we moved this too quickly, so we had to do a little bit of fancy footwork and make sure that this measure had an appropriate effective date.

"I rise in support because I wanted to mention, as we introduced earlier, the Prevent Suicide Hawaii Taskforce is an organization with us, a network of over 100 public and private organizations, including government agencies, that work to improve and educate the community about suicide prevention and awareness, as was discussed in the previous bill.

"This bill, some members sometimes think the designation of month is not so important, but this particular measure designating September as Suicide Prevention and Awareness Month will play a key part in advancing the recommendation of the taskforce in raising greater awareness overall. This taskforce is doing such important work, and one of their strategic recommendations, as mentioned by the Representative from Kauai, was to reduce suicide in Hawaii by at least 25% by the year 2025.

"We don't do things simply in Hawaii or we don't do things just a little half approach. This recommendation was actually modeled after a national project of 20% by 2025. Here in Hawaii, this taskforce has done such tremendous work and has set the goal of 25% by the year 2025. So, this is really an important measure to help us advance in our efforts. Thank you, Mr. Speaker."

The motion was put to vote by the Chair and carried, and H.B. No. 655, HD 1, SD 1, entitled: "A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HEALTH," passed Final Reading by a vote of 50 ayes, with Representative Mizuno being excused.
