

## SEVENTEENTH DAY

**Tuesday, February 11, 2020**

The House of Representatives of the Thirtieth Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2020, convened at 12:05 p.m., with Vice Speaker Nakashima presiding.

The invocation was delivered by Representative Dee Morikawa, after which the Roll was called showing all members present with the exception of Representative Quinlan, who was excused.

Duane DeSoto, Founder and CEO, Na Kama Kai.

Representative Holt recognized the accomplishments and contributions of the honorees, congratulated them on being inspiring parents, thanked them for their strong dedication and commitment to their 'ohana and to the Native Hawaiian community, and introduced additional honoree who was seated on the Floor of the House:
